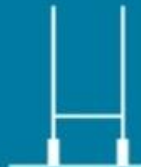

Elsewhere in the club, there is renewed energy. For the executive committee, we haven't stopped... moving from the end of the youth section straight back into adult preseason preparations! That said, we are 12 months into our plans for restructuring, and a number of smaller committees have been established, not least, an adult committee. They are prioritising sponsorship and a better matchday experience including mascots and sponsors days and "old boy reunion" days and so I am looking forward to seeing how some of these ideas work out throughout the season. For now, I hope all that have attended today enjoy the game and hospitality.

With Prent stepping down Ben Jackson has joined the team who will be responsible for our keepers & new for this year "data analysis". Finally club legend Ali Whitrow will continue as Physio.

Whilst its always nice to get pre-season out of the way, it's certainly been the most enjoyable since taking over, the lads have worked super hard and are raring to go, we have put in some decent performances including a very respectable draw against Banbury United. We have asked a lot of the squad & made changes in the way we want to play, they have all adapted really well. We currently have a squad of around 18 players that we want to keep hold of, its my job to try and keep them happy & ticking over. With so many games its vital we have the numbers.

March Town will have strengthened and will be one of the favourites again for promotion, so today will be a good test. They are well supported and will create a lively atmosphere. We won't need any motivation, today is what we have been working hard for & we can't wait to get going. There will be bumps again but with this group of lads we will stick together. We have ambitious in-house targets that starts from today so we want to hit the ground running!

THE CLAN: History of The Clan

The Club was formed in the immediate post-war period of 1945/46 to fulfil the sporting and social needs of the young people of the Easington housing estate in Banbury, many of whom were returning from war service. The Club, then known as 'The Clan', soon prospered, as there was an obvious need for such a facility, and formed a cricket, tennis and a ladies section. Football was, however, the main branch of the Club's activity, and they began playing in the local Junior Leagues as Easington Sports F.C.

The football was played on pastureland to the west of Wykham Lane, and for a few years endured the lack of facilities enjoyed today by almost all clubs. (No water available on site, no real changing facilities to name but two of the privations to be met on a cold winter's afternoon). Fortunately, this situation was soon to change after tireless fund raising by stalwarts such as Gordon Vivash, Tim Fountain and many other committed club members, the prospect of a new ground owned by the Club became a reality.



The purchase of the Addison Road ground and the building of a clubroom, together with the Club's entry to the Oxfordshire Senior League was the beginning of senior football for Sports, and to their credit they proved to be a formidable force at that level. Sports became winners and finalists in the Senior Cup and led the Premier League table on two occasions in the early and mid-fifties. In view of their success at county level the Club sought entry and was accepted into the old Warwickshire Combination, which at that time counted professional and semi-professional teams including Aston Villa 'A' and West Bromwich Albion 'B'.

Although having moderate success in this competition, as with many other amateur clubs; finance played its part in the decision to return to the Oxfordshire Senior League, where the expenses, in particular travelling, were much more in line with the club's limited income. Looking to raise their standards once more, the Club sought entry to the Hellenic League. Subject to certain ground improvements they were readily accepted and remained as members until 2021. In 2018/19 Ben Milner and squad won promotion to the Premier League being crowned Champions before two Covid affected seasons. A review of the NLS saw Sports move into the United Counties League South and a new challenge. In our first season in the UCLS, Matt Giles managed the squad to 14th with impressive wins including those against Coventry United and Rugby Town.

In 2021/2022 Andy Sharman managed the Development squad to the UHL Division 2 title and OFA Intermediate Cup Final. With Matt Giles stepping down, Andy Sharman was appointed managed with Tommy Kinch and Mark Boyland assisting. Sharman will once again focus on using local Banbury based talent to compete in the UCL, giving a chance to many from the Development and Clan squads.

In 2022 the club were awarded Level 3 FA Accreditation, with 38 affiliated teams and over 600 players. Our youth teams include both boys and girls and our open age section now includes three male, two female, a pan disability squad and over 50's football. We also work in partnership with Oxford United in the Community, offering free Women Wellbeing, Premier League Kick and Primary Stars sessions as part of the programme. Relocation remains a priority for the committee and trustees to ensure that our facilities match the growth and needs of the club. We remain committed to providing those in the local community with a pathway into football.

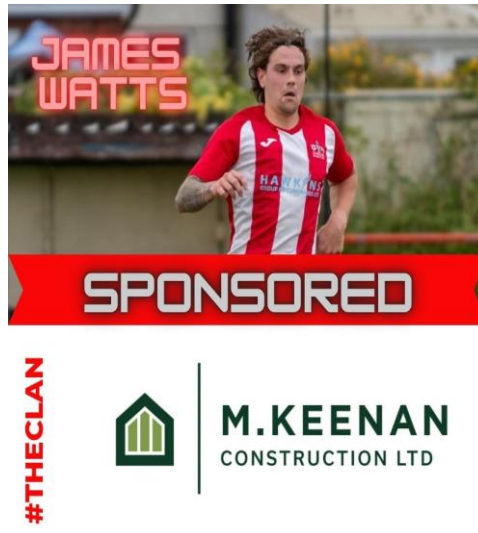

The aim of the collaboration is to provide a full youth pathway for players aged 5 to 15 to feed into the existing adult football provision currently delivered by Easington Sports FC.

The long-term aim of the partnership is to provide disability recreational/team opportunities for U12, U14, U16 and adult players in Banbury, and we believe this can be achieved by all clubs pulling their resources together.

To kick things off, the partnership is delivered a Banbury Inclusive Football Summer Festival on Sunday 20th August 2023 (10am – 12pm) at Easington Sports FC (Addison Rd, Banbury OX16 9DH).

The taster session was for individuals to sign up and we provided both youth (5 – 15-year-olds) and adults (16+) the opportunity to come and get involved. Everybody was welcome regardless of learning or physical disability.

The event was a huge success and we aim to release new dates soon for further sessions.

THE CLAN: The Visitors

March Town played on several grounds in the early 1880's before sharing a ground with March Town Cricket Club at The Avenue. March Town played there until after the war.

As founder members of the Isle of Ely Football League, March played in that League until joining the Peterborough & District League.

After the war they added 'United' to the Clubs' title, reflecting the move to the GER sports ground in Robingoodfellows Lane.

After an unsuccessful spell in the United Counties League, March appointed ex- Norwich City and Notts County player, Oscar Hold as Manager and after two seasons won the UCL Championship.

In the 1955-56 season, March joined the Eastern Counties League and finished runners-up to Peterborough United Reserves. They finished runners-up to Spurs 'A' in the 1960-61 season but had to wait until the 1987-88 season to lift the Championship.

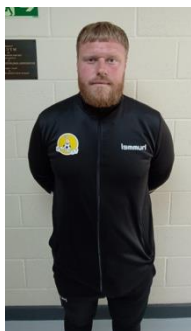
March have won the League Cup once, beating Spurs 3-2 in a two-leg final, with the second leg being played at White Hart Lane.

The Hares have reached the first-round proper of the FA Cup twice, going out to Brentford 4-0 in the 1956-57 season and more recently losing 2-0 at Swindon (1977-78 season). They have jointly held the East Anglian cup with Barking in 1953-54.

March Town now runs three senior sides and a Ladies Team. The 1st team play in the Thurlow Nunn (Eastern) Division One North, whilst the Reserves, A Team and ladies teams play in the Cambridgeshire Leagues

March Town also has a thriving Youth set up, with the under 18's playing in the Thurlow Nunn League.

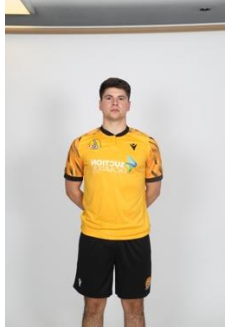

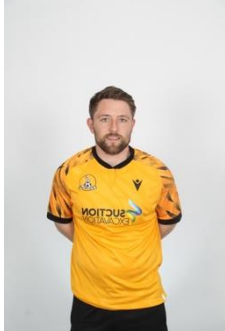
