PROJECT PUSTAK

Launched with a vision to bridge educational inequality, Project Pustak stands as one of the Rotaract Club of R.V.C.E.'s most impactful initiatives of 2025. The project was conceived to support underprivileged children who, despite receiving school uniforms through government aid, often lack access to essential academic tools. Project Pustak set out to change that, one school kit at a time.


From 22nd to 26th July 2025, the Rotaract Club of R.V.C.E. hosted the fourth edition of Project Pustak, marking a significant step toward educational empowerment. The first phase, conducted in collaboration with the Pranav Foundation, witnessed the active participation of 58 participants, 17 volunteers, and 3 faculty members, whose collective efforts enabled the successful distribution.



The numbers speak volumes. Through contributions received during the first phase, the team assembled an extraordinary 24,000 notebooks, 3,250 stationery kits, and 2,250 geometry boxes, which were combined into 5,500 school kits tailored for different age groups.

These kits were distributed across 12 government schools in regions such as Doddaballapur, Anekal, Kanakapura, Mallathahalli, and Bengaluru Rural and Urban, with special focus on underserved communities. Beyond fulfilling material needs, the initiative ignited hope—rekindling motivation among students and encouraging them to pursue their studies with renewed confidence.

Project Pustak's impact went beyond classrooms, gaining attention from TV channels and local newspapers, highlighting the power of youth-led service and the impact of compassion-driven collective action.



NAIVEDYAM 4.0

On 18th October 2025, the Rotaract Club of R.V.C.E. organized Naivedyam 4.0, a food donation drive aimed at supporting underprivileged communities. The initiative focused on spreading kindness and highlighting the joy of giving back. This year, the club distributed 190 kilograms of cooked rice and served freshly prepared meals to around 1,200 people at the Savitri Bai Phule Slum, Nayandanahalli, as well as at Samartha Trust and Swavalambi Trust.

With 24 Rotaract Clubs joining hands—some organizing drives in their own regions and others supporting the cause—the collective effort helped serve around 2,000 people across different locations, reflecting how teamwork and compassion can create meaningful change.



Naivedyam 4.0 brought together Rotaract clubs from Romania, Sri Lanka, Nepal, and various parts of India, strengthening bonds beyond borders and across the nation through collective service. This wide collaboration reflected the true spirit of unity and shared responsibility.

More than a food distribution drive, Naivedyam 4.0 was about human connection and hope. Volunteers spent time interacting with beneficiaries, listening to their stories, and witnessing the impact of simple acts of kindness. The smiles and gratitude exchanged left a lasting sense of purpose, reinforcing the Rotaract Club of R.V.C.E.'s belief in service above self—one meal at a time.



FIST FULL 4.0



From 3rd to 25th November 2025, the Rotaract Club of R.V.C.E. turned a simple act of giving into a powerful movement through its food donation drive, “Fist Full.” Hosted at the Geotechnical Lab, Civil Engineering Department, the initiative became a hub of daily generosity and student-led service.

The concept was straightforward yet impactful - students were encouraged to donate either 5 kg of rice or 2 kg of toor daal. What followed was an inspiring display of unity and compassion, with students consistently contributing throughout the drive. By the end of the campaign, 1,943 students had come together to donate an extraordinary 4,445 kg of rice and 2,566 kg of daal, highlighting the collective strength of the R.V. College of Engineering community.

The donated grains were carefully distributed to six organizations, Hanuman Temple, Pruthvi Foundation – Blind Boys Hostel, Amrutavani Vridh Seva Samithi, Sai Ashraya Hospital, Sai Satguna Sangraha Trust School, and Nele Foundation, ensuring that the contributions reached those most in need, including children, the elderly, and marginalized communities.

Beyond addressing food insecurity, Fist Full served as a reminder of the role students can play in driving meaningful social change. The initiative emphasized community-centric problem solving, sustainability, and collaborative learning, encouraging participants to look beyond academics and understand the real-world impact of their actions.



BLOOD DONATION CAMP


On 30th October 2025, the Rotaract Club of RVCE conducted its flagship event – the Blood Donation Camp. This event was a large-scale humanitarian initiative dedicated to promoting voluntary blood donation and creating awareness about its life-saving impact.


The event started bright and early on a Thursday morning, with Rotaract board members and club representatives setting up for the commencement of the camp. We hosted three leading blood banks – Kidwai Memorial, Indira Gandhi Institute of Child Health, and Red Cross Society - whose skilled professionals ensured donor safety and adherence to quality standard procedures. The camp was graciously sponsored by Rotary Bengaluru South, with HDFC Bank supporting the cause as the official goodie sponsor, motivating donors to come forward and participate.



We were graced by the presence of several prominent personalities throughout the camp, such as the District Governor Rtn. Shridhar B.R., Dr. K. N. Subramanya, Principal, RVCE, eminent leaders from Rotary Bengaluru South, and the administrative team of RVCE. Their presence encouraged and inspired participants, reinforcing the importance of community engagement and service.

As the day progressed, the influx of donors only grew as more people stepped forward to contribute to this noble cause. All donors, once registered, underwent a basic health check-up by on-site physicians to ensure they were fit and eligible to donate blood. Once deemed fit, they were directed to their assigned blood banks, after which they were offered refreshments, goodies, certificates, and any additional assistance they required. Our volunteers ensured that all the activities are happening in a smooth and coordinated environment.





We witnessed overwhelming participation from students, faculty members, and volunteers, who proudly held their certificates and posed at our handmade photobooth after their successful donations, capturing moments of pride, joy, and fulfilment. Smiles were everywhere, and the impact being created was deeply felt, reflecting the strong spirit of compassion, unity, and social responsibility that RVCE actively nurtures within its community.

The day concluded in the dusky evening with cheers and pleasantly exhausted smiles as participants gathered for closing remarks, heartfelt acknowledgements to the dignitaries, and the presentation of awards to deserving board members, marking a meaningful and memorable end to an impactful day of service.

The Blood Donation Camp 2025 was a resounding success, culminating in the collection of an incredible 1006 units of blood - a landmark achievement for the institution breaking all the past records. FAST TREK 4.0





ChatPata Bites: India's Love Affair with Chinese Food



FIRE ON ICE




In a country where sunlight dominates most of the year and sports usually unfold on grass or clay, the idea of an Indian women's ice hockey team sounds almost unreal. It seems like a sport that belongs to faraway lands, to Canada's frozen lakes or Europe's indoor rinks, not to a nation where finding snow itself is rare. And yet, in 2025, a determined group of young women from Ladakh did the unimaginable. They brought home India's first ever international medal in ice hockey, a bronze at the IIHF Women's Asia & Oceania Championship.

Their journey began not on professional rinks, but on frozen lakes high in the Himalayas. In the remote villages of Ladakh, winter does not come gently. The cold settles in sharply, the winds are unforgiving, and lakes freeze into vast sheets of solid ice. To most people, this environment is tough and limiting. But to the children of Ladakh, it becomes a playground. For many of the girls who would one day represent India, the frozen lakes were their first rinks. Their early memories involve slipping across natural ice, playing with makeshift sticks, and learning balance the hard way, through countless falls and bruises that never once dimmed their love for the sport.

It wasn't an easy passion to nurture. Ice hockey is expensive: the skates, pads, sticks, helmets, almost everything has to be imported. Professional rinks are scarce in India, and for women, the challenges multiply. Some players recall being told that ice hockey "isn't meant for girls" or that they should pick a sport more suited to their environment or future. But passion, once ignited, rarely listens to practicality. What these girls lacked in resources, they made up for in determination. Their mornings often began before sunrise, squeezing in training sessions before school, then hurrying through homework to find time for practice again. Families, communities, and local supporters pooled resources, shared equipment, and encouraged them in whatever way they could.

This persistence carried them to the 2025 championship. Entering the tournament, they were complete underdogs. Other teams had better rinks, better funding, and years of structured training. India had heart and a team that had learned to adapt, improvise, and fight for every inch of progress.



Throughout the championship, their play surprised spectators. Their speed, coordination, and sheer resilience reflected years of pushing through limitations. They defended fiercely, attacked fearlessly, and displayed the kind of spirit that makes a team unforgettable.

With each match, India's confidence grew, and so did the buzz around their performance. Spectators who had initially watched them with curiosity soon found themselves cheering for their energetic and fearless plays. Game by game, the team stitched together moments of brilliance that made people stop and pay attention. By the time they reached the bronze medal playoff, there was a gentle but undeniable excitement in the arena, a sense that this underdog team had something special left to show.


The defining moment came in the bronze medal playoff. The game slipped into tense overtime, every second heavy with pressure. Then, in a flash of brilliance, forward Stanzin Dolkar broke past defenders and sent a backhand shot into the net. For a heartbeat, the arena fell silent, and then erupted. With that single goal, India claimed its first international medal in women's ice hockey.

But the victory was more than a medal. It was a triumph for every girl told her dream is unrealistic, for every community quietly supporting its athletes, and for every underdog who dares to hope. Their win sparked conversations across India about winter sports, infrastructure, and the importance of nurturing talent from unexpected places.

What makes their story so inspiring is not just the result, but the road they took to reach it. They proved that excellence can rise without perfect facilities, that passion and persistence can outshine limitations. Their journey shows that greatness often begins with humble roots, far from the spotlight, nurtured by courage instead of convenience.

Today, the team stands as a symbol of possibility. Their breakthrough has inspired young talents across India and challenged assumptions about what Indian athletes can achieve. Their journey is not finished, if anything, it has only just begun. But what they have already accomplished is remarkable, turning ice into opportunity, obstacles into motivation, and doubts into triumph. In a world quick to limit what is possible, these women carved their own path. *They didn't just skate on ice, they set it on fire.*

F1: SECOND SEAT *CURSE*

When fans think of Red Bull Racing, they think of raw speed, aggressive racing philosophies and the drivers who redefine limits of what a Formula 1 car can do. But behind this lies one of the hardest challenges that is the second seat. Max Verstappen started his Red Bull career in 2016, ever since then the spot alongside him has become the toughest and the most unpredictable role on the grid, so much that it has created controversies, reshaped careers.

THE BEGINNING

Every F1 team has two drivers on the grid. On paper both the drivers are given the same machine with near perfect similarities. But at Red Bull's garage it works slightly differently.

As Max rose to be the central competitive force for the team, the team has built the car around him and according to his preferences. The car, the setup, the entire development plan revolved around him to maximize his strengths on the track.

For a newcomer or even an experienced driver, it was near impossible to adapt to that car as the

entire car was built to match one's driving style.

THE DRIVING STYLE PROBLEM

Max in a nutshell is an aggressive driver and likes the car to be more agile at the front, capable of rotating sharply while staying stable even when pushed to its extreme limits. The aerodynamic engineer and a former Red Bull mastermind Adrian Newey, is one of the few designers in F1 history capable of creating machinery that perfectly complements such a demanding driving style

But this design came at a cost, as other drivers prefer their cars to be neutral and more rear stable. This mismatch creates a fundamental conflict with the second driver, this means the second driver isn't competing with Max but with the car itself.



THE TIMELINE

The second seat's reputation didn't appear overnight.


- Pierre Gasly (2019) stepped in young and talented but was overwhelmed by the pace difference, eventually being demoted mid-season.
- Alex Albon (2019–2020) showed flashes of brilliance but also fell behind Verstappen's consistency and raw speed.
- Sergio Pérez (2021–2024) was expected to bring experience and stability. While he delivered crucial results, most famously in title fights his performance gap to Verstappen widened over time.
- Liam Lawson (2025) – Given the shot many fans wanted, but struggled immediately. After just two races, Red Bull pulled him out for not being able to match Verstappen's pace.
- Yuki Tsunoda (2025–Present) – Fighting hard, showing effort, but the numbers don't lie. He currently holds less than 10% of Max's points, highlighting how brutal the second seat still is.

PRESSURE FROM ALL SIDES: THE PSYCHOLOGY OF BEING “NUMBER TWO”

Beyond the technical challenges, the second seat carries a unique psychological burden. Every lap every number on the telemetry is being compared with Max and the media amplifies the mistakes. The expectations of the team creates a

huge pressure to support the championship leader.

It's not that these drivers lack skill; it's that they are operating in an environment built around perfection from someone else.



THE BIG QUESTION: IS IT A CURSE OR JUST THE COST OF EXCELLENCE?

Red Bull's second seat isn't cursed, it's simply the result of building a machine so perfectly aligned to a single driver, the car is exceptional but it is exceptionally demanding.

In the end, the second seat represents a larger truth that extends far beyond Formula 1. Greatness, in any field, creates standards so sharp and precise that only those who perfectly fit the mold can excel. And sometimes, in the pursuit of perfection, space for others naturally narrows.

The moral is simple: excellence comes at a cost. A system built on one's characteristics can elevate that person to unimaginable heights, but can push the others down who step into the same space. Whether in sports, academics or the workplace, environments shaped around exceptional people demand adaptability, resilience, and a willingness to grow under pressure.

Breakfast at Tiffany's

Some films fade with time. Others linger—quietly alive, whispering to the present as if they were never meant to age. *Breakfast at Tiffany's* is firmly the latter: a romantic comedy that still hums with emotional electricity once the noise of decades is stripped away.

At its heart, this is an Audrey Hepburn masterpiece. What she achieves as Holly Golightly is not performance but embodiment. With the smallest glances and pauses, Hepburn reveals inner weather—she doesn't play Holly, she becomes her.

Often remembered for charm and whimsy, Holly is something heavier here: loneliness beneath glamour, fear behind independence. Hepburn preserves the ache at the core of Truman Capote's creation while transcending Hollywood's softer framing. Funny without frivolity, glamorous without emptiness, vulnerable without pleading—Holly feels real.

Visually, the film captures early-1960s New York as a tender dream, poised on the edge of change. Henry Mancini's "Moon River" drifts through it like memory, never instructing emotion, only confessing it.

Beneath the sparkle lies displacement and the fear of belonging. The final act may falter, but the emotional truth endures.



WHY DOES IT STILL MATTER?

Because some people shine not because they are light, but because they are fractured in a way that catches the sun. Holly Golightly is not a fantasy—she is a feeling. And Audrey Hepburn gives that feeling a face we still recognize.

This isn't nostalgia. It's endurance.

FINAL VERDICT

A flawed, dazzling classic—immortalized by Audrey Hepburn's soul-deep performance.

Watch it for the elegance. Remember it for the ache.

FIFA World Cup 2026

When Stories Matter More Than Fixtures

The FIFA World Cup 2026 feels less like a list of fixtures and more like a collision of stories. Long before tactics are debated or line-ups announced, this World Cup already carries emotional weight. It is not about which team plays which opponent on which day it is about legacies clashing, eras overlapping, and football standing at the edge of a generational shift. For fans, 2026 is not just a tournament; it is a narrative coming full circle.

At the heart of this story are Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi, the two figures who defined modern football. For nearly two decades, they reshaped what greatness looks like not just through talent, but through longevity, obsession, and relentless excellence. While Messi completed his World Cup destiny in 2022, the possibility that 2026 could be the final time fans see both legends on this stage adds an unmatched emotional pull. For Ronaldo in particular, this tournament represents a final chase, one last attempt to claim the only prize that still eludes him.

Portugal's journey into this World Cup mirrors that urgency. This is arguably the strongest Portuguese squad ever assembled, a golden generation overflowing with technical quality, athleticism, and tactical depth. For years, Portugal have looked capable of winning it all, yet have fallen just short. With Ronaldo nearing the end of his international career, 2026 feels like a moment of truth not just for a player, but for an entire generation determined to define its legacy.

Across the footballing world, 2026 also feels like a farewell tour for many icons who shaped this era. Neymar may be approaching his final World Cup, still chasing the trophy that would place him among Brazil's immortals. Luka Modrić, the symbol of Croatia's golden rise, could be offering his final lessons in midfield mastery. Alongside them stand players like Kevin De Bruyne, Antoine Griezmann, Robert Lewandowski, Thomas Müller, Virgil van Dijk, and Manuel Neuer players who defined a generation through leadership, intelligence, and consistency. For many of them, 2026 may be the final chapter on football's biggest stage.




What gives this World Cup its poetic balance is the presence of players who grew up watching Messi and Ronaldo and are now ready to inherit their spotlight. Kylian Mbappé already feels like a natural heir, a player built for moments, pressure, and global stages. Erling Haaland represents football's future in a different form: ruthless, powerful, and relentlessly efficient. Alongside them, stars like Jude Bellingham, Pedri, Vinícius Júnior, and Jamal Musiala symbolize the passing of the torch. This is the World Cup where the shadows of legends finally give way to new kings.

From a team perspective, the landscape is equally compelling. The Argentina national football team arrive as reigning champions, carrying belief rather than pressure, though age and endurance over an expanded tournament remain open questions. The France national football team looks terrifyingly complete stacked with depth, athleticism, and experience making them feel almost inevitable contenders. The England national football team continue to boast immense individual talent, yet persistent doubts about chemistry, mentality, and cohesion still linger when it matters most. Meanwhile, the Spain national football team represents a fascinating paradox: technically brilliant but inexperienced, fearless yet fragile, a team still learning how to survive the unforgiving nature of World Cup football.

The expanded 48-team format and hosting across the United States, Canada, and Mexico add another layer of unpredictability. Akshara


Akshara focuses on making learning lively and approachable, blending visuals, real-life examples, and simple tricks to build confidence, curiosity, and connection.

Vision


Vision guides students of classes 10 to 12 through science, commerce, and humanities, helping them explore subjects and make informed career choices.
