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



THE CHRISTMAS TOY BAG

Do it Yourself

As practical as it is magical, this large drawstring bag is the perfect companion for organizing Christmas gifts. Personalizable with each child's name—a charming detail we love—it replaces scattered presents under the tree with a unique surprise to discover. Made in velvet or a playful Christmas print and tied with a pretty ribbon, this sewing project by Mondial Tissus is both decorative, functional, and fully customizable.





MATERIALS LIST

To make the toy bag, you will need:

- 60 cm of fabric for the exterior of the bag (velvet, cotton canvas, or calico)
- 60 cm of cotton canvas for the lining
- Embroidery thread
- Embroidery needle
- 50 cm of 15 mm wide velvet ribbon
- A spool of thread
- A pair of scissors
- Pins

1) THE PATTERN OUTLINE

On cutting paper, draw a rectangle measuring 57 x 42 cm. This piece will form the body of the bag.




2) CUTTING THE FABRIC

Cut the piece so that you have two pieces from the main fabric and two pieces from the lining.

3) MARKING THE NOTCHES

On the four pieces you just cut, mark notches on the top sides. Make a small 0.5 mm cut with scissors at 3 cm from the edge, and another at 4.5 cm from the edge.




4) ASSEMBLING THE BAG

Pin the bag with right sides together. Sew the sides and bottom of the bag 1 cm from the edge, leaving the area between the notches open. Backstitch at the beginning and end of the seams.

CREATION - DIY

5) ASSEMBLING THE LINING

Pin the lining with right sides together. Sew the sides and bottom of the bag 1 cm from the edge, leaving the area between the notches open and leaving a 6 cm opening at the bottom of the bag. Backstitch at the beginning and end of the seams.



6) L'ASSEMBLAGE DU SAC ET DE LA DOUBLURE

Place the bag and the lining right sides together, inserting the lining inside the bag.

6 bis Pin the top of the bag and lining with right sides together, and sew all around the top edge of the bag 1 cm from the edge.

6 bis2 Turn the bag right side out through the opening left in the lining. Topstitch 1 mm from the top edge of the bag, and close the lining opening with a topstitch.





7) MAKING THE DRAWSTRING CASING

Sew two parallel topstitches, 2 cm and 3.5 cm from the top of the bag, making sure that the openings left on the sides are positioned between the stitches. Backstitch at the beginning and end of each seam.

8) THREADING THE RIBBON THROUGH THE CASING

Hem the ends of the ribbon by folding them twice 1 cm towards the wrong side. Stitch on the right side 9 mm from the edge. Thread the ribbon through the casing all the way around.

Your toy bag is now ready: all that's left is to fill it with gifts and place it under the tree to make children's eyes light up on Christmas morning.

ON Jewels

Light at the Fingertips

Olga transforms the invisible into tangible forms, the sacred into pieces to wear or display. Through ON Jewels, she creates jewelry and decorative objects that blend myths, ex-votos, family heritage, and gratitude for everyday life. Her world, imbued with mystery and light, tells of faith in the gesture, the power of symbolism, and the magic of making with one's hands. A meeting with an artist for whom art is both a mission and a legacy.

Olga, your world seems steeped in mystery, light, and gratitude. You transform sacred symbols and intimate emotions into jewelry and decorative objects of rare sensitivity. How did this journey begin?

Olga: ON Jewels was born on a return flight from Mexico, high above the Atlantic Ocean. During the trip, I was inspired by the typical Mexican symbols and local craftsmanship, and I decided to give life to an idea I had carried within me for years: to create a brand for my creations and share them with the world. ON Jewels is a universe that speaks of gratitude, because creativity is a gift; it is steeped in mystery, because I don't fully understand the act of creation — I find it divine; and it is inherently light, because creating something from scratch brings light into my life and gives it deep meaning. It is almost a mission: to spread art.

Your family story is fascinating: one grandmother was a goldsmith, the other a painter... How did they shape your perspective on beauty and the creative process?

Olga: I must say that since birth, I've been in close contact with both of my grandmothers. The creative gesture has always been part of my life: as a child, I would make necklaces and paint, often using the tools from my goldsmith grandmother or the less precious stones from the family workshop, as well as the colors, canvases, and brushes of my painter grandmother. Both of them have a unique style, which helped sharpen my eye for beauty and the extraordinary in everyday things.





Ex-votos hold a unique place in your universe. What moves you about these offerings, so full of meaning and gratitude ?

Olga: I've always been drawn to this symbol, but when I discovered its meaning, I was truly enchanted. They are literally offerings made in gratitude for a promise kept, a blessing received. In Mexico, I was struck by how each one is different: every piece represents a personal request, a unique story. I decided that each of my creations would be made to honor the small daily blessings. So many things in our days seem taken for granted, when we should simply say thank you. That's what I keep in mind when I create.

What is your relationship with the sacred, with faith, or with that everyday magic that is reflected in your creations?

Olga: I love the sacred. As a child, I was fascinated by churches, and I still am. In southern Italy, there are so many magnificent churches... I love visiting them and drawing inspiration from them. I try to put all the faith I have into my creations: I want them to be tangible symbols of faith.

How does an ON Jewels creation come to life — from a sketch, an intuition, or a dream?

Olga: The unique thing is that I don't have a standard creative process — it's always different. I don't always make a preliminary sketch, and if I do, I often change it along the way.

What inspires you?

Olga: I draw my inspiration from the place where I live. My city, Reggio Calabria, overlooks the Strait of Messina. It is the cradle of Magna Graecia, a place steeped in history, myths, and legends. My family's goldsmith workshop is also a constant source of stimulation. I take a lot of energy from everything around me and try to transform it. And certainly, what inspires me most is traveling: after every journey, I feel creatively different.

Which materials do you enjoy working with, and how important is the hand — the gesture, the touch, the imperfection — in your creations?

Olga: I love acrylic colors for their texture, clay because from nothing, by shaping it, you create; I love beads, and above all, I enjoy being able to recycle and transform things into art. Among these tangible materials, what matters most is the thought guiding the hands and creating a sacred ritual. That's why I believe in touch: it transforms the material, and imperfection is proof of human creation — our signature.

Your works seem to vibrate with light. Which colors tend to appear most often in your universe?

Olga: I love pink: it is born from red —fire, passion—and white, which evokes peace, tranquility, and purity. I love this union. I wish everything were pink; the other colors are merely a complement.



Provence celebrates its Christmas traditions with great fervor. The Nativity holds special significance in this region of France and is celebrated with the joy of a thousand symbols. During Advent, the four weeks leading up to Christmas, the people of Provence prepare for the festivities. Each family decorates their home, sets up the nativity scene, and attends to the final preparations for the famous thirteen desserts.



The Scents of Christmas

Christmas in Provence is recognized as much by the nose as by the eye. Homes fill the air with characteristic scents: thyme, rosemary, pine, oranges studded with cloves, and sometimes cinnamon. These aromas, far from being mere embellishments, are an integral part of the décor. They create a warm, authentic, and sensory atmosphere. Hanging bouquets, ceramic fragrance burners, lavender sachets tucked between cushions... everything contributes to enveloping interiors in a Southern festive scent. Altogether, they form a unique olfactory signature, fresh, woody, and subtly sweet.

The Typical Colors and Materials of a Provençal Christmas

Provençal Christmas is distinguished by its warm, natural palette. Deep ochres and reds harmonize with olive greens, aged golds, and occasionally a touch of lavender blue. As for materials, everything exudes authenticity: terracotta, raw wood, glazed ceramics, linen, and aged iron. These textures create an atmosphere that is both rustic and refined, perfect for lovers of natural décor. In a modern home, just a few carefully chosen touches —a handcrafted pot, a washed linen tablecloth, or elements of driftwood—can evoke the Provençal aesthetic without overwhelming the space.

SOULEIADO

The Textile Soul of Provence

Founded in the 17th century, the Souleiado house is the emblem of traditional Provençal fabric. Its creations, blending colorful patterns with timeless elegance, adorn household linens, tablecloths, cushions, and accessories. A true symbol of the Provençal art of living, Souleiado preserves a unique artisanal craft, combining authenticity, color, and modernity while staying true to its regional roots.



Southern-Style Table Décor

The Christmas table in Provence is inseparable from the traditional gros souper, a symbolic meal served before midnight Mass. Its décor emphasizes elegant simplicity, where nothing is left to chance. Sainte-Barbe wheat, sprouted since December 4th, takes pride of place as a symbol of abundance. The popular saying accompanies it: "Quand lou blad vèn bèn, tout vèn bèn!" — When the wheat thrives, all is well! Well-sprouted wheat promises prosperity for the year ahead.

It is complemented by slender candlesticks, sprigs of rosemary or olive tucked between the plates, and glazed ceramics typical of southern France. Natural linen tablecloths and artisanal dishware add a contemporary touch. The colors remain soft: off-white, olive green, and subtle gold. Small lavender sachets or fragrant sprigs are often used as charming place markers.

Dried orange garlands add a natural, warm touch to Christmas décor. Their amber tones catch the light and release a delicate fragrance, evoking old traditions and the fruits of the sun. Combined with natural elements, they create an authentic, simple, and welcoming atmosphere, full of the charm of Christmases past.



Christmas Shaped by Artisans

At the heart of Provençal Christmas are the hands of artisans. Figurine makers, potters, ceramists, glassblowers, and creators of candles or textiles craft meaningful objects in every village, carrying tradition and memory. Heirs to skills passed down through generations, they bring to life nativity scenes, ceramics, votive lights, tablecloths, and unique décor. Each authentic, enduring piece tells a story and breathes the true spirit of Christmas in Provence into the home.




The Provençal Nativity and Santons: An Emblematic Decorative Art

Born during the French Revolution, when churches were closed and nativity scenes were banned, santons—from the Provençal santoun, meaning “little saint”—emerged as a way to recreate the Nativity at home. The people of Provence began crafting small clay figurines representing not only biblical characters but also village folk: the miller, the fisherman, the baker, the tambourine player... These miniature scenes depicted daily life as much as sacred history.

Over the centuries, this popular art became a true craft passed down through generations, making santons a strong symbol of Provençal identity and an essential part of Christmas décor in the region. A Provençal Christmas would be unimaginable without the nativity scene. This miniature tableau is much more than a religious element: it is a decorative universe where traditional trades, charming characters, and Provençal landscapes come together.

Handcrafted from clay, santons are genuine works of art. Their charm lies in the painted details: a basket of lavender, a piece of checked fabric, a straw hat... Each santonnier adds a personal touch, making each piece a collectible item and a legacy to be passed down.





Santons of Provence

The Living Art of Traditions

The tradition of Provençal santons dates back to the early 19th century, but among the workshops still active today, Ateliers Marcel Carbonel is one of the oldest and most emblematic houses producing handcrafted Provençal santons. Founded in Marseille in 1935, this family business has been creating clay santons for over four generations, maintaining an exceptional collection and traditional craftsmanship still practiced on-site. Another historic workshop is Maison Fouque, founded in 1934 in Aix-en-Provence, also renowned for its handmade santons and long-standing family tradition. A glimpse into these two timeless and exceptional houses.


LES ATELIERS MARCEL CARBONEL

Founded in Marseille in 1935, Maison Marcel Carbonel is one of the oldest workshops still active in the creation of Provençal santons. For nearly 90 years, the Ateliers Carbonel have preserved traditional Marseille craftsmanship, hand-shaping and painting santons and nativity accessories, keeping the living traditions of Provence alive.

Located in the Saint-Victor district at 47 Rue Neuve Sainte-Catherine, the workshops remain faithful to ancestral techniques: from molding to firing and decorating, each step is carried out on-site by artisans trained within the house itself.

The workshops open to visitors from Monday to Thursday, by appointment only, offering a privileged immersion into this unique craft.



In 2007, Maison Marcel Carbonel was awarded the Entreprise du Patrimoine Vivant label, an official distinction recognizing excellence in French artisanal craftsmanship.


LA MAISON FOUQUE

Today, Emmanuel Fouque, creator and sculptor, designs and shapes the new creations, continuing the pursuit of excellence that has defined the brand since its inception. Renowned for the quality of its craftsmanship, the workshop has been awarded the Entreprise du Patrimoine Vivant (EPV) label—a well-deserved recognition for a house where every santon is far more than a figurine: it is a living piece of Provençal heritage.


WHEN PROVENCE TAKES CENTER STAGE

The 13 Desserts


The Provençal Christmas Culinary Ritual

The 13 desserts, or “Li trege dessèr” in Provençal, represent one of the most delicious traditions of Aix-en-Provence Christmases. According to custom, each guest must taste a bit of every sweet to ensure happiness and prosperity throughout the year. This indulgent ritual—a procession of thirteen sweet dishes, symbolizing Christ and his twelve apostles—concludes the festive meal as a generous and authentically Provençal tableau.

Olive oil cake, dried fruits, white and black nougats, figs, dates, calissons, candied fruits... Each dish brings its own color, texture, and story. In décor, the presentation plays a key role: wooden trays, faience bowls, shelves, and artisanal glassware. Together, they create a winter buffet that is as visually appealing as it is delicious. The 13 desserts thus become a visual ritual: an edible tableau embodying Provençal generosity.

Depending on the village and the family, some desserts may vary: some include clementines, fresh figs, white or black nougat, or homemade fruit pastes. The exact selection can differ, but the most classic items are:






La Maison Roy René

A Century of Provençal Sweets

In Aix-en-Provence, Confiserie du Roy René has been one of the region's culinary gems since its founding in 1920 by artisan Ernest Guillet. Here comes to life one of Provence's most iconic treats: the calisson of Aix, a sweet jewel made from a centuries-old recipe combining finely ground almonds, candied Provençal melon, and orange peel, all placed on a thin wafer and covered with delicate royal icing.

Over the generations, Maison Roy René has successfully combined tradition and modernity. Today, it accounts for nearly 70% of Aix calisson production and welcomes visitors and food lovers to its factory, located amidst an almond grove.

A local anecdote recalls that this sweet is said to have originated in the 15th century for the wedding of King René, whose confectioner supposedly served these little "hugs" to the new queen, hence the Provençal name "di calin soun" — literally "these are hugs".

In addition to classic calissons, the house also offers creative variations and exceptional collections that continue to delight the taste buds. A visit to the Calisson Museum allows visitors to explore the fascinating history and the secrets behind the making of this confection, which has become a symbol of Provençal heritage.





Ingredients:

- 24 shrimp
- 1 small mango
- 2 avocados
- $\frac{1}{2}$ bunch of cilantro
- 1 lime
- Salt and pepper

Preparation :

1. Peel the shrimp. Dice half of them into small pieces, keeping the rest whole for garnish. Peel and remove the pits from the mango and avocados. Cut the flesh of the mango and avocados into small cubes. Finely chop the cilantro. Squeeze the juice of the lime.
2. In a mixing bowl, combine the diced shrimp, avocado, mango, cilantro, and lime juice. Season with salt and pepper and mix well.
3. Serve in small glasses and garnish each with a whole peeled shrimp.

Oyster Tartare with Anise ★ and Pickled Radishes ★

Ingredients :

- 16 oysters
- 1 tbsp anise seeds
- A few sprigs of chervil
- Pepper


For the pickled radishes :

- 12 pink radishes
- 6 cl white balsamic vinegar
- 40 g sugar

Preparation :

1. The day before, cut the radishes into small cubes. Bring the vinegar and sugar to a boil for 5 minutes, then let it cool. Add the radishes and refrigerate for at least one night until ready to serve.
2. On the day of serving, shuck the oysters and discard the first liquid. Detach the oysters from their shells and cut them into small cubes.
3. Place the oyster tartare back into the shells. Add 1 tsp of pickled radishes with a little of the pickling juice to each oyster. Sprinkle with anise seeds and chervil sprigs. Season with pepper.

Ingredients :

- 400 g pork shoulder
- 400 g beef chuck
- 400 g lamb shoulder
- 75 cl dry white wine (Riesling)
- 2 leeks
- 4 carrots
- 1 onion
- 1 bay leaf
- 2 juniper berries
- 2 cloves
- 2 kg potatoes
- 100 g flour + water
- Salt and pepper

Note : This dish is often served for Christmas Eve dinner, as it can be prepared the day before and cooks slowly in the oven. It is therefore very convenient to make when hosting guests.

Preparation :

1. The day before, cut the meat into large cubes. Marinate it in the white wine with the sliced white parts of the leeks, and the peeled carrots and onion cut into rounds. Add the bay leaf, juniper berries, and cloves, and season with salt and pepper. Cover with cling film and let rest in the refrigerator for 24 hours.
2. On the day of cooking, peel the potatoes and cut them into fairly thin slices.
3. Fill a terrine by alternating layers: start with a layer of potatoes. Season with salt and pepper, then add the drained meat and vegetables. Finish with a final layer of potatoes.
4. Adjust the seasoning. Pour the marinade wine through a fine sieve. Close the lid.
5. Preheat the oven to 140 °C (280 °F / Gas mark 4-5).
6. In a small bowl, mix the flour with a little water until you obtain an elastic dough. Place this dough around the terrine lid to form a seal, preventing steam from escaping.
7. Bake the baeckeoffe in the oven for 3 hours. Serve immediately.

FROZEN NOUGAT WITH ★ DRIED FRUITS ★

Ingredients :

- 75 g pistachios
- 150 g almonds
- 100 g honey
- 3 eggs
- 120 g sugar
- 40 cl very cold heavy cream

Preparation :

1. Toast the nuts in a dry pan for 1 minute, stirring constantly. Roughly chop them with a knife.
2. Heat the honey.
3. Separate the egg whites from the yolks. Whip the egg whites until stiff, then gradually pour in the hot honey in a thin stream while continuing to whisk.
4. Whisk the egg yolks with the sugar, then fold in the meringued egg whites.
5. Whip the heavy cream into soft peaks, then gently fold it into the mixture. Add the chopped nuts and mix carefully.
6. Pour the mixture into a loaf pan lined with cling film and freeze for 8 to 12 hours. Then unmold the nougat onto a serving platter and serve.

Ingredients :

- 250 g flour
- 150 ml lukewarm water
- 1 tsp dry yeast
- 1 tsp sugar
- 1 tsp salt
- 20 g melted butter
- Coarse salt or fleur de sel

For the boiling step :

- 1 L water
- 1 tbsp baking soda

For the finishing touch :

- 150 g dark chocolate
- Sesame seeds, crushed pistachios, and grated coconut

Preparation :

1. In a mixing bowl, combine the water, sugar, and yeast. Let rest for 10 minutes. Add the flour, salt, and melted butter. Knead for 5 minutes and let the dough rise for 1 hour. Shape the dough into small logs, then form the mini pretzels.
2. For the boiling step, bring the water and baking soda to a simmer. Immerse each pretzel for 30 seconds, then remove and drain.
4. Place the pretzels on a baking sheet. Sprinkle with a little salt and bake for 15 minutes at 200°C (392°F).
5. Melt the chocolate and dip each pretzel into it. Then roll in sesame seeds, crushed pistachios, or grated coconut, and let set before enjoying.

• LINZER TORTE •

Ingredients :

- 150 g whole almond powder
- 200 g flour
- 110 g brown sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp gingerbread spice mix
- Zest of 1 lime
- 50 g dark chocolate
- 1 egg
- 150 g salted butter
- 300 g homemade raspberry jam

Preparation :

1. Toast the almond powder for a few minutes in a pan, then mix it with the flour. Add the sugar, cinnamon, gingerbread spice mix, lime zest, and coarsely grated dark chocolate (do not melt). Combine everything in a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, then add the egg and the butter in pieces, mixing until the dough forms a smooth ball. Wrap the dough in cling film and refrigerate for 1 hour.
2. Preheat the oven to 180°C (356°F / Gas mark 6).
3. Roll out two-thirds of the dough on a large sheet of parchment paper, then transfer it into a tart pan. Prick the dough with a fork, then spread the jam evenly over the base.
4. Roll out the remaining dough on a floured surface and cut into strips using a fluted pastry wheel. Arrange the strips in a lattice pattern over the jam and bake for 30 minutes.
5. Remove the tart from the oven and let it cool. Cut it into small portions and enjoy slowly for a moment of pure delight.

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
