Many of the players have not played at this level before and it's going to take time for them to adjust and grow in confidence. We must all remember that, regardless of how positive the signs have generally been so far.

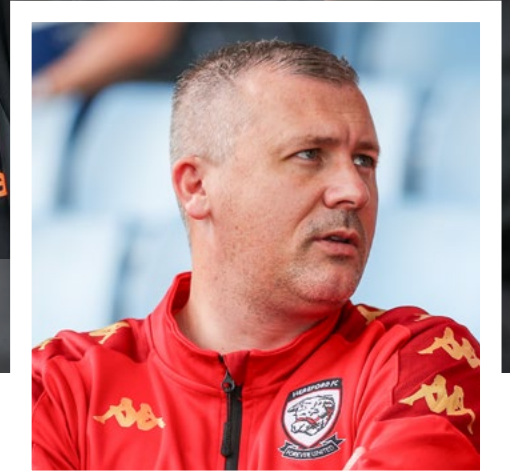

Peterborough Sports

Peter Crook - Goalkeeper

'Crooky' became an instant hero to Turbines fans by saving two penalties in the 2021/22 Southern League Premier Central play-off final against Coalville Town, securing promotion to the National League North. Identified as a top recruitment target by former manager Jimmy Dean, Peter Crook joined permanently in the summer of 2022 after a loan stint. He excelled in Step 2, earning the Manager's Player of the Year award for the 2022/23 season with over 15 clean sheets.

Matthew Tootle - Defender

Experienced Football League full-back Matthew Tootle signed from Grantham Town for the 2023/24 season, offering invaluable experience to the youthful squad. Despite stepping down in league levels previously, Tootle eagerly anticipates the challenge of National League North competition this season.

Hayden Cann - Defender

Young and promising defender Hayden Cann, highly regarded by parent club Lincoln City, joined on a season-long loan deal for the 2023/24 campaign from League One.

Ryan Fryatt - Defender

Having played Academy football at Norwich City and Cambridge Utd, Ryan Fryatt, a seasoned defender, significantly contributed to the 2021/22 promotion season. He scored 8 goals in his debut season and was key to the team's National League North debut, earning both Players Player and Supporters Player awards for the 2022/23 season.

Connor Johnson - Defender

A product of Northampton Town and Wolverhampton Wanderers academies, Connor Johnson bolstered the squad for the 2022/23 National League North adventure. He formed solid partnerships in defense, earning acclaim within non-league circles.

Dan Lawlor - Midfielder

Exceptional passer Dan Lawlor, who joined in the 2016/17 season, played a pivotal role in the club's UCL Premier division title. An energetic midfielder, he has risen through the ranks, becoming a Turbines Legend. Known for his engine and tenacity, Lawlor's a fan favorite.

Ben Fowkes - Forward

Leiston FC's standout player from Step 3, Ben Fowkes, signed for the 2023/24 season. With 21 goals and 8 assists last season, he's a tricky winger eager to make an impact in the National League North.

Josh McCammon - Midfielder

Technically gifted midfielder Josh McCammon signed from Northampton Town, playing a pivotal role in promotion seasons. His standout performances included crucial goals in play-off matches and a successful debut season in the National League North.

Mark Jones - Forward

A club legend with over 250 appearances, Mark Jones has been a key striker since the 2016/17 season. Known for his hard work, leadership, and goal-scoring ability, he's a vital presence both on and off the pitch.

Dan Jarvis - Midfield

Signed in 2020/21, Dan Jarvis impresses fans with his athleticism and work ethic. His versatility extends to different positions on the field, making him a valuable contributor.

Jordan Nicholson - Forward

Despite injuries, Jordan Nicholson's pace and trickery on the wing won fans' hearts since the 2019/20 season. His experience from spells at Peterborough United and Barnet enhances the team's attacking prowess.

Lewis Elsom - Goalkeeper

A product of Peterborough United's youth setup, Lewis Elsom is a reliable goalkeeper known for his contribution to back-to-back Northants Cup victories.

Hugh Alban-Jones - Midfielder

Joining in February 2023 after spells in Spain and local clubs, Hugh Alban-Jones offers all-round midfield abilities. After contributing to the 2022/23 season, he aims to solidify his role in the squad.

Luke Steele - Forward

Former professional goalkeeper Luke Steele, now a manager, played at the highest levels in Europe. Although he won't feature as a player, he's actively involved in coaching.

Roddy McGlinchey - Midfielder

Loaned from Peterborough United, Roddy McGlinchey is a young and talented midfielder with a promising future. His loan stint at AFC Rushden & Diamonds was successful.

Sidney Pereira - Forward

Described as a 'local gem,' Sidney Pereira impressed during pre-season and aims to establish himself after early experiences in the Peterborough United youth setup.

Michael Gash - Forward

A marquee signing, Michael Gash played a significant role in the promotion campaign of 2021/22. Combining playing with coaching, his experience benefits the team.

Matty Miles - Defender

Returning after two seasons away, defender Matty Miles played a crucial role during previous seasons at Step 3. His versatile skills from a successful youth career make him a valuable asset for Peterborough Sports.



The History

Peterborough Sports

Founded in 1908, Peterborough Sports Football Club carries a unique heritage linked to Brotherhoods Engineering Works, an emblematic factory team associated with the pioneering steam turbine engine manufacturer. This historical connection is vividly portrayed in the club's emblem and celebrated nickname, "The Turbines." After going through transitional phases as Bearings Direct in the 1990s, the club ultimately settled as Peterborough Sports.

Throughout these transformations, the club's steadfast home remained at Lincoln Road, which underwent a remarkable transformation starting in 2012, thanks to a combined effort that included the Football Foundation's support.

The club's competitive journey commenced in 1919 within the Northants League, capturing the title in its inaugural season. Progressing to the Peterborough League in 1923, the club's footprint expanded. Notably, Peterborough Sports faced the formidable Tottenham Hotspur before the onset of WWII, an era when the club's ground boasted a stand stretching the full length and drew crowds of over 3,000 for local showdowns, particularly against Peterborough & Fletton United, now known as Peterborough United.

Success had its ebbs and flows, with sporadic triumphs punctuating the years. Following the 1920 Northants

League victory, a Peterborough League Division 3 title arrived in 1926. A barren spell ensued until 1976, marked by the reclamation of the Peterborough Division 3 title. A similar feat occurred in 1981. The 1990s brought a glint of prosperity, characterized by an ascent to the Peterborough Premier Division and back-to-back Northants Lower Junior Cup victories in 1994 and 1995, a period overseen by the present board advisor, Stephen "Tommy" Cooper.

The onset of the 2006/07 season heralded a dramatic resurgence for Peterborough Sports. Under the stewardship of Al Lenihan & Tommy Flynn, the club secured both the Peterborough Premier Division and the Northants Junior Cup titles, marking a significant milestone in its history. However, subsequent years ushered in challenges that nearly brought the club to the brink of dissolution. It was through the steadfast dedication of life president Colin Day, Secretary Roger Martin, and manager Chris Bartlett that the club's survival was ensured.

In January 2011, Tommy Cooper's return as Chairman sparked a new chapter for the club. The 2010/11 season witnessed the club clinching the Challenge Cup and returning to the Peterborough League Premier Division. Managed by Seamus Morgan, the club's trajectory continued to rise, culminating in securing a spot in the United Counties League.

A notable facet of Peterborough Sports' story lies in its Reserves. Reconstituted early in the decade, they surged forward with three successive promotions and emerged as Peterborough Sports Development. Their journey culminated in claiming the Peterborough League Premier Division in 2016/17.

The club's debut season in the UCL was a mix of promise and disappointment, prompting the appointment of Chris Plummer in 2014. The 2015/16 season, however, emerged as a watershed moment. Under Jimmy Dean's leadership, the club clinched the title with a commanding lead, winning the first 23 games of the season. A series of triumphs followed, including the UCL League Cup, the Northants Junior Cup, and the prestigious Hinchingsbrooke Cup. This remarkable feat earned them the moniker 'Fourmidables.'

The 2016/17 season continued this success story, with Peterborough Sports securing the UCL Premier Division title and setting records for points and goals. Their run in the FA Vase captured attention, and the transition to higher leagues brought its own set of challenges. Yet, the club persevered and eventually earned promotion to Step 2 in the 2021/22 season, marking a remarkable achievement in its journey through the Non-League pyramid.

HUST 50/50 Matchday Draw Darlington – What a Splendid Atmosphere!

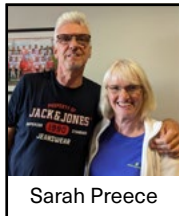

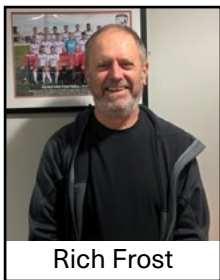

MATCH REPORT | Hereford 2-7 Cardiff City U19s



Last Sunday Edgar Street played host to a day of women's football. With the Lionesses starting the day with a narrow 1-0 defeat in the World Cup final which was shown in the Executive Club, the Bullettes took to the pitch to take on Cardiff City U19s. It would naturally be a tough affair against a member of the FA Women's National League South's youth side.

Hereford got off to a good start and maintained their shape against a well drilled side. Cardiff kept possession well and moved the ball quickly, but the Bullettes kept their discipline in defence. Chances started to come for the visitors, but the Bluebirds were unable to work the Bulls Keeper Hannah Pritchard.

20 minutes in, the Bullettes took the lead. Pressure high up the pitch from Millie Griffiths caused trouble for the Cardiff back line and gave Griffiths the opportunity to grab the opener. A good finish past

the Cardiff keeper gave the Bullettes the advantage.

Just before the break, the Bullettes were punished for not clearing the ball and this time the Bluebirds took their chance to level the score.

Cardiff came out of the second half and started to show their class. Two quick goals came soon after the break. Cardiff City then started to run away with it, two more goals from the Bluebirds took the scoreline to 5-1.

Hereford grabbed one back from a cross into captain, Sian Bull, to slot home. City kept up their dominance and scored another two before the full time whistle.

Malcolm Cowell, Head of women's football after the match: "We played against a well coached and drilled team and could see they had been together for sometime. This will be another learning curve for the girls but it how we learn to come back from this, will tell us about the group. I believe in this group of players and that they will bounce back ahead of our first league game on Sunday 3rd September at Edgar Street."
