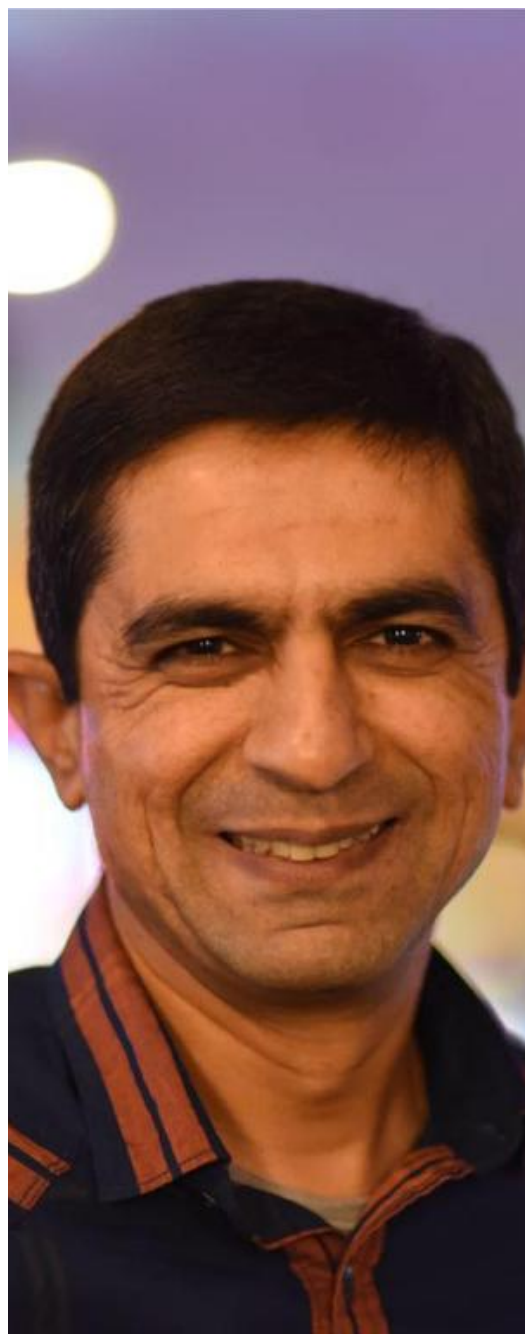
# MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

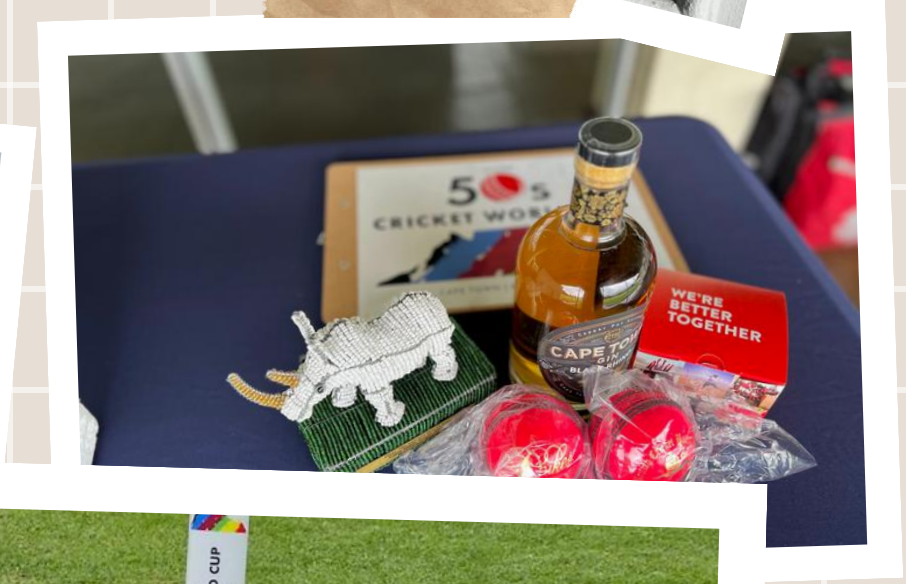

# TEAM USA OVER 60 TO CANADA

MCUSA Over 60 team is about to embark on a tour of Toronto, CANADA to participate in a multi nation championship- the CANADIAN CUP!! Master's O 60 is in a rebuilding phase and working towards where the MC-USA O 50 team is in terms of fitness and skills. Beginning of this year the O 60 team made a tour of Barbados and experienced mixed results. Just as the O 50's had a wake-up call on their tour of UK few years back the O 60's team too saw firsthand the importance and impact of fitness.

Fresh blood, quicker legs, fitter bodies and higher skill levels were the need of the hour for the O 60 team to be competitive in ensuing competitions. A relentless drive from Arun Vitalla, Jeevaka Weerasinghe, David Martil to meet the above requirements resulted in 58 cricketers across the country over the age group of 60 showing keen interest in participating in a Trials cum tournament in LA a month back. Proven talents like Ajith Jayasinghe, Jeevaka Weerasinghe, Abrar Ahmed, P De Silva, Imran will be turning 60 come 2024 which will tremendously add to an already good pool of fitter and skilled cricketers in Mc-USA O 60 category. As these cricketers have not yet turned 60 they are missing on the Canadian tour.

The team to Canada is led by Ravi Suri with Chandrakant Barlingay as the vice-Captain. The coach cum manager on tour is Susheel Bhat an able administrator- cricketer- team owner.

# **HIGH INTENSITY INTERVAL TRAINING**

Have you ever heard of high-intensity interval training (HIIT) and wondered what it is? It sounds complicated, but it doesn't have to be.

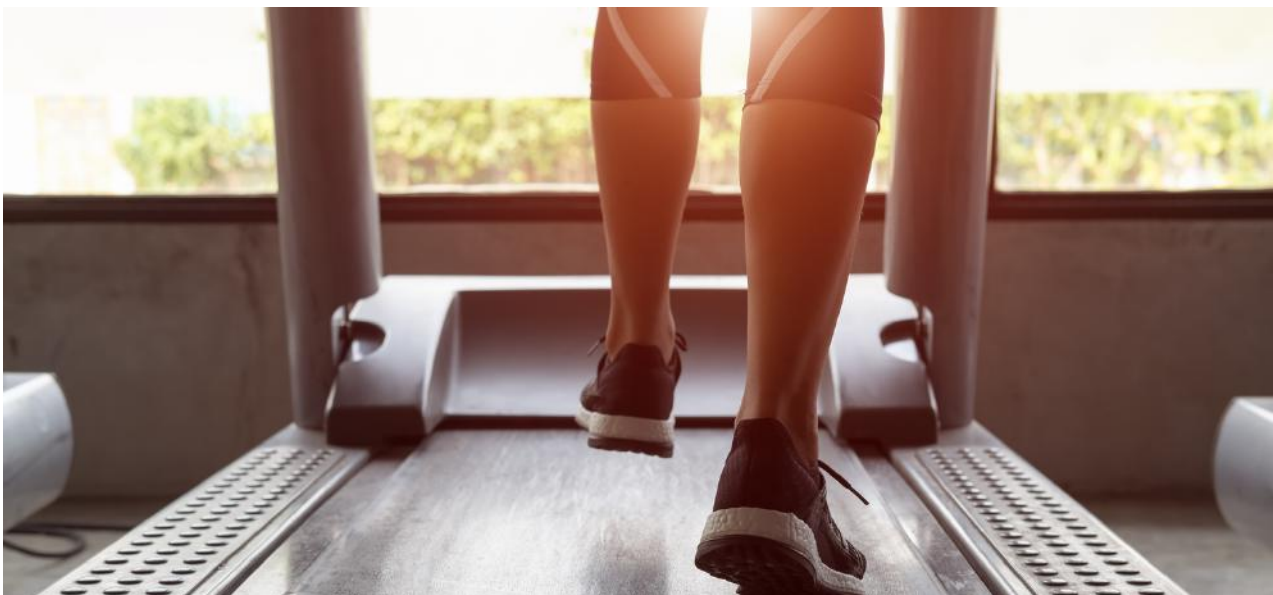
HIIT is a type of workout that switches between high effort and recovery periods. HIIT can be modified to meet your needs and fitness level. This makes it accessible to adults of all ages. The goal is to switch between high and low levels of effort based on which activity level is right for you.

There are many ways to do a HIIT workout. It can be done with little or no equipment or in any style of exercise you like. If you like to bike, for instance, you can ride for 30 seconds at a high effort and 90 seconds at a lower level of effort to recover.

HIIT is effective in improving heart health. In fact, it can improve heart health in a shorter time when compared to other types of exercise. HIIT can also improve the maximum volume of oxygen the body can use, known as VO2 max. The better your VO2 max, the better your heart can pump blood. This also means it will be harder to get out of breath. These are protective factors against heart disease.

Additionally, HIIT workouts may increase muscle strength, improve cholesterol, lower blood sugar and improve insulin resistance, boost metabolism, increase ability to do exercise that involves pushing your heart rate, lower blood pressure, help with weight loss

Of course, you should always check with your doctor before starting any exercise program. But HIIT is safe for adults of all ages and may well be a great option for you.

## HIGH INTENSITY INTERVAL TRAINING

Some general guidelines:

Pick an exercise that is safe for you. Older adults may want to choose low-impact exercises like walking or using a stationary bike to prevent injury

Variety is best. Alternate HIIT workouts with other types to prevent overuse injuries. HIIT workouts should be spread out throughout the week with one to two days in between each workout to allow time to recover.

No matter what the exercise, it's important to make sure you use proper form. Poor form can put you at risk of injury. Correct form will have the best results. If you aren't sure where to start, schedule a session with an exercise physiologist or trainer.

The high-intensity interval should feel challenging. But it's important to start slow. Think about intensity as a ten-point scale, with zero as no effort and ten as the hardest effort. Start with high effort at a three and recovery at a two.

For example: Start at an intensity of one with an easy walking warm-up. Walk faster or uphill to increase the intensity to a three. You should be breathing heavily but still be able to maintain a conversation. Stay here for one to two minutes. Move into the recovery period at an effort of two for two to three minutes. Move between these high and low effort levels for a period of 30 minutes.

"As you continue on your HIIT journey, you can slowly increase effort during the high-intensity interval," It is important that high intensity feels challenging and uncomfortable but not dangerous to your health. Ultimately, you want your high effort to reach around an eight and your recovery period to around a four.

Adding HIIT to your exercise routine can provide variety and result in health benefits. As always, be sure to start slow and check with your doctor before starting a new exercise program.

As a commentator, my experience has been both rewarding and challenging. Commentary requires a good understanding of the subject matter, whether it's sports, politics, or current events, and the ability to provide insightful analysis and commentary that engages and informs the audience. Cricket is a complex sport, and providing insightful commentary requires a deep understanding of the game, its rules, and its nuances.

To start with, the tournament was held over three different cricket grounds: Moosa Cricket Stadium, Balquees Cricket field, and Prairie View Cricket Ground. So, every game was a different experience to commentate on. There were 16 different teams from all over the states for the Houston regionals, which were held in March 2023. Some professional players had played domestic level cricket back in their countries. So, as a commentator, you got to have some insights about the grounds, pitches, teams, and the players. This helps to engage the audience and make the game more enjoyable and informative for viewers.

The experiences during commenting were really wonderful because the quality of cricket was so good, I never got bored to commentate even on a single delivery. Some of the matches went right down to the wire. The players were fantastic and, as it's called the 'Gentlemen's Game,' every player played in the right spirit of the game. There were no on-field arguments, players were supportive of each other, and respecting the umpire's decisions, so it was a positive atmosphere overall. The tournament being for those who were over 40 years of age, I was amazed to see the fitness of the players. It was really good to see the passion players still have at this age towards the sport.



# MASTERS COMMENTARY EXPERIENCE

There were some really good experiences off the field with some players and umpires that I met during the tournament. We had team get-togethers before the start of both the regional tournaments where all the players would get to know each other. I got to know many players and other staff because of such events being held off the field. Again, there was a Karaoke night, table-tennis tournament being held to get out from the game mindset and have some good light-hearted moments for everyone. The food served during these events and during the innings break was delicious.

In conclusion, my cricket commentary experience for the Masters tournament has been an exciting and fulfilling journey. It has allowed me to share my passion for the sport with others and engage with fans, players, umpires, and organizers from all over the world. While it can be challenging at times, the opportunity to analyze the game in real-time and provide insights to the audience makes it an incredibly rewarding job to do. It was a memorable experience overall.



# MASTERS UMPIRES EXPERIENCE

An umpire is a person who has the authority to make decisions about events on the cricket field according to the Laws of Cricket. He / She is the custodian of the laws of the game during its duration. Umpiring is often referred to as a thankless job; a good umpire is never noticed while the so-called bad umpire is all over the front pages of the media be it social or other forms. Spectators go to the stadia to watch a batsman in full flow or a bowler in full flight. A Viv Richards or a Michael Holding put bums on the chairs across stadiums the world over. One can't say the same about Dickie Bird or David Sheppard two of the most likeable and genial umpires. A batsman or a bowler can have an off day and nothing much happens but if an umpire has a bad day the roof comes down. The only time the umpire gets applause is at the beginning of the day when both umpires walk out signaling the commencement of play for the day.

Umpiring is the toughest job and every time an LBW decision is made, the umpire is displeasing one of the team's. It is a damn if you and damn if you don't situation. Either way umpire is losing. A batsman can switch off when he is not on strike a bowler can switch off when he is resting between spells but the umpire has no such luxury. Every ball of the entire duration of the game the umpire has to concentrate and be focused.

To quote from my personal experience as an umpire, a few years back I officiated a game between Ceylon and Cavaliers in NJ in the Millennium Cricket League. I went to the game overconfident in my umpiring abilities given that I was playing the game at this league level for close to 4 decades. I was pretty confident of my knowledge of the rules and self-assured of making the call come the moment. That moment came sooner than later when the Ceylon medium pacer trapped Xavier Marshall ( former West Indies test Player ) dead plumb in front of the stumps. It was as plumb an LBW as it can get. To my utter dismay my shoulder and finger froze and I could NOT lift my finger to indicate an out. Reason; I was seeing a BIG name player in front of me, X which is Marshall's nickname was is murderous form that year and was a name to reckon with. All this may have played on my mind and I made a miserable decision which I regret to this day almost 6 years on. I learnt a huge lesson that day on how many factors come into play when an umpire is officiating the game.

# MASTERS UMPIRES EXPERIENCE

An umpire is the life and blood of the game and we at Masters are fortunate to have many willing to officiate and be part of the second innings of our lives. Umpires are humane and prone to making mistakes. If I say all the umpires in master's make impeccable decisions I will be flattering to deceive. Like us players umpires too make mistakes, they too go back and learn from mistakes. The best part of umpires in MC-USA is the bias quotient is nonexistent. Umpires in MC-USA are extremely professional in that regard. MC-USA has several umpires doing an outstanding job. Jatin Kanwar from MA region officiated in the recently conducted over 50 world Cup in Cape Town. Daniel Meredith from San Diego is currently officiating in the on-going Minor League Cricket games in CA. These are moments of pride for all of us in master's USA.

Many umpires from various parts of USA give their valuable time and knowledge of the game to officiate in various Masters tournaments be it National, Zonal, or special one-off tournaments like the one we had in LA for the Over 60 where Kalpesh Patel, Daniel Meredith, Jatin Karvir, and other umpires officiated. We had a few umpires from the Caribbean officiate in many of MC-USA games in Houston TX.

We will soon see participation of umpires from South Africa in our upcoming tournaments in Houston TX. All this calls for tremendous coordination, networking and organizing skills. Arun Vittala who has the ability to multitask is again at the forefront of coordinating umpire resourcing and scheduling.

Let me take this opportunity to thank each and every umpire and the umpiring fraternity as a body for their tremendous contributions to MC-USA and cricket in general. It is the toughest job in the game and the most under rated one at that. Hats off to each one of you.

## THE GREY ASHES

It was England take came away victorious and won the Grey Ashes this summer, as they Australia 3-2 across a five ODI series, with matches taking place all over England.

The Grey Ashes is a series that took place between the two Over 60s sides of both England and Australia, this summer it was hosted in the UK with matches taking place at Thame, Burton, Southport and Birkdale, Chipping Campden, and Littlehampton.

The first match of the series took place on the 12th of July and was a rain-reduced affair that came down to the wire. England were sent into bat first and despite some early troubles, they managed to recover well to post 201 in their reduced 42 overs. Their innings were highlighted by Edward Gordon Lennox's 49 off 51 balls, and Mel Hussein's 30 off 59. While Bill Blair would manage to take four wickets across his 9 overs, to post a final stat line of 9-42-1-4.

After DLS the Australians were set 203 to win, in which they narrowly chased down with two balls remaining the win the first game of the series. Both Andrew Walsh and Peter Jensen would pass 50 with them scoring 58 and 70 respectively, and they finished on a total of 206/4 (41.4).

The Australians would head to Burton CC with a 1-0 lead.

Four days later both sides would turn up the heat. England would win the toss and put their counterparts into bat, Australia responded well to this with opener Walsh putting up 92 runs of his own off just 100 balls, while Graeme Pavey would also cross 50, scoring 51 before losing his wicket. Posting a total of 246, a response from England was needed, and that's exactly what they did.

The top half of the batting order was on absolute fire for the England Over 60s side. Captain Richard Merriman top scoring at 67, while three other batters, Nick Gaywood, John Butterworth and Gordon Lennox would all pass 35. As they'd chase down the total with 8 balls to spare.

During the third ODI, we saw 6 of the best performances of the series, on both sides of the ball. During the first innings, Australia would once again bat first, and took it in stride, with captain Eric Higgins scoring 91 runs off just 92, while Jensen would follow that up with 86 runs off 90 balls to set a mammoth total of 259 runs for England to chase down, however, this total could have been a lot higher, if it was not for Marcus Young, the English spinner would take three wickets across his last three overs, which helped reduce the potential damage the Australian attack was laying in, as they went from 227-5 to 258-8 with Young only conceding five an over during that period.

With a huge total on the board to chase, England took it on head-on. Losing just one wicket in the process, they'd reach 263 and pass the total in 42.3 overs, while losing just one wicket. Merriman followed up his innings-leading knock from the second ODI, with another good performance scoring 72, while Tony Birbeck batting third would also pass 70 when he reached 74 off 67 balls. However, it was Nick Gaywood who would round off the highlight reel of the third ODI, and scored the first century of the series, when he finished on 108. Sealing the 2-1 series lead for the English.

The fourth match taking place at Chipping Campden was another close one, this time the biggest performance happening with the ball as Young would once again finish strong, taking a fifer in the process and stopping Australia from reaching the total they needed to win.

Once again England would start strong with all four of the top four passing 40, however, it was Hussein this time that top scored with 67, just pipping the 64 set by Merriman as he opened well again. Leaving Australia with the biggest total of the series to chase 289.

The Aussies would start valiantly with their top five all passing the 30 mark, it would be fought back equally by Nick Newman and Young. Although Newman would only take the one wicket, he held up an end well creating pressure the Young would capitalise on finishing with a line of 6.4-38-0-5, as Australia would finish 240 all out, giving England the victory and with it, they'd win the Grey Ashes.

Although the fifth ODI was a dead rubber, it truly showed the strength of the Australian side that England had been battling the whole time. Outshining the home team, with the bat, ball and in the field. In a rain reduced 34 over match. They'd go out there and score 229 as once again Jensen and Blair would shine as they'd score 72 and 56 respectively. Blair's 56 coming off just 35 balls in what was a phenomenal performance. Then the visitors would go out and shine even brighter with the ball, restricting an England team that had been scoring runs for fun to below 200. As they finished 199/9 with the only score of note being Hussein's 40 off 40.

Finalising the series score at 3-2, with Jensen finishing as the top run scorer with 262 runs across the 5 matches, while Marcus Young would finish top of the wicket tacker leaderboard taking 10 wickets, highlighted by that fifer in the fourth ODI.

## THE OVER 40 GLOBAL CUP

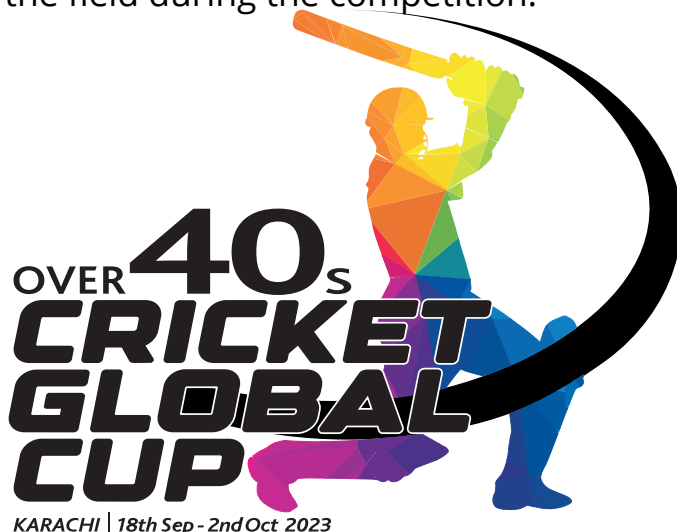
The Pakistan Veterans Cricket Association (PVCA) is set to create history of sorts by staging the inaugural Over-40s Cricket Global Cup in Karachi from September 18th to October 2nd this year. This tournament has come to fruition mainly due to the untiring efforts of Fawad Khan. Besides hosts Pakistan, there will be 7 other countries participating in the tournament including Teams from Australia, West Indies, Canada, USA, UAE, Hong Kong and Nepal. The first-ever Over-40s CGC is scheduled to be played on a single group round-robin format with the top four teams of the preliminary rounds to qualify for the semifinals.

The PVCA has been on the lookout for expanding veterans cricket and it has been in the forefront in facilitating international tours and events. With the kind of efforts its officials are putting in continuously, the upcoming Over-40s CGC is certain to become another feather in the cap of the PVCA.

Meanwhile as many as five venues of Karachi will be used for holding the matches of the Over-40s CGC. National Bank Stadium, will be hosting the matches, along with Karachi Gymkhana Cricket Ground, NBP Sports Complex, Moin Khan Cricket Academy and Southend Club Cricket Stadium.

All group matches of Pakistan's team, one semi-final and final will be taking place at the National Bank Stadium. All these matches will be telecast live on PTV Sports while all other games will be live streamed with 8 to 9 cameras and a drone setup with running commentary in English.

This will be the first international experience for Masters Cricket USA in the Over 40 Arena. Former test cricketers and international players are expected to represent various countries in this competition. Pakistan greats Shahid Afridi, Yousuf Khan, Misbah-ul-Haq and Abdul Razzaq are also lined up to take the field during the competition.

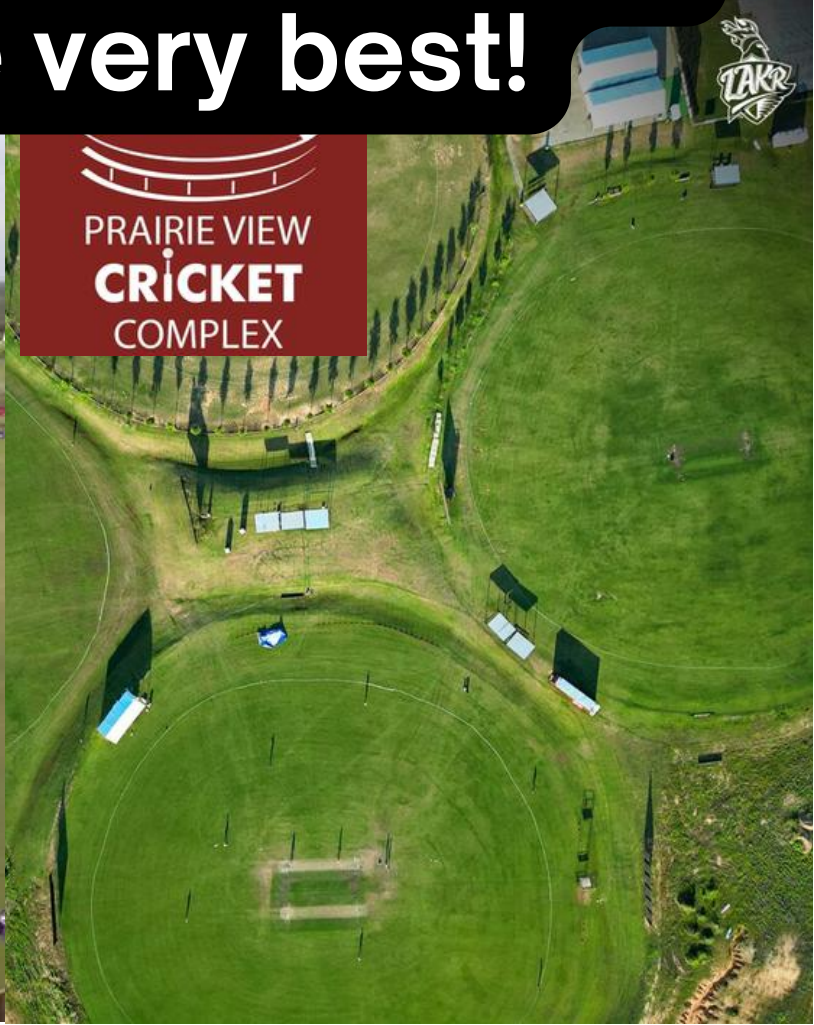
