In 2023, HELMEPA reached new heights, setting records across all programs: maritime training, beach and underwater clean ups, educational initiatives in schools, youth engagement in the blue economy, prestigious awards and recognition, impactful decarbonization projects, volunteer participation, and membership growth.

HELMEPA Academy, honored with the Lloyd's List Greek Shipping Awards 2023, has become a leader in lifelong learning, reaching thousands of people across the maritime world, from seafarers and industry professionals to young scientists and even our youngest members.

With a high-quality roster of over 80 experts, all volunteers committed to sharing knowledge, the Academy covers 75+ maritime subjects and has expanded its impact globally. It has trained over 30,000 maritime professionals, Hellenic Navy and Coast Guard officers, and international crews, continuously increasing record participation.

Nowhere else in the world does a community share knowledge like this, moving forward together.

Our flagship METAVASEA project, recognized at COP28 for driving the green transition in the Eastern Mediterranean, puts people at the heart of maritime decarbonization. As the shipping industry faces the ambitious goal of achieving net-zero GHG emissions by 2050 under the revised IMO strategy, HELMEPA leads the way through INTERMEPA, uniting maritime stakeholders and supply chain participants. Together, we are advancing decarbonization efforts and promoting the UN Sustainable Development Goals, fostering synergy and collaboration to overcome challenges and drive meaningful progress.

Our environmental efforts reached remarkable milestones, with record participation in beach and underwater clean ups. We proudly adopted the former PIKPA beach, creating inclusive opportunities for children with disabilities to access and enjoy the sea. This initiative also launched our Marine Litter Monitoring Program, encouraging members to go beyond experiential clean ups by systematically monitoring beaches and following established protocols for volunteerism and citizen science.

Despite all this activity—and I have only mentioned a few—the hardworking and efficient Secretariat successfully undertook the demanding relocation to new offices after 22 years, bringing the team together in an open layout that fosters a more collaborative atmosphere. Throughout the transition, they ensured that our activities continued at the highest standard, with no delays. We are very proud of our team.

The new 2023-2024 program titled "Skills Development and Growth Mindset for Enhanced Maritime Safety Culture in the Era of Decarbonization, Green & Digital Transition," conducted by HELMEPA's certified Maritime Training Center, is a dynamic, multi-disciplinary, and highly participatory learning platform for seafarers and maritime professionals.

In 2023, a total of 31 webinars and labs of a total duration of 43 days (156 hours of training) were held, attended by 3,484 Merchant Navy (EN) bridge and engine officers of 12 different nationalities, Navy and Coast Guard officers, maritime executives, students of Merchant Marine Academies and HELMEPA scholarship holders.



Emphasizing the importance of the International Maritime Organization (IMO) World Maritime Day 2023 Message "MARPOL at 50 – Our Commitment Goes On," HELMEPA has been presenting a unique practical retraining program for 41 years. This initiative promotes voluntary knowledge sharing, lessons learned, and best practices for the collective benefit of its members, which include 349 companies and organizations in Greece and abroad, as well as over 14,200+ seafarers and maritime professionals.

It is important to ensure that seafarers are a priority in the green transition and for this to happen they need to be properly trained and reskilled, including technical and soft skills such as critical thinking and decision-making, teamwork, resilience, leadership, communication and adaptability, thus acquiring a growth mindset.

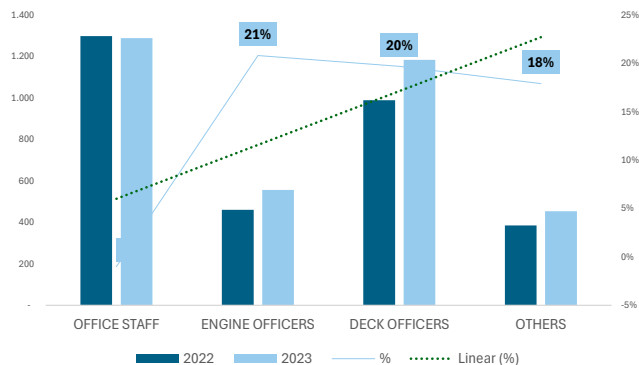

The most attended seminars focused on seafarers' welfare, ship preparation for PSC inspections, and MARPOL issues, while sessions on maritime decarbonization, safety leadership, and shipboard electrical-electronic-mechanical engineers SEMOs were rated as the most useful for shipboard and office operations. The use of interactive tools like polls increased attendee engagement by 50%.

cruise, port management, and marina management. This team effort, supported by HELMEPA's volunteer network, raises awareness of career opportunities in the Blue Economy.

CULTIVATING SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT LITERACY

ESG ABC TO SDGs

HELMEPA's in-house developed "ABCs to SDGs" lab has been running for the second consecutive year, aiming to foster a culture of sustainable development literacy. Through a combination of 6 in-company workshops and 2 in-house workshops, a total of 90 participants engaged in learning about the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and their importance for meeting today's needs without compromising future generations.

These workshops build a shared understanding of sustainability, ensuring that all participants are equipped to engage with the SDGs at some level.

- 52%** of participants didn't know the 17 UN goals beforehand
- 93%** rated the workshops' usefulness as "very good" to "excellent"
- 78%** felt the workshops met their initial expectations
- 88%** understood that Sustainable Development is about meeting current needs while preserving the ability of future generations to meet theirs

NAUTIS 3: UPGRADED BRIDGE SIMULATOR FOR REALISTIC TRAINING AND ASSESSMENTS

In 2023, HELMEPA's upgraded NAUTIS 3 bridge simulator provided highly realistic training to over 166 deck officers and 123 cadets and students of Merchant Marine Academies, universities, and private schools. With enhanced graphics and vessel handling capabilities, the simulator covered a wide range of maritime skills, including navigation, planning and executing transits, ship handling and maneuvering, collision and avoidance regulations, narrow water navigation, mooring and tug assistance, and crucial Search and Rescue (SAR) and Man Overboard (MOB) operations.

The upgraded NAUTIS 3 simulator also enables detailed performance assessments, allowing companies to evaluate and prepare their officers for promotions and leadership roles. All participants received HELMEPA Certificates of Attendance, making this a powerful tool for both skill development and career progression.



HELMEPA's NAUTIS Full Mission Bridge Simulator, manufactured by VSTEP, operates since 2016 in the Association's Maritime Training Centre, following kind donation by member-company DNV. In 2022 the bridge simulator was upgraded with kind donations by member-companies Drylog, Gaslog and Hellenic Mutual War Risks Association.

Based on the IMO Model Course 1.22 and approved by the Cyprus Maritime Authority, consists of 19 topics developed in a total of 40 hours (20 hours of presentations and 20 hours of practical training).

HS2 ADVANCED SHIP HANDLING & NAVIGATIONAL SAFETY (3 days)

7 hours of presentations and 14 hours of practical training.

HS3 NAVIGATING IN DENSE TRAFFIC - FISHING AREAS - COLREGS & LOSS PREVENTION (2 days)

6 hours of presentations and 8 hours of practical training.

HS4 REAL INCIDENT SIMULATION & ROOT CAUSE ANALYSIS (2 days)

Present, simulate and analyse real maritime incidents of members and others from official sources such as MAIB, CHIRP, MARS etc.

A COLLECTIVE INITIATIVE FOR MARITIME DECARBONIZATION AND SUSTAINABILITY

The METAVASEA initiative, led by HELMEPA and funded by the Lloyd's Register Foundation (LRF), aims to train and re-skill 1,500 seafarers, port workers, and maritime professionals in the Eastern Mediterranean

The initiative focuses on the decarbonization of shipping, new fuels, developing a safety culture on ships and in ports, adaptation to the digital age, and environmental leadership. In addition, METAVASEA aims to raise climate change awareness among 2 million people, including over 10,000 students and 750 teachers, across the region.

The project's key partners include Lloyd's Register, the World Maritime University of IMO (WMU), CYMEPA, the Cyprus Maritime and Marine Institute (CMMI), Premium Consulting, and the Mediterranean Information Office for Environment, Culture and Sustainable Development (MIO-ECSDE).



Collaborating partners include the Athina Maritime Learning and Development Center of Minerva Dry Inc, the Hellenic Chamber of Shipping (N.E.E.), the Panhellenic Association of Merchant Marine Captains (PEPEN), the Union of Greek Ports (ELIME), the Port Authorities of Elefsina, Heraklion, and Thessaloniki, INTERMEPA, Nautical Chronicles (GRATIA Publishing), KNOWL Social Enterprise for Lifelong Learning, ORIANI, and WISTA Hellas.

With 61 shipping companies and public and private organizations already committed to the project, METAVASEA is generating significant interest and support in the region.

The initiative evaluates the preparedness of shipping and coastal communities for the transition to new fuels, identifies gaps and opportunities, and raises awareness of maritime safety and environmental protection.

COP28 Global Environmental Summit in Dubai recognized the METAVASEA project as one of the 50 most important initiatives under the Green Shipping Challenge for the decarbonization of shipping, included at the initiative of the U.S. Department of State

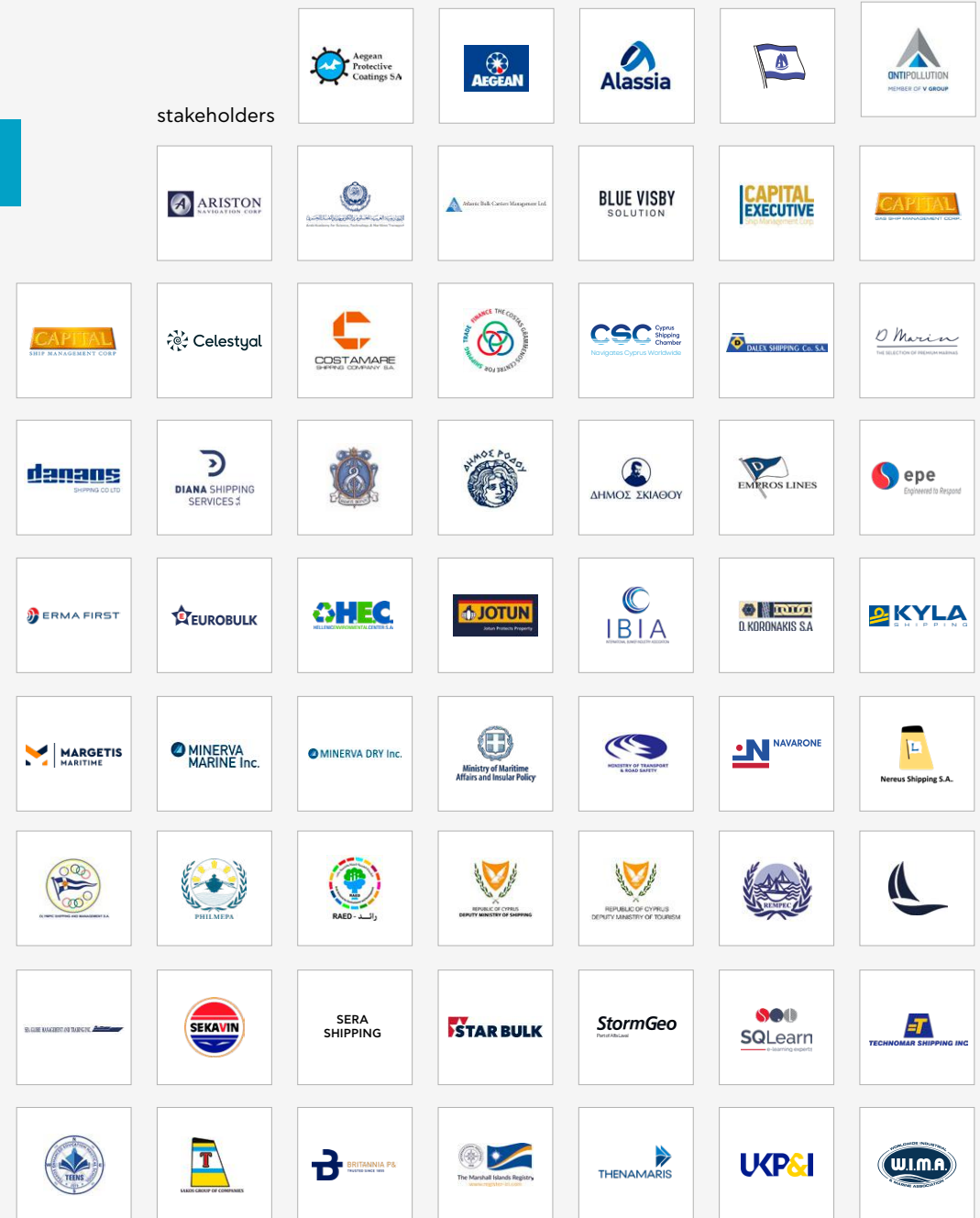

VOLUNTARY INCIDENT REPORTING PLATFORM

In 2023, HELMEPA's Voluntary Incident Reporting Platform (VIRP) continued to grow, now featuring over 1,500 anonymous incident and near-miss reports submitted by 40 managing companies. These reports have led to valuable "lessons learned" shared across HELMEPA's community through the wide distribution of four quarterly VIRP Digests. Member companies Thenamaris and Tsakos Shipping and Trading highlighted the importance of efficient pilot-bridge team communication and strategies to address the bank effect.

Launched in 2021 with financial support from the Lloyd's Register Foundation (LRF) and technical support from DYNAMARINE, the VIRP continues to play a crucial role in promoting safety and accident prevention in the maritime industry.

Sharing lessons learned
VIRP Digest is a quarterly e-bulletin, sharing "lessons learned" from maritime accidents, incidents, and near-misses uploaded by HELMEPA member-vessels to the Voluntary Incident Reporting Platform (VIRP).

Collective impact
1,500+ Reports uploaded to VIRP by 40 member-managing companies that are logged on. Recent upgrade of the VIRP provides users with a wide range of new capabilities and statistical research, enabling smoother user interface and better detection of emerging trends.

Being part of safety case
All managing companies members of HELMEPA are provided, upon request, with an exclusive access code to upload their vessels' incidents and near misses and view all the database reports and emerging trends through a wide variety of filters.

Fostering proactiveness and sustainability
Sharing "lessons learned" from the analysis of previous incidents helps avoid the human errors that lead to the repetition of similar incidents and accidents in the future. Active participation of a company in the VIRP reinforces a strong maritime safety culture at all company levels.

Collisions Averted: The Importance of Bridge Team - Pilot Communication

This article highlights a pivotal safety concern that continues to recur in VIRP and other incident reporting tools/schemes: the challenge of poor communication between Bridge Team - Pilot which poses a serious risk of collisions at sea.

Voluntary Incident Reporting Platform

INCIDENT 1
During daylight, with good weather but poor visibility, a container vessel, under pilotage while transiting the channel outboard, collided with an inbound transiting bulk carrier, which was also under pilotage. During the Master-Pilot exchange the expected inbound traffic had been discussed. Accordingly, the pilot confirmed that there should be only one inbound vessel, and there is an agreement with the pilot of the other vessel to pass Green to Green due to container's deep draft to keep close to green buoys, where there is greater depth. The Master notified the Pilot that the inbound vessel was not allowing enough space by not keeping to his left side of the channel. The Pilot contacted the other vessel pilot on VHF channel 12 talking in their own language and confirmed that all was in good order and the vessel would pass Green to Green. The Chief Officer notified the Master that the other vessel's intentions were not clear, turning to her starboard. The Master notified the pilot accordingly and asked the forecastle lookout to report if the other vessel was visible and in which position. The lookout responded that the other vessel was not visible yet. Due to the risk of collision, the forecastle lookout was instructed to leave their duties and to proceed to safe area. After having a look at the radar screen, the Pilot realized the risk of collision was high. Therefore, to prevent collision, he instructed hard to port to keep the agreement for passing Green to Green. About 2 minutes later the two vessels collided.

INCIDENT 2
A bulk carrier vessel was anchored in a river. The river pilot boarded the bulk carrier vessel in order to shift her upstream. Once the vessel reached the pilot boarding area, the harbor pilot went on board. He was informed about the vessel's condition and characteristics by means of the pilot card, which he signed accordingly. The pilot informed the Master that the vessel would be berthed portside alongside, dropping the starboard anchor, and without tug assistance. The terminal was located on the right bank of the river; therefore, the vessel's berthing would be performed heading the downstream current. The vessel's headway was stopped, and the main engine was set on 'slow astern' to move her parallel to the berth, but due to the current (between one to two knots), the stern turned to port towards the berth. Due to this fact, the pilot advised 'slow ahead' to stop said turn. About 2 minutes later, the pilot advised 'half ahead', then 'full ahead' and rudder hard to starboard, in order to reduce the speed and keep the stern away from the berth. In spite of this, the vessel continued drifting towards the berth. About a minute later, the vessel's port quarter contacted the sparrier mooring dolphin. Consequently, the vessel and the dolphin sustained damages.

New Study: Onboard Carbon Capture Shows 30% Emission Reduction Potential

A recent feasibility study by DNV and TMS Tankers (HELMEPA members) reveals that retrofitting Onboard Carbon Capture and Storage (OCCS) on a Suezmax tanker could cut CO2 emissions by up to 30%. While promising, the study also identifies significant challenges, including high costs and space limitations, as well as adequate port reception facilities for delivery of liquified CO2, that need addressing before OCCS can be widely implemented. This truly full camp experience fostered collaboration and knowledge sharing among the next generation and maritime professionals.



NAFTEMPORIKI & HELMEPA LEAD IMPORTANT TALK ABOUT ESG IN SHIPPING

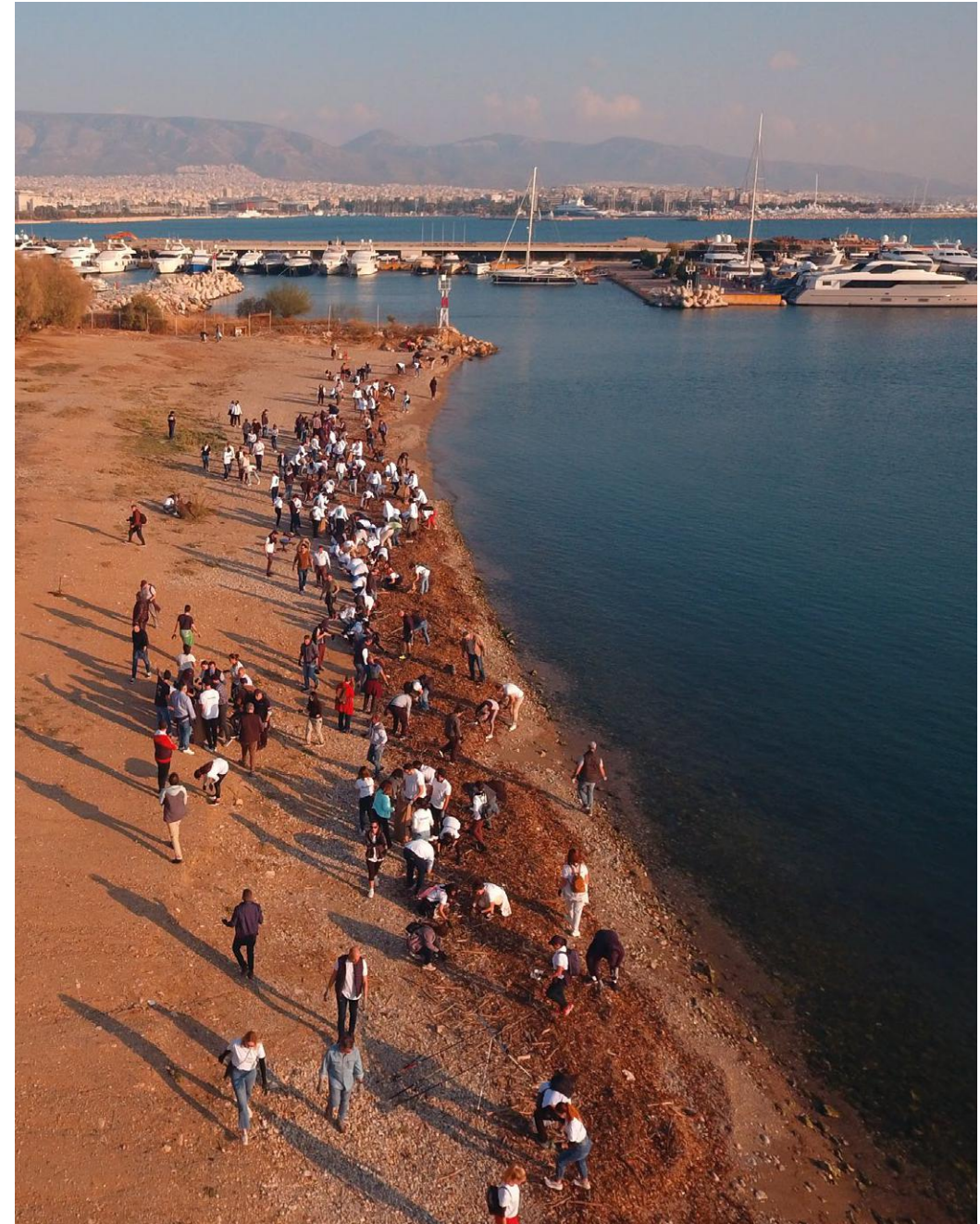

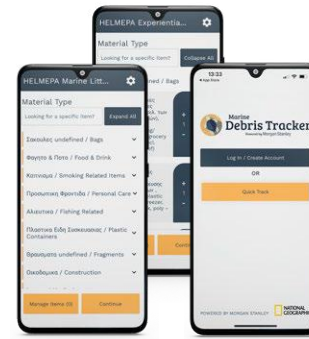
As the national coordinator of the International Coastal Clean up for 33 years, and the “Let’s Clean Up Europe” Campaign for 10 years, HELMEPA has made significant strides in marine conservation. As part of these initiatives, our members can earn badges that showcase their commitment to combating marine litter, which can be integrated into their ESG reports.

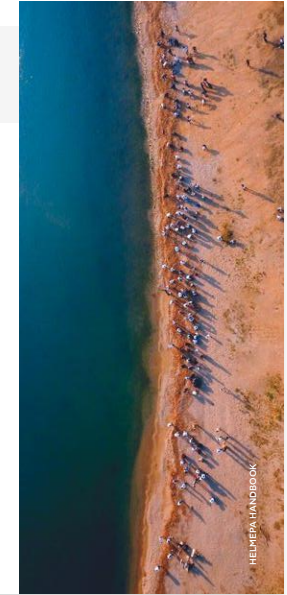

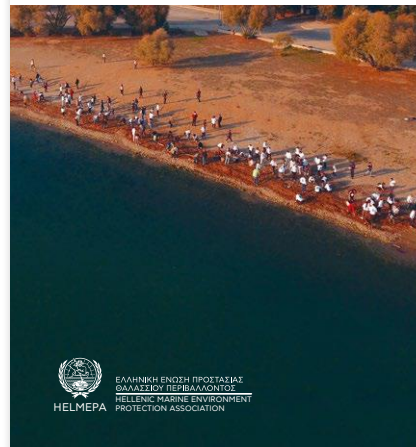

Experiential Marine Clean up HANDBOOK



WHAT IS AN EXPERIENTIAL MARINE CLEAN UP AND WHY WE DO IT?

A marine clean up is a meaningful team activity and an organised effort to remove litter from our shores and surrounding areas. Individuals, groups and business organisations all come together to collect, record and properly dispose of the litter from the coast following simple instructions. Such efforts are based on the principles of citizen science: equipped with the necessary recording list and following an international protocol citizens take initiative and remove the litter found on the shores and waterways.

Marine litter and plastic pollution come mainly from land-based sources becoming pollutants without borders as they get carried away by currents and wind. Each year millions of tons of litter, enter the ocean harming marine life, the ecosystem and human health.

Most of it is plastic; 8 - 12 million tons of plastic waste find their way into the ocean annually which is equivalent to the weight of about 33,000 blue whales or 571,000 school buses.

Our coasts and seas have received much of this pollution as it washes out and drifts over. The use of plastic skyrocketed in the 1970s when we, consumers, stopped buying in bulk or using reusable containers.

Plastic is a cheap and convenient material; however, virtually every piece of plastic that was ever made still exists in some shape or form. Our dependence on single-use plastic has negatively impacted our planet.

If we are to protect the marine environment for future generations, we need increased awareness, collective action and responsible waste management.

A marine clean up is an effective way to address the problem on Greek coasts.



STEP 1 PLANNING AND PREPARATION

Since you are reading through this handbook you have already chosen a type of marine clean up and have already received your information pack. With a bit of preparation, the clean up activity can be fun, effective and rewarding for participants and organisers. The first decision you need to make is to choose an appropriate site.

HOW TO CHOOSE A GREAT SITE

Sites may be in the vicinity of ports or harbours river mouths coastal urban areas tourist destination or even in relatively remote locations provided there is easy access all year round. Avoid sites with many local businesses as these get cleaned up regularly.

TABLE 1 shows the characteristics of an ideal survey site. Matching as many of these criteria as you can, would be ideal but note that this is not always possible especially for the Greek coastline.

UNDERWATER CLEAN UP ACTION AT THESSALONIKI PORT (SEPTEMBER 2023)

Over 250 students from local schools learned about blue economy professions while observing the underwater clean up at Thessaloniki Port. This action was conducted in collaboration with Antipollution, HEC, MEPP, and the Municipality of Thessaloniki.

MEGA JOINT CLEAN UP (NOVEMBER 2023)

HELMEPA organized the largest coastal clean up action to date on the beach and seabed in front of the Peace and Friendship Stadium, with over 450 individuals participating from 31 member companies and partner organizations, including WISTA. Antipollution provided technical support for the event.



CLEAN UP ACTION AT ELEFSINA PORT

HELMEPA, in collaboration with the U.S. Embassy in Greece and the Elefsina Port Authority, organized a joint clean up as part of the European Capital of Culture 2023. The event involved 80 sailors and marines from the USNS TRENTON. Following the clean up, participants enjoyed an enlightening tour of the Ancient Site of Elefsina.



MARINE LITTER MONITORING (3-YEAR BEACH ADOPTION COMMITMENT)

The three-year beach adoption commitment involves a combination of coastal clean ups and seasonal research to document marine litter, conducted at least twice and ideally four times a year. This program provides companies with an opportunity to enhance their ESG-CSR initiatives by demonstrating their commitment to environmental protection and sustainable development while creating a positive and measurable impact on society and the environment.



CLEAN, ACCESIBLE, INCLUSIVE HELMEPA ADOPTS BEACH FOR DISABLED KIDS

HELMEPA and the Rehabilitation Center for Children in Voula (formerly PIKPA) have teamed up to create a welcoming beach environment for kids with disabilities. Restoration, beach and underwater clean ups, equipment installation, waste collection and management, and upcycling – breathing new life into dead seagrass and transforming it into sunglasses, rackets, etc.

Heartfelt thanks to our dedicated Board of Directors and their companies for their unwavering support to revamp the beach, now buzzing with children and adults with disabilities, spreading happiness each day. Special thanks to G. Kallianis (Special Secretary) for on-site coordination and A. Giakoumelos (Board Member) and Antipollution for the waste management coordination / works.

It provides children with an insightful lens into environmental challenges while fostering essential soft skills like creativity, critical thinking, solution-finding, adaptability, and empathy.

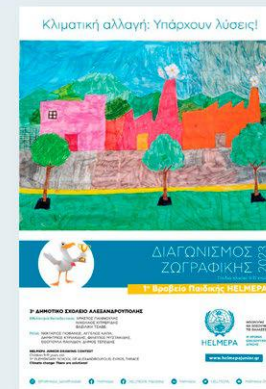

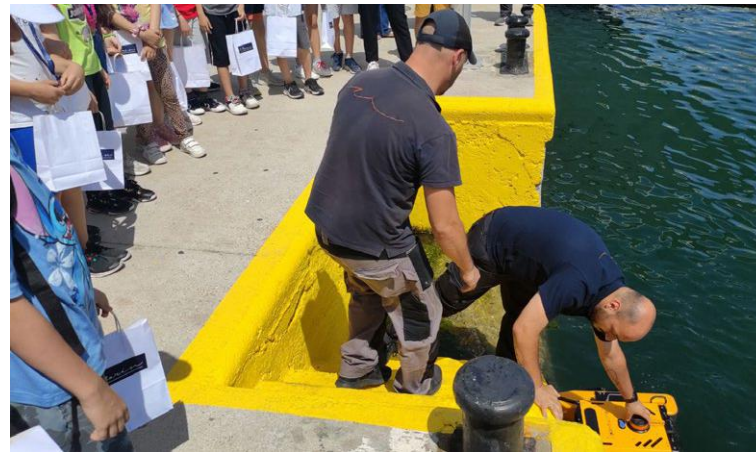


NEMO AT ZEA MARINA

EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION FOR MARITIME PROFESSIONS



The Blue Horizons initiative, held from March 17-19, 2023, brought together over 250 young people (ages 15-25) to explore maritime career opportunities. Organized by HELMEPA, the Yacht Club of Greece, and the Propeller Club (Port of Piraeus), the initiative connected youth with the shipping industry and the growing blue economy.

Key industry leaders like George Prokopiou (President, Yacht Club of Greece), Semiramis Paliou (President, HELMEPA), and Costis Frangoulis (President, Propeller Club) shared insights on maritime careers, women's inclusion, and the need for updated education. Workshops and mentoring sessions focused on marine transportation, blue careers, and sustainable development.

HELMEPA's unique methodology empowers the youth to take an active role by posing direct questions to industry leaders, fostering real-time dialogue and on-the-spot mentoring. This approach allowed participants to engage meaningfully, gaining immediate insights and advice from experts, ensuring their voices were heard and their curiosity met with guidance tailored to their needs.





SHAPING FUTURES: HELMEPA GRANTS 7 NEW SCHOLARSHIPS TO YOUNG SCIENTISTS

Seven new scholarships were granted to young scientists for postgraduate studies in Shipping, Environment, Sustainable Development and Education, for the Academic Year 2023-2024, with a total value of €75,000, honoring the memory of the late George Livanos, Capt. Vassilis Constantakopoulos, George Dalacouras, Vassos Hajioannou, Stavros Daifas, and

Nikolaos Apostolopoulos, symbolizing a continuation of their legacy through the pursuit of knowledge.

The **BLUEGENERATION PROJECT**, funded by EEA Grants, was successfully completed in 2023, reaching over 17 million young people across Europe and earning several awards. Building on this success, HELMEPA has launched two new Erasmus+ programs:

SHE4SEA

Aiming to enhance women's employability in shipping, maritime tourism, and fisheries/aquaculture in Greece, Cyprus, Spain, and Bulgaria, with a duration of 27 months.

EXCEED

Focused on creating Centers of Vocational Excellence (COVE) in Advanced Manufacturing across Spain, Italy, Greece, the Czech Republic, and Finland, with a duration of 4 years.

OCEAN AND CLIMATE LITERACY IN NAUTICAL HIGH SCHOOLS

From April 2022 to August 2023, 120 Greek and Italian students from two Nautical High Schools participated in the "RIDE THE WAVE" project, aimed at developing ocean and climate awareness. This educational program, implemented by HELMEPA in partnership with the Italian environmental organization Marevivo Onlus, included a series of seminars on ocean and climate topics.

At the end of the program, students presented their projects, which were successfully integrated into the European Blue Schools Network. The Italian Institute created the mural "Art for the Sea," combining science, artistic expression, and environmental education to promote sustainable practices.



The project also featured a collaborative effort by EPAL Konistron, where students conducted in-depth interviews with executives from Environmental Protection Engineering (EPE SA).

An Educational Guide was developed, providing guidelines for implementing similar projects and involving stakeholders such as teachers, marine professionals, and environmental associations in ocean and climate education.

The program included a series of three webinars with expert scientists from Greece, Italy, and other European countries, fostering the exchange of knowledge and practices in environmental education. This initiative formed a network of organizations (Local Sea Network, LSN) related to the Blue Economy.

The "RIDE THE WAVE" project was funded by the Erasmus+ 2021-2027-KA210-SCH-000049369 program and was awarded as a "Best Practice," highlighted on the Erasmus+ Results Platform.

EDUCATING THE GUARDIANS OF THE SEA

The "Sea Guardians" program (October 2021 - June 2023) aimed to educate professionals whose work impacts the marine environment, with a focus on Marine Protected Areas. Coordinated by HELMEPA, with partners AENAOS THALASSA, Natural Environment & Climate Change Agency (OFYPEKA), and scientific support from the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki, the program highlighted challenges facing marine ecosystems and proposed solutions.

Over 700 participants, including Coast Guard officers, fisheries service staff, researchers, NGO members, fishermen, and citizens, engaged in structured dialogues and workshops. Educational materials were shared online.

The program was funded by the Green Fund under Priority Axis 3, "Innovative Actions with Citizens," as part of the "Natural Environment and Innovative Actions 2021" initiative.



Key activities included:

- 3 webinars on the role and importance of marine environment.
- 3 online workshops (e-labs) exploring systemic and individual practices affecting marine ecosystems, using participatory dialogue.
- An experiential weekend in Kavala with workshops for fishermen, coastal clean ups, and a two-day conference in Alonissos.
- Launch of the Seatizens Watch mobile app for citizen science, gathering data on endangered species and pollution hotspots.

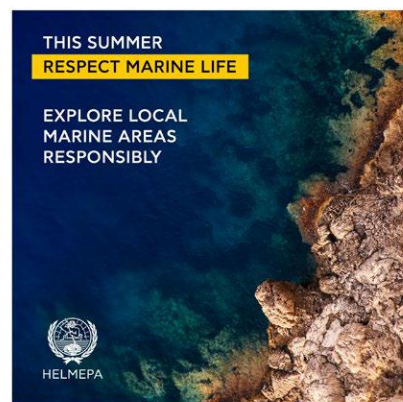
IMPACTFUL WORK ON SAFETY AT SEA
