Evening all,

I'd like to extend a warm welcome to Peterborough Sports players, staff and supporters to Edgar street for this evening's National League North fixture.

We as a group of players and staff understand how difficult a test Peterborough Sports have been for us in the past as a football club and expect a real tough challenge tonight. We had an excellent performance and result away to tonight's opponents towards the back end of last season which will give us great confidence going into tonight's game.

I have got to say I am extremely proud of the players and really pleased with our results early on in the campaign. We have played a full time South Shields who have had 6 weeks of full time training to prepare for us and then a robust and tough Chorley away from home who was so close to finishing 2nd last season. To come away undefeated and with 4 points and conceding only 1 goal is a great return for us. I think the players deserve a huge pat on the back for the points return we have managed to gain in 2 very tough opening home and away fixtures. The atmosphere for the South Shields game was extremely pleasing and I really appreciate the patience you showed the players having set up to be difficult to beat against a real threatening side in South Shields. We were extremely efficient in and out of possession and on the afternoon deserved the 3 points. A late arrival to the Hereford squad Rose joined the Bulls at the end of pre-season. Rose Speaking on how the move happend:

“I know the Gaffer from last year and Adam [Rooney], I’ve know him for about 4 years now. I was training with them last year before my move to scotland so I knew the set up, I knew the gaffer, i knew a few of the boys as well.

I was without a club and Roons asked if I wanted to join and I said ‘why not’ so here I am.”

It was a succesful time in Scotland for Rose. Spending 14 games on loan at Hamilton and finding the back of the net 8 times. His goals helped The Accies secure promotion to the Scottish Championship.

“It was my first one [promotion], I can’t explain the feeling it was great to get my first promotion.

We’ve got ambitions at Hereford to push up the leagues, that’s our aim”

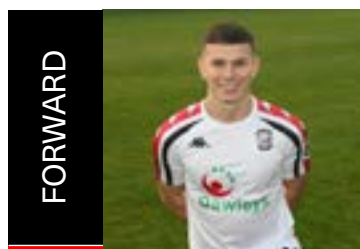

Peterborough Sports



Peterborough Sports football club was founded in 1908 and were initially known as Brotherhoods Engineering Works a non-competitive factory side for the company that was founded by Peter Brotherhood in 1867 that was famed for designing and manufacturing the first steam turbine engine in the world. The club honours its heritage to this day with the turbine engine featuring in the club badge and "The Turbines" as the club nickname. We were called Bearings Direct in the 1990's and then changed to Peterborough Sports all at the same Lincoln Road ground which has undergone a major revamp since 2012 funded by a combination of Parkway Social Club, the Football Foundation and former Manager & Chairman Tommy Cooper.

The club started competitive life in the Northants League in 1919 (which became the UCL in 1934) winning the title in that first season before joining the Peterborough League in 1923. The club once entertained Tottenham Hotspur at Lincoln Road before the 2nd World War in front of a crowd of 4,000 at a time when a stand went down the whole length of the ground and drew over 3,000 for the visit of local rivals Peterborough & Fletton United (now Peterborough United).

Without doubt the clubs most famous player is Victor Watson (pictured) who played in the Northants League title winning team of 1919/20 before moving onto West Ham United for £50 via Wellingborough in March 1920. He remains the Hammers record goal scorer with 326 goals from 505 appearances. Watson played 5 times for England scoring 4 times between 1923 & 1930 including a brace against Scotland in 1930 and played in the first FA Cup Final at Wembley in front of 200,000 fans v Bolton

Much of the clubs early years were notably unsuccessful. The Northants

League win in 1920 was followed 6 years later with a Peterborough League

Division 3 title in 1926, with a gap then to the Peterborough Football

Association Minor Cup win in 1940. The barren spell of success continued right up until 1976 when the Peterborough Division 3 title was secured again, which was repeated in 1981.

The club enjoyed a brief golden period at the start of the 1990's with promotion secured back to the Peterborough Premier Division and 2 Northants

Lower Junior Cups being landed in 1994 & 1995 under the management of current advisor to the board Stephen "Tommy" Cooper.

The club again had some barren time before the Turbines suddenly became successful in the 2006/07 season when both the Peterborough Premier Division and Northants Junior Cup were secured for the first time in the clubs history under the management of Al Lenihan & Tommy Flynn. Unfortunately the club did not follow up on this success and in the ensuing years almost went out of existence. It was only the efforts of current life president Colin Day (who has been at Sports over half a century), Secretary Roger Martin & manager Chris Bartlett that kept the club running.

Tommy Cooper returned to the club in the role of Chairman in January 2011 and in that 2010/11 season the club secured its first PFA trophy since the 2nd world war when lifting the Challenge Cup and were promoted back to the Peterborough League Premier Division for a short 2 season stay.

Bartlett was replaced as manager by Seamus Morgan for the 2012/13 season and the former Peterborough Northern Star reserves manager steered the club into the United Counties League with a 3rd place position in 2012/13 when Netherton turned down their promotion having finished in 2nd.

The Reserves enjoyed 3 successive promotions after reforming at the start of the decade and are now in the Peterborough League Premier Division themselves, which they won in 2016/17 and are now re-named Peterborough Sports Development.

The clubs 1st season at UCL level started well but ultimately ended in a disappointing 16th placed finish with Morgan replaced as manager by former QPR & England Under 21 manager Chris Plummer in January. The following season 2014/15 saw the side challenging for promotion right to the end of the season, but a run of 7 away games to finish, saw them eventually finish in 5th.

At the end of that season Plummer stood aside and his assistant Jimmy Dean took the reins for the 2015/16 campaign. In his first year the club won the title at a canter by a huge 21 points, helped by winning their first 23 games. The side also picked up the UCL League Cup, becoming the first side from Division 1 to ever do so, after a penalty shoot-out triumph against Premier Division Holbeach United. The side also added the Northants Junior Cup for a 2nd time

and the prestigious Hinchingsbrooke Cup for the 1st time and were to be forever dubbed the 'Fourmidables'.

That success was continued into the 2016/17 as the team won the UCL Premier

Division with a league record points tally of 112

and were the top scorers in the top 11 levels of English football with 150 in the league and 205 in all competitions. The Hinchingsbrooke Cup was also retained with a 2-1 victory over 2nd placed Deeping Rangers and the side had its best ever run in the FA Vase reaching the 4th round.

The side entered the Northern Premier League for the 2017/18 season and initially found the going tough – indeed the side went into 2018 bottom of the table before a dramatic turnaround saw the Turbines finish a most respectable 12th with that summer seeing the side transfer across to the Southern League, with Grant Biddle replacing Tom Cooper as Chairman and Paul Venters joining as Vice Chairman

With an additional step 4 league implemented for 2018/19 Sports were moved into the Southern League to play in the Division 1 Central section where the side duly won their 3rd title in 4 years under Dean. The side only lost 3 games all season (which included twice to runners up Bromsgrove Sporting) which was mark of their consistency. The side also had probably the best win in its history when beating National League North and former football league side Boston United 2-0 away in the FA Cup 2nd qualifying round. Their reward was a home tie with unbeaten National League North side Chorley with the game screened on the red button on the BBC which attracted a peak viewing figure of 240,000 and a club record 404 in attendance. Unfortunately Sports went out 3-0 on a stinking day weather wise, which was replaced with the glorious weather at Easter and the raising of the Championship, secured on the Saturday with a 2-0 win away at Kidlington with the trophy presented on the Monday before the derby win over Cambridge City. We then went onto to beat the Southern title winners Blackfield & Langley 5-1 in the Championship Match

Season 2019/20 was to be spent in the Central Premier Division at Step 3 for the first time in the clubs centenary year and Sports were leading the way when the league for declared null and void due to COVID-19.

The 2020/21 season was again greatly affected by COVID-19 but this did not stop Sports progressing well in both the FA Cup (reached 3rd Qualifying Round) and the FA Trophy (Reached 5th Round).

The 2021/22 season was to become another landmark season for the club as we reached Step 2 of the Non-League pyramid by finishing second in the league and gaining promotion by winning the play-offs.

Peter Crook - Goalkeeper

'Crooky' became an almost immediate hero to the Turbines fans when completing not one but two penalty saves in the Southern League Premier Central play-off final against Coalville Town in 2021/22 to secure promotion to the National League North. Crook was a vital player in our season at Step 2 and at the end of the 2022/23 season, Crook was awarded Manager's Player of the Year, keeping over 15 clean sheets in the league.

Matthew Tootle - Defender

An experienced Football League full-back, Matthew Tootle was signed in readiness for the 2023/24 season from Grantham Town. Described as 'a real coup' by a number of fans of his previous clubs, Matt provides a wealth of experience to a young squad.

Eliot Putman - Defender

Confirmed and signed for the 2024/25 Season, defender Eliot Putman is a Turbine! Having most recently played at Coalville Town Eliot is highly rated and relishing the chance of playing at Step 2!

Ryan Fryatt - Defender

Signing for Sports in June 2021, Ryan Fryatt is a highly experienced defender having played Academy football at Norwich City (including U18s) and also Cambridge Utd. Ryan enjoyed a long and successful career at Kings Lynn Town before joining National League North outfit Kettering Town in October 2020, scoring 4 times in 20 appearances. He has also spent time at Dereham Town and Wisbech Town.

Ashton Fox - Defender

Ashton Fox is a young, towering central defender who was signed on loan from League One side Peterborough United for the 2023/24 season. Fox impressed managers Luke Steele and Michael Gash during a number of games and first team football and the defender is relishing the chance of continuing his career with Peterborough Sports FC confirmed and signed for the 2024/25 Season.

Dan Jarvis - Midfielder

Signed for the 2020/21 season, Dan Jarvis played for Peterborough United from the age of 8 all the way through to a full scholarship. When signed to Sports, DJ was described as the perfect signing, who is young, athletic and has a great work ethic.

Dan Lawlor - Midfielder

Dan Lawlor is an exceptional player with a range of passing at his disposal. He was signed for Sports in the summer of the 2016/17 season, helping the club to their historic UCL Premier division title. Dan has been an ever-present player for Sports since his signing over 7 years ago and he can certainly be described as a Turbines Legend by the fans.

Hugh Alban-Jones - Midfielder

Hugh joined Sports in February 2023 after recently playing at Bedford Town. His early career began at Peterborough United, but he moved to Spain for three years after his release.

Kellan Hickinson - Midfielder

Attacking midfielder Kellan Hickinson joined Peterborough Sports at the end of March 2024, signing from local

Step 5 side Yaxley FC. A product of the Peterborough United Academy, Kellan worked his way through the setup from Under 9s level to gaining a professional contract.

Dion Sembie-Ferris - Forward

Confirmed and signed for the 2024/25 Season, forward and club legend Dion Sembie-Ferris is back at Peterborough Sports FC on a permanent basis ready to score more goals and support the team as we tackle another National League North campaign!

Mark Jones - Forward

Signed in the 2016/2017 season, Mark Jones is a club legend who has gone on to make over 250 appearances for The Turbines and scoring many goals.

Kaine Felix - Forward

Kaine signed for Sports in October 2023, returning to the club after a brief spell at the beginning of the 2022/23 season. Felix started his career at St. Neots and went on to play for Boston United, York, Stockport County, Leamington and Brackley Town before joining Guiseley in 2018.

Michael Gyasi - Forward

Having been monitored for quite a while by Peterborough Sports, Michael Gyasi is a valuable addition to the squad, Gyasi brings pace and experience with a calmness that is perfect for this league. Match Report

Hereford 3-0 South Shields



Hereford got the season off to a winning start with a 3-0 victory at home to South Shields.

The home side took the lead in the 26th minute through debutant Montel Gibson.

Andy Williams then doubled the lead early on in the second half before Yusifu Ceesay made it three in the 82nd minute.

The win puts Hereford third in the league whilst South Shields sit bottom.

Paul Caddis made two changes to the side that drew to Newport County in the final game of pre-season with Ceesay and Matt Preston coming in for Preston Bitemo and Cosmos Matwasa.

Elliott Dickman also made two alterations to the Mariners side from their last game of pre-season with Coleby Shepherd and Robert Briggs replacing Bryan Taylor and Ewan McGowan.

The Bulls started the brighter of the two sides but it was the visitors who had the first decent chance in the 13th minute when, after a quick break Paul Blackett was played in down the right side of the box but his shot was deflected just wide of the far post.

South Shields, who were now on top, had another good opportunity just three minutes later when Blackett pulled the ball back dangerously into the box forcing Aaron Chapman into an excellent save from close range.

The flurry of chances for the away side continued when Blackett beat Chapman to a ball over the top, he then got a shot off from the edge of the box but Lewis Hudson was back to clear off the line.

Hereford took the lead in the 26th minute when a misplaced pass from Shepherd put Gibson through on goal who slotted it past the keeper and into the bottom right for a goal on his debut.

Dickman's side had a great chance to equalise in the 31st minute when Blackett beat D'Ath to a ball over the top, he then rounded Chapman but the midfielder was back to clear off the line heroically.

Right on the cusp of half-time, Alex Babos had a great chance when the ball dropped to him inside the area after a Williams flick across the box but his shot was straight at the feet of Myles Boney meaning that the first half finished 1-0.

Caddis' side got off to a flying start in the second 45 when Babos fired a ball into the box for Williams who brought it down brilliantly and fired it just under the bar to make it two.

Gibson had the chance to get his second of the game just past the hour mark when a long ball over the top from Chapman dropped to the striker, he brought it down with an excellent first touch but his finish did not match as he fired wide.

In the 82nd minute, Tate Campbell broke forward down the right wing and played a perfect ball across to Ceesay who fired it into the bottom left first time to round off a brilliant display and end the game 3-0.

LOOKING BACK

Fred Potter

Throughout the season, we'll be taking a look back at previous Player of the Season winners from both Hereford United and Hereford FC.

Fred was a Black Country boy and proud of it. He played for Homer Street School in Cradley Heath before naturally graduating to Cradley Heath Juniors. Fred was originally an inside-right and a very good one too and in 1958, he was snapped up by Halesowen Town as an 18-year-old. After about 18 months, Fred had a short stay with Codsall Villa before signing for another Villa in 1959, none other than Aston Villa! He signed professional terms in 1959, still as an inside-right but when their Reserve keeper was injured at Lye Town, Fred took over between the sticks and never looked back. A rapidly-revised contract saw Fred make his debut between the sticks on Boxing Day 1959 and he went on to make three further first-team appearances in Villa's first-team campaign. Unfortunately, Fred was released on a free transfer at the end of the season so in the summer of 1962.

Now a goalkeeper by trade, Fred quickly earned a reputation for his fearless nature and in July 1962, he signed for Doncaster Rovers on a free transfer. Over the next two seasons, Fred became a regular in Rovers' Fourth Division side and in four seasons at Belle Vue, he made 124 Football League appearances and helped Rovers gain promotion to the old Third Division. In the summer of 1966, Fred dropped down into non-league football and signed for Southern League Premier side Burton Albion on a part-time basis, allowing him to take a job erecting fences. He was a fans' favourite and won their player-of-the-year award for 1969/70.

After four happy seasons with the Brewers, Hereford United's manager John Charles, stepped in and



persuaded him to move to Edgar Street. It turned out to be an inspired signing as Fred soon won the hearts of fans with his fearless displays and never-say-die attitude. He was no mean keeper either and during 1971/72, he kept no less than 38 clean sheets in all competitions. During the giantkilling FA Cup run of the same season, Fred was United's goalkeeping hero and at times, kept his team in the cup almost single-handedly. Fred was so cool, calm and collected under pressure that his teammates were convinced that it wasn't blood but ice that coursed through Fred's veins.

Despite his success and popularity, Fred was kept out of the side in 1972/73 by a young David Icke and only played nine League games in United's inaugural Football League season. When Icke was forced to quit the game due to his severe arthritis, Fred was looking forward to a season in goal for Hereford in their first season in the Third Division but tragically, it wasn't to be. On the opening day of United's 1973/74 campaign at Grimsby Town, Fred not only broke his wrist but later found out that he'd severely injured his cruciate ligament during the game. His knee turned brighter shades of blue and sadly, Fred never played again. After retirement from the game, Fred worked in the construction industry for Baldwin Durafencing. He settled in Stourbridge and had three sons but sadly, in later life, Fred suffered with Parkinson's' disease.

Sadly, last month the Hereford United and Giant Killing legend, Fred Potter passed away. The thoughts of everyone at the club are with Fred's wife, Margaret, and all his family and friends
