

Friends of Curry Campus Speaker Series Presents: Monarch Butterflies in Our Backyard 4/10, 1pm-2pm

This is a free program sponsored by the Friends of Curry Campus and will be held in the Community Room on Southwestern's Curry Campus, 96082 Lone Ranch Parkway (off Highway 101), Brookings.

Dennis Triglia will talk about his love of the Monarch Butterfly, and the petition to have Brookings, Oregon become the first Monarch City in Oregon. Vicki Mion and Patsy Haggerty were monarch enthusiasts and together with Dennis they started the Brookings Oregon Monarch Advocates (BOMA) group in 2015. They had monthly meetings, two Monarch Festivals in Azalea Park (2017 and 2018), and started collecting monarch butterfly eggs and milkweed for the students at Kalmiopsis Elementary School which were reared indoors away from predators in the garden. Dennis rallied the support of Brookings City Council and BOMA was approved as a Monarch City in May 2017. In 2018, he applied on behalf of Kalmiopsis Elementary School for Monarch School USA in conjunction with having set up a pollinator garden in the Little Bear Patch Garden at the

MONARCH CITY USA was created in 2015 in Maple Valley, Washington as a nonprofit organization with a mission of helping the monarch butterfly population recover by encouraging local cities to plant milkweed and nectar plants within their borders. Dennis has witnessed the decline of this beautiful species of butterfly. In 1980 Dennis visited Pacific Grove in the Santa Cruz area of California and saw millions of monarchs hanging from the eucalyptus trees like long orange-and-black blankets. When he revisited Pacific Grove forty years later in 2020, there were very few (perhaps hundreds instead of millions!). Dennis will describe how Brookings and Curry County can protect and increase the population by creating habitat, collecting data for researchers and advocating for the reduction of insecticides and herbicides. Dennis will share posters of the Monarch life cycle, preserved male and female specimens, cages in which folks could captively rear monarchs from eggs, lists of nectar plants and descriptions and photos of several species of milkweed. Milkweed is the only host plant on which monarchs lay their eggs.

Topics covered will be the Monarch life cycle, role as a pollinator, current conservation issues, how to rear them in captivity from egg-collecting through five caterpillar stages to the pupa (chrysalis) and ecloses (emerging from the chrysalis as an adult). Dennis will share some personal stories that he and other monarch enthusiasts have experienced.

Explore, grow and create with the Friends of Curry Campus on the second Thursday of every month during the school year. Stay tuned for upcoming talks in our speaker series. For more information contact the Curry Campus at 541-813-1667.





The Real Story Of 420 By Bruce Ellis



Every year on April 20 (4/20) marijuana smokers celebrate cannabis in both legal and illegal states. There have been many myths of how this day and time were created. After doing some research and going through all the myths I found the most logical reason this "Stoners Part Day" became a yearly ritual.

In the early 1970s, a group of high school students in San Rafael, California, known as the "Waldos," were looking for a way to find each other to smoke weed after school. They decided to meet at 4:20 PM near a statue of Louis Pasteur at the local park.

The "420" Code:

The students used "420" as a code word to refer to smoking weed, and it became their way of communicating their intentions to each other.

The Grateful Dead Connection:

One of the Waldos, Steve Reddix, later became a roadie for the Grateful Dead bassist, Phil Lesh.

Reddix and the other Waldos began to spread the use of "420" among Grateful Dead followers, who

began to use it as a way to refer to the time of day to smoke weed.

Popularization:

The "420" code spread through the Grateful Dead fan base, and it eventually became a popular term in cannabis culture. Following The Grateful Dead, 420 has become synonymous with cannabis use. Merry Jade even declared '420' as "the cannabis equivalent of the Kardashians." Celebrations spread worldwide every April, resulting in concerts, cultural festivals, and a cloud of smoke in every major city. Even non-cannabis retailers like Fatburger and Jack in the Box have gotten in on the celebration with 420 special deals. The term '420 friendly' has become common terminology in everything from dating apps to roommate postings online. The aptly named California Senate Bill 420 became the Medical Marijuana Program Act, signed by the governor in 2003 and established the state's medical use program. From heresy to history, 420's mythology became larger than anyone could have anticipated, becoming the regular highest sales-grossing day in the regulated industry.

April 20th:

Because of the association with the date 4/20, April 20th became a popular day for cannabis enthusiasts to gather and celebrate.

Myths of how 420 came about: Police Code for Marijuana Use

A heavily referenced rumor is that '420' is the police code for cannabis use in progress. However, that myth has been busted. While there are some standards, police codes differ by state, county and local department and not all of them use code no. 420." They note that police in Las Vegas use code '420' to reference a homicide (the opposite of cannabis use), and in San Francisco, '420' relates to juvenile disturbance.

Hitler's Birthday

While April 20th, unfortunately, is the birthday of Adolf Hitler, that has nothing to do with cannabis. Nobody is celebrating Hitler, let alone celebrating him by smoking cannabis. April 20th is also the birthday of George Takei, a wonderful public figure from Star Trek. While this perhaps has been used to vilify cannabis users, the connection between his birthday and celebration of any sort is preposterous. This myth is effectively and thoughtfully busted as a pure coincidence.







Creature Feature Easter Creatures From Around The World By Bruce Ellis







Of course we in the states are familiar with the animals symbolic of Easter in America such as the bunny, dove and chicken. But in other countries they have different animals that represent their Easter celebration.

America, The Easter Bunny

Some believe bunnies were chosen (along with eggs) as seasonal mascots because they represent new life, which is relevant to both springtime and the religious significance of Easter. Throughout northern Europe in March, hares can be seen running around in the empty fields competing for a mate. So it might have been that hares were seen as a spring and Easter animal, especially in Germany and The Netherlands. The earliest record of an Easter rabbit is from 1682 in central Germany where, in a folk story, a rabbit hides eggs in a field for children to find. In other parts of Germany, the animal featured in this folk story was often a fox or a stork. The Easter bunny seems to have become more popular when German and Dutch settlers took these folk stories over to the US. Church bells from Maundy Thursday until Easter Sunday. This represents

America, The Chicken

The egg is the underlying symbol that links many Easter animals. The reason being that the egg is a powerful symbol of life, whether you see this as relating to the fertile season of spring and the pagan Goddess Eostre, or the Christian Resurrection story. And while the idea of a rabbit laying eggs might seem a bit tenuous now, the idea of chicks coming out of them is only natural.

Switzerland, The Cuckoo

Cuckoo birds have the monopoly on Easter treat delivery in Switzerland. They're the overall symbol for spring in the country. They represent new life, the reason for the season, and are commonly found in the area. It's a popular belief that cuckoos are the ones bringing children eggs on Easter; but not necessarily their own. Cuckoo Birds are notorious egg thieves which may explain the colorful array of eggs they bring.

Russia, The Dog

In Russia, dogs are believed to lay Easter eggs. According to the legend, a dog was present at the tomb of Jesus and witnessed his resurrection. The dog was so overjoyed that it began wagging its tail and scattered eggs everywhere. This is believed to be where the Easter egg hunt tradition

Australia. The Bilby

Australians aren't big on bunnies. Rabbits were brought to Australia in the 17th century, says Portable Press, and since then, they've become an invasive species. Instead of being a symbol of adorable softness, rabbits in Australia are seen as grim reapers for crops. Not exactly fitting for a season about new life. Instead, Australians get their Easter goodies from the native bilby, which is a small, rabbit-like marsupial with big ears. Bilbies not only have a better reputation in the land down under they're also endangered, so having them represent Easter increases awareness for their conservation as well.

France, Flying Bells

Egg-toting rabbits pale in comparison to the whimsy of enchanted, flying, gift-delivering church bells. In France, it's tradition not to ring the period of mourning, during which Jesus was crucified, and leads into the celebration of His resurrection on Easter morning. The story told to French children is that the bells aren't ringing because they're too busy flying to Rome to be blessed by the Pope. On their way back to France, they drop treats all over France for children to find and enjoy on Easter.


Sweden — The Easter Witch

In Sweden, children exchange baby animals and pastel colors for "Påskkäring," or the Easter Witch. During the witch hunts of the 15th century, it was believed that Easter was the witches' Sabbath, a day when they'd commune with Satan and do everything backwards. Old witches became young, and they would gather around a large table, sitting facing outward, of course. Because the fear of witches on Easter was alive well into the 1800s, young pranksters would dress as witches. They'd turn their clothes inside out and play tricks, like knocking over wagons, on unsuspecting innocents for fun, and then go door-to-door asking for something to eat or drink. They would often draw a picture of a witch with an invitation to join the witches' Sabbath and leave it on peoples' doorsteps, just to cause chaos. Today, the tradition is less mean-spirited: Young children dress up as elderly witches and go doorto-door with a hand-drawn picture, asking to be rewarded for their artistry with sweets.





Insider Mysteries

The Origin Of "Special Days" In April By Bruce Ellis





Well of course Easter is in April but there are also several other "special days" throughout the month. If you ever wondered how they all originated....wonder no more!

April Fools Day

The origin of the holiday is thought to date back to 1582 by some historians. That year, France switched from using the Julian calendar, which starts the new year on April 1, to the Gregorian calendar, which restarts on Jan. 1. People who hadn't yet received news that the start of the year had been changed were called "April fools."

Other historians have linked the holiday to festivals like Hilaria, celebrated together to appreciate the value trees provide to our community in ancient Rome, and to the vernal equinox or first day of spring, when weather is often unpredictable.

As the tradition of April Fool's Day evolved, people began to engage in more elaborate pranks and jokes on April 1st.

The custom of April Fool's Day spread across different cultures and regions, with variations in the types of pranks and jokes that are considered acceptable.

Today, April Fool's Day is still celebrated with pranks, jokes, and lighthearted teasing, with some people even engaging in elaborate hoaxes. While the core concept of April Fool's Day remains the same, there are cultural variations in the types of pranks and jokes that are considered appropriate.

There are variations between countries in the celebration of April Fools' Day, but all have in common an excuse to make someone play the fool. In France, for example, the fooled person is called poisson d'avril ("April fish"), perhaps in reference to a young fish and hence to one that is easily caught; it is common for French children to pin a paper fish to the backs of unsuspecting friends. In Scotland the day is Gowkie Day, for the gowk, or cuckoo, a symbol of the fool and the cuckold, which suggests that it may have been associated at one time with sexual license; on the following day signs reading "kick me" are pinned to friends' backs. In many countries newspapers and the other media participate—for example, with false headlines or news stories.



Arbor Day

In 1872, a man by the name of J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees. This holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than one million trees in Nebraska, and is now celebrated all over the world. Prizes were offered to counties and individuals for the largest number of properly planted trees on that day.

While most states celebrate only one day of Arbor festivities, Oklahoma celebrates a full week! This is the time when we come and to learn more about how to keep them thriving here... furthermore, it's the perfect time to plant new trees throughout the city -at home and in public places.

Earth Day

In the 1960s, growing awareness of pollution and environmental damage, coupled with the energy of the anti-war movement, fueled a desire for change. It may be hard to imagine that before 1970, a factory could spew black clouds of toxic smoke into the air or dump tons of toxic waste into a nearby stream, and that was perfectly legal. They could not be taken to court to stop it. How was that possible? Because there was no EPA, no Clean Air Act, no Clean Water Act. There were no legal or regulatory mechanisms to protect our environment.

In spring 1970, Senator Gaylord Nelson created Earth Day as a way to force this issue onto the national agenda. Twenty million Americans demonstrated in different U.S. cities, and it worked! In December 1970, Congress authorized the creation of a new federal agency to tackle environmental issues. The first Earth Day spurred a dramatic rise in public concern about environmental issues and led to the creation of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the passage of important environmental protection legislation, including the Clean Air Act, Clean Water Act, and Endangered Species Act.

Good Friday

The history of Good Friday goes back to the time when Jesus was arrested by royal soldiers and was then sentenced to death by crucifixion. As per the Bible, Jesus' crucifixion took place on Friday, the reason why it's called Good Friday. The day is one of remembrance, marking the crucifixion of Jesus Christ at the hands of the Romans. It is believed that Jesus rose from the dead the following Sunday, which is commemorated in the form of the joyous day of Easter.








CHANGE and IMPERMANENCE -The Constants of Life By Ken Dobberpuhl

In It is often said that change is good, but clearly some changes in our lives can shake us to our core. I used to have a quote by Wolfgang Goethe, hanging in my training

studio, that stated: Change will occur when the will to change is greater than the resistance to change. At that time, I honestly believed that change was simply a matter of will power. Now that I have a few more years of life experience under my belt, I don't give this offering quite the weight I used to. Intellectually, most people understand that not many things in life stay the same and that change is inevitable, but when change is presented to us, most of us resist.

In Buddhist philosophy, it is stated that the root cause of suffering is attachment, and often when faced with change, we suffer because of our resistance to it. Naturally, there are aspects of our lives that we work hard to maintain, our relationships, our jobs, and our homes, but none of these are guaranteed to remain unchanged. I think it's worth considering the impermanence of all things, as a hedge against the

devastation one can feel when we lose someone or something we are closely attached to.

I believe that by at least acknowledging that change and impermanence are always at play, we can hopefully be more resilient when it comes our way. In Stoic philosophy there are two axioms that are helpful in this regard: Memento Mori - Remember that

you are going to die and Amor Fati - Embrace your fate. Some might consider these as negative or doom and gloom, but I find them motivational, to live life to the fullest, because the party doesn't last forever. By embracing our fate or what life throws at us, we can develop a deep unwavering constitution that can carry us through any

hardship we are presented with.

I'm not suggesting that this is easy, but neither is life. Like an old Arab proverb states: Life is harsh and then you die. Just as we cultivate our physical bodies tobecome strong and resilient, so to, can we train our minds to develop a form of self- mastery, that keeps us steady in a crisis. Learning to respond, rather than react immediately can prevent worsening an already tough situation. There are daily opportunities to practice responding after a brief assessment of the situation, rather than flying into reaction mode and defending some supposed assault on your ego or character. You might get cut off in traffic, someone might be critical of your work, your partner might say something hurtful. Rather than reacting, take a long slow breath and ask yourself, is this worth going to battle over?

Change and Impermanence will be omnipresent throughout our lives. We can't stop these events, but we can decide how we will respond to them when they arrive in our lives. Unanticipated events or difficult people give us an opportunity to grow by not reacting emotionally but with a measured response.


