

There are more than 1,621 children who experience homelessness in Davis County, 300 of whom are high school students. These children often experience inadequate and unstable living conditions such as couch surfing or living in cars, abandoned buildings or storage units. Many are on their own, with school acting as the only place they can get food and safety from the elements.

In an effort to keep these students in school and equip them with lifelong skills that prevent chronic homelessness, Davis Education Foundation is constructing centers that address their basic needs. Built inside Davis School District high schools, teen centers provide students in need with a safe place to shower, launder clothing, make a hot meal, access a quiet study area and connect to vital education and community resources.

If services, advocates and resources are available, lives can be changed and futures made possible for the most vulnerable population of students.



Teen Residential Center

COMING SOON

The Teen Residential Center will be a supportive and supervised environment that offers food, shelter, clothing and emotional and mental resources to teens. It will offer temporary housing to displaced students in crisis.

Goal

The goal of the Teen Residential Center is to keep students in school while equipping them with life-long skills as they transition to adulthood. This is an upstream effort to prevent intergenerational poverty and chronic cycles of homelessness. The philosophy of the center is one of opportunity with accountability through self-empowerment.



FAST FACTS

- The center will be operated by a third-party nonprofit organization with Davis School District, Layton City and Davis County acting as coordinating partners in accessing key community resources.
- Funding for the construction and operations of the center will come from public/private partnership, individual and corporate donors and grant funding.
- Secondary students who want to access the center must complete a referral process and meet certain requirements for placement and continued eligibility.
- Students can access various services such as school district student services, Davis County social services, post-secondary and employment preparation, life skills training, basic necessities and student mentors and advocates.

Miller & Huntsman \$1 Million Donation

In 2021, the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation and the Huntsman Foundation made a joint donation of \$1 million to help construct five of the teen resource centers in Davis School District. Their generosity provided the momentum needed to quickly expand critical resources to more at-risk students in Davis. The involvement of both the Miller Family Foundation and the Huntsman Foundation also helped push this work to the state level, creating a crucial public/private partnership. Thanks to their support and Representative Steve Eliason, lawmakers approved \$3.5 million in funding for teen resource centers in Utah during the 2022 legislative session.

MCKINNEY-VENTO PROGRAM

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act is the federal legislation for the education of children and youth experiencing homelessness. Davis Education Foundation is responsible for utilizing and running this program within Davis School District to assist students and families that are experiencing displacement or homelessness. The goal of this program and the Foundation is to remove barriers for these students by providing them with the resources and assistance they need to stay in school and succeed.



1,621 McKinney-Vento Students in DSD

To qualify for the McKinney-Vento Program, students must lack access to housing that is:

- Fixed
- Regular
- Adequate

There are more than 1,600 students who are classified as homeless in DSD based on these qualifications.

Success Coaches

Starting in 2021, Success Coaches were hired to assist McKinney-Vento students in every high school. These mentors meet one-on-one with each McKinney-Vento student to help them get on track to graduate. Their assistance includes creating academic plans, helping with homework and make-up packets, applying for scholarships and colleges and serving as a touch-point for access to basic essentials and resources.

"Every year we hear stories of hardship and triumph as these students strive to break barriers of homelessness and poverty. One such story this year was of a student who was not on track for graduation and had a lot of credit to make up. We paired him with one of our success coaches and teen center coordinators and with their help was able to get him to graduation. He disclosed that he would be a first generation high school graduate! His family was so proud of him that they decided to save all they could for a cap and gown so that they could celebrate his major accomplishment. Once the family was told that his cap and gown was covered by our program they switched their plan and were able to throw him a graduation party with the money. Every year we come across talented, amazing, hard working students that need a little cheering on and guidance to help them get to graduation."

Watkins Hardship Grant

STUDENT RESOURCES

Teen Center Summer Hours

Students experiencing homelessness and other hardships can continue utilizing their school's teen resource center during the summer. The centers are open to students in need for laundry, showers, food and additional resources. Summer hours at the teen centers are sponsored by Young Powersports.

Ascent Program

The Ascent Program provides funding for credit recovery, graduation fees, college applications, school supplies and more for secondary students facing financial instability. This resource has proven to be crucial for the academic success of many students in need.

Bridge Program

The Bridge Program provides funding for career training, program tuition and fees for students in crisis who are not able to finish their coursework before they graduate. This eliminates the burden of out-of-pocket expenses for financially disadvantaged students and allows them to finish the programs and move forward.





CHILD SPREE

Child Spree provides elementary students in need with new clothing essentials to start the school year. Volunteers have \$150 to shop for their assigned student at Kohl's. The clothes are then delivered to each school for student pickup the following week. The numbers below reflect totals for the 2021 and 2022 Child Spree combined.

The Kids' Closet program provides clothing essentials throughout the year for students in need. Teachers, counselors and principals submit Kids' Closet requests for students they identify in their school with clothing needs.

The picture to the left was taken by an elementary principal. A first-grader approached the principal and asked if she could help fix her shoes. Thanks to Kids' Closet, the principal was able to quickly purchase the student a new pair of shoes.



Hygiene Kits

Students experiencing homelessness and other crisis often lack access to basic essentials. The community has stepped up in monumental ways to ensure that these students have what they need for day-to-day living. Hygiene kits and feminine hygiene kits are assembled and then kept at the Foundation warehouse before being distributed to every school and teen center in the district.

No Hunger Zone

\$39,377 In Community Donations 2021-2023

Food insecurity affects more than **17,000** children in Davis School District. The No Hunger Zone initiative raises funds to provide each school with access to food vouchers, principal pantries, individual pantry packs and emergency food boxes. **Schools with a community pantry stocked by No Hunger Zone include Clearfield High, Layton High, Northridge High and Mountain High.**

207,550 Pantry Packs Distributed 2021-2023

In partnership with Bountiful Food Pantry and other community donors, pantry packs are assembled and distributed to schools each week. These packs are intended to provide food-insecure students with meals for the weekend when they are not at school. 
Gift cards to quick service restaurants are distributed to at-risk students who may not have access to food over weekends or school breaks.



UNIFIED SPORTS

Unified Sports is an inclusive high school sports program facilitated by Special Olympics Utah. The program combines a proportionate number of Special Olympics Utah athletes (individuals with intellectual disabilities) and partners (individuals without intellectual disabilities) on teams for training and competition. Teammates are similar in age and ability to foster meaningful involvement in the game and build friendships that extend beyond the game.

The Foundation partnered with Utah First Lady Abby Cox and her "Show Up" initiative to bring Unified Sports to Davis School District on a larger scale. Davis was the first district in the state to do so, starting in 2021.

INNOVATIVE GRANTS

As a way to encourage innovative and creative instructional programs, schools and departments in the district can apply for specific project-based funding up to \$5,000. Innovative Grants play a vital role in elevating academic experiences for students while preparing them to compete in a global economy.

The ornithology program at Farmington High used an innovative grant, along with matching community funds, to set up an aviary for its birds. This school aviary is one of the first of its kind in the country. Its four exhibits house birds such as Fischer Lovebirds, Grasseets, and South American Macaws. Every bird in the aviary is a rescue.

Meadowbrook Elementary doubled their number of Vex Robotics teams, allowing more students to compete. The school also created an after-school program for students in younger grades to help them prepare to be on robotics teams later on. Additionally, Meadowbrook purchased new robots for all grades to use in computer technology class.



The orchestra program at Legacy Jr. High only had four violins and no small violas for students to rent. The school used an innovative grant to purchase high quality Eastman String instruments so that more students have an opportunity to continue on to higher levels in their orchestra studies, without having to own or purchase their own instrument.

The Catalyst Center Outdoor Concert provided the opportunity for audio and video students to run a live concert with a professional band. Students were able to work with industry professionals and set up the stage, sound equipment and emcee the concert. Students gained valuable professional connections, demonstrated their skill sets, and experienced unparalleled personal growth.




