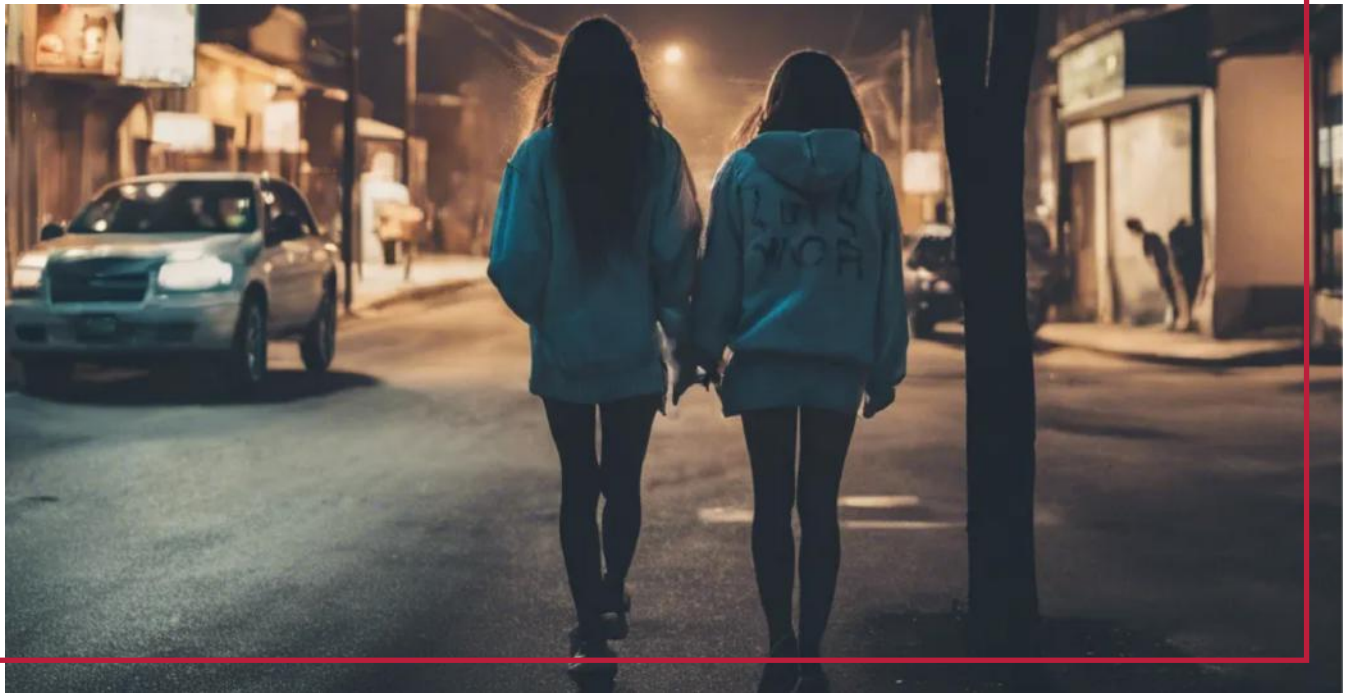

CHARITY PARTNER | IMPACT UPDATE

CRISIS AID INTERNATIONAL

At Big League Impact, our mission is simple: to help people in times of need. Since 2013, we've partnered with MLB players and their fans to raise funds and awareness for causes like childhood cancer, global poverty, and clean water access. We believe that when people come together, they can make a real difference in the lives of those who need it most.

One of the organizations we support is Crisis Aid International. St. Louis Cardinals pitcher Miles Mikolas has been a longtime supporter of the organization's U.S. Safe Initiative, a program that helps those at risk or caught in sex trafficking.

Since 2020, Miles has donated more than \$120,000 to this

cause, allowing Crisis Aid to provide one-on-one support to over 6,079 children and families and educate 15,000 community members on exploitation prevention.

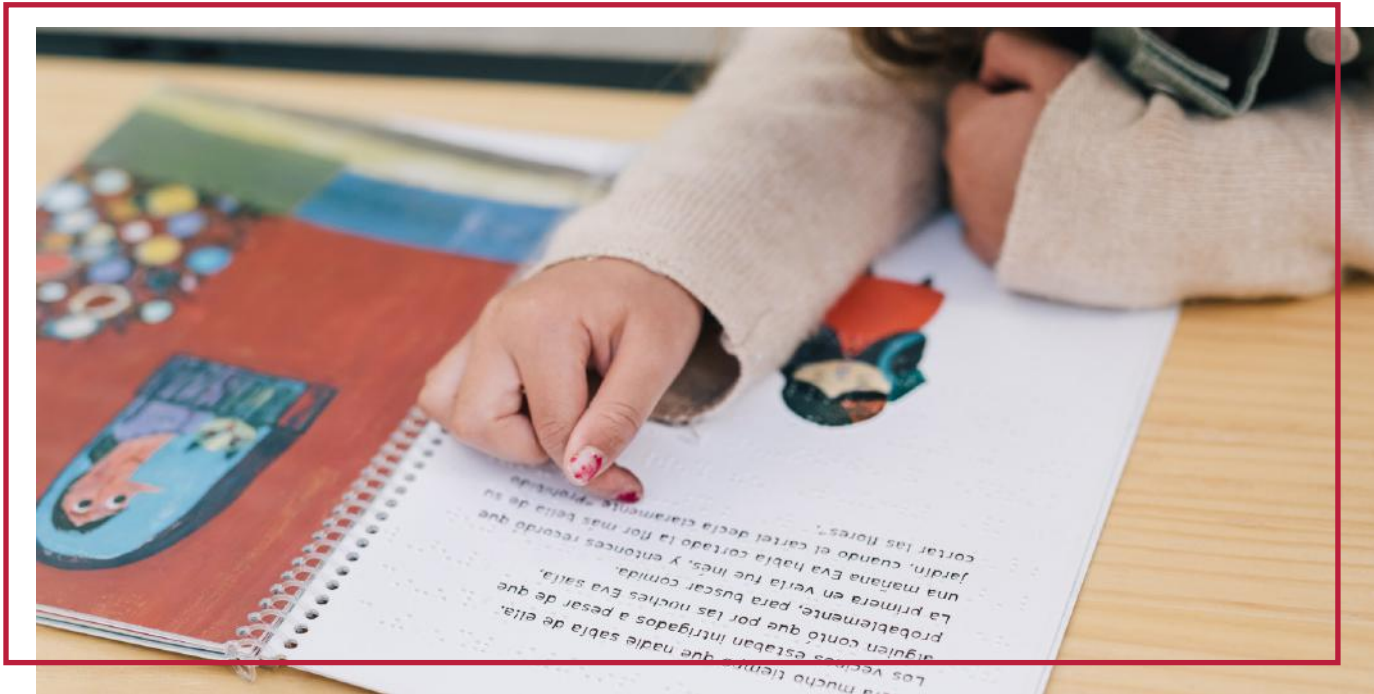
In 2023, Crisis Aid identified 1,361 children and families affected by sexual exploitation or trafficking. Of those, 503 children received specialized intervention, while 858 family members were supported. Additionally, 6,008 community members benefited from outreach efforts.

In 2024 (through Aug. 31), the program reached 1,140 children and families, with thousands more receiving education and intervention.

Operating from five St. Louis police stations, Crisis Aid

collaborates with the U.S. Attorney's Office, local courts, schools, hospitals, and child welfare agencies. The initiative focuses on identification, intervention, and prevention, working with law enforcement to locate victims, provide crisis support, and educate communities on the dangers of online exploitation and trafficking.

With the support of players like Miles, the Crisis Aid U.S. Safe Initiative has achieved remarkable success in protecting and empowering vulnerable children and families. Through advocacy, education, and intervention, Big League Impact is making a tangible difference in the fight against exploitation, giving hope to those in need and optimism for a better future.



CHARITY PARTNER | IMPACT UPDATE

THE LITTLE BIT FOUNDATION

Another organization we support is The Little Bit Foundation, which has had a profound impact on families like Jessica Johnson-Boykin's. Former St. Louis Cardinals first baseman Paul Goldschmidt has championed its mission through our #ALLWIN St. Louis campaigns and other fundraising efforts.

Jessica remembers how much her daughter, Deja, looked forward to visits from The Little Bit Foundation during her time at Peabody Elementary in St. Louis. The organization provides essential items—books, school supplies, and winter clothing—small gifts that create a lasting impact.

"I know from my work that when we feel better, we do better. Having a community partner that helps students feel confident and supported is invaluable." — **JESSICA JOHNSON-BOYKIN**

"First, it was a pencil and colorful bookmark, then books, then a coat and new shoes for the winter. Every time, it was a wonder to her," Jessica recalls.

Most importantly, the books Deja received ignited her love for reading, helping her develop early phonetic awareness.

"I truly believe that having books in front of her — and

the encouragement from people outside our family — fostered her creativity and passion for words," Jessica shares.

That love for storytelling inspired Deja to submit her own book to the Young Authors in Illinois Contest, where she wrote about a community coming together to clean up pollution.

When Jessica learned that

The Little Bit Foundation was expanding into the East St. Louis School District, where she now works as a mental health specialist, she was thrilled.

"I know from my work that when we feel better, we do better. Having a community partner that helps students

feel confident and supported is invaluable," she says.

As the manager of the district's Project Aware grant, Jessica works closely with students and staff on mental health literacy, substance abuse awareness, and connecting families with resources. She believes that partnerships

like these send a powerful message.

"All of these efforts show a commitment to supporting the whole child."

Thanks to efforts like these, more children will receive the resources and encouragement they need to thrive!

CHARITY PARTNER | IMPACT UPDATE

PLAYERS ONLY FANTASY FOOTBALL LEAGUE (POL)

A professional athlete's competitive spirit doesn't take an off-season!

Our players only fantasy football league was created in 2020 to give MLB players a chance to compete against each other for charity. In 2024, the POL once again transformed athletic rivalry into a powerful force for community change, raising \$160,000 to split among 30 charities hand-picked by participating players.

The league's top three finishers — pitcher Craig Stammen, pitcher Kyle Gibson and shortstop Trevor Story — directed substantial donations to their chosen charities. The charities shared some of the ways they'll be able to use these funds to further their missions and make an impact for people in need.

\$160,000 RAISED
BY 34 MLB PLAYERS FOR 30 CHARITIES

SAN DIEGO RESCUE MISSION

Craig Stammen has directed \$50,000 to the San Diego Rescue Mission, an emergency shelter providing meals, shelter, clothing, education and job-skills training for men, women, and single parents with children experiencing homelessness.

In 2025, the San Diego Rescue Mission aims to get 1,921 people off the streets immediately and to secure housing for 495 individuals. Additionally, the nonprofit will provide shelter, meals, clothing, and educational support to over 450 children,

while offering more than 4,000 showers and 400,000 meals to unhoused community members.

GRACE'S PLACE

Kyle Gibson's \$20,000 donation to Grace's Place will address immediate practical needs at the organization. The funds will help purchase new tires for their agency vehicle, which transports children to and from school, medical appointments, and community outings — especially crucial during harsh winter conditions.

The donation will also support the organization's insurance costs and food program, which served over 3,700 meals and snacks during more than 7,530 hours of care provided to children in need over the past year.

"We are so very thankful for this grant — it's such a wonderful way to get our 2025 started," says Amanda Jones, CEO of Grace's Place.

GIVING SOLE

Trevor Story has directed \$10,000 to Giving Sole, a charity focused on providing

new footwear to children in the foster care system. This contribution will enable the organization to provide over 150 foster children with brand new tennis shoes of their choosing.

Since 2018, Giving Sole has supplied more than 3,000 pairs of new shoes to foster kids, and Trevor's consistent partnership continues to make a significant impact; he also donated to the nonprofit after placing in the POL's top 3 in 2022 and 2023

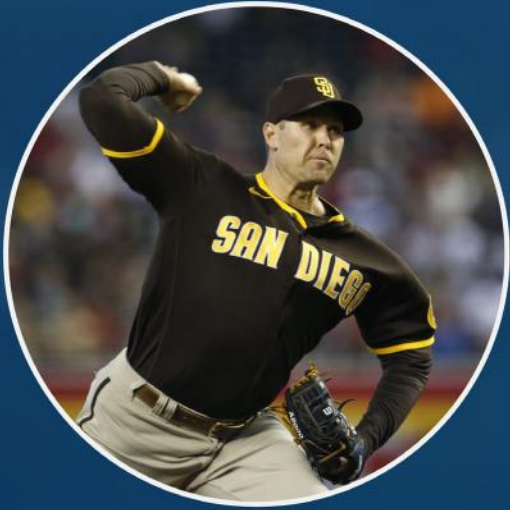
"The impact that Trevor Story has had partnering with us
