The Southern Sunday FL History

"A LEAGUE TO BE PART AND PROUD OF"

The Southern Sunday Football League was formed in 1944 as the Second World War was coming to an end. Its first headquarters was the Bulls Head at Clapham Old Town. The four principle founders were Home Guard Captain Jim Sips (Chairman for the first 15 years), Cliff Miller (General Secretary for 24 years), Bert Swift (Attendance Secretary) and Frank Woods, the first president who donated two cups and a shield to start the league.

In 1960 the league moved its headquarters to the Old White Horse on Brixton Road and stayed there for the next 20 years. Marcus Lipton, MP for Brixton donated a cup in 1959, which all teams still play for every season. Frank Blunstone (Chelsea and England) donated a cup in 1964 which replaced the existing senior cup.

In the early 1960s the Southern Sunday Football League, the Sunday Sportsman's League and the Association of Jewish Youth Leagues led a deputation to the Football Association to have Sunday football legitimised by the FA. Their efforts were rewarded in 1962 when the FA recognised Sunday football leagues which even today account for 70% of all football clubs. South London has changed considerably over the 70 years since the start of the SSFL, but the league continues to prosper.

The SSFL continues to be one of the biggest men's 11-a-side leagues in London and in 2019/2020 we were named the London FA Grassroots League of the Year. In the same year we attained FA Charter Standard Status (England Accredited) and we remain the only adult Sunday league in London to have achieved this prestigious status. In 2020/2021 the awards didn't stop coming, Graham Rodber our Chairman and General Secretary won the London FA grassroots volunteer of the year which is something he and the league are very proud of. Those who know the league often comment on how well run the league is, this award is a testament to all of the hard work of Graham and the rest of the league management committee.

The 2024/2025 season has been another exciting one as we have continued to operate with twelve divisions accommodating 110+ teams. We are very proud of our cup competitions due to the shocks and upsets they continue to provide each season. Our most prestigious cup competition is the League Cup (Marcus Lipton Cup) which all teams compete for each season.

The future of grassroots Sunday football looked bleak a decade ago with the numbers of leagues, clubs and players dwindling. It now continues to prosper with participation growing every season, this is something that we as a league are proud to be a part of.

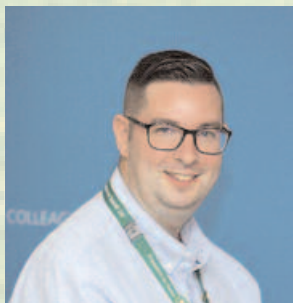

Magpie Recruitment FC traces its roots back to 2017 when a lifelong passion for the beautiful game and years of club sponsorship culminated in a bold new venture. Drawing on the veteran talents of Lennox United FC and FC Sheen, stalwarts of the West Fulham League in the 2000s, the club's founding squad emerged from retirement to lay the foundation for something special. In that inaugural season the fledgling Magpies soared to a respectable fifth-place finish in League 5, hinting at the potential to come.

By year two destiny called in the form of the Donovan Thomas Cup. Against a charged crowd at Sutton United's packed ground Magpie Recruitment FC overcame FC London Phoenix FC to lift its first ever silverware, proof that grit and veteran know-how could trump more fancied rivals. The next few seasons in the lower leagues were a testing ground refining tactics and forging a culture of resilience.

Then came the game-changer in 2021 to 2022. Fueled by fresh blood and steely ambition Magpie Recruitment FC stormed through the campaign undefeated clinching both the League 5 title and a long-awaited promotion. The following season 2022 to 2023 became a goal fest of note: ninety-eight strikes in eighteen matches propelled the Magpies to the League 3 crown and into the Bob Dixon League 1. Cup runs teetered on the brink but heartbreak only sharpened their resolve.

The 2023 to 2024 season stands as the club's greatest triumph. A commanding League 1 title was complemented by a stunning 5–1 victory over Wimbledon Commoners in the Ken Bailey Cup final and a 2–1 win over South London United in the Chairman's Cup sealing an unprecedented treble and earning the SSFL Team of the Year accolade on the SELK podcast.

Today's Magpies arrive at the cup final buoyed by their recent Championship League win poised to conquer one of SSFL toughest cup challenges and secure a historic league and cup double. From that humbling 0–14 defeat to Emerson in 2017 to 13 to 1 routs of East Putney FC and Balham Mariners FC in 2023 Magpie Recruitment FC's journey is a testament to dedication and desire to improve.

Scott Queen Defender. "Queenie". The Gary Neville of Sunday league, voted both Players' Player and Manager's Player last season. Straight running, pinpoint passing, and eternally stoic under pressure, unstoppable charisma.
