53 YEARS OF ATROCITIES BY THE CPP-NPA-NDF IN THE PHILIPPINES



Skeletal remains dug out in the infamous CTG killing field at Mt. Sapang Dako, Brgy. Calinisan, Inopacan, Leyte, Philippines. The site has been referred to as **'The Garden'**. The bones were believed to be those of the victims of purging (locally known as **Oplan Ahos** or **Kampanyang Ahos**) launched by the Communist Party of the Philippines, New People's Army and National Democratic Front. Families of the victims were able to file criminal cases against Jose Maria Sison, his wife and 36 other CTG members by virtue of criminal case numbers 08-262163 (formerly known as H-1581) and 14-306533 to 14-306546 (14 counts) for murder (15 counts).

FOREWORD

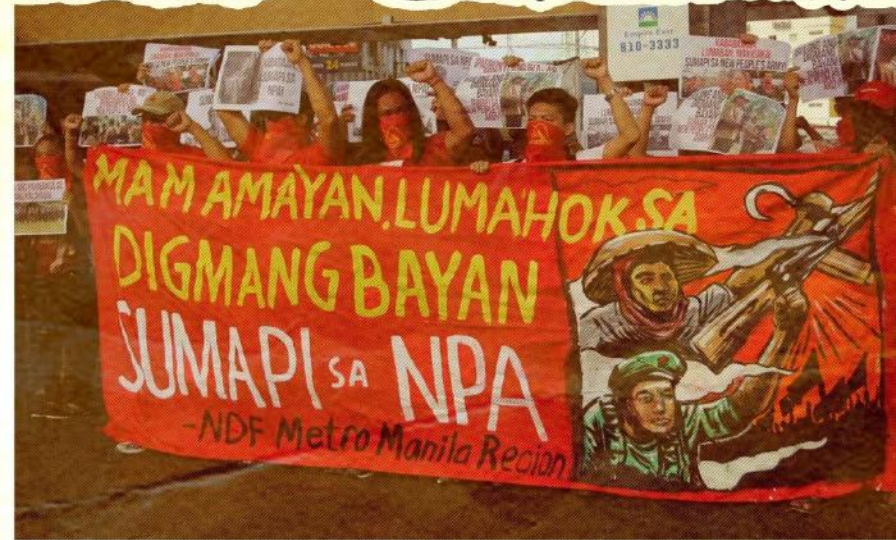
53 Years of Thirst for Blood in Waging a Revolution

To put a stop to the 50 years of exploitation, these facts and accounts hope to heal the wounds that are tormenting the Filipinos and to get the justice long denied.

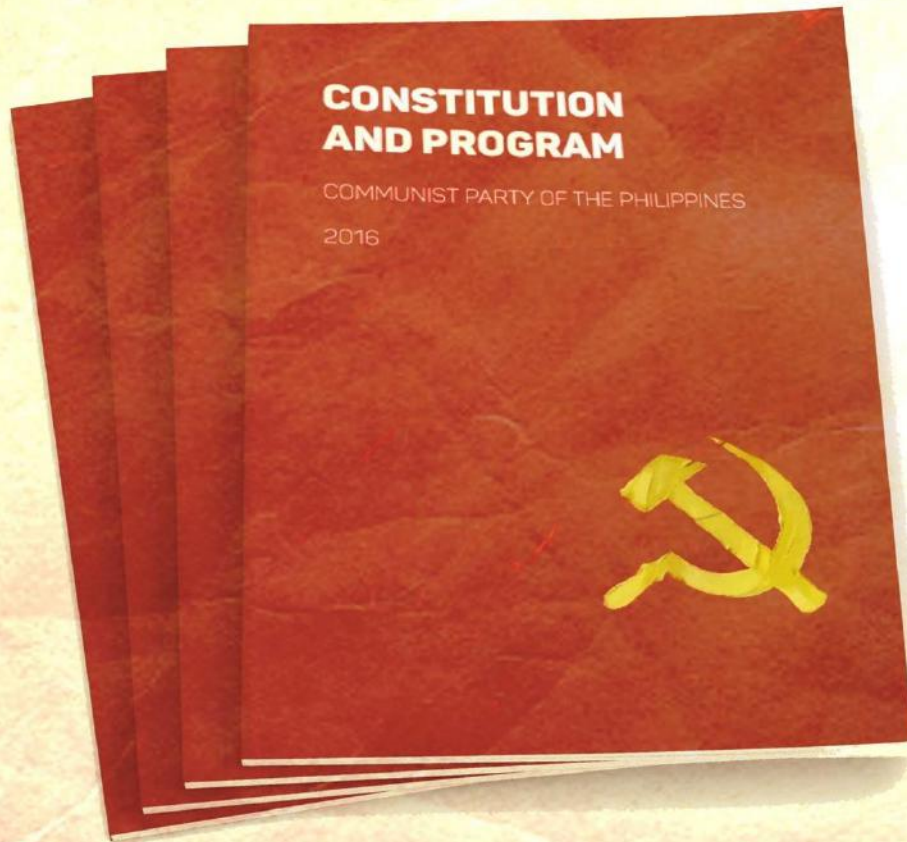

Chapter 1

THE DECEPTION BEGINS

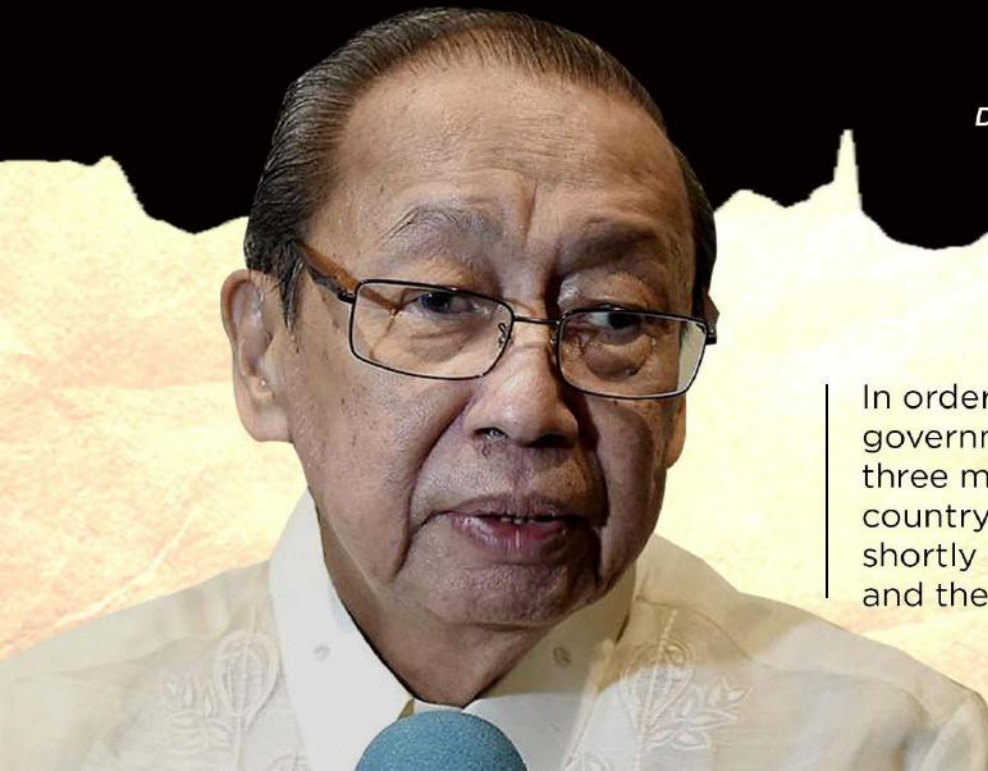


On December 26, 1968, the Communist Party of the Philippines (CPP) was established. With the direction of its founding fathers under the leadership of Jose Maria Sison, it followed the Marx, Lenin, and Mao Zedong ideologies which sought to overthrow the Philippine government through armed uprising and establish a communist system.

In order to carry out the plan to overthrow the incumbent government of that time, the CPP-NPA-NDF masterminded three major events that changed the history of the country - the **First Quarter Storm in 1970** which was shortly followed by the **Plaza Miranda Bombing in 1971** and the **MV Karagatan Shipment in 1972.**

THE FIRST QUARTER STORM

Coined by Jose Maria Sison, the First Quarter Storm was the **huge anti-government youth revolution** in the first three months of 1970. It propelled the **Kabataang Makabayan** and **National Union of Students of the Philippines (NUSP)** to conduct series of violent strikes, protests and demonstrations.



During the period of civil unrest, top CPP cadres under the leadership of Jose Maria Sison led violent demonstrations that provoked more police brutality resulting to overwhelming youth outrage and revolts.

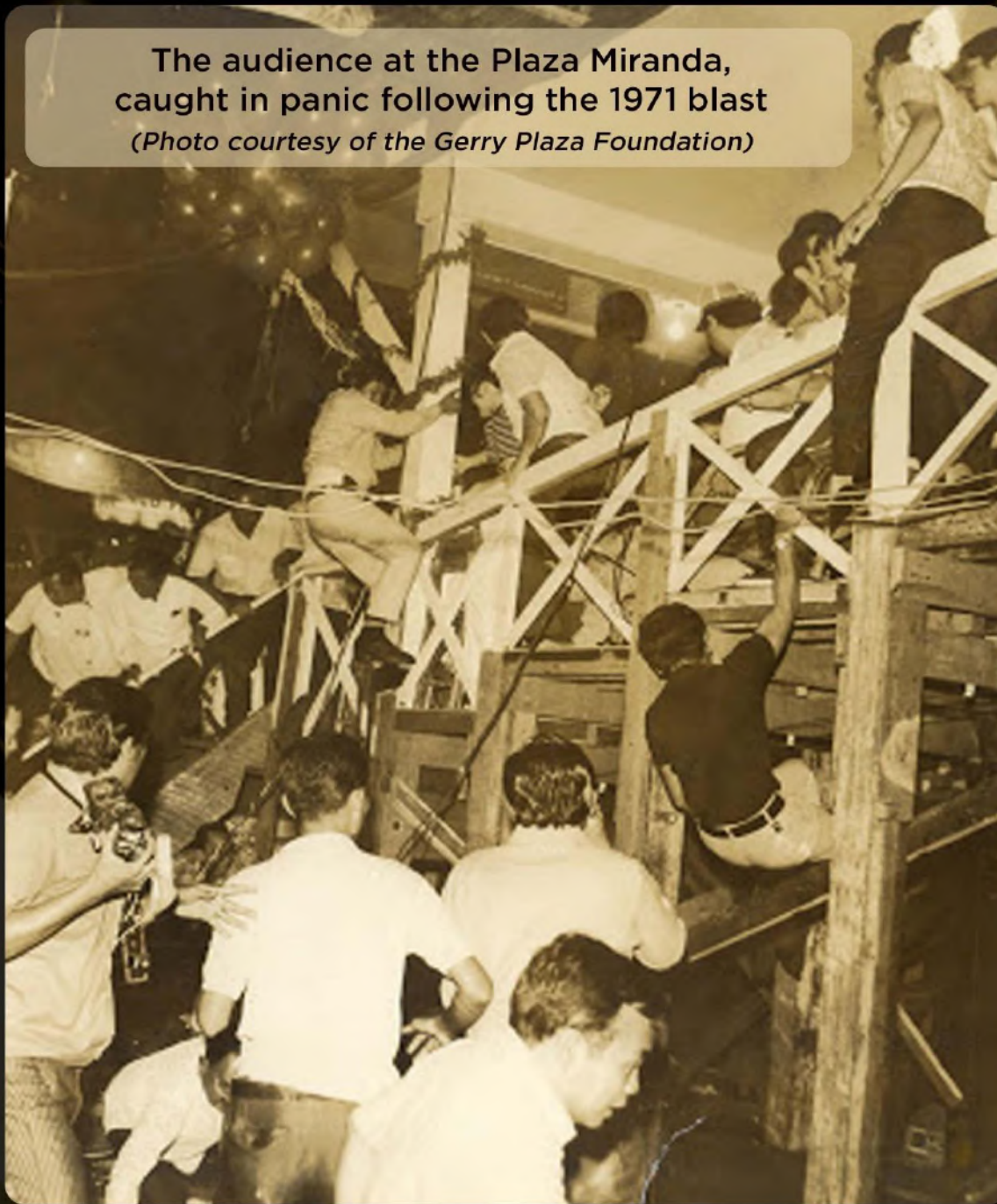

THE 1971 PLAZA MIRANDA BOMBING

To achieve political polarization, the Communist Terrorist Group (CTG) launched a bloody attack in the **Miting de Avance** of then President Ferdinand Marcos. It was purposely designed to achieve the CTG's first Great Leap Forward.

The **Plaza Miranda Bombing** is the biggest and the bloodiest crime in the history of the Philippines.



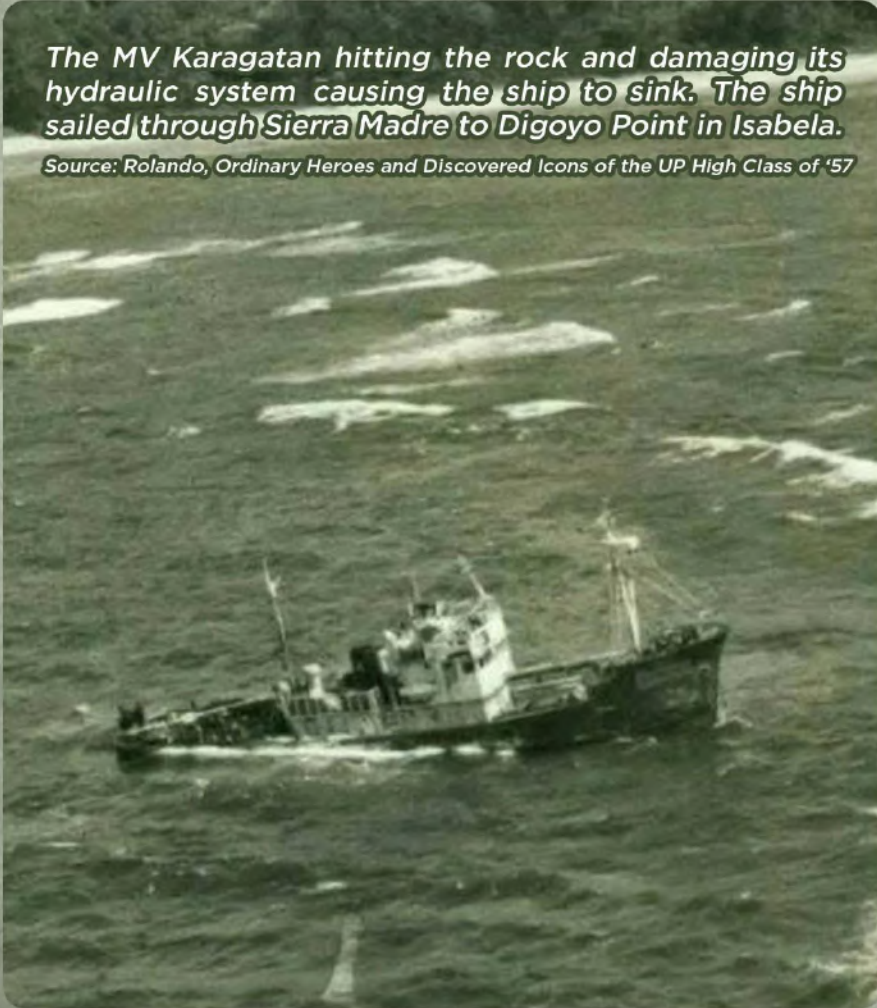

The **MV Karagatan** was a ship vessel utilized in the infiltration of high-powered rifles, ammunitions, 40-millimeter rocket launchers, rocket projectiles, communication equipment and other assorted war materials by the CTG.

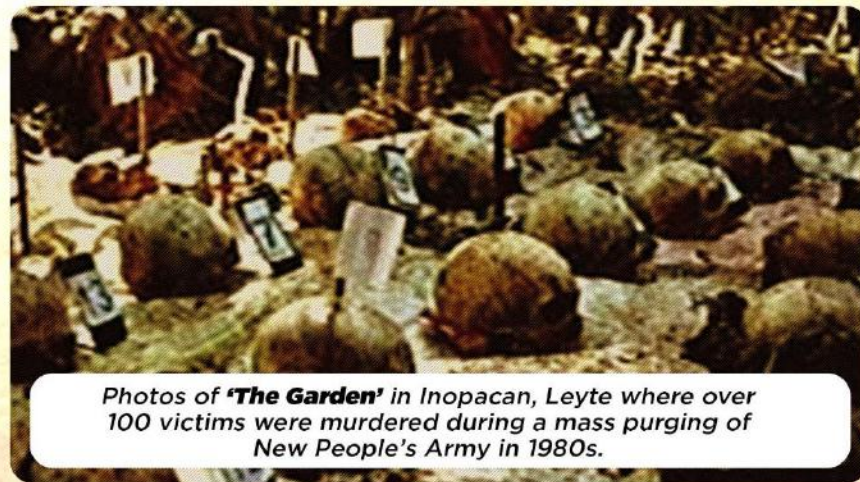
Chapter 2

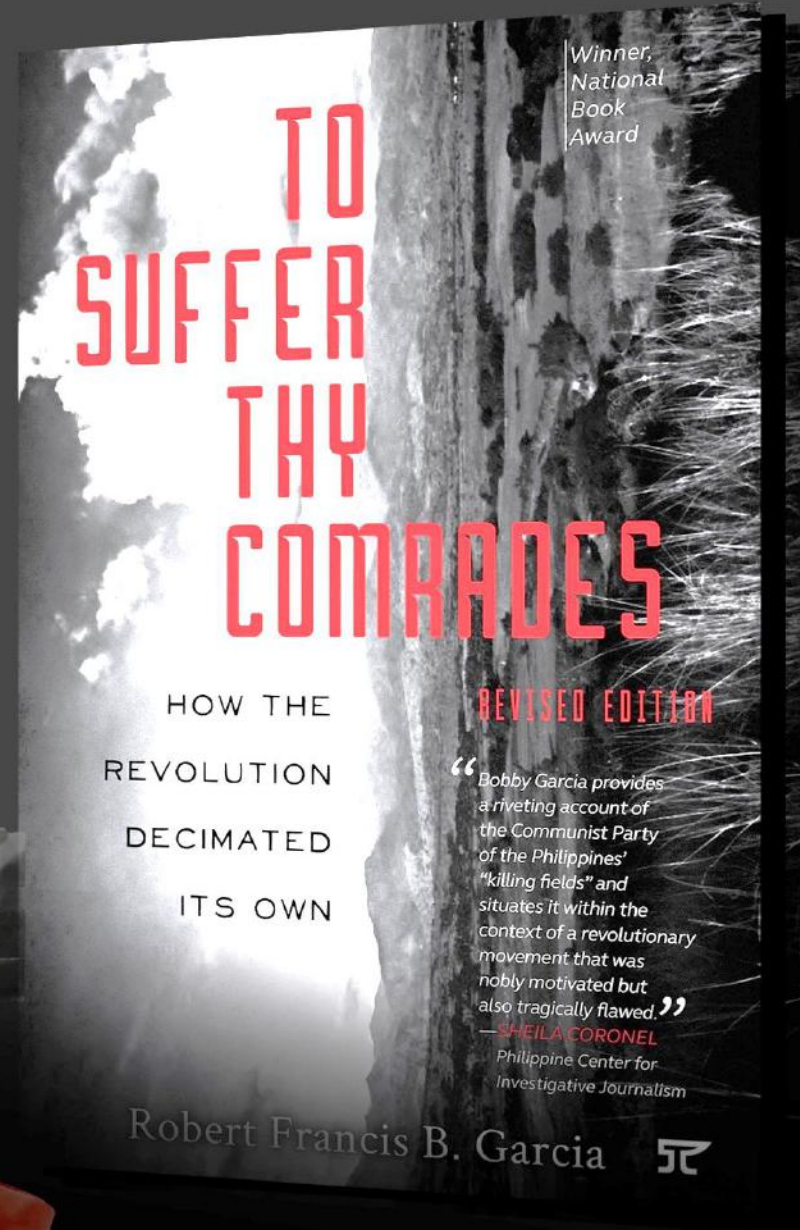
The skeletal remains of **Gregorio Eras** who was killed by the NPA that was exhumed at Sitio Kaintsikan in Baybay, Leyte.

BURNING OF EQUIPMENT

The CTG inflicts acts of terrorism against government projects like farm-to-market roads and transportation system. They purposely prohibit entry to these roads for once reached by government services thereby, the CTG becomes irrelevant, losing power in the communities they want to control. Moreover, burning of heavy equipment owned by multi-national companies that provide jobs to Filipinos is an inevitable act of the CTG in their desperate attempt to paralyze the economy.

MASS PROTESTS AND MARCHES

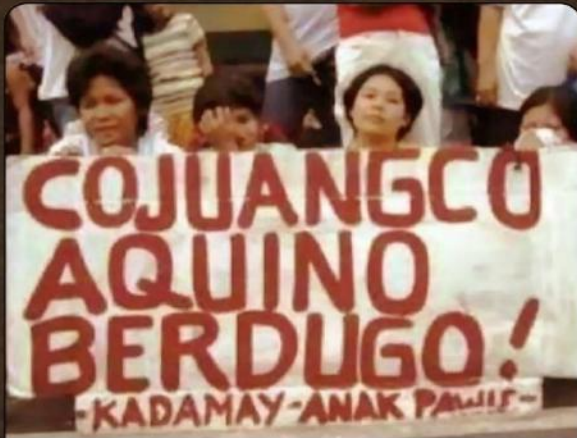

CTG'S IMPACT TO THE LABOR SECTOR

From 1995-2016, 462 industries and businesses had closed down due to the radical labor infiltration of the CPP through the Kilusang Mayo Uno (KMU).

More than half of these were businesses and industries in Central Luzon, Calabarzon and NCR. 250,000 people lost their jobs.

Reportedly, the country lost GDP income at 1.75% per annum or roughly a commutative average of more than \$2.4 billion including income projects for the succeeding 5 years.

Chapter 4

LUMAD AND YOUTH EXPLOITATION



CONTROL OF LUMAD COMMUNITIES

The CTG were able to establish Lumad Revolutionary Organization (ROL) under a shadow government that undermines the country's basic political structure (the barangay) and the integrity of the Lumad's culture and tradition. This further led to the establishment of Left-Leaning Organization (LLO) projects in the Indigenous People (IP) Communities like livelihood, basic social services¹ and establishment of CTG's informal schools known as Salugpungan and others.²

Lumad is a CTG-coined Visayan term which means "native" or "Indigenous People."

This group of indigenous people comprises 13 ethnic tribes namely Blaan, Bukidnon, Higaonon, Mamanwa, Mandaya, Manobo, Mansaka, Sangir, Subanen, Tagabawa, Tagakaulo, Tasaday, and T'boli.

The CTG established Organs of political power in the Indigenous Cultural Communities of these indigenous people.³

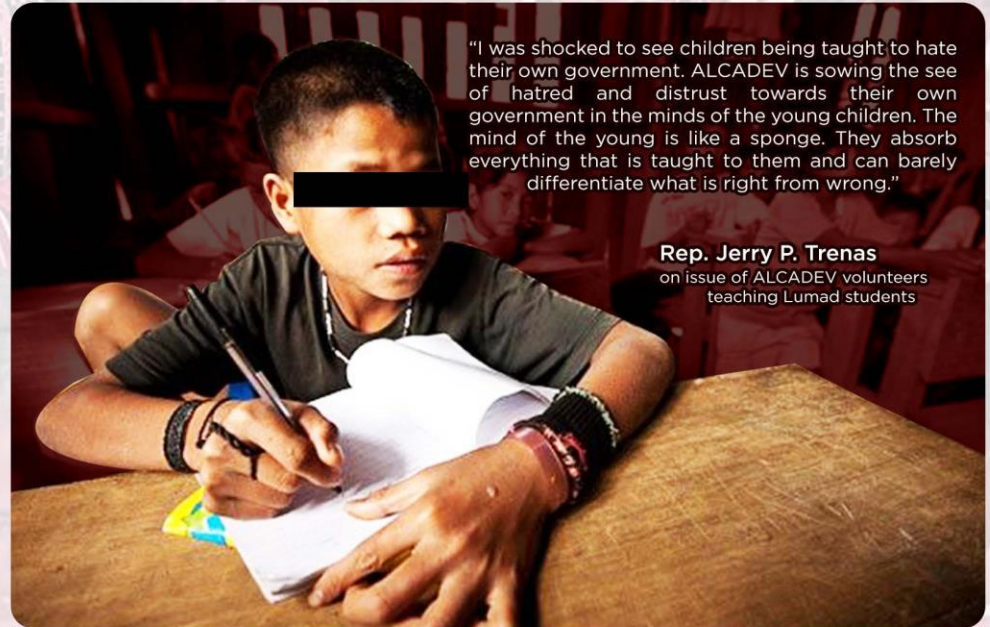

Through the ROL and LLO's established community interventions, the CTG were able to gain the trust and confidence of the Indigenous People / Indigenous Cultural Communities (IP/ICC), believing that the CTG is a better alternative government in the highlands. As a result, the NPA utilizes the IP/ICC as their sanctuary. Having terrorist in their communities, many IPs had died under the NPA's kangaroo courts.

Furthermore, they used hapless and vulnerable IP in their propaganda efforts bringing them to metro manila to show dissent against the government.

KILLING OF LUMAD LEADERS

Missing IP leaders found in “Lakbay-Hukay”

“LAKBAY HUKAY” was an interagency-initiated program where remains of IP leaders murdered by the CPP-NPA were exhumed in various areas in Mindanao IP/ICC. This program was initiated by IP Mandatory Representatives (IPMR) of different local government units together with PNP Scene of the Crime Operatives (PNP SOCO), National Bureau of Investigations (NBI) and Barangay Officials.

With the invigorated AFP campaigns in the IP/ICC, many IP leaders defected from the CTG’s shadow government.

With this development, they conducted systematic and deliberated murder of these IP leaders resulting to considerable number of deaths.

ORPHANED CHILDREN

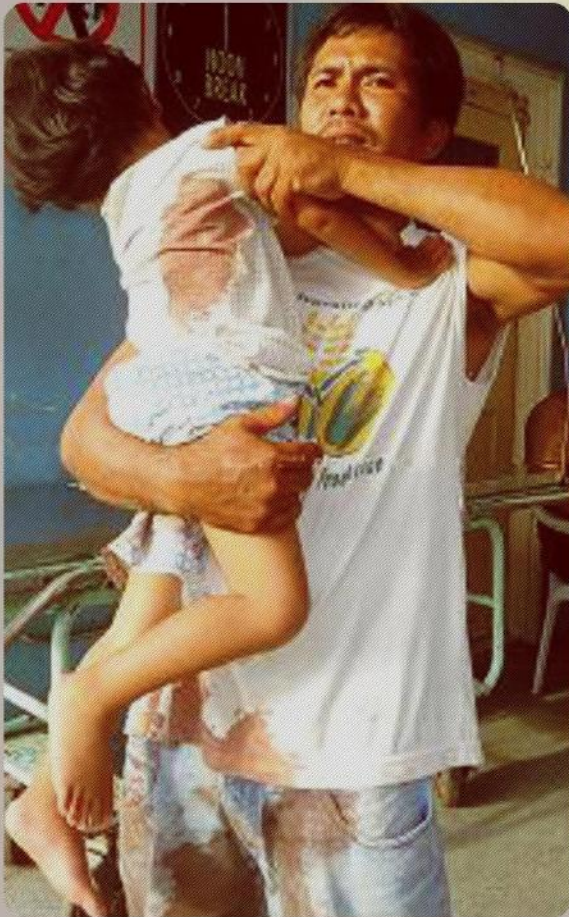

WAKING UP FROM THE DECEPTION


