## Trethomas Bluebirds AFC fans can save lives by giving blood

Trethomas Bluebirds AFC is teaming up with the Welsh Blood Service to inspire football fans to roll up their sleeves and become lifesavers.

As the first ever official community partner of the Football Association of Wales' JD Cymru Leagues and Genero Adran Leagues, the Welsh Blood Service's 'Blood, Sweat and Cheers' campaign calls on football fans to consider how many lives they could save if they donate blood at one of the upcoming donation sessions in their area.

Approximately 350 donations of blood a day are required by Welsh hospitals and the Welsh Blood Service is calling on support from local fans to make a significant difference to thousands of patients' lives.

The Welsh Blood Service needs to collect around 100,000 blood donations each year from roughly 70,000 volunteer donors. This year the organisation is hoping its 'Blood, Sweat and Cheers' campaign will help it meet its wider goal to recruit more first time donors.

Blood and its by-products play a vital role in saving lives each day, with donations helping accident victims, patients having a kidney, liver or an organ transplant, pregnant women, leukaemia and cancer patients, someone about to undergo open heart surgery or premature babies in need of a vital blood transfusion.

It's easy for anyone aged between 17 and 66 to book to donate online and become a lifesaving donor. From start to finish, the donation process takes up to one hour, with the physical blood donation lasting only 5-10 minutes.

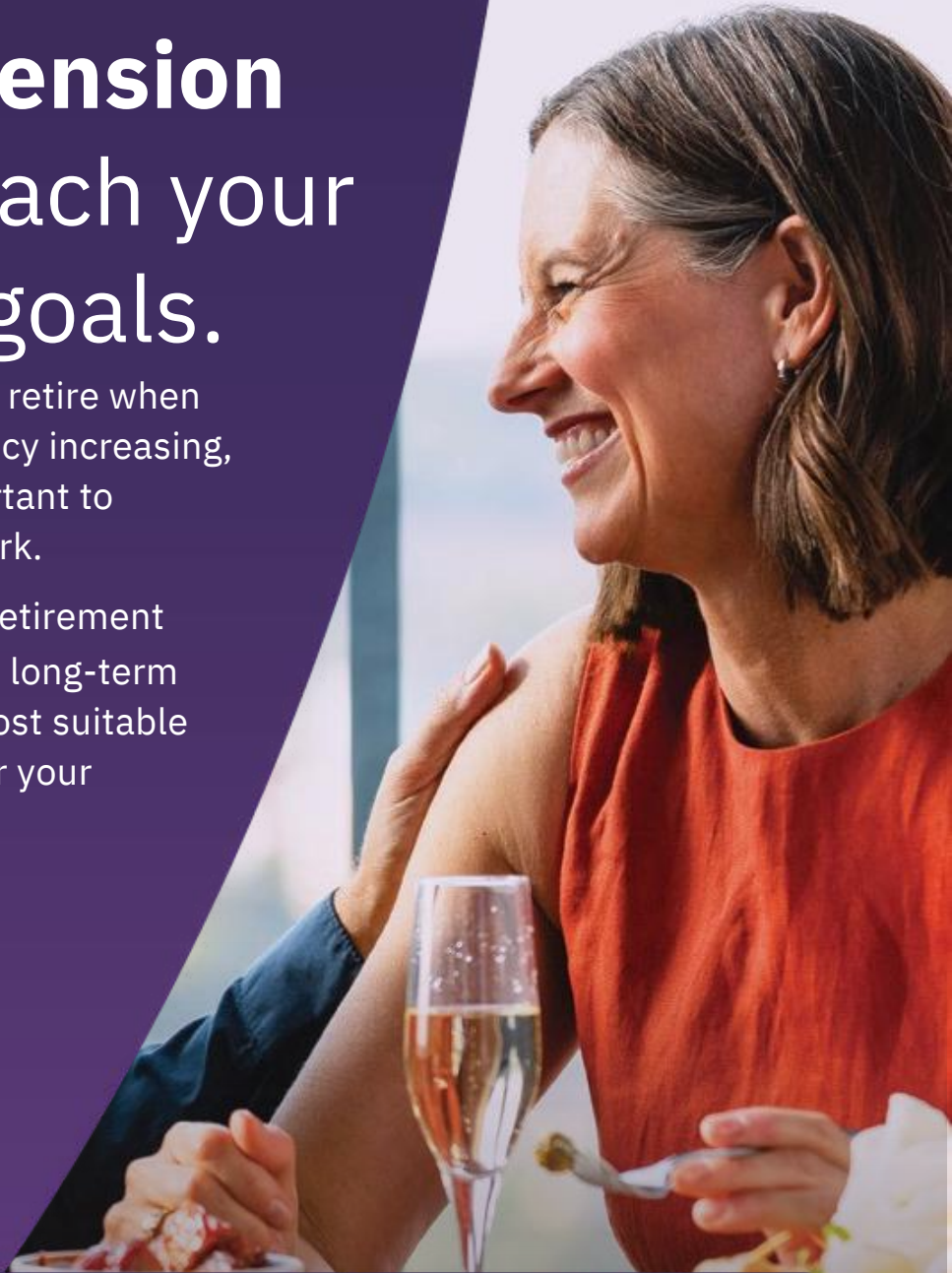

# Trethomas Bluebirds History

Formed in 1903, football began when a piece of land in the village was bought by a group of local miners. Workers at the Bedwas Colliery purchased land and Llanbafon Drive Playing Field was developed for recreation, including organised sport. This was to become the home of Trethomas Football for over 100 years.

The first records of Trethomas were in 1925-26 when the club played in Division 2 Section A of the Welsh League, finishing 11th with 12 wins and 6 draws out of 30 league games. Notable present-day local rivals also competed that season, Aberbargoed, Treharris and Abergavenny. The club continued to compete in this division, their best season in 1934-35, when Trethomas finished 3rd winning the Lady Lewis Cup and the Caerphilly Miners Hospital Cup.

Football resumed in Trethomas after the Second World War, with the club competing again in Division 2 Eastern Section in 1945-46. However, in 1947-48, the club struggled winning only 2 games out of 34 and conceded 157 goals, dropping out of the Welsh League, only to return in 2016.

In the intervening years, the club played local league football in the Monmouthshire League in the 1960s. However, by the year 2000 the club now known as Trethomas Bluebirds after club members looked for inspiration from Cardiff City, were playing in the Gwent County League.

Despite relegation to Division Three in 2002-03, the club bounced back to win promotion as Gwent County Division Three Champions in 2005-06. Promotion to Division One followed and the club were unlucky to finish as runners up in the 2012/13 season. The Bluebirds would not have to wait long though to return to Welsh League status as 3 years later the club were promoted to the Welsh Football League in 2015/16, as Gwent County Division One Champions.

The Welsh League return of Trethomas brought a 11th place finish with 11 wins in 30 league games. The club were now playing at Bedwas Rugby Club, having had to move to meet Welsh League criteria, before a move to the Centre of Sporting Excellence in Ystrad Mynach.

The club were now well placed for future promotion and this also resulted in the Bluebirds finishing 3rd in the newly named Welsh League Division Two, before the restructuring into the Ardal Leagues, where the Bluebirds played in the South East Division of Ardal Southern.

Cup success in the inaugural Ardal Leagues Southern Cup 2021/22 was followed by Amateur Trophy success in the 2023/2024 season. The momentum continued into the 2023/24 season which saw the club promoted as Champions and entry into Cymru South for the 2024/25 season, the second tier of Welsh football.

# Newport City FC History

Newport City FC was initially formed in 1963 as Spencer Works AFC and joined the Newport & District Football League. The club later entered the Gwent Premier League and was crowned champions during the 1970/71 and 1971/72 seasons and was then elected to the Welsh Football League for the 1972/73 season, where they have remained ever since.

The club spent the majority of the next twenty seasons in the middle division of the league and in 1988 changed its name from Spencer Works AFC to Llanwern AFC to reflect the change of name of the steelworks on whose ground they played.

This change coincided with a change in the club's fortunes where it gained promotion to Division One of the Welsh League in 1992/93. After this achievement, the club spent a number of years between the top two divisions and in 2002 won the Welsh League Cup.

In 2003, the club re-located to the Newport Stadium where they continue to play today. League reorganisation resulted in Llanwern AFC dropping down to Division Three in 2010/11 where it spent two mediocre seasons before once again achieving promotion back to Division Two for the 2014/15 season. The following season saw another name change for the club following FAW approval and it is here where Newport City FC was born.

During the summer of 2016, however, the club almost folded when the long serving Chairman and Secretary both retired until a new Chairman stepped in to keep the club going with a group of core players. The club brought in a new manager in Sam Houldsworth but despite building the side over the course of the season, Newport City FC were relegated to Division Three.

In 2017, a new committee was formed and a raft of new players were recruited to ensure Welsh Football League status and push for promotion back to Cymru South (old Division 2) which they achieved last season via the play offs.

The 2023/24 season also coincided with Newport City the winning the FAW Amateur Trophy after they defeated Penrhyncoch FC 5-4 in a thriller back in April 2024.

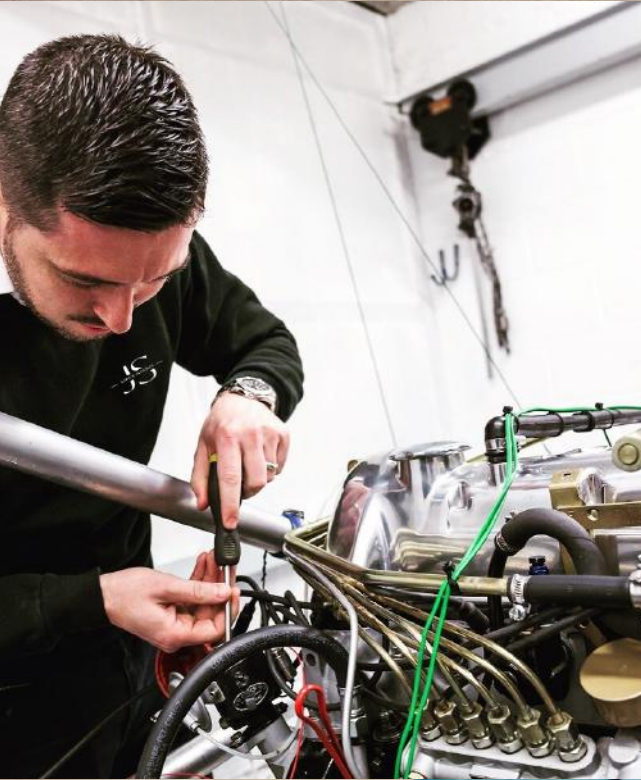

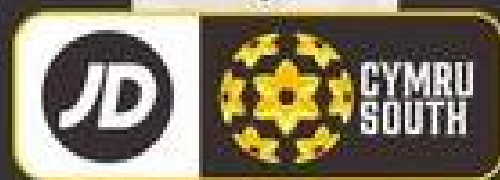

# Trethomas Bluebirds get back on track with victory over Afan Lido

Trethomas Bluebirds returned to winning ways on Friday night with a 3-2 victory over Afan Lido in the Cymru South. The Bluebirds were looking to get things back on track after a couple dropped points in recent games, and had a great chance to do so against a Lido side who were one from bottom with a new manager.

It proved a tricky one however, despite the visitors going down to ten men with 30 minutes to play. In the end though, a late Kallum Thomas strike made it 3-2, with Mark Dunford's side snatching all three points under the floodlights of the Centre for Sporting Excellence.

### Kick-off

Fifteen-minutes later than expected due to an official getting stuck in traffic, the game got underway. Two very contrasting game plans saw the Bluebirds parked high-up the pitch whilst their Port Talbot-based opposition sat in and soaked-up pressure.

The visitors found it difficult to apply any pressure however, with Trethomas passing it from side to side, probing for a gap in the defence. If anything, it was a case of too many options for Mark Dunford's men, it all became a little too cute at times with dinked balls over the top and players refusing to take a shot.

A move from striker Gareth Tedstone down the left was probably the best passage of play inside ten minutes. He spun his man before whipping a venomous cross into the back post where James Young couldn't get enough on it. When the ball did go back to the Bluebirds defenders, captain and midfielder James Saddler would sit in and control the game, whilst the centre backs split and fullbacks came inside, providing all sorts of options out wide and through the middle.

Despite their dominance, it was the visitors who had the first big chance of the game, when Joshua Webber was away down the left. In far too much space, Webber had time to pick-out the far corner, which he would have done, bar the outstretched glove of Harry Irving. A superb save. The Bluebirds number one could do little about the next chance from the resulting corner however. Unmarked, Connah Troy headed home from a few yards out and somehow it was 1-0 Lido. With just one win in their last six league matches, there was a fear the Trethomas heads would drop, as the visitors started to play with more belief and urgency.

One Lido player who was quickly sapped of any belief and hooked at half-time was Sean Hanbury; he was having a nightmare up against Jack Jones down the right who was turning him inside out. After a few failed crosses, Jones finally made the right pass having danced past two brilliantly before cutting back to Thomas Gameson in the box.

The midfielder couldn't miss, and found the far corner to make it 1-1 after 30 minutes.

There were still a few cracks appearing on the rare occasion Lido did manage to break. The gap between the Bluebirds defence and midfield was a bit stretched at times, leading to the visitors picking-up the ball between the lines.

Defender David Vincent always seemed to be in the right place to mop-up any potential threat however, not the quickest of players by any means, but reads the game as well as anyone.

Shortly before the half, Jones was once again testing Hanbury, who was beaten for the final time as the tricky winger found another cut back, this time to James Young on the edge of the box.

The midfielder had all day to pick his spot, which he did superbly into the top corner to make it 2-1 at the break.

## Second-half

Just when you expected Trethomas to kick-on and put this one to bed, the side one from bottom in the Cymru South tied the game up. A cross cleared only as far as captain Damon Thomas on the edge of the area was caught flush by the forward. Brushing off the fingertips of Irving, he could do nothing as was the power behind the ball; straight into the top corner.

Perhaps a little over confident after the goal, Lido committed a lot of men forward for a corner, which was cleared to the lively Jones near the halfway line.

Some lovely touches and a burst of pace saw him clear two men before reaching the box and preparing to shoot. On his backswing however, 16-year-old Kieran Jenkins caught him leaving referee Ieuan Lewis no choice but to send him off and award a spot kick.

Tedstone stepped-up after a fairly quiet game, still fresh off a hamstring injury.

It was a solid enough penalty into the bottom left corner, but keeper Ben Haines was more than equal to it. A strong glove kept his side in the game.

For the next 20 minutes or so, the contest became a hugely frustrating one for the fans, players, and coaches. Credit to Lido, they sat in well and made it extremely difficult, but it was a classic case of ten-man syndrome from Trethomas. Expecting more chances and space, everyone piled forward leading to defenders playing the attempted balls through as opposed to the midfielders who would normally be in that position.

It was only when the likes of Gameson and Young got a hold of it did the Bluebirds really start to put pressure on and open the game up. The addition of Kallum Thomas from the bench was a welcomed one. It was probably his best day so far in a Bluebirds shirt, which saw him make some great runs into the box. He was involved again when after what felt like an eternity of the ball bobbling around in the Lido box, it eventually came to Thomas on the edge. Putting his foot through it and aiming goal-bound was about all he could do with a sea of bodies in front of him, but it fizzed through everyone and found the net. A roar of relief more than anything was made by the 200 spectators on the night.

With less than ten minutes to go, Trethomas managed the game out fairly comfortably.

Young was still running around making every tackle. He'd be pick of the bunch if pushed for a man of the match. The whistle went and it was a feeling of 'job done'. A bounce-back victory which steadies the ship after a dip in form.

## Reaction

Bluebirds manager Mark Dunford spoke to Caerphilly Observer after the game and said: "I thought we were excellent in possession during the first-half and worked the patterns really well. "They got a goal on the break and unfortunately that's us at the moment. We keep conceding really poor goals.

"I just spoke to my assistant Adam Raymond and we said if you're conceding two every game, it's always going to be a tough gig."

On how his side played with a man advantage, Dunford said: "It's difficult. We've been on the other side and made it tricky for teams too. You've got to keep doing the right things and making the right decisions. I don't think it's a huge advantage to have an extra man, but we did change shape to look for the goal."

"I think Kallum Thomas' influence was immense, he was brilliant after coming on.

"In the end, we had the snap chance and put it away."

Finally, asked how big this win feels, Dunford said: "We needed this however it came. The three points are huge in putting us back on track.

"We've been playing alright but that doesn't always lead to results. We just need to stop leaking these silly goals and hopefully kick-on from here."

# Trethomas Bluebirds take Haverfordwest to penalties but bow out of Welsh Cup

Trethomas Bluebirds almost landed an historic double against Cymru Premier side Haverfordwest County, but fell just short in a penalty shootout.

The two sides have a surprising history, with Trethomas getting the better of County in a Welsh Cup game two years ago.

Despite their best efforts, Trethomas couldn't replicate the result when the pair met in Carmarthen on Saturday October 19 in the same competition.

Having survived for 90 minutes and had chances themselves to win it, the visitors just missed out and lost 5-3 on penalties.

## Kick-off

Missing no less than six starters through injury and suspension, Trethomas knew they would be in for a long afternoon against a side one division above them.

The first thing you noticed from the sideline was the sheer size of the County players. Set pieces were going to be a problem, made clear by a string of four corners for the hosts inside the opening few minutes.

One player who wasn't so tall but still had a huge impact was County fullback Rhys Abbruzzese. His touch and speed from a standing start was hard to match down the left. The Bluebirds still stuck to their guns in terms of getting high-up the pitch and pressing when they had the chance.

A good interception from Alfie Jones in midfield allowed the defender to break past two before crossing to Gareth Tedstone in the middle. The keeper got there just ahead of the striker however.

Clearly well prepared for the match ahead of them, the makeshift defensive unit and backup goalkeeper for the visitors were brilliant from minute one.

It wasn't just them who were putting a shift in though, Tedstone found himself making a tackle in the right-back position before threading a ball through to Jack Jones down the right in acres of space.

The winger cut the ball back across the box before it was cleared just wide of the post by a County defender.

Straight back up the other end though and it was the hosts who had the best chance of the match when Ricky Watts' pass through to Harri John split the Bluebirds defenders.

John looked certain to score, but put his effort narrowly wide to the relief of the Cymru South league leaders.

The game settled after this, with the Bluebirds coping well with any half threats posed by the hosts, which usually consisted of lobbed passes in behind the defence, regularly thumped away by the likes of Alfie Jones and Joseph Cashman.

Trethomas still had to ride their luck at times though, a clearance off the line by captain Ryan Bolter was crucial, before a follow-up shot by Abbruzzese clipped the bar.

The remainder of the half was fairly back and forth, with the Bluebirds having chances of their own through a couple of set pieces.

It was beginning to feel like one of those games where if the visitors could keep it at 0-0 and frustrate their Cymru Premier opposition, they could nick something at the end.

## **Second-half**

The Bluebirds started the second-half with plenty of energy despite having worked so hard in the first 45 minutes.

Their job was in theory made easier when County captain Dylan Rees was shown a second yellow after a strong tackle on Ethan Edwards.

Edwards looked out of it with a hip injury, but in the spirit of the day, he refused to be taken off and limped back onto the pitch.

Despite the red card, the flow of the game didn't really change. Haverfordwest were still fairly comfortable in possession but not in threatening areas, while the Bluebirds did their best to counter.

The back four were still holding-up superbly after 75 minutes, but the hosts were making it so easy for them with the attempted balls in behind, there must have been a handful of moments where they'd string together more than five passes in the final third.

With 80 minutes played it was Trethomas who looked more likely to grab a winner. Some lovely feet from midfielder Thomas Gameson eventually saw the ball shuffled wide to Jack Jones who cut back on his favoured left foot.

He couldn't quite get a clean shot away though and the defender slid in to block and clear. The chances kept coming; substitute Harvey Selway's snapshot down the right fizzed just wide of the near post.

The best chance of the match for Trethomas however fell to Edwards with just a few minutes remaining.

Receiving the ball in the box, he had time to pick his spot but was at full stretch. The winger could only manage a stab with the outside of his foot, which was saved brilliantly down low by Ifan Knott.

The game looked certain to head to penalties before another goal line scramble, this time in the Trethomas box, nearly meant heartbreak. It was cleared away for the final time by Bolter though and referee Jordan Harman blew his whistle.

## **Penalties**

Always a bit of a lottery, Haverfordwest were clinical from the spot. Player-coach Adam Raymond, Lee Baldock, and James Young all scored their goals, but a save to Kallum Thomas' effort meant the hosts survived a scare and progressed to the next round of the Welsh Cup. It was still a great occasion for the club as a whole, who brought along their U16s on the team bus up, alongside some Bluebirds faithfuls who all seemed to enjoy themselves.

Credit to the players and coaching staff for making a game of it however. If someone didn't know the two sides were a division apart, they wouldn't have been able to tell.

## **Reaction**

After the match, Caerphilly Observer spoke to Trethomas Bluebirds manager Mark Dunford. He said: "I thought we were excellent. We carried out the gameplan and the boys put everything into it.

"On a massive pitch against a tier one side who are second in the league, I thought we were outstanding and had a chance to pinch it at the end."

Asked about his defensive unit who worked tirelessly throughout the match, Dunford said: "It suited the personnel we put out there today and individually they were brilliant. It shows how much depth we have as a squad."

Dunford continued: "Across the board you'd have to say there wasn't much between the two sides today. I spoke to their manager (Tony Pennock) after the game and he said 'I don't want to ever have to play you guys again'."

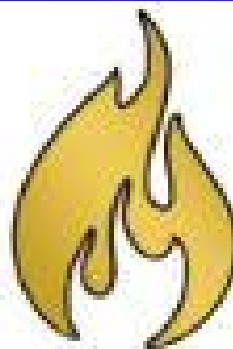

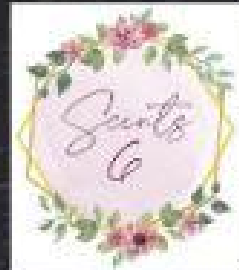

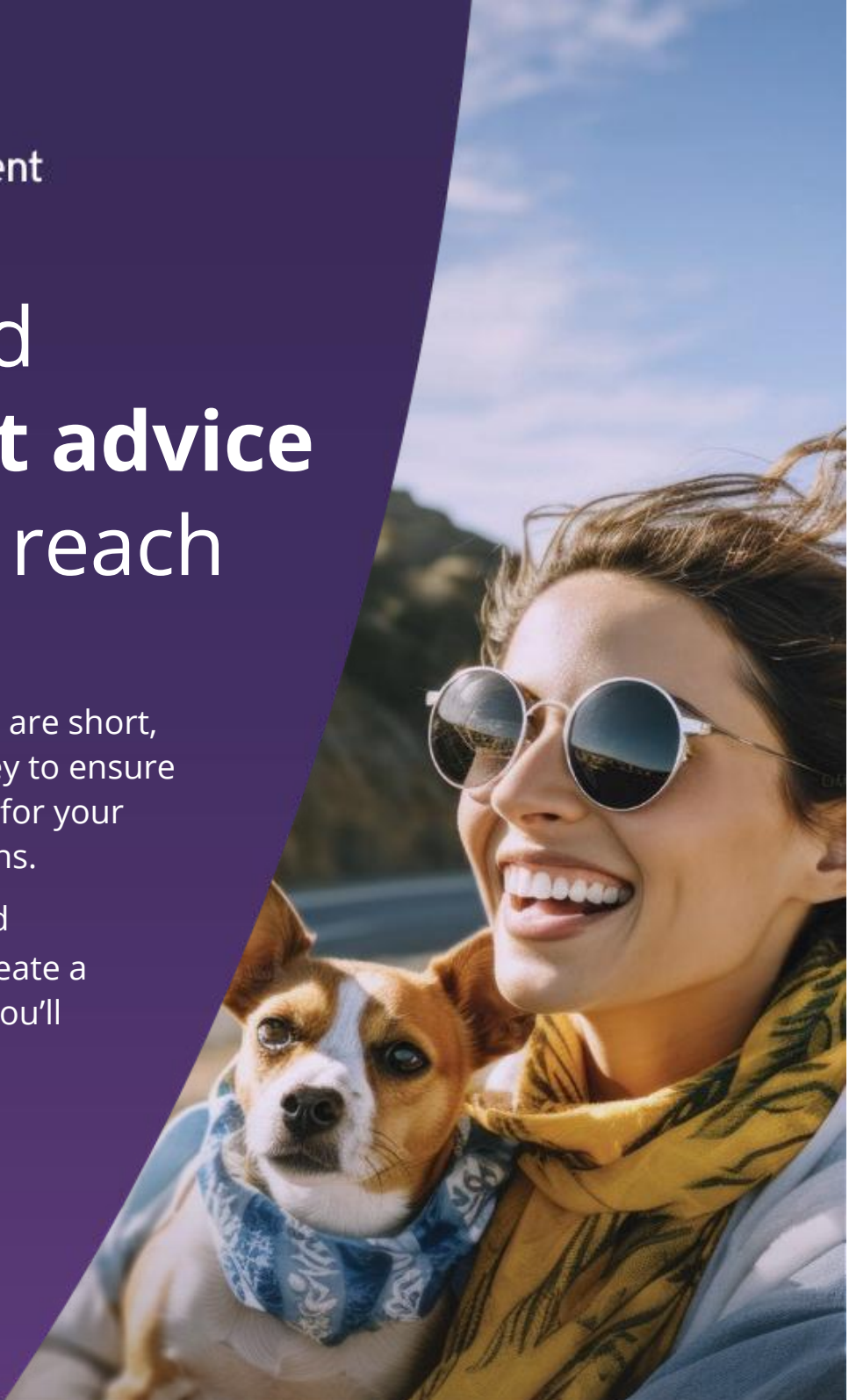
