Q

How do you explain Bollywood dance to someone who has never seen it before?

When explaining Bollywood dance to people it can get confusing since there are different forms of it. But a generalization is quite literally dancing but with Indian music and some steps and dance styles originating in India. But when explaining my type of Bollywood dance I explain it the same, we just add a more modern twist to it!

A


Like I explained earlier there are different techniques and styles to Bollywood. The ones I specifically focus on are modernized Bollywood and Bollywood in general. We use a technique of just doing 8 counts to learn steps. We do combine a little bhangra (energetic dance in Northern India) into our steps but its usually just regular Bollywood dance with a twist to it.

What does Bollywood dance mean to you personally or culturally?

A

Bollywood dance has been such a big part of life and always will be. I started to dance around the age of 4 and I've been doing it on and off since then. 

My favorite gymnastics event is floor because I love to tumble.



I would do it at my church because we have many programs where you can express it and also compete in competitions.



A The style of dance I do is Irish dance and I started dancing at age 5. I train 5 days a week, 9 hours a week.




Q Describe World's: How do you qualify, where did it take place, and what other details you think we need to know?

This event is similar to another Irish dance competition I attended in February, in Killarney, Ireland. The main difference, of course, was the number of competitors.

What advice would you give to incoming 8th graders or younger students to help them succeed in middle school?




