



Since **October 7** Israel has been at war... A war started by the brutal attack by Hamas terrorists on Israel's citizens which left a horrifying toll of over **1,200 dead**, **3,500 wounded** and over **230 kidnapped**. With missiles being fired at Israel daily, hundreds of thousands of Israelis forced to leave their homes, battles raging on two fronts, and the number of killed and injured continuing to rise, the horror of these attacks and their aftermath continues to affect all of Israel's citizens - Jews and Arabs, religious and secular, from the south and from the north.

The Peres Center has mobilized all its forces for action, drawing upon 27 years of impactful activity during which the Center has forged strong relations with governments, leaders, and friends of Israel worldwide as well as developed methodologies and extensive infrastructure for implementing large-scale regional projects. This is our expertise, this is our strength, and we feel it is our duty to harness it for the future of the State of Israel, **for the future we envision for our country and for our region**.



War Effort Projects



Support for the Families of the Hostages & Missing

In the immediate aftermath of the October 7 attacks, the Peres Center began working to support hostage families, doing all in our power to promote their release. From bringing their voices to the world media, to arranging international delegations the Peres Center utilized its immense international network to keep the issue at the forefront of governments' and people's minds.

The Peres Center also launched a wide-spread social media campaign highlighting the pain of all citizens of Israel: "The Mothers of Israel Don't Sleep at Night" campaign united mothers from all walks of life in solidarity, through late-night posts focused on restless and sleepless nights spent reflecting on the pain and plight of **mothers** whose children and families are being held hostage in Gaza.



Supporting Displaced Communities

As soon as evacuations began from the south and the north of Israel, the Peres Center's educational teams mobilized to provide evacuees with relief and respite. Our teams visited 22 evacuation centers the length and breadth of the country conducting over 125 in-person and online workshops for over 2,000 evacuees, from preschool children to the elderly.

During the many weeks of bombardment on Tel Aviv-Yafo, the Peres Center also opened its doors to local educational institutions that did not have appropriate shelters in order to allow children to **safely** continue their educational and extracurricular actives during these immensely challenging times, all the while also offering free online Innovation Center tours and workshops to the general public.





Resilience in Innovation

The **Start-Up Nation** has faced significant challenges in light of the war. Many **companies found themselves in financial distress** in the months following the war due to the **large-scale mobilization** of manpower to the military and attention directed to supporting social initiatives relating to the **war effort.**

In response, the Peres Center, in partnership with the Israel Innovation Authority, leveraged its successful annual Innovation Marketplace to launch the **Resilience Innovation Marketplace**, a series of online events which connected almost **100 startups** and entrepreneurs, whose operations have been negatively impacted by the current situation, with over **150 investors** and donors seeking to support the Israeli tech ecosystem.



Medal of Distinction Award Ceremony in honor of International Women's Day

The Peres Center's annual ceremony in honor of International Women's Day 2024 was dedicated to the **bravery, initiative, determination and leadership** of **21 remarkable women** on, and since, October 7.

The ceremony served to highlight the courage, ingenuity, and resilience of women who made significant impacts on the battlefield and throughout Israeli society amid the ongoing conflict.

The awards recognized contributions across sectors, including journalism, advocacy, medicine, philanthropy, and military service. A special Medal of Distinction was also awarded to **the bravest of them all**: the women who were taken captive in Gaza – those who have already returned and those who are still held hostage.





Highlighting Solidarity in Shared Tragedy

The entirety of Israeli society was affected by the events of October 7 and its aftermath underscoring the broad spectrum of our shared reality. To convey this collective Israeli story, the Peres Center exhibited the world-renowned postcard illustrations of artist **Zeev Engelmayer ("Shoshke")** which portray significant stories and moments since October 7, depicting the mood of the country and embodying the horror, fear, and sorrow felt by all in these times. This exhibition was viewed by tens of thousands of national and international visitors to the Peres Center, serving as a constant reminder of the heartbreaking situations Israelis are facing on a daily basis.

In the wake of the horrific attacks of October 7 and the devastating war that has followed, all of Israel's diverse communities have been united in sorrow. An important part of understanding and **highlighting our shared reality** is acknowledging the Israeli-Arab citizens who were among the murdered and kidnapped, as well as among first responders, police officers, and soldiers who were killed in the line of duty. Since that tragic day, there have been numerous **acts of solidarity initiated among all sectors of Israeli society**.



"October Seventh" Photo Exhibition by Ziv Koren

The Peres Center's "October Seventh" exhibition of photographs by world renowned photojournalist Ziv Koren opened in May 2024 and has since drawn over 30,000 visitors. The exhibition, which documents events from the first moments of October 7, serves to memorialize and preserve the memory of the greatest disaster that has ever occurred in the State of Israel. These hard-hitting, powerful works serve as a startling, unique and firsthand testimony from the kibbutzim and the towns and cities of the Gaza Envelope - from soldiers on the battlefield to the rehabilitation of the wounded. Koren's work also accompanies the released hostages, their families and the campaign demanding the release of those still held captive. Each photo tells a different and powerful story of memory, pain, and bereavement alongside heroism, renewal, and hope.

The exhibition is **dedicated to the memory** of the many Israelis who have been brutally and prematurely taken, to the heroism witnessed on the battlefield and on the home front, and to the rehabilitation and recovery of those wounded both in body and mind.



Next October - From Grief to Growth

The Peres Center has partnered with the Next October initiative, established by the family of Yaron Oree Shay, an Israeli soldier who fell in battle on October 7 while defending hundreds of civilians at Kibbutz Kerem Shalom.

Next October seeks to harness Israeli innovation to **honor those lost** on that day and during the subsequent war, both soldiers and civilians, by linking startup founders with the families of the victims - **fostering growth and progress** in the memory of the fallen.

The startups participating in this initiative commit to President Peres' core value of "innovation for good" and pledge to honor the victims' memory in various ways, keeping their stories alive in hearts and minds.

This commitment is not just a symbolic gesture but is integrated into the operational and ethical framework of the participating startups. In return, these startups gain credibility, enhanced investor relations, and valuable mentorship.

Over 500 startups have already joined the initiative's network since its establishment and Next October together with the Peres Center hope to triple this figure by October 2025.

We must look to the future, and the future will be a future of peace. There is no alternative.
