Trethomas Bluebirds AFC fans can save lives by giving blood

Trethomas Bluebirds AFC is teaming up with the Welsh Blood Service to inspire football fans to roll up their sleeves and become lifesavers.

As the first ever official community partner of the Football Association of Wales' JD Cymru Leagues and Genero Adran Leagues, the Welsh Blood Service's 'Blood, Sweat and Cheers' campaign calls on football fans to consider how many lives they could save if they donate blood at one of the upcoming donation sessions in their area.

Approximately 350 donations of blood a day are required by Welsh hospitals and the Welsh Blood Service is calling on support from local fans to make a significant difference to thousands of patients' lives.

The Welsh Blood Service needs to collect around 100,000 blood donations each year from roughly 70,000 volunteer donors. This year the organisation is hoping its 'Blood, Sweat and Cheers' campaign will help it meet its wider goal to recruit more first time donors.

Blood and its by-products play a vital role in saving lives each day, with donations helping accident victims, patients having a kidney, liver or an organ transplant, pregnant women, leukaemia and cancer patients, someone about to undergo open heart surgery or premature babies in need of a vital blood transfusion.

It's easy for anyone aged between 17 and 66 to book to donate online and become a lifesaving donor. From start to finish, the donation process takes up to one hour, with the physical blood donation lasting only 5-10 minutes.

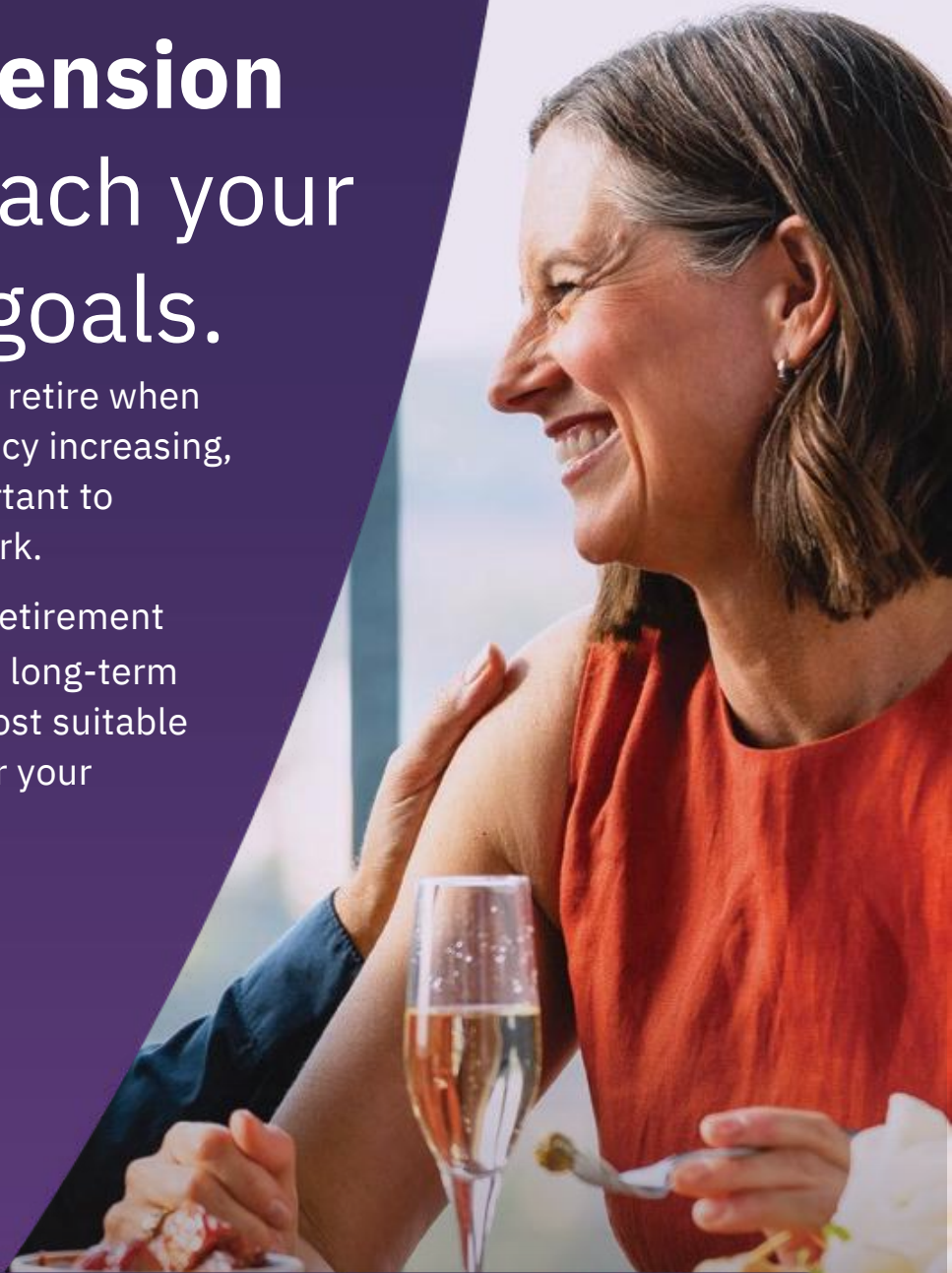

Trethomas Bluebirds History

Formed in 1903, football began when a piece of land in the village was bought by a group of local miners. Workers at the Bedwas Colliery purchased land and Llanbafon Drive Playing Field was developed for recreation, including organised sport. This was to become the home of Trethomas Football for over 100 years.

The first records of Trethomas were in 1925-26 when the club played in Division 2 Section A of the Welsh League, finishing 11th with 12 wins and 6 draws out of 30 league games. Notable present-day local rivals also competed that season, Aberbargoed, Treharris and Abergavenny. The club continued to compete in this division, their best season in 1934-35, when Trethomas finished 3rd winning the Lady Lewis Cup and the Caerphilly Miners Hospital Cup.

Football resumed in Trethomas after the Second World War, with the club competing again in Division 2 Eastern Section in 1945-46. However, in 1947-48, the club struggled winning only 2 games out of 34 and conceded 157 goals, dropping out of the Welsh League, only to return in 2016.

In the intervening years, the club played local league football in the Monmouthshire League in the 1960s. However, by the year 2000 the club now known as Trethomas Bluebirds after club members looked for inspiration from Cardiff City, were playing in the Gwent County League.

Despite relegation to Division Three in 2002-03, the club bounced back to win promotion as Gwent County Division Three Champions in 2005-06. Promotion to Division One followed and the club were unlucky to finish as runners up in the 2012/13 season. The Bluebirds would not have to wait long though to return to Welsh League status as 3 years later the club were promoted to the Welsh Football League in 2015/16, as Gwent County Division One Champions.

The Welsh League return of Trethomas brought a 11th place finish with 11 wins in 30 league games. The club were now playing at Bedwas Rugby Club, having had to move to meet Welsh League criteria, before a move to the Centre of Sporting Excellence in Ystrad Mynach.

The club were now well placed for future promotion and this also resulted in the Bluebirds finishing 3rd in the newly named Welsh League Division Two, before the restructuring into the Ardal Leagues, where the Bluebirds played in the South East Division of Ardal Southern.

Cup success in the inaugural Ardal Leagues Southern Cup 2021/22 was followed by Amateur Trophy success in the 2023/2024 season. The momentum continued into the 2023/24 season which saw the club promoted as Champions and entry into Cymru South for the 2024/25 season, the second tier of Welsh football.

Llantwit Major FC History

Llantwit Major Football Club was formed in 1962. A selection committee selected the team until entry to the South Wales Amateur League Second Division was gained in 1971. Life Member Gwyn John was appointed as the first team manager. Manager John's team were promoted to the 1st Division after finishing second in the 1976–77 season. Llantwit consolidated in the division before claiming their first Amateur League title under new manager Alan Foster in the 1979–80 season. This was closely followed by their second championship just a year later after retaining the title and adding the Corinthian Cup to achieve the double. This kick started a golden period in the 80's where the club won another double of league and Corinthian Cup in 1983–84. The hat-trick of Corinthian Cups came in the 1986–87 season. The club were also runners up in the league on a further two occasions during the decade.

The 1990s by contrast was a very mixed period for the club, first relegation in 1991–92 under Rob Sherman's leadership, followed by promotion two years later with Steve Manning at the helm. Fast forward two years and relegation, this time with record appearance holder Pete Lingham as player/manager. However the club made sure they were in the first division again at the turn of the millennium, the management duo of Kev Pycroft and Phil Clay gaining promotion by winning a comfortable Second Division title. The club spent the next decade consistently flirting with the league title without ever looking like serious title contenders with Llantwit stalwarts Tim Watts and John Guy providing much needed stability in charge. The club also came runners up in the Corinthian Cup in 2005. John Guy stepped down as manager in 2010 following a decade as manager to move upstairs as chairman. Guy did this selflessly in order to allow the introduction of fresh ideas into the club from new boss Kevin Rees in partnership with Watts. Rees and Watts introduced fresh blood into the playing staff gaining instant success by lifting the SWFA Senior Cup in 2010–11. The bedrock of the new players was Darren Robinson who became player/coach/manager along with the irrepressible Watts.

Supporters and Rivalries

Llantwit Major supporters are known as the 'Windmill Army', and can draw crowds of up to 250 for important matches such as their 2018 title decider against STM Sports. For many years, the number one rival was St. Athan, however this rivalry has diminished due to Llantwit's rise through the leagues. Instead, Pen-Y-Bont FC have become the opposition most looked forward to by fans and players alike.

A rivalry has also developed with Ammanford AFC, which began when a Twitter video posted by the Llantwit Major Twitter account after a 3–1 victory left numerous players and supporters of the Ammanford side in tears.

Meanwhile, the club has friendly links with Dutch club Feyenoord Rotterdam, Boca Juniors and Port Talbot Town.

Recent success (2016-onwards)

Llantwit Major have enjoyed incredible success in recent years, rising from the amateur divisions to the second tier of Welsh football. Manager Karl Lewis has established a strong squad of players from the local area, many of whom have been playing together for their entire lives. The most notable success so far was lifting the Welsh Football League Division Two title in the 2017/18 season, in the club's first season at that level having been promoted from Division Three the season before. Former players Sam Snaith and Adam Roscrow have gone on to play in the Welsh Premier League with Cardiff Met, and the club also enjoyed a victory over Barry Town AFC – one of the biggest clubs in Wales. The Windmill Lane stadium has also seen improvements, with the addition of a new seating area and concrete standing areas, as well as improvements to the bar and clubhouse.

Following a 4 - 3 victory over Pontypridd Town, Karl Lewis announced he would leave the club at the end of the season. Darren Robinson was announced as his replacement shortly after.

Cymru South 2019–20

For the 2019–20 season, Llantwit were inaugural members of the Cymru South. A number of improvements were made to the ground and pitch to be ready for the campaign, with the highlight being the addition of a new main stand.

Llantwit finished the season in 11th place, with the final standings determined on a points per game basis due to the coronavirus crisis. This meant Llantwit finished clear of relegation and would once again be in the second tier the following season. The highlight of the season was the return of former Manager Karl Lewis, who had overseen the most successful period in the history of the club.

Cymru South 2021–22

With the 2020–21 campaign cancelled due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, Llantwit once again remained in the Cymru South. Far from the relegation battle they were predicted to endure, Llantwit led the table for much of the 2021–22 season, and were crowned champions[2] on 18 April 2022, following a 3–1 victory away at Undy Athletic. It was an outstanding campaign for the Major, beating almost every team in the league at least once, with Swansea University FC the only exception.

Cymru South 2022–23

Before the 22/23 season, manager Karl Lewis decided to leave the club to become an assistant at Briton Ferry FC. He took seven current Llantwit players with him, leaving the club with a significant rebuild. New manager Stevie Campbell-McCarthy was quickly appointed, who went to work bringing in new players.

Former manager Lewis would continue to raid the club, taking a total of 15 former Llantwit players with him during the course of the season. Despite this, new signings such as Matt Kimmins and Paolo Marengi enabled Llantwit to be in a decent position at the halfway point of the season, overcoming a poor start to the campaign to sit mid table. Despite a poor end to the season with no wins from the final 4, Llantwit strongly beat their expectations to finish in 7th place.



Llantwit Major FC History

Cymru South 2023–24

Stevie McCarthy-Campbell was dismissed early in the season, replaced by incoming manager Ben Stait. The Major were in the bottom three when Stait took over, but he bought around a huge improvement on the previous manager, and was able to secure safety on the final day of the season with a 3–0 victory away to Carmarthen Town. Llantwit had the best defence in the league over the second half of the season, and will be optimistic about the new campaign as the Ben Stait era can truly begin.

Fenix Trophy

In 2023, Llantwit became the first Welsh side to play in the group stages of a UEFA competition, by being invited to the [FENIX Trophy](#). They were drawn against sides from England and Denmark in the group stages. Llantwit performed well throughout the competition, finishing in 2nd place in Group A, including a historic 1–0 victory over reigning champions BK Skjold. This made Llantwit the first team in Welsh football history to win a UEFA group stage match.

Llantwit were invited back to the competition the following year, facing off against Belgian side Berchem Sport in the first round

Bluebirds beaten by top tier Barry Town in third round cup tie

Trethomas Bluebirds have been knocked-out of the Nathaniel MG Cup after a spirited 4-1 loss to Cymru Premier side Barry Town. Coming into the third round tie as clear underdogs, the Bluebirds were beaten comfortably at the Centre for Sporting Excellence against a Barry side that oozed quality all over the pitch. Needing to weather an early storm to have any chance, Trethomas conceded within ten minutes under the floodlights on Tuesday September 17, and struggled to regain any composure. The visitors were sharp and accurate with the ball, and soon had their second before the half. Two goals in the second 45 meant the game was won, although Bluebirds winger Jack Jones did pick up a late consolation.

Kick-off

Fresh off their 3-2 bounce-back win over Pontypridd United on the weekend, the Bluebirds would have been feeling good heading into the match. Spirits seemed high before kick-off, although every player appreciated the challenge ahead of them.

Up against the four-time MG Cup champions, conceding an early goal was out of the question. If they were to take anything from this match, the hosts had to keep it tight for as long as possible. It was clear early on however that was going to be a tough ask. A corner for Trethomas led to a Barry break which was seamless from back to front with perfectly timed runs and passes to match. No goal that time, but a throw-in down the right soon led to a chance in the box for the visitors. Unsettled, the Bluebirds failed to clear the ball and it ended-up at the feet of Keenan Patten inside the area. His first effort was blocked, but the forward took a perfect touch from the rebound and curled a beauty into the far corner leaving keeper Harry Irving rooted to his line.

Now a case of surviving for a few minutes, Barry looked relentless in finding what would be a killer second so early in the match. Pressing with two high-up the pitch made it almost impossible for the Bluebirds to play out, forcing them to go long and ask their forwards to out-jump a Barry side whose average player height must have been six foot plus.

The task was made doubly difficult for the hosts who were without a recognised striker as Gareth Tedstone remained side-lined through injury, and Barry loanee Callum Huggins was ineligible. The match itself became quite a physical one as time went on. Yellow cards were shown and injuries to Barry's Rhys Schwank and Trethomas' Harvey Selway didn't help the flow. Still struggling to find any time on the ball due to the sheer speed of Barry, the Bluebirds did manage to create a golden chance to make it 1-1 in front of a crowd of 340 people. Down the right, there was a rare bit of space for winger Jack Jones to whip a cross in. He played a good ball low and firm across the front post where Leon Thomas was running into. Thomas caught it as well as he could have hoped for, but keeper Luc Rees somehow made an outstanding save with his legs to deny the forward, who had his hands on his head in disbelief. At this level, missed opportunities cost you. Within moments were Barry back down the other end and celebrating their second of the evening. A cross pulled back from the left to the edge of the box found Michael George who dinked a delicate pass through to Patten. With one goal under his belt, Patten smashed his effort at Irving who was beaten for power. 2-0. With half-time approaching, the Bluebirds did have one final chance when a mistake at the back gave Trethomas the ball high-up the field with numbers on their side. A slow chip to Jones out left – who had swapped wings with Ethan Edwards – meant the visitors could scurry back, but not before Jones had a chance to shoot. His effort was put into the side netting however.



Second-half

The pattern of the match so far continued into the second-half. An early save from Irving denied a third, but it wasn't long before he was picking the ball out of his net again.

Down the right, a cross through the legs of defender David Vincent gave Cymru Premier's leading scorer Ollie Hulbert a chance in the box.

Clearly a man in form, he used the pace on the ball to guide his effort into the far corner.

Brilliant finish. The Barry faithful who'd travelled to the match were enjoying themselves – as they had been all evening in fact. It was a great watch for them, the neutrals, and probably even the Bluebirds fans who were being treated to some easy on the eye football from one of the best sides in Wales.

There were moments of positivity for the Bluebirds however, who were far from camped in their box for 90 minutes.

A corner down the right allowed Edwards to whip a lovely cross into a dangerous area.

Vincent got his head to the effort but it was deflected behind.

Any time Trethomas bodies were committed forward, they had to be ultra aware of a break.

Another one of these breaks soon led to a chance. A perfectly played ball over the head of Lee Baldock by Eliot Richards found Michael in space.

He took one touch before dinking his effort past Irving, onto the far post and in. A great goal and 4-0. The visitors took their foot off the gas a bit after that goal, and ended-up gifting the Bluebirds a couple of half-chances towards the end of the game.

A stray pass to substitute Kallum Thomas provided the midfielder a chance to have a shot on the edge of the area. He went for a lob but got it all wrong. Straight at Rees.

A host of substitutions were made from both sides, with youth featuring for Trethomas in the shape of Connor Wright and Noa Barry. A good experience for them up against such high quality opposition.

Shortly after and another mistake from the visitors gave the Bluebirds a chance to score.

Miscommunication between Rees and captain Evan Press saw a headed pass fall short to Jones who was alert to the chance.

With only the defenders on the line to beat, Jones almost missed his window to shoot, but just about managed to find the far corner and make it 4-1.

There was a bit of life out there for the final ten minutes or so, but Barry managed the game out comfortably enough to claim victory and secure their spot in the next round.

Reaction

After the game, Bluebirds manager Mark Dunford spoke to the Caerphilly Observer.

He said: "There was a definite difference between the two sides and I thought Barry played a great game.

"We started really well in the first few minutes and conceded a soft goal. I think that was a big moment in the match.

"We then have a huge chance with the cut back which has been saved amazingly and 30 seconds later we're 2-0 down."

Asked what positives he'll take from the game, Dunford added: "We kept going. I've just praised the boys for not giving up when it would have been easy to throw the towel in.

"The subs came on and gave us some intensity which was really good to see. With some better decisions in the final third we maybe could have even grabbed another goal on a different night."

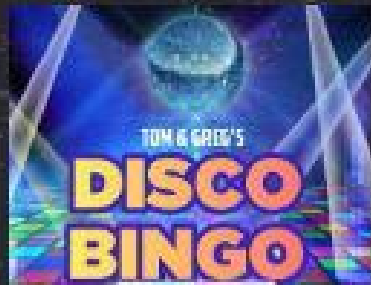

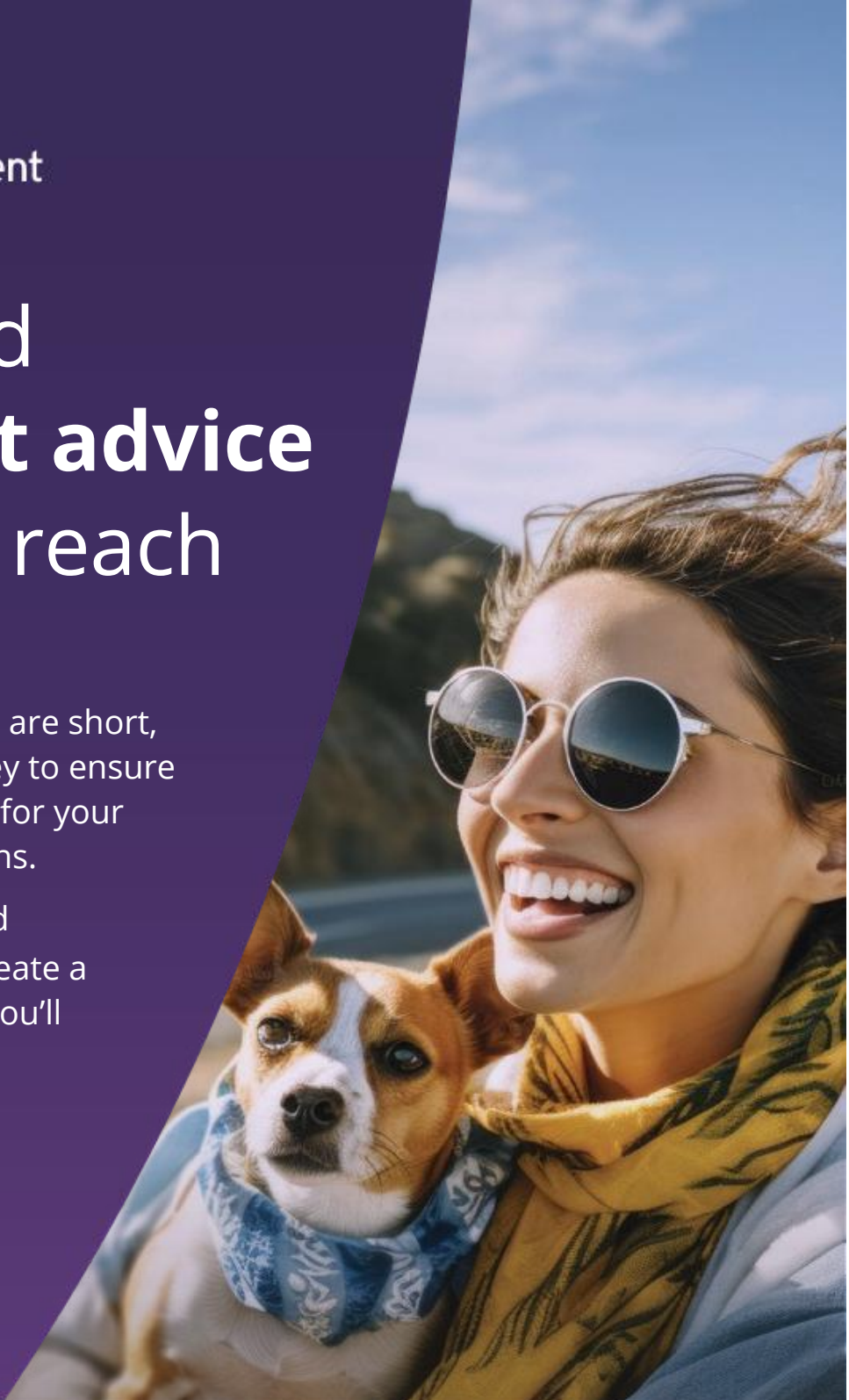
