NSS NSUT Cell has time and again demonstrated that the values of honesty, unity, ethics, determination, and collaboration are deeply embedded within each of their volunteers.

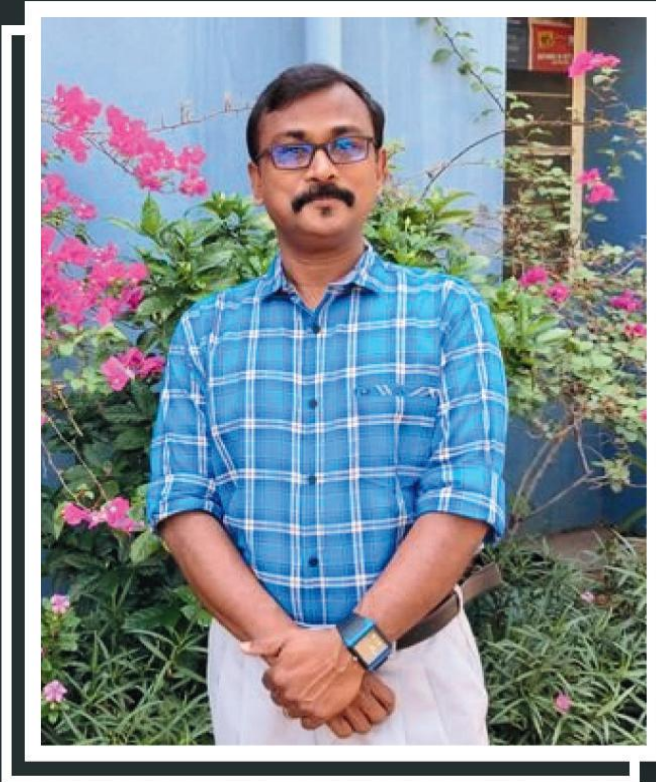

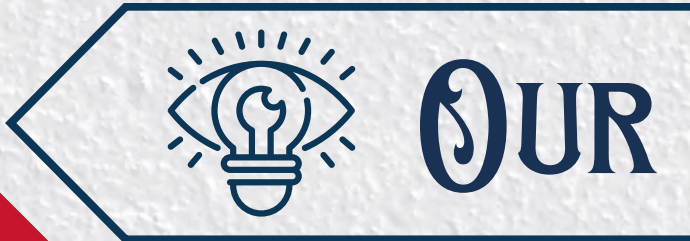

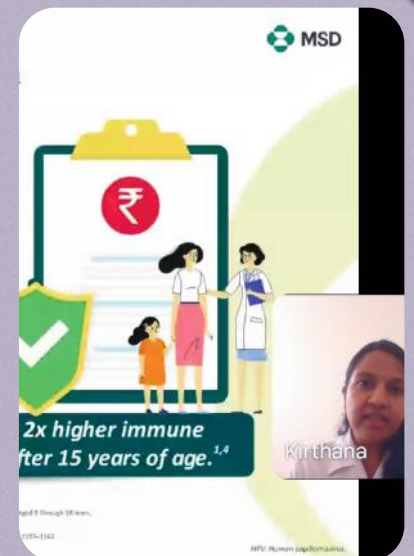
## NUKKAD NATAK

India generates over 62 million tonnes (MT) of waste in a year. Only 43 MT of total waste generated gets collected, 12 MT is treated before disposal, and the remaining 31 MT is discarded in waste yards. Most of the waste generated remains untreated and even unaccounted for, becoming major cause for public health concerns in the country.

NSS NSUT Cell conducted various plogging drives under the "Swachhta Hi Seva" campaign on the university campus and university adopted villages. It was an effort to free our society from all kinds of dry wastes and other hazardous substances that are depleting the environment. We have been actively involved in the task of raising awareness on reduction of plastic waste and shedding light upon the climactic issues that our planet is facing.

## COMMITTING TO MOTHER EARTH

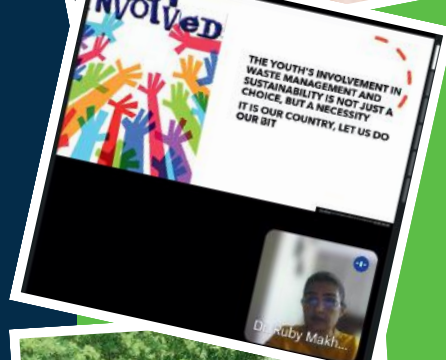

## AIDS AWARENESS RUN '23

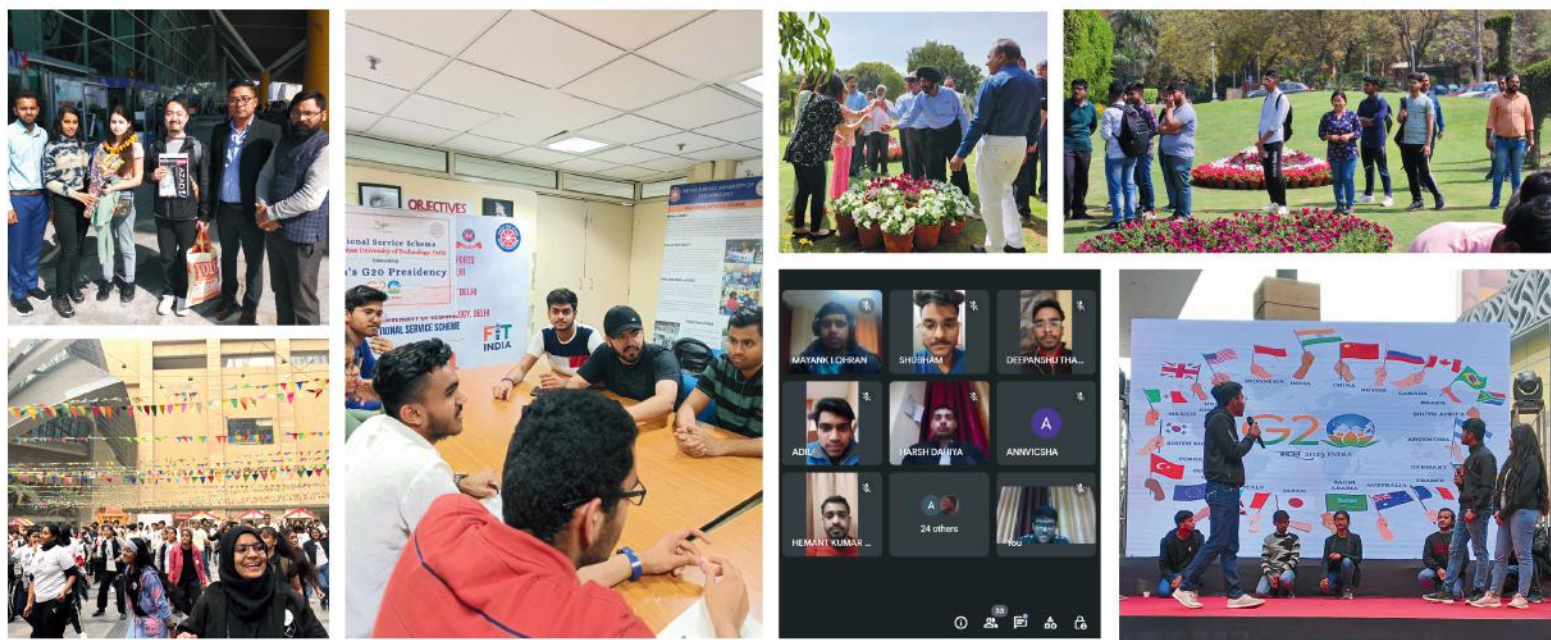
# Group of 20 countries

Because of its size and strategic importance, the G20 has a crucial role in setting the path for the future of global economic growth.

The G20 started out in 1999 as a meeting of finance ministers and central bank governors. Following the global financial crisis in 2008, the urgent need for a meeting of the G20 at the Leaders' level emerged.

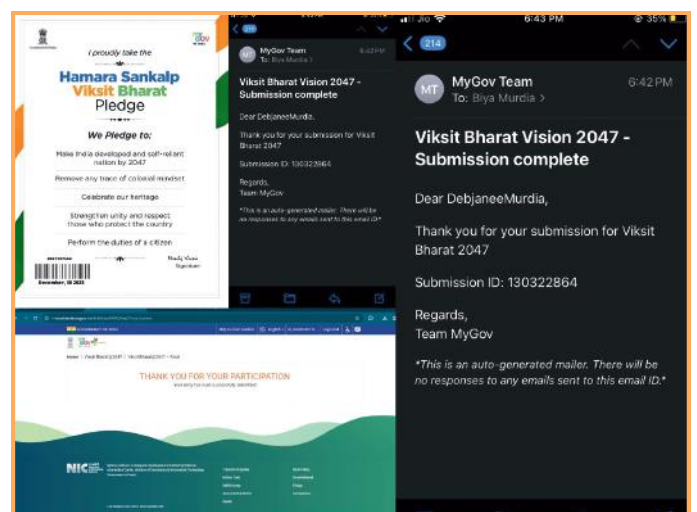


# G20 CAMPUS CONNECT

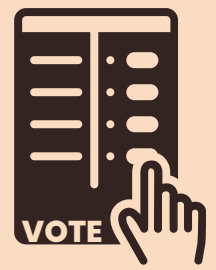

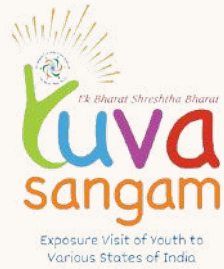
## INDIAN MOBILE CONGRESS
