WHEREAS, the dedication and talent of Cary High School Band members bring pride to our community while also reflecting their commitment to academic achievement and personal growth; and


WHEREAS, music enriches lives, connects cultures, and serves as a powerful force for unity, creativity, and shared celebration; and

WHEREAS, 2025 marks the 104th anniversary of the Cary Band, which started in 1921 and continues to inspire generations;


WHEREAS, for 66 years, the Cary Band has proudly hosted North Carolina's premier celebration of marching band excellence and music education;

Chief Judge

RICHARD HOLMES graduated from Winthrop University in Rock Hill, SC, in 1989 with a Bachelor of Music Education degree, where he studied under Dr. William Malambri. He later earned a Master of Music degree with a concentration in Band Directing from Appalachian State University in Boone, NC, studying with Dr. Jay Jackson and Dr. William Gora.

After 31 years of dedicated service to public schools in North and South Carolina, Mr. Holmes retired at the end of the 2017-2018 school year. Throughout his teaching career, his bands consistently received "Superior" and "Excellent" ratings in both marching and concert performances. Under his leadership, the band programs grew in both size and quality, with numerous students participating in All-County Honors Band, All-District Band, All-State Honors Band, and Solo and Ensemble Music Performance Adjudication (MPA).

In addition to his teaching, Mr. Holmes held several leadership positions. He served as Treasurer, Webmaster, Chair of the All-District Band Clinic, and Chair for the High School Concert Band MPA within the South Central District Bandmasters Association. He was also President and Secretary of the North Carolina Bandmasters Association and President of the North Carolina Music Educators Association. Currently, he serves as the Southern Division Representative on the National Association for Music Education's Council for Band Education. His professional memberships include the North Carolina Association of Educators, National Association for Music Education, North Carolina Music Educators Association, South Central District Bandmasters Association, American School Band Directors Association, National Band Association, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia.

Mr. Holmes has received several honors, including the 2004 Award of Excellence for the South Central District and recognition in Who's Who Among America's Teachers for many years, thanks to nominations from former students. He has also served as a clinician for numerous All-County Honor Bands in North Carolina and judged marching and concert band assessments in both North Carolina and Virginia. Currently, Mr. Holmes works as an Educational Representative for Music & Arts in the Charlotte, NC area.

Music General Effect

MARTIN DICKEY is a native of Bristol, Virginia, and graduate of East Tennessee State University in Johnson City. He earned a Master's Degree in Arts and Letters from Southern Oregon University in Ashland, Oregon, and a Master's Degree in School Administration from Capella University in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Mr. Dickey has over 40 years of experience as a high school band director and music coordinator in public schools. Ensembles under his direction have performed at Pearl Harbor in Honolulu, Hawaii; the Lord Mayor's New Year's Day Parade in London, England; the Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena, California; the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in New York City; and for the National Football League's Carolina Panthers.

His marching bands have won 17 South Carolina State Championships, 9 Regional BOA Class Championships, and are 6-time BOA Grand National Semi-Finalists. Over Mr. Dickey's career, his concert ensembles have received more than 50 Superior Ratings, performed multiple times at the SCMEA In-Service Conference, been featured at the USC Band Clinic, and performed at the BOA Concert Festival.

In addition, Mr. Dickey was a finalist for the first annual Music Educator Award presented by The Recording Academy and the GRAMMY Foundation.

Mr. Dickey remains active as a musician, clinician, coordinator, adjudicator, and consultant for organizations and ensembles throughout the Southeast and is certified by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards. He is a Past President of the South Carolina Music Educators Association and the South Carolina Band Directors Association and has served on the staff of the U.S. Army All-American Marching Band and the Tournament of Roses Parade Honor Band of America.

Music Performance Individual

TONY K. ROBINSON is a 1982 graduate of Western Carolina University and began his teaching career as assistant band director and choir director at Enka High School in Asheville, N.C. In 1984, he became band director at his home school, Pisgah High School, in Canton, N.C.

In 1987, Mr. Robinson accepted the position of Director of Bands at Cary High School. During his 13-year tenure, the Cary Band continued its strong tradition of excellence by winning numerous marching band, concert band, jazz ensemble, percussion ensemble and winter-guard awards, grand championships and many class honors in guard, drum major and percussion.

The Cary Bands performed in the 1998 New Year's Day Parade, in London, England, and also gave a concert performance in Wembley Hall. In April 2000, the Cary Bands were invited to return to Europe, performing a 10-day tour of concerts in Bruges, Belgium, Le-Touquet and Paris, France.

In 2000, Mr. Robinson started the band program at Wakefield Middle School in Raleigh, N.C. From its first year enrollment of 80 students, the band grew to over 225 members earning Superior and Excellent ratings at N.C. Musical Performance Assessments during his 10-year tenure.

From 2010-23 he was the Instrumental Director at the 500 student Franklin Academy Charter High School in Wake Forest, NC. He conducted the Concert Band, 2 Jazz Ensembles, 2 Percussion Ensembles, and piano class. The band began with 27 members and grew to over 90 members. The Franklin Academy Band Ensembles are the 2014, 2016, 2018, and 2022 Music in the Parks, Williamsburg, V.A. Spring Grand Champions.

Mr. Robinson has earned Teacher of the Year honors at both Cary High School and Wakefield Middle School. He has been recognized as both a semi-finalist and a finalist for the Wake County Public Schools Teacher of the Year, Wake County PTA Teacher of the Year and recipient of the NC Central District's "Award of Excellence".

Mr. Robinson was the Conductor of the Triangle Youth Symphony, Philharmonic Association, from 1997-2010. He also serves as adjudicator for marching band, concert band, and winter-guard competitions in NC, TN, SC, and Virginia. He is a career long member of NCMEA, NC Bandmasters Association, Atlantic Indoor Association, and East-Central District Band Directors Association.

Mr. Robinson retired in June of 2023 after a 40-year career as a music educator for the North Carolina Public Schools.

Music Effect

JEFF WHIPPLE is a full-time visual designer, educator, clinician, and adjudicator based in Centerville, Ohio. With more than two decades of experience in the pageantry arts, he is active year-round as an adjudicator across the full visual spectrum.

Jeff has been a member of the visual teams for The Blue Knights and The Cavaliers, and currently serves as Visual Caption Head for The Sacramento Mandarins. His design and instructional work spans highly competitive programs across state and national circuits, with ensembles appearing in Bands of America Regional Finals, multiple state championships, and WGI Regional and World Championship finalist ensembles—including numerous Visual and General Effect caption winners.

Jeff's adjudication experience includes serving on panels across the country, consistently contributing to multiple State Championship panels during both the fall and winter seasons, as well as maintaining an ongoing role as a WGI Percussion Adjudicator.

He is currently the Visual Caption Head for The Centerville Jazz Band, where he is excited to contribute to the program's rich history. Jeff is a graduate of The University of Iowa, where he performed with the Hawkeye Marching Band and also served as the university's mascot.

When not immersed in the pageantry arts, Jeff enjoys traveling and exploring new hiking trails around the world.

Visual General Effect

BRIAN MCMATH is the retired Director of Bands from Northwest Guilford High School in Greensboro, North Carolina, with a prior appointment at Southwestern Randolph High School. He taught for 30 years as a music educator.

While at Northwest Guilford High School, Mr. McMath built ten performing ensembles for students to advance within: Jazz Ensemble, Percussion Ensemble, Concert Band, Symphonic Band, and Wind Ensemble — all consistently receiving accolades and Superior Ratings at adjudicated festivals and events. The nationally competitive Marching Viking Band, Middle School Cadet Winter Guard, JV Winter Guard, National Semi-Finalist Varsity Winter Guard, and Winter Percussion Ensemble continued to entertain audiences and provide meaningful co-curricular performance experiences for all students.

Students in Mr. McMath's programs have been selected for local, state, and national honor bands, and many former students have gone on to careers in music and music education.

Ensembles from Northwest Guilford performed in Tampa and Orlando, Florida; Tempe, Arizona; Dayton, Ohio; Toronto, Canada; New York City; the 2018 Hollywood Christmas Parade in California as well as Disneyland; and the 80th Pearl Harbor Concert Series in Waikiki, Hawaii, in 2021. The program has also traveled to Italy, Greece, Australia, New Zealand, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, and France. The Marching Vikings recently returned from their performance for the Pope in the 2024–2025 New Year's Day Parade in Rome, Italy.

Mr. McMath holds both a Bachelor's and a Master's Degree in Music Education from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, as well as

National Board Certification in Post-Secondary Music Education, earned in 2002 with recertifications in 2012 and 2022.

Mr. McMath was named the Coca-Cola Outstanding Young Educator (1999), Guilford County United Arts County Teacher of the Year (2011), NC Teaching Hero Award recipient (2019), and the 2021 Central District Bandmasters Award of Excellence for North Carolina. He is also a four-time Grammy-Nominated Music Educator (2023 Semi-Finalist and 2021 Top Ten Finalist) and was recognized as the 2024–2025 Teacher of the Year for Northwest Guilford High School.

He has held professional memberships in the Music Educators National Conference, North Carolina Music Educators Association, North Carolina Bandmasters Association, North Carolina Association of Educators, Central District Bandmasters Association, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity, and Pi Kappa Lambda.

Mr. McMath has performed in Switzerland, Italy, France, and Monte Carlo with the Greensboro Choral Society. He has also conducted in New York, London, York, and in Scotland for the Prime Minister in April 2001.

Mr. McMath is the Founder and CEO of MAC Group Travel, which offers travel opportunities for small and large groups. The company specializes in Band, Orchestra, Choral, Visual Art, and Drama trips, but also coordinates travel for sports teams, churches, theater groups, families, and others looking to travel domestically or internationally.

Visual Performance

DR. WES PARKER is an active clinician, adjudicator, trombonist, and guest conductor who has worked with middle school, high school, and collegiate jazz ensembles throughout the Southeast. He has directed numerous All-State and All-Region honor bands in Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, North Carolina, and Tennessee, and is in demand as both a jazz and classical trombonist.

As a Teaching Professor and Director of Jazz Studies at North Carolina State University since 2006, Dr. Parker directs multiple jazz ensembles, coaches jazz combos, and teaches jazz history and jazz improvisation.

Dr. Parker's trombone playing has been heard in jazz ensembles and orchestras throughout the United States. As an active freelance musician, he has shared the stage with such artists as Aretha Franklin, Idina Menzel, Plácido Domingo, Branford Marsalis, Ellis Marsalis, Michael Feinstein, Josh Groban, Regis Philbin, the Jimmy Dorsey and Glenn Miller Orchestras, The Temptations, and The Pointer Sisters. He performs regularly with the North Carolina Opera and Carolina Ballet Orchestras, the Chamber Orchestra of the Triangle, and is a member of the North Carolina Jazz Repertory Orchestra.

Under Dr. Parker's direction, the Jazz Program at NC State has grown to include three big bands and four jazz combos. The program has performed multiple times at the annual North Carolina Music Educators Association Conference, and the advanced jazz combo will soon release its second studio album, *For the First Time Again*. His bands have hosted and performed with such notable jazz musicians as Bobby Shew, Jiggs Whigham, Wayne Bergeron, Jeff Coffin, Michael Dease, Terell Stafford, Harry Watters, Chris

Vadala, Bryan Carter, Marcus Roberts, Tim Armacost, and Arturo O'Farill. The NC State Jazz Orchestra recently performed at The Midwest Clinic in December 2022, becoming the first collegiate ensemble from North Carolina to appear in the 76-year history of the conference.

Dr. Parker is an Outstanding Teacher Award recipient at North Carolina State University and has received a Citation of Excellence from the National Band Association. Prior to his appointment at NC State, he served as Interim Professor of Trombone at The University of Southern Mississippi and taught public school in Mississippi and Oklahoma.

He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from Tennessee Tech University, and both a Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts in Trombone Performance and Pedagogy from The University of Southern Mississippi.

Percussion

DR. MARK COLE recently completed 11 years as Associate Professor of Music Education, Director of Bands, and Music Department Chair at Gardner-Webb University in Boiling Springs, North Carolina. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Central Florida, a Master of Music degree in Wind Conducting from Florida State University, and a Doctor of Philosophy in Music Education from the University of South Florida.

Previously, he spent 11 years teaching in the Florida public school system, directing bands and teaching at Ridgewood High School in New Port Richey; the Bands of America Regional Champion, 2002 Grand National Semi-Finalist and five-time FMBC Champion Cypress Creek High School in Orlando; North Port High School; and the Douglas Anderson School of the Arts in Jacksonville, which won the 2006 DownBeat Magazine Student Music Award for the best arts school symphonic band in the nation. He also served on the music staff of Arizona Sun in 1992 and on the design and instructional staff of the 1995 DCI Finalist Magic of Orlando. Today, Dr. Cole performs with local big bands and small groups in his new home of Greenville, South Carolina.

During his career as a Navy musician, Dr. Cole served as Musical Director for the Midshipman Drum and Bugle Corps at the U.S. Naval Academy, Director of the Navy Band Memphis, Director of the Sixth Fleet Band in Naples, Italy, and Assistant Director/Associate Conductor of the United States Navy Band in Washington, D.C. His duties included conducting for four U.S. Presidents and numerous senators and congressmen, and he was responsible for the day-to-day operations of the 172-person Presidential support unit.

Dr. Cole composes and arranges for high school bands across the country and is in frequent demand as a guest clinician, consultant, and conductor. He is a member of Phi Mu Alpha, the Music Educators National Conference, the College Music Society, and the Central States Judges Association, and was selected for inclusion in Who's Who in America (2007).

REIKO CASTEEN lives in Moseley, VA, and is a native of East Tennessee. She graduated from Daniel Boone High School, East Tennessee State University, and Eastern Virginia Medical School. She has taught several guards (fall and indoor) throughout her career.

Her winter guard performing experience includes Daniel Boone High School (1992–1995), Nuendo Winter Guard (1995–2000), where they were WGI Bronze Medalists in 1996, and Infiniti World Winter Guard in 2003.

Reiko's drum corps experience includes marching with the Phantom Regiment Drum and Bugle Corps from Rockford, Illinois, in 1994 (3rd place), 1995 (5th place), and 1996 (DCI Gold Medalist).

Reiko currently lives in Richmond, VA, with her husband and son. She is a Licensed Surgical Assistant for MEDRVA at St. Mary's Hospital and is the owner of Casteen Surgical Assisting, LLC.

In his free time, he composes choral and instrumental music, serves as a judge for the International Competition for Collegiate A Cappella and the A Cappella Education Association, and performs with the semi-professional a cappella group Triadic Vocals.
