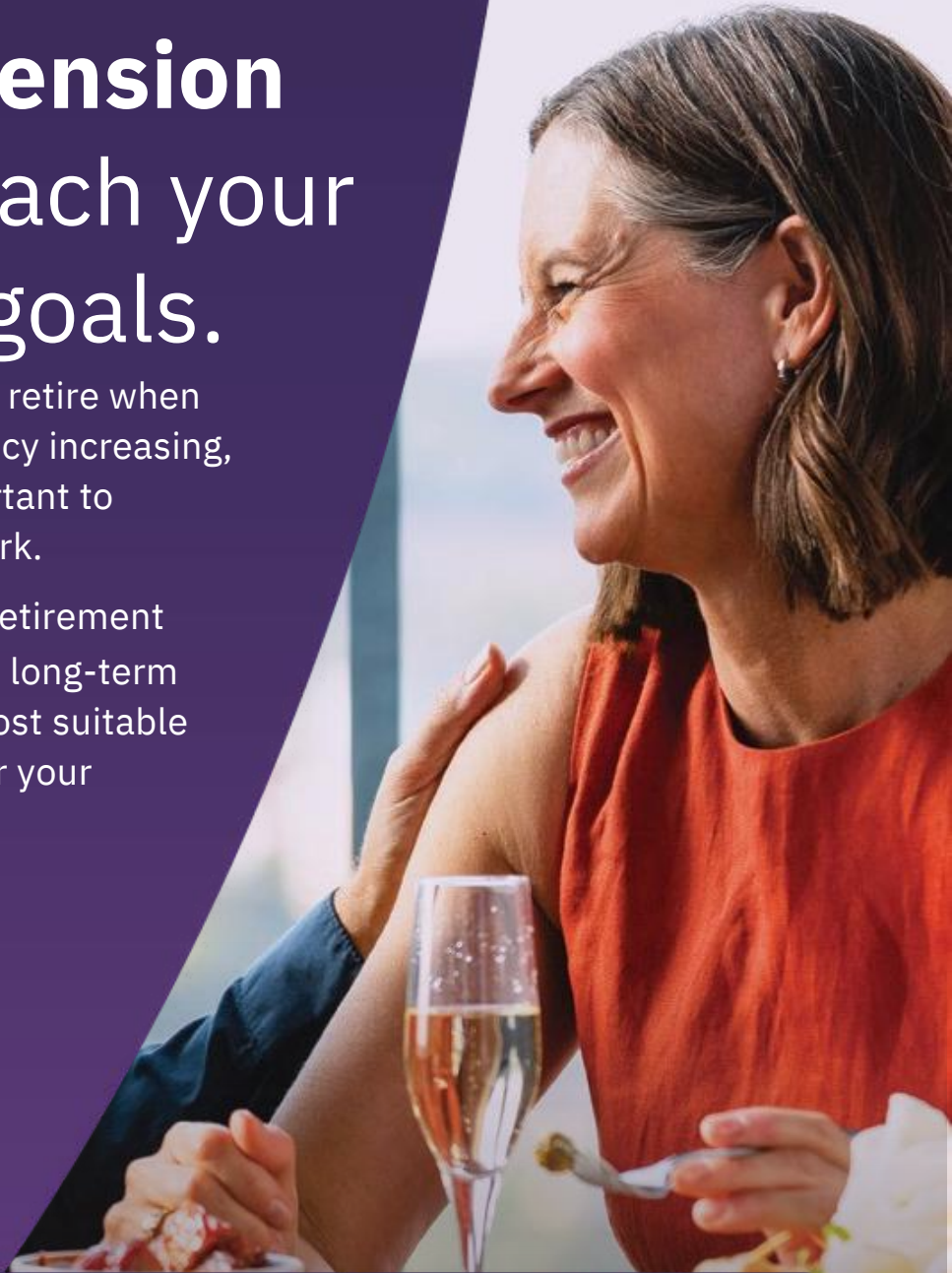

Trethomas Bluebirds History

Formed in 1903, football began when a piece of land in the village was bought by a group of local miners. Workers at the Bedwas Colliery purchased land and Llanbafon Drive Playing Field was developed for recreation, including organised sport. This was to become the home of Trethomas Football for over 100 years.

The first records of Trethomas were in 1925-26 when the club played in Division 2 Section A of the Welsh League, finishing 11th with 12 wins and 6 draws out of 30 league games. Notable present-day local rivals also competed that season, Aberbargoed, Treharris and Abergavenny. The club continued to compete in this division, their best season in 1934-35, when Trethomas finished 3rd winning the Lady Lewis Cup and the Caerphilly Miners Hospital Cup.

Football resumed in Trethomas after the Second World War, with the club competing again in Division 2 Eastern Section in 1945-46. However, in 1947-48, the club struggled winning only 2 games out of 34 and conceded 157 goals, dropping out of the Welsh League, only to return in 2016.

In the intervening years, the club played local league football in the Monmouthshire League in the 1960s. However, by the year 2000 the club now known as Trethomas Bluebirds after club members looked for inspiration from Cardiff City, were playing in the Gwent County League.

Despite relegation to Division Three in 2002-03, the club bounced back to win promotion as Gwent County Division Three Champions in 2005-06. Promotion to Division One followed and the club were unlucky to finish as runners up in the 2012/13 season. The Bluebirds would not have to wait long though to return to Welsh League status as 3 years later the club were promoted to the Welsh Football League in 2015/16, as Gwent County Division One Champions.

The Welsh League return of Trethomas brought a 11th place finish with 11 wins in 30 league games. The club were now playing at Bedwas Rugby Club, having had to move to meet Welsh League criteria, before a move to the Centre of Sporting Excellence in Ystrad Mynach.

The club were now well placed for future promotion and this also resulted in the Bluebirds finishing 3rd in the newly named Welsh League Division Two, before the restructuring into the Ardal Leagues, where the Bluebirds played in the South East Division of Ardal Southern.

Cup success in the inaugural Ardal Leagues Southern Cup 2021/22 was followed by Amateur Trophy success in the 2023/2024 season. The momentum continued into the 2023/24 season which saw the club promoted as Champions and entry into Cymru South for the 2024/25 season, the second tier of Welsh football.

Ammanford AFC History

Ammanford AFC was formed in the early 20th century, plying its trade in the Ammanford and District League at Rice Road. The first recorded fixture to date was in 1908/09, when Ammanford Town played a friendly against a Rhondda touring team. In the 1920's, Ammanford Thursdays played at Caemawr, Betws, before the first Betws soccer club called Betws Blackbirds played on Rice Road with their dressing rooms and headquarters at The Coopers Hotel, Betws during the 1930's. The committee at that time had the foresight to purchase the playing field and for land to build a club house for £750.

It wasn't until 1949 when Ammanford entered the Welsh Football League, then under the name of Betws. In 1957/58, they finished runners up to Llanelli, before being crowned champions of Division 2 (West) and promoted to Division 1 in 1958/59. They also won the Division 2 cup, beating Division 2 (East) champions Tredomen. On Saturday 22nd August 1959 the club played its opening First Division Welsh League fixture at home against Cardiff City Reserves and won 2-1. At the request of the Welsh Football League, they changed their name to Ammanford Town in 1960. It didn't take long to stamp their authority on the Welsh League circuit, employing former Liverpool player Roy Saunders to take over the helm in the early 1960's.

This was followed with the clubhouse being built at Rice Road in 1963. In 1964, at a cost of £4,000, a 450 seater stand and new changing rooms were built at Rice Road. From 1966/67 to 67/68 they finished Runners-up to Cardiff City Reserves in consecutive seasons. The club's main cup achievement came in 1983/84, where they reached the Final of Welsh Football League Cup, losing to Lake United in the final. In 1992, they amalgamated with Ammanford Athletic to become Ammanford AFC.

Unfortunately, in April 2003, a fire destroyed the stand and changing rooms at Rice Road, the start of the demise of the Rice Road ground. Therefore, in 2006 they moved to a new ground 'The Rec'.

Despite being relegated in 2013/14 due to a Welsh Pyramid restructure, they went on a 15 match win streak to gain promotion back to Welsh League Division Two in 2014/15. They remained in this division for three years before gaining promotion to Welsh League Division One for the 2018/19 season.

In the last few season they have finished 2021/22 12th, 2022/23 10th and last season 2023/24 a very creditable 3rd.

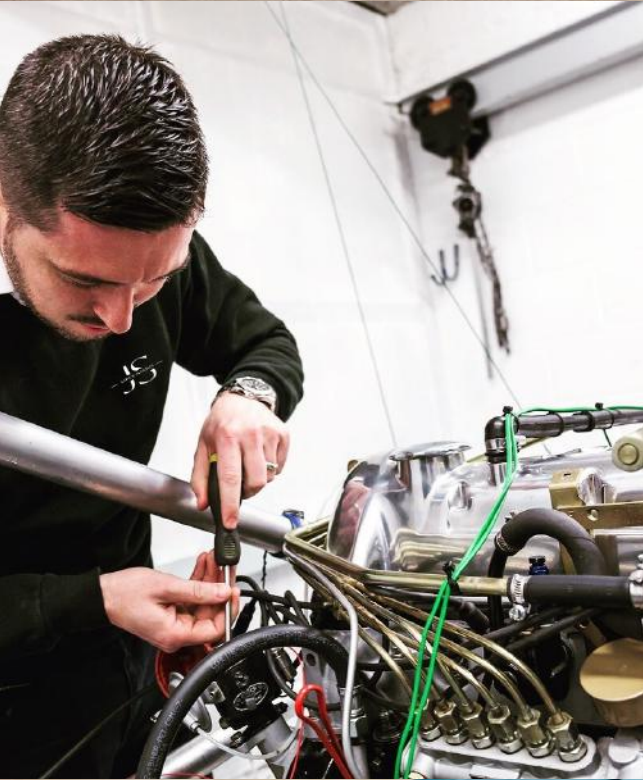

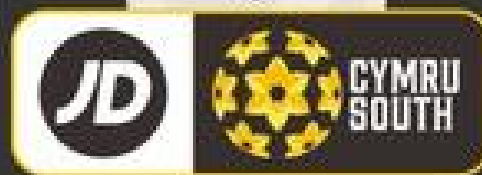

Title charge continues for Bluebirds with victory over Goytre United

Trethomas Bluebirds made it seven wins from eight in the Cymru South with a 3-1 victory over Goytre United.

Under new manager Stephen Kelleher, the visiting side were looking to start fast, but it was the Bluebirds who opened the scoring after five minutes through Gareth Tedstone.

Defender Lee Baldock doubled the hosts' lead shortly before half-time on a freezing cold Friday night at the Centre for Sporting Excellence, Ystrad Mynach.

A Kyran Steadman header for Goytre made it interesting, but a sublime Thomas Gameson strike put the game to bed as the Bluebirds claimed all three points and maintain their two point cushion at the top.

Kick-off

Looking for a fresh start, any hopes of a 'new manager bounce' were quickly snuffed out inside the opening moments by the clinical Bluebirds.

A free-kick for Goytre was cleared to the feet of winger Ethan Edwards, who drove at the backline with striker Gareth Tedstone alongside him.

Timing his pass perfectly, there was no doubt what would happen next. The club's top goal scorer made it five in four games with a neat finish into the far corner.

Edwards continued to cause carnage down the left with his sheer speed and skill, moments after the restart and he was past new signing Harry Bailey like he wasn't there. His cross blocked on this occasion though. Looking to clear their lines, the perhaps unsung pairing of Andrew Evans and David Vincent at the back were waiting to get the ball forward once more.

It was good to see Leon Thomas back out on the pitch following a hamstring issue, he might've had the dream return if his shot from an Edwards cut-back found the net. Not to be though with several bodies in the way.

The league leaders continued to push for the all-important second, Tedstone battled with Adam Robbins as the last man but his shot was just wide of the post.

There's always a nagging feeling when you don't take your chances that you may live to regret it, but fortunately team of the week keeper Harry Irving made sure that wasn't the case when saving a fierce Brad Flay strike at full stretch to deny the visitors.

A bit of a wake-up call, Edwards was again providing the greatest threat; an early floated cross this time found the head of Tedstone after 25 minutes, but the Bluebirds number nine put it straight at Tye Williams.

Things became a little more pedestrian as the half went on to the frustration of the Bluebirds bench. Goytre were happy enough to let Trethomas have the ball, but the hosts couldn't find the killer blow.

That was until once again Edwards got involved, his cross finding fullback Lee Baldock in the middle. Baldock's strike wasn't the cleanest off the outside of his boot, but it spun away into the bottom corner and counted all the same shortly before the half.

Second-half

The Bluebirds started the second-half minus David Vincent who picked-up a knock, but were hoping that wouldn't make a difference as they pressed for the third.

It was the visitors who were growing into the game though, a header flicked on to Cameron Harris allowed the forward to get a shot off. His effort was well over the bar from just inside the area. A cheap free-kick to the right of the box was given away by the Bluebirds after an hour played, and provided Goytre the chance they needed to get back in the contest.

A lovely floated ball in by Kyran Gardner found the unmarked captain Kyran Steadman who picked-out the far corner expertly with his header to make it 2-1. Game on.

A very similar situation to the Newport City game last week, Trethomas needed to soak-up some pressure and get back on top.

Substitutes helped, Jack Jones replacing Thomas offered a more direct threat with the 21-year-old always looking to get past people.

His efforts led to the crucial third goal for the Bluebirds when his shot was cleared as far as Thomas Gameson well outside the Goytre penalty area.

It had been a quiet night for Gameson up until then, but his powerful first-time strike missed everyone on its way into the far corner, leaving Williams rooted to his line.

As the pressure lifted, the Cymru South leaders looked good value to see out the match.

It wasn't a simple last 15 minutes though, Irving called into action on more than one occasion. The Bluebirds number one produced a superb save after Connor Smith flicked a cross goal bound.

The final kick of the match saw a ball loop over Irving and onto the post, but thanks to that two goal cushion, the three points felt inevitable.

The whistle went on a match which was always going to be close against a Goytre side with a new manager and a point to prove.

All that matters for the Bluebirds is another win. They remain two points clear of Llanelli Town at the top who also won that evening.

Reaction

Bluebirds manager Mark Dunford said: "I thought we were a bit scruffy first-half for parts.

"We had a great first few minutes where we scored and had a few chances, but for 20 minutes we stepped-off the gas a little bit and were waiting for things to happen."

"You're coming up against a side with a new manager and players trying to impress in front of a decent crowd and it caused us a lot of problems at times."

On the third goal, Dunford said: "It was massive. At 2-1 it was going to be difficult for us, especially after losing David Vincent who has been tremendous. It was a great strike from Tom (Gameson)."

Asked about the win overall, Dunford added: "I had a funny feeling tonight's game would tough but yeah it's a tremendous run that we're on, we were here last year and we just need to take it one game at a time."

Battling Bluebirds stay top after dogged win over Taffs Well

Trethomas Bluebirds remain two points clear at the top of the Cymru South following a tough 2-0 win on the road against struggling Taffs Well.

It was a top versus bottom clash under the floodlights, with the Wellmen equally desperate for three points as they hope to remain in the division.

On a tricky surface it was a tough game for both sides, but the Bluebirds managed to get their noses in front at the break thanks to a James Young goal.

The hosts battled hard in the second-half, but despite having to play the final ten minutes with ten men, it was Trethomas who managed to score a late goal through Thomas Gameson to make it 2-0 at full-time.

Kick-off

It was a lightning fast start from the visitors; top scorer at the club Gareth Tedstone setting the tone early with a block straight from kick-off and almost scoring up the other end.

Another man who set the tone early was referee Kris Hames. Tedstone was the first to pick-up a caution inside five minutes, just one of ten players who would see yellow across the full 90.

Both sides struggled to find their footing in the opening 20 minutes, both figuratively and literally. The pitch was in a pretty sorry state making it difficult to string more than a few accurate passes together.

It was the Wellmen who managed to work the first opening however, a cross down the left needed to be flicked away by the Trethomas defence with yellow shirts waiting in the middle.

The match didn't really spark into life until the Bluebirds had a penalty appeal when second striker Callum Huggins went down in the box.

Nothing given, but a foul to Taffs Well a few moments later in front of the dugouts led to some heated exchanges on a cold winter's night.

The resulting free-kick was underwhelming, but somehow deflected off a few bodies and fell to Reece Perry in the box. He rushed the chance though and keeper Harry Irving made a comfortable stop. This seemed to wake the Bluebirds up, and down the other end Lee Baldock put in another decent delivery from a set piece – the 33-year-old seemed to have his eye in from the start with some dangerous crosses. The initial header was met by defender David Vincent who nodded down to the always alert James Young. The midfielder calmly took a touch around the defender and picked-out the bottom corner to give his side a 1-0 lead.

A huge goal under any circumstance, but especially in these conditions.

On a night where set pieces were central to everything, the hosts had a golden chance of their own shortly after the first went in. Another free-kick, this time a shot from some distance was palmed back into the middle by Irving.

With nobody following their runners in, the Wellmen were queuing up. It fell kindest to Joshua Pope who had to score from a few yards out. The winger snatched at it though and his bobbled effort bounced into the grateful arms of the Bluebirds number one.

The mad few minutes before the half continued as Tedstone shrugged off the last defender down the right side of the box and found Huggins in the middle.

Perhaps the Barry Town loanee could've hit it first time, but his touch allowed keeper Iwan Hooper to smother. The ball fell as far as captain James Saddler on the edge of the box whose powerful strike was saved again by January signing Hooper.

Second-half

The Bluebirds coaching staff appeared to have preached a message of simplicity during the break. It was back to basics for Trethomas, who benefited massively from some combinations and when unsure got the ball into space in the wide areas.

This led to a chance for Vincent when yet another set piece found the 34-year-old at the back post. His header just clipped the outside of the post.

Not the header he was looking for up the other end of the field though when a looping heave forward was missed by Vincent, leaving William Bevan last man up against Tom Rees.

Bevan made a bit of a mess of it and brought Rees down right on the edge of the area. Given what had gone on before, Bevan wouldn't have been shocked to see Hames brandish a red.

Just a yellow though, with the resulting free-kick put into the car park.

The game remained very scrappy with neither side really getting hold of it for any length of time.

The addition of Kallum Thomas was a smart move from the Bluebirds coaching staff. He looked calm and composed whenever he had the ball in midfield.

Leon Thomas quietly had a good game down the left too. His hold up play is always surprisingly effective for someone who is also so good with their feet.

The game was stopped for ten minutes or so when a nasty, but accidental, clash of heads left Vincent in a heap. He managed to eventually hobble off after receiving treatment.

This did mean however that the Bluebirds would have to play the remainder of the match with ten men having used all their substitutions.

Throwing everything at the visitors now, the Wellmen had what would have been a great chance bar the superbly timed sliding tackle from defender Andrew Evans. It almost felt as big as a goal.

A last minute free-kick for the hosts threatened to spoil things, but it was the work rate of substitute Jack Jones who made sure of all three points when he capitalised on the Trethomas clearance.

Having worked tirelessly since coming on, the winger had no right to win a header around the halfway line up against a big defender, but win it he did and sent through Thomas Gameson who only had the keeper to beat.

Knocking it around Hooper, Gameson walked it into an empty net to double the lead and cement the victory.

It was a match which felt like it was going to have to be a 'smash and grab' before the first ball was kicked. Credit to the Bluebirds for battling hard and once again demonstrating they have more than one string to their bow when it comes to finding ways to win.

Reaction

After the win, Bluebirds manager Mark Dunford said: "It was always going to be a difficult one. It was a tough pitch and we faced a side fighting for their lives and credit to them they ran their socks off.

"I thought we deserved the first goal and had some momentum and territory in a territorial football match. It gave us a bit of a lift but it was a shame we didn't get that second.

"The second-half was full of bits of drama so we're just happy to get through it."

With Llanelli Town also winning on the night, the Bluebirds maintain that two point gap at the top. Asked about the title race, Dunford added: "We're down to ten games now so it's a case of getting the group right, keeping the right mentality and seeing how far it takes us."
