LEADERSHIP AT ITS BEST

VERY FREQUENTLY, my mind goes back to one of the first headlines I saw tweeted at the beginning of the pandemic that said, in short, the quality of one's leadership would be on full display during this crisis. Already feeling the pangs of an uncertainty the magnitude of which most of us had never experienced, somehow, I felt comforted by the notion that leading well during the pandemic was on someone else's mind. My circle of friends and colleagues compared notes almost daily about the changes we were seeing and how we were faring, not just as individuals but as teams within our various workforce segments. I have read a lot about companies piv-

Pre-pandemic, from the solace of normalcy, I thought of successful leadership in big concepts like ambition and perseverance. Don't get me wrong—those themes are still extremely useful to realizing success as a leader. But, what I've found since early 2020 is that defining leadership is in the nuances; and that is what I discovered among the Atlantans featured in this year's *Atlanta 500* issue.

What makes this list of corporate, non-profit, civic, entrepreneurial, religious, and creative leaders the cream of the crop is more than their titles or stations at the top of their organizations. It's the thoughtful way that they have gone about considering their work and the work of their companies-people first. Finding the value in people from their employees to the customers they serve and the communities they call home is what undergirds the organizations they head.

It is obvious that they have something in common in that they understand nobody rises to the top by themselves.

BUSINESS

Jeff Arnold

At age 28, Arnold founded WebMD and grew it into a \$1 billion revenue company. Next came the Convex Group, a media and internet investment organization that acquired HowStuffWorks, then sold it to Discovery Communications, where Arnold met Dr. Mehmet Oz, who collaborated with him to launch yet another health-focused website, Sharecare. In 2021, the company went public, debuting on Nasdaq with a valuation of nearly \$4 billion.

J. Veronica Biggins

Biggins is currently the managing partner of the Atlanta office of Diversified Search. Previously, she served as director of presidential nersonnel and assistant to President Bill Clinton. She was also vice chair of the U.S. delegation to the United Nations Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing.

Michael J. Coles

After a long career in the clothing business, Coles founded the Great American Cookie Co. with Arthur Karp in 1977. They grew an initial \$8,000 investment into the largest cookie store franchise in the United States. The serial entrepreneur has chaired the Georgia Film Commission and served on the University System of Georgia Board of Regents. the Kennesaw State University Foundation Board, and the Walker School Board.

Lonnie G. Johnson

Johnson earned his master's degree in nuclear engineering from Tuskegee University and went on to work for the U.S. Air Force and the NASA space program. Experimenting with high-powered water guns, he invented the bestselling Super Soaker. He has since been developing the Johnson thermoelectric energy converter (JTEC), an

engine that converts heat directly into electricity, a potential source of low-cost solar power.

R. Charles Loudermilk Sr.

Loudermilk founded Aaron's, a lease-to-own retailer, in 1955 with a \$500 bank loan. He took the company public in 1982. In 2009, the Atlanta City Council changed the name of Buckhead Triangle Park to Charlie Loudermilk Park in honor of his contributions to the neighborhood. He helped build the Omni and once owned the Atlanta Hawks and the Flames.

Sig Mosley

As president of Imlay Investments and then managing partner of Mosley Ventures, Mosley has invested in 120 start-ups since 1990-likely making him Atlanta's most active angel investor. He helped nurture the city's technology industry.

PROFESSIONALS

Joel Rabbit

Babbit is CEO of Narrative Content Group, which he founded in 2009 with Rolling Stones keyboardist Chuck Leavell, and which launched the sustainability website Mother Nature Network (sold in 2020). Narrative has created and distributed content for many of the world's leading brands, including Coca-Cola, Mercedes-Benz, and Subway.

Emmet Bondurant

A partner at Bondurant Mixson & Elmore, Bondurant has been recognized by the National Law Journal as one of the top 10 trial lawyers in the United States.

Xernona Clayton

Media pioneer Clayton worked with Martin Luther King Jr. and Coretta Scott King and launched the Trumpet Awards in 1993.

Bob Hope

President and cofounder of Hope-Beckham communications firm. Hope was public relations director for the Atlanta Braves in the Hank Aaron era.

Bunnie Jackson-Ransom

Jackson-Ransom is the president and CEO of firstClass, a public relations and marketing firm founded in 1975.

Glen Jackson

In 1995, Atlanta native Jackson cofounded the marketing communications agency Jackson Spalding with Bo Spalding, and he continues to provide leadership for many of its clients. He's also the author of the book Preeminence: What It Means and How to Sustain It.

Valerie Jackson

The WABE radio host was the wife of Mayor Maynard Jackson and helped prepare the city for the 1988 Democratic National Convention and the 1996 Olympic Games.

Tom Johnson

Under Johnson's leadership, the Los Angeles Times received six Pulitzer Prizes. As president of CNN, he worked closely with founder Ted Turner to pioneer the 24hour news cycle.

Hank Klibanoff

The Pulitzer-winning author is now a professor in Emory's Creative Writing Program. He coauthored The Race Beat.

Monica Pearson

Pearson was the first woman and first minority to anchor the daily evening news in Atlanta, where she worked for 37 years at WSB-TV. She has won more than 33 Southern Regional and local Emmy Awards.

Joey Reiman

Reiman was founder and

chairman of the global consultancy BrightHouse. In 2018, he cofounded Brand New World Studios, which produces "purpose-inspired movies" to connect businesses to consumers. He also teaches creative and critical thinking at Emory University's Goizueta Business School.

Lois Reitzes

Reitzes began working at WABE-FM 90.1, the National Public Radio affiliate in Atlanta, in 1979 as a music programmer and announcer, becoming program director in 1992. Now, she hosts City Lights, Second Cup, and other series.

Alexis Scott

Retired as publisher of the Atlanta Daily World, founded by her grandfather in 1928, Scott was a longtime member of FOX 5's Georgia Gang.

Frank Ski

Described as a rainmaker of urban radio, Ski began his career as a disc jockey and recording artist and has evolved into a radio, film, and TV personality, motivational speaker, journalist, and philanthropist. Twenty years ago, he launched the Frank Ski Kids Foundation, which exposes young people to science, technology, athletics, and the arts.

Ted Turner

Founder of CNN, TNT, Cartoon Network, and Turner Classic Movies, the avid environmentalist donated \$1 billion to fund the United Nations Foundation.

Antonin Aeck

Aeck is chairman emeritus and a founding principal of the architecture, interiors, planning, and preservation firm Lord Aeck Sargent. His career began in Paris, where he worked on completing the late Le Corbusier's final unfinished design commissions

Robert L. Brown Jr.

Brown established his firm R L Brown & Associates in 1984. He has held leadership positions with the Georgia Chamber of Commerce, Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, and many other organizations. He is a former chair of the Georgia Department of Transportation.

William Millard Choate

Choate is executive chairman of Choate Construction, one of the largest commercial building contractors in the Southeast. He founded his company in 1989.

Jerome M. Cooper

In 1960, Cooper cofounded Cooper Carry, an architecture and design firm based in Atlanta. He has received the Rothschild Award, the highest honor granted by the Georgia chapter of the American Institute of Architects; in 2018, the AIA named Cooper Carry its Architecture Firm of the Year. As a student, he received a Fulbright Fellowship and studied under architect Bruno Zevi in Rome.

Tom Cousins

Cofounder of Cousins Properties, one of the nation's largest equity real estate investment trusts, Cousins developed Atlanta landmarks such as the CNN Center, the Omni Coliseum, 191 Peachtree Tower, Bank of America Plaza, and Wildwood Office Park. With his wife, Ann, he established the Cousins Foundation and the CF Foundation, and they were instrumental in rehabilitating East Lake. In 2009, Cousins established Purpose Built Communities in partnership with philanthropists Warren Buffett and Julian Robertson.

Lawrence L. Gellerstedt III

Gellerstedt joined Cousins Properties in 2005 when it acquired his firm, and later led the company as chairman and CEO. Through high-profile urban deals and a major merger with Parkway Properties, he led Cousins from an equity market cap of \$665 million to more than \$3.8 billion.

Oscar Harris

A notable architect, fine artist, and author, Harris founded Atlanta's Turner Associates, which designed parts of Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, the iconic Centennial Olympic Park light towers, the MLK Visitors Center, and Georgia State Student Center, among many other prominent projects. He now spends much of his time painting and encouraging students to enter the fields of architecture, construction, and engineering.

Bill Johnson

Founder of the Johnson Studio at Cooper Carry and now design adviser, Johnson is an architect and interior designer lauded for his highly personal approach to restaurant design. Since launching his restaurant-design career with Atlanta's Peachtree Cafe in the early 1980s, he's worked on local projects including Chops Lobster Bar, Seeger's, Aria, and Rathbun's.

Steve Selig

During Selig's tenure as president, Selig Enterprises has helped develop key projects such as the Buckhead Triangle, Logan Circle, the Plaza Midtown, the District at Howell Mill, 12th & Midtown, and the Works. From 1976 to 1980, he served as President Carter's chief liaison with the business community, and he chaired the host committee for the 1988 Democratic National Convention in Atlanta. His family endowed the Selig Center for Economic Growth at the University of Georgia.

Ivenue Love-Stanley & William J. Stanley III

Since 1978, Stanley and Love-Stanley have focused on integrating architecture and interior design. As one of the largest Black architectural practices in the South, they have been responsible for many landmark projects in Atlanta and throughout the region. Their awardwinning projects include the Olympic Aquatic Center at Georgia Institute of Technology and Ebenezer Baptist Church.

John Wieland

Over three decades and with more than 25,000 homes, Wieland established his company as the Southeast's leading builder of semicustom homes. He has been inducted into the Home Builders Association of Georgia's Hall of Fame and has received the Greater Atlanta Home Builders Association's lifetime achievement award.

GOVERNMENT & INFRASTRUCTURE

Nathan Deal

Deal served as a prosecutor, judge, state senator, and U.S. congressman for Georgia's 9th District before being elected Georgia's 82nd governor in 2010 and reelected in 2014. Deal's tenure was marked by efforts in transportation, criminal justice reform, and education reform.

Pat Epps

In 1965, Epps bought a small

fixed-base operation at DeKalb Peachtree Airport and launched Epps Air Service. He has grown the original facility into a hub serving local and international businesses. His many honors include the National Business Aviation Association's American Spirit Award and lifetime achievement award. Epps has also been inducted into the Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame.

Shirley Franklin

Inaugurated in 2002, Franklin became Atlanta's 58th
mayor. She was not only the
city's first female mayor, but
also the first African-American woman to helm any major Southern city. A former
protégé of mayors Maynard
Jackson and Andrew Young,
she helped bring the Olympic Games to Atlanta. She
received the John F. Kennedy
Profile in Courage Award in
2005.

Johnny Isakson

In 2016, Isakson became the first Georgia Republican ever to be elected to a third term in the U.S. Senate. He is also the only Georgian ever to be elected to the state House, state Senate, U.S. House, and U.S. Senate. The Atlanta native is a respected businessman with more than 40 years of experience in the real estate industry. He stepped down from the Senate at the end of 2019.

Keisha Lance Bottoms

In 2018, Bottoms took office as Atlanta's 60th mayor—only the second woman to hold the city's highest municipal government seat. She's also the only mayor in city history to have been elected to all three branches of government, serving previously as a judge and city councilmember.

Sam Massell

Beginning his career in real estate, Massell served 22 years in elected offices, including eight as president of Atlanta's Board of Aldermen TOB ICU At Grady, we treat the everyday needs, the exceptional cases, and the emergencies no one else can handle. And we blaze trails with research and technology that advance healthcare around the globe. We celebrate every patient's recovery and every caregiver and loved one. and four as the city's mayor from 1970 to 1974. As mayor, Massell established MARTA and developed minority opportunities in city government. Later, he became the founding president of the Buckhead Coalition.

Kasim Reed

Reed served two terms as Atlanta's 59th mayor, beginning in 2010. Prior to that, he spent 11 years as a member of the Georgia General Assembly, first elected in 1998 as a state representative, then serving from 2002 to 2009 in the state Senate. He's a former partner in the litigation practice of Holland & Knight, an international law firm with offices in Atlanta, where he specialized in entertainment law.

Leah Ward Sears

Now in private practice with Smith, Gambrell & Russell, Sears was the first woman to serve as a judge on the Superior Court of Fulton County. Four years later she was appointed, and then elected, to become a justice on the Supreme Court of Georgia-the first woman and youngest jurist ever to receive that title. From 2001 to 2005, she became the presiding justice of the Georgia Supreme Court, eventually being named chief justice.

Andrew J. Young

A protégé of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Young was a leader of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. He helped draft the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. He was Georgia's first African-American congressman since Reconstruction. President Carter tapped him to be the U.S. ambassador to the United Nations. He served two terms as mayor of Atlanta and helped bring the 1996 Olympics here. His accolades have included the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Morehouse College's Andrew Young Center for Global Leadership is named

for him, as is Georgia State University's Andrew Young School of Policy Studies.

ARTS, SPORTS & ENTERTAINMENT

Vincent Anthony Anthony founded the Center for Puppetry Arts in 1978. Under his leadership, the center received a record 12 Citations of Excellence from UNIMA-USA, the U.S. division of Union Internationale de la Marionnette, the international organization for the art of puppetry. A native of Sarasota, Florida, Anthony has also received a personal Citation of Excellence from UNIMA-USA-puppetry's most prestigious award.

Zac Brown

Brown is the founder, front man, and lead vocalist for his eponymous, multiplatinum, Grammy Award—winning Southern rock group. He is a songwriter, producer, record label head, businessman, and philanthropist.

Peter Conlon

As president of Live Nation Atlanta, Conlon books the city's top venues, from Chastain Park to State Farm Arena. He cofounded Music Midtown in 1994 with the late Alex Cooley, whom he befriended while arranging concerts for Jimmy Carter's presidential campaign. The longtime collaborators became the city's most powerful music promoters.

Bobby Cox

A former pro infielder, Cox led major league teams for three decades, racking up more than 2,500 victories. In the 1990s, he led the Atlanta Braves to 14 straight division championships, five National League pennants, and a 1995 World Series title.

Lisa M. Cremin

During a quarter century with the Community Foundation for Greater Atlanta, Cremin oversaw an innovative suite of programs serving local arts organizations—including the Metropolitan

Atlanta Arts Fund, which she helped found to support small to midsized groups.

Vince Dooley

Serving from 1963 to 1988, Dooley is the most successful football coach in the University of Georgia's history. Under Dooley, the Bulldogs won one national championship and six SEC championships. He also served as director of athletics from 1979 to 2004 and was the only person ever to be president of both the American Football Coaches Association and the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics.

Fav Gold

Gold pioneered contemporary art in Atlanta. She operated one of the nation's top galleries here for nearly 30 years, staging groundbreaking exhibitions of artists such as Jean-Michel Basquiat, Cindy Sherman, Robert Rauschenberg, Alex Katz, Keith Haring, Irving Penn, Andres Serrano, and Robert Mapplethorpe.

Indigo Girls

Performing together since high school, Amy Ray and Emily Saliers released a self-titled record for Epic in 1989 that became the first of six consecutive gold- and/or platinum-certified albums. One of the most successful folk duos in history, they have enjoyed a 35-year career that began in clubs around their native Atlanta. Their most recent album, Look Long, was released in 2020.

Tom Key

Now retired from his long-time role as artistic director of the Theatrical Outfit, Key has appeared on many national stages as well as those of the Alliance Theatre, Kenny Leon's True Colors Theatre, and the Atlanta Opera. He has received the Governor's Award in the Humanities and the Georgia Arts and Entertainment Legacy Award.

Chuck Leavell

A conservationist, sustainable-development advocate, tech entrepreneur, and the Rolling Stones' musical director for more than 20 years, Leavell cofounded the Mother Nature Network. which he sold in 2020. He's also a Grammy-winning keyboardist who has recorded with Eric Clapton, George Harrison, and the Allman Brothers Band, and the author of four books, including an autobiography, a children's book, and a history of American forests.

Kenny Leon

Leon is the former artistic director of Atlanta's True Colors Theatre Company, which he cofounded with Jane Bishop in 2002 following 11 years as artistic director of the Alliance Theatre. Leon is a Tony Award-winning film and theater director whose Broadway credits include Fences, A Raisin in the Sun starring Denzel Washington, and The Mountaintop starring Samuel L. Jackson and Angela Bassett.

Hala Moddelmog

In 2014, Moddelmog became the first female president and CEO of the Metro Atlanta Chamber. And, in 2020, she was named president and CEO of the Woodruff Arts Center.

Billy Payne

value A lawyer and real estate developer, Payne is best known as CEO of the Atlanta Committee for the 1996 Olympic Games and then president and CEO of the games themselves. He chaired Augusta National Golf Club for more than 10 years, during which women were first admitted to membership.

Alicia Philipp

When Philipp joined the Community Foundation for Greater Atlanta in 1977, the philanthropic anchor institution had \$7 million in assets. Before she retired as president in 2020, the organization had grown to more than

\$1 billion under management, providing grants to organizations in 23 counties.

Camille Russell Love

Former art gallery owner Russell Love has served as executive director of Atlanta's Office of Cultural Affairs since Bill Campbell was mayor. She oversees programs such as Chastain Arts Center, the city's Public Art Program (including Elevate), and the Atlanta Jazz Festival.

John Schuerholz

A Baltimore native, Schuerholz began his baseball career with the Orioles, helping build a Kansas City Royals team that won the World Series in 1985. In 1991, he teamed up with Bobby Cox to help the Braves go from "worst to first" and win the National League pennant. Then from 1991 to 2005, the Braves finished first in their division in every completed season. He was the first general manager whose teams captured World Series titles in both the American and National Leagues.

Robert Spano

Spano has served as the music director of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra since 2001, retiring at the end of the 2020-2021 season. He has led performances at the Metropolitan Opera, Carnegie Hall, and Lincoln Center, and won four Grammys. He's one of only two classical musicians in the Georgia Music Hall of Fame. A dedicated mentor, Spano is responsible for nurturing the careers of numerous celebrated composers, conductors, and performers.

Mary Stanley

Stanley founded her eponymous studio in 2004 and has long been a vibrant presence on the Atlanta art scene—as a private art consultant, artist representative, and curator who's organized shows at the Atlanta Legal Aid Society, Hathaway

Contemporary Gallery, and Museum of Contemporary Art of Georgia.

Lucinda Weil Bunnen

Photographer Bunnen has published seven books. Her images have appeared in many public collections, including the Museum of Modern Art and the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York, Pushkin Museum in Moscow, and the Smithsonian in Washington, D.C. A photography collection at the High Museum bears her name.

EDUCATION & HEALTHCARE William Foege, MD, MPH

Considered a titan of epidemiology, Foege was instrumental in the successful campaign to eradicate smallpox in the 1970s. At Emory University, he holds the title of Emeritus Presidential Distinguished Professor of International Health, in addition to being a Gates Fellow and former Carter Center leader.

David Satcher, MD, PhD

A renowned physician, public health leader, and scholar, Satcher is best known for serving as the 16th U.S. Surgeon General. Prior to that, he was director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. He is the founding director of the Satcher Health Leadership Institute at Morehouse School of Medicine.

Alana Shepherd

Shepherd and her husband Harold cofounded Atlanta's Shepherd Center in 1975. The facility has grown from a six-bed unit to a world-renowned hospital specializing in research, medical treatment, and rehabilitation for people with spinal cord and brain injuries and other neurological conditions.

Louis W. Sullivan, MD With the exception of his four-year tenure as secre-

tary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, which ended in 1993, Sullivan was president of Morehouse School of Medicine for more than 20 years. Today, he's the chairman of the National Health Museum in Atlanta, the Washington, D.C.-based Sullivan Alliance to Transform the Health Professions, and the Georgia Global Health Alliance, which seeks to advance global health equity by facilitating collaboration among business, academic, nonprofit, and government partners.

Beverly Tatum

A noted scholar, teacher, author, administrator, and race relations expert, Tatum was the ninth president of Spelman College. Tatum is a licensed clinical psychologist with an MA and PhD from the University of Michigan, as well as an MA in religious studies from Hartford Seminary, and is the author of the acclaimed 1997 book Why Are All the Black Kids Sitting Together in the Cafeteria? And Other Conversations about Race.

Comer Yates

A champion of education and literacy, Emory Law graduate and former high school teacher Yates has served since 1998 as executive director of the Atlanta Speech School.

RESTAURANTS & HOSPITALITY Bob Amick

As a partner in Peasant Restaurants, Amick grew the company to dozens of locations nationally before selling. He helped create concepts such as Mick's and City Grill. Next came Killer Creek Chophouse, which he also sold. Finally, Amick launched Concentrics restaurants, which have been nominated for several James Beard Awards including Outstanding Restaurateur and Best Restaurant.

Pano Karatassos

When Karatassos opened Pano's and Paul's in 1979, he revolutionized Atlanta's dining scene. As founder and CEO of the Buckhead Life group, he has gone on to open more than a dozen eateries in Atlanta, as well as in South Florida. He earned the National Restaurant Association's Legend Fine Dining Award in 2008 and has been named to Nation's Restaurant News's Fine Dining Hall of Fame.

Gerry Klaskala

Klaskala came to Atlanta after graduating from the Culinary Institute of America in 1976. He and George McKerrow, founder of LongHorn Steakhouse, launched Canoe in 1995. He also opened Aria, which has been awarded the highest cumulative Zagat score of all Atlanta restaurants, in 2000. As a consultant, Klaskala helped launch Buckhead Diner, Horseradish Grill, Atlas, and Murphy's. He has supported the Atlanta Community Food Bank, Georgia Organics, the High Museum of Art, and Southface.

George McKerrow

McKerrow opened his first LongHorn Steakhouse in 1981 and grew it into RARE Hospitality International, which owns LongHorn Steakhouse and the Capital Grille. He sold the company to Darden Restaurants in 2007. Cofounder and CEO of Ted's Montana Grill with Ted Turner, he is also cofounder of Aria and Canoe with chef Gerry Klaskala and Ron San Martin. McKerrow has served on the board of the National Restaurant Association and the Culinary Institute of America. His many honors include the first Lifetime Achievement Award from the Georgia Restaurant Association.

Tom Murphy

Longtime Virginia-Highland restaurateur Murphy got his start at age 11, when his father gave him and his

brother a New York-style hot dog cart. Next, he ran a cheese shop in what became Sweet Auburn Market. Then, while he was at Georgia State University, he did a feasibility study on opening a neighborhood deli. He ended up getting financing for the project, which over four decades has grown into the iconic Murphy's Restaurant on Virginia Avenue.

Steve Nygren

Nygren opened the Pleasant Peasant in 1972 and grew the company to 34 restaurants in eight states before selling. In 1994, he, his wife Marie, and their three daughters relocated to Chattahoochee Hills, where they helped design a novel land-use plan that preserves the countryside while building a new wellness- and art-centered community. Serenbe's many awards include the Urban Land Institute's inaugural Sustainability Award, the Atlanta Regional Commission Development of Excellence, and EarthCraft's Development of the Year.

In 2019, Perry opened a new production facility, one of the nation's largest, on the site of the former Fort McPherson. Perry has also created television shows including *House of Payne*, served as an executive producer of the Lee Daniels film *Precious*, and starred in David Fincher's *Gone Girl*, among other acting projects.







After serving 11 years in the Georgia House of Representatives, including seven as minority leader, Stacey Abrams became the Democratic nominee for governor of Georgia in 2018. The first Black woman to receive a major-party nomination in a gubernatorial race in the United States, Abrams got more votes than any Democrat in the state's history. Following the election, Abrams launched the organization Fair Fight to mobilize voters, advocate for electoral reform, and fight voter suppression. In January 2019, she was tapped to give the Democratic response to the State of the Union address.


