Furnishing the eight foot by eight foot dorm room no longer worries the PLNU students who have moved off-campus. Bedding and clothing is no longer their only concern, but instead couches, dishes, furniture now plague the moving vans. Could the over-packed moving van actually be symbolic of the coming responsibilities?

With about 800 students living off-campus this year, most of them fill the apartment complexes of Pt. Loma rather than opt for the commute from their parent's house or another term in the dorms.

"Although my first priority was to live on campus this year, living off-campus has been better than thought," says senior Jill Farabelli, three-year dorm veteran. "I would never want to trade it in for Goodwin Hall."



Although Flex Housing may be similar to off-campus housing, the R.A.s make it a point to keep this community connected. Activities such as Sub Sandwich Night and Root Beer Socials help maintain a closeness for each of the neighboring students. Klassen women also got together during alldorm nights to watch movies, play board games and bake cookies during the holidays and final exam week.







The open shower area is one of the distinctive qualities at Hendricks. "I think some people are still getting used to it," says freshman Jonathan Howe.


Thankfully, overcrowding and a communal shower are only part of what Hendricks is about.

"Sometimes we would just run around for no reason. We like to do that. Running for no reason is cool. I like it," said freshman Mitchell Smee.












Miguel Covenant Village, talking to them, loving them, and showing the love of Jesus Christ to them. This ministry's vision is to share stories and touch lives.








Special Friends

"The women are very deep, so we cover most events very well with the women," declared Arvin.




The hundreds of hours spent on the field yielded close friendships and good memories. And talk of talented recruits for next year is already exciting the returning players.







The rough ride that the men's team will have to encounter will be with Vanguard University, ranked high in PNLU's district.



With what looks to be a full team of returners that are all familiar with the league and playing with each other, PLNU women's volleyball is committed to come out strong next year.


"This group will put us right back where we were a couple of years ago," said Wnek. "We've got a goal to be in the top 10 of the nation and this team will put us there."

Freshman opposite Bohdana Saunders agrees. "We are going to be setting the pace for future PLNU Volleyball."




Once again the men's soccer team had a very strong season with many talented players. They started off the season with a 6-0 record until ruining the streak with a loss to Utah.

Senior David Matheny learned a lot about business at his internship with Merrill Lynch this fall. Ironically, though, the internship did more to repel him away from the field of business than increase his interest.

"I definitely want to steer more clearly away from the business aspect of my major," he says. Rather, Matheny sees himself in a career possibly working with computers and databases.

Matheny, who is majoring in Management Information Services, is also pursuing a minor in Business. At Merrill Lynch, a global financial management and advisory company, Matheny worked as a financial consultant and database intern.

Many departments at PLNU require students to complete an internship as a require-

ment for graduation. In order to receive credit for the internship, business students are required to work, non-paid, for a total of 80 hours. Matheny completed his in a little more than two months by working an average of 12 to 15 hours a week.

His duties involved creating databases, sending mailings, and scheduling estate planning seminars. The purpose of the mailings and seminars, he says, were basically to entice people to invest their money with the company's mutual funds and stocks.

One of the perks of his job, he says, was going to the estate-planning seminars, which were usually held in restaurants. He also found these meetings a great way to create contacts and meet owners of large companies.

"It's all about the networking," says Matheny, who hates to admit that most of the business world is about who you know.


Obviously, Matheny doesn't completely buy into this concept. He believes that it's better to graduate with skills in an aspect of the field rather than having to rely solely on one's associates.

Overall, he says his experience at Merrill Lynch was a positive one. He was especially fortunate to work with computers in database management -- the area of interest he will most likely pursue when he graduates.





The library installed a set of terminals configured just for checking e-mail because of the high demand from students. Being just a buzz, ring, or click away, young adults are connected more than ever.



















Students can enjoy free coffee and tea while lounging in the large couches. "I wanted it to be a place where any student can come bless the students with their gifts," Zeller says.


