Dear brothers and sisters,

In contemplating the challenges and triumphs of 2021, we acknowledge the hurdles we faced while embracing the opportunities for growth, change, and progress that await us.

The evolving social status of Tibetans, especially among the second and third generations, adds complexity as they explore diverse career paths and aspirations. This exploration, while indicative of progress, also creates confusion.

Today, Tibetan schools in India experienced a decline in the number of Tibetan children coming for education but an increase in Tibetan-origin youth from the Himalayan regions.

It's a long process not only for us but for the youth, parents and the community.

Despite these prevailing challenges, Empowering the Vision Project (EVP) seized the opportunities and continued to make significant strides in achieving scalable impacts throughout the year 2022-23.

Here are some noteworthy accomplishments:

- In Northeast India, In-person career exploration workshops were successfully resumed in Senior Secondary Schools of STS Darjeeling, STS Kalimpong, and STS Sonada, providing invaluable guidance and empowering students to make well-informed decisions about their future paths.
- In Punjab, the University Outreach Program was further expanded with the introduction of job readiness training specifically tailored for Tibetan university students, marking a significant milestone in this initiative.
- In Delhi, Mission Admission Workshop achieved remarkable success, with all participating Tibetan students securing admissions in their desired colleges.
- In Dharamshala, Bir, Chauntra, and Gopalpur, GTPN members visited four schools, inspiring over 400 high school students with their career journeys.

- In Majnu Ka Tila, Delhi's little Tibet, 'Sontsa Hub' was inaugurated as a dynamic community center for Tibetan youth. With over 400 visitors, it fostered connections, knowledge-sharing, and empowerment.
- In Ladakh, a reading intervention program was implemented in the remote village of Jangthang, northern India, to instill reading habits among children within the community.
- A total fellowship grant of INR 500 thousand enabled 15 school and college dropouts across India to complete job-oriented training courses successfully.
- The GTPN Dinner in Delhi brought together 25 Tibetan professionals to discuss future collaborations and support the career development of Tibetan youth.
- The collaboration with like-minded organizations was expanded to empower career exploration, personal development, emotional well-being, and nonviolent communication.

Thanks to our core funder, Tibet Relief Fund (UK), we achieved remarkable results for Tibetan youth last year. Our Total operating revenue was INR 650 thousand, up 30% from 2021.

As we reflect on the achievements and heartwarming success stories of our youth, we invite you to take a moment to explore the results from 2022. Your support and contribution are invaluable in our journey towards a more impactful 2023 and beyond. Together, let us empower Tibetan youth and shape a brighter future for generations to come.

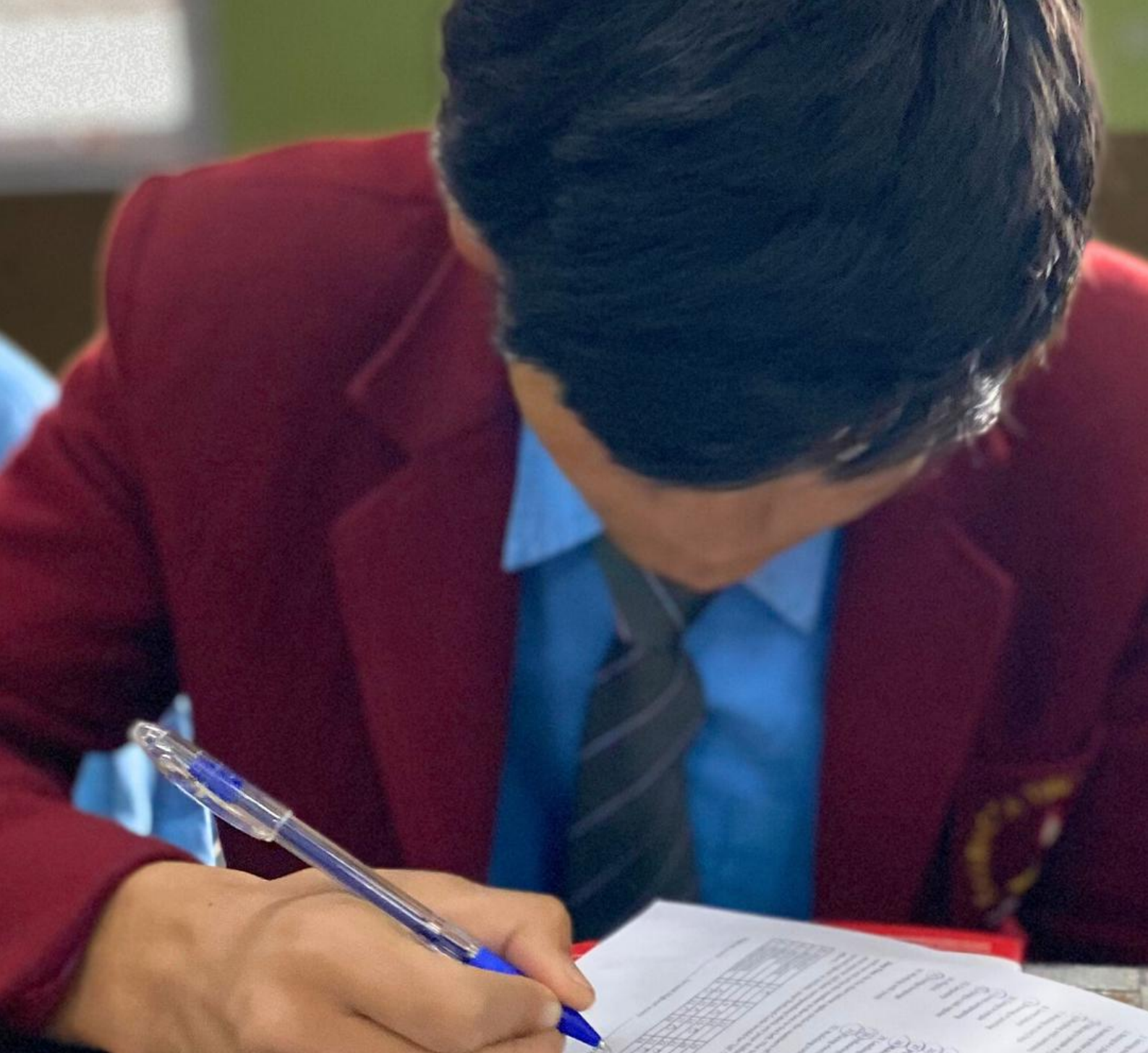
Through dedicated learning, Tenzin earned a certification in 'Inclusive Matters.' As part of her course action plan, she organized an impactful workshop on inclusion at Sontsa Hub. She continues to champion inclusivity and positively impact the Tibetan community through awareness sessions.



KUNSANG TOPDEN EVP FELLOW YOGA INSTRUCTOR

Kunsang Topden, an EVP fellow, embarked on a life-changing quest to enhance employability skills. With a completed yoga course in Rishikesh, Uttarakhand, he obtained certification as a yoga instructor. Passionately dedicated to his community, Kunsang conducted numerous free yoga sessions catering to people of all ages. He also works as a freelance personal yoga trainer. Currently, he is collaborating with the Department of Health, CTA, on a month-long project in Chauntra and the Bir Tibetan colony, delivering free yoga sessions to promote wellness.





Tibetan Career Services

The Tibetan Career Service (TCS) is a major program that operates throughout the year with the primary objective of supporting Tibetan students and youth in their pursuit of a successful career. The program takes a comprehensive approach to career development by offering counseling and mentoring services, short-term courses and training to enhance skills, knowledge sharing through events and networking opportunities, and personalized support to Tibetan youth. Moreover, it provides help with resume and cover letter writing, interview preparation, posting job openings, and connecting with potential employers.

TCS arranges workshops and training sessions covering a wide range of subjects aimed at enhancing the skill sets of Tibetan youths, expanding their awareness of potential opportunities, and providing them with valuable insights from experts from diverse backgrounds.

HIGHLIGHTS 2022-23

CAREER HELPDESK

- Assisted with job placement, resume building, interview preparation, and connecting with employers.
- Provided admission guidance and scholarship information for higher education.
- Sharing weekly job opportunities on social media for Tibetan youths.
- One-on-one career counseling sessions with a dedicated counselor.
- Provided career and academic guidance to 87 individuals, resulting in 17 successful job placements and 13 individuals benefiting from in-person career counseling sessions.



FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME

- Begun in 2014, the EVP Fellowship program empowered 83 young Tibetans with essential competencies and skills for professional growth.
- Supported 15 young Tibetans with up to INR 50 thousand grant.
- Assisted them with finding suitable training institutes and potential organizations for internships.
- The initiative has enabled these individuals to become self-reliant and contributing members of the society.

EVP INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

- **Yeshe Gyatso**, a graphic designing student, successfully completed a three-month internship as a graphic designer in November 2022 and is currently pursuing a 3D Animation course at Arena Animation in New Delhi.
- **Dawa Lhamo**, a secretary trainee from Tibetan Private ITI, Selakui, received comprehensive training and valuable experiences during her six months internship from October 2022 to March 2023. Currently, she works as an office Manager at Fenesta in Ladakh.



MISSION ADMISSION WORKSHOP

- Commenced in 2017, the Mission Admission Workshops offers college admission guidance to Tibetan high school graduates with aspirations to join Delhi University.
- The virtual workshop held on September 16th saw 25 participants from across India attending remotely from their home towns, all securing admission in their preferred choice of course at Delhi University.
- The workshop provided comprehensive step-by-step guidance on the admission process, fee structures, SMART goal setting, and hostel accommodations.



SCHOOL OUTREACH PROGRAMME

The Career Exploration Workshop for Tibetan Schools in the northeast region started in 2018 with the primary objective of reaching out to remotely located Tibetan schools with limited access to academics and career opportunities. The workshop aims to provide students with valuable insight and resources to explore various career options. Also to help them understand their interests, strengths and aspirations and guide them in making informed decisions about their future career paths.

At the inception of this workshop, none of the three schools- STS Sonada, STS Kalimpong (formerly CST), STS Darjeeling (formerly CST) had designated counselors. However, since then, the schools have made progress by employing counselors except for STS Sonada, which still has no counselors.

The workshop encompassed various aspects such as career exploration, scholarship opportunities, college admission, job prospects, and self-exploration activities. A total of 98 students from class XI & XII attended the workshop. The workshop garnered positive feedback, as students appreciated the enlightening and personalized sessions. School principals and teachers commended the initiative and expressed their desire for continuity. Following the workshop, we have been receiving phone calls from students seeking guidance and assistance with college admissions and scholarship applications.



EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS WORKSHOP

- EVP conducted a workshop on Employability Skills at Tibetan Private ITI in September 2022.
- The workshop aimed to develop fundamental skills such as professional resume writing and email etiquette.
- Tibetan professionals with over ten years of experience in the same field participated in the workshop as resource persons.
- 47 participating students received enhanced employability skill training through hands-on activities.
- The professionals shared their journeys and provided valuable insights and advice on succeeding in the hospitality sector.

UNIVERSITY OUTREACH PROGRAMME

- EVP engaged with Tibetan university students offering Job Readiness Workshop.
- Marking a significant milestone, the workshop was initiated in Punjab, expanding its reach and impact.
- The workshop in Punjab and Delhi was attended by 49 university students from Lovely Professional University, and Delhi University.
- The workshops covered important topics like resume building, cover letter writing, self-evaluation, and virtual interaction with Tibetan professionals.



READING INTERVENTION PROGRAMME

- The Reading Intervention Program was introduced in the remote Tibetan settlements of Ladakh and Changthang to inculcate reading habits among school children.
- Reading sessions are conducted both at the Sonamling Tibetan settlement community library and through a Mobile library, ensuring access to non-accessible areas throughout the year.
- Over 20 children visit the library after school for reading activities and book discussions. This further serves as a safe space for children to openly discuss challenges and find solace, fostering a sense of community.
- The EVP counselor conducted workshops on career exploration, awareness, and the art of positive parenting, empowering students and parents.

SUPPLEMENTARY ENGLISH LEARNING CLASS

- Resource person Lhamo Tsering provided supplementary English learning classes to students of grades 8th to 10th at the Tibetan Children Village School in Ladakh.
- The class focuses on enhancing students' conversational English skills and expanding their vocabulary.
- The program specifically prioritise students from remote areas of Changthang who need help meeting standard English requirements.

Sontsa Hub

The Sontsa Hub project, initiated in June 2022, is a dynamic youth civic engagement platform dedicated to empowering Tibetan youth in all works of life, specifically those facing unemployment, substance abuse, or having dropped out of school. The project fosters a vibrant community through regular Friday 'Social' and Wednesday 'Lhakar Meet,' promoting a sense of belonging, co-learning, and instilling confidence among Tibetan youth.

Sontsa Hub also serves as a co-working space for students and working professionals to study, work and connect.

HIGHLIGHTS 2022-23

LHAKAR MEET

Lhakar Event at Sontsa Hub offers center-stage to book launches, discussions, interactive sessions, and inspiring stories from Tibetan professionals. With enriching workshops and activities, this event empowers participants to grow personally and professionally while promoting community engagement and cultural exchange among Tibetan youth.

At Sontsa Hub's Friday social events, Tibetan youth find a welcoming space for community networking. Through various activities such as open mic performances, skill-building workshops, movie and documentary screenings, art exhibitions, poetry reading, and games, attendees can express their talents, learn new skills, and build connections with others who share their interests.

- Screening of documentaries such as - What Remains of Us, Mission Joy, Tashi and the Monk, Escape over the Himalayas, 7-Year-old Great Lama Initiation, Orphans of Tibet, Theory of Everything, Tuesday with Morrie, Tibet-the Path of Wisdom.
- Open Mic session - a platform to showcase talents and express freely.

Building Bridges

Building Bridges Project is designed to bring together young people from the Tibetan and other communities to foster a better understanding of cultures, and develop respect, sharing, and learning. This project facilitates various exchange and exposure opportunities for school children and university students. Since its inception in 2016, over 649 Tibetan school children and university students have benefited.



HIGHLIGHTS 2022-23

CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Since 2018, the Empowering the Vision Project (EVP) has initiated cultural exchange programs between Tibetan school and university students and their counterparts from Fu Jen Catholic University in Taiwan.

The program provides a platform for students to engage in meaningful cross-cultural interactions with a comprehensive full-day exchange event. Participating students are from Tibetan Children's Village (TCV) Majnu Ka Tila day school, Delhi University, and Jawaharlal Nehru University.

Complying to covid 19 pandemic, a virtual exchange program was organized in 2022 via google meet. The program was held in two sessions on July 2nd and on July 30th. The virtual exchange program was attended by 10 students from Fu Jen Catholic University and 25 Tibetan students from universities in Delhi and Bangalore.

Both Tibetan and Taiwanese students delivered a presentation on their respective home country, providing an overview of its history, culture, and sharing insight about their university. The dynamic interaction deepened their understanding of each other; cultures and fostered a sense of mutual respect and appreciation. The participants expressed their enthusiasm and eagerness to meet in person for future cultural exchange programmes, signifying the success and positive impact of the virtual engagement.



UNIVERSITY EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

On Sunday, November 27, 2022, EVP hosted a group of 15 students from Ashoka University, along with Professor Swargajyoti Gohain and Dr.Swati Chawla from O.P. Jindal University at our Sontsa Hub. The purpose of the visit was to facilitate discussions on topics such as ancient Indian knowledge, Tibetan culture, and education. The session was also attended by the secretary of the Global Tibetan Student Union, adding valuable insights and perspectives to the conversation.

The interactive session has ignited the need for future collaboration and networking sessions among Tibetan and Indian university students.

lofC-LMAD NATIONAL YOUTH CONFERENCE

Let's Make A Difference (LMAD) is an annual national youth conference organized by the Initiative of Change (lofC) at the Asia Plateau in Panchgani. The conference is exclusively designed for young individuals to enable them to explore their inner potential, cultivate their core values and set meaningful goals for personal and professional growth. The eight-day residential program is held annually from June 1st to June 8th and is attended by around 250-300 Indian students from all parts of India.

EVP supports ten Tibetan university students annually to attend this conference. Since 2008, over 140 college students have participated.

This initiative aims to provide a platform for young Tibetans to connect with people from diverse backgrounds, nurturing friendship, and mutual respect, and exchange knowledge and experiences.

EVP organizes various events and programs with the members offering a platform to contribute to youth career development.

HIGHLIGHTS 2022–23

GTPN DINNER

On November 20, 2022, the Global Professionals' Network (GTPN) hosted a dinner at our newly launched Sontsa hub at Majnu Ka Tilla. The gathering was attended by 25 Tibetan professionals from diverse backgrounds, including architects, photographers, Fashion designers, Human Resource Managers, educators, Beauty experts, chefs, Bar consultants, Mural artists, and cartoonists. The event convened professionals with shared goals to deliberate on the challenges and opportunities faced by Tibetan youth in India. It served as a platform to gather valuable ideas and suggestions, focusing on integrating them into ongoing initiatives such as collaborative programs, fundraising efforts, and mentorship programs.

CELEBRATING SUCCESS

The Celebrating Success initiative offers a unique and inclusive platform for honoring and highlighting the achievements of talented Tibetan professionals.

Accomplished professionals from diverse backgrounds share their journeys and insights through a monthly conversation series conducted on Instagram. This virtual format transcends geographical barriers, enabling participants from various locations to access conversations and draw inspiration from shared knowledge and experiences.

The sessions attracted a substantial audience who actively participated in the conversation, posing numerous questions about navigating the path toward a successful career.



GTPN ROLE MODEL SCHOOL VISIT

The annual GTPN role model school visit took place on the 30th and 31st of March, 2023. Five GTPN members visited four Tibetan Children's Village (TCV) Schools in Himachal Pradesh, Northern India, as a part of the school outreach program. The interactive session saw the participation of 417 students from classes 10 and 12 students.

Five Tibetan professionals from vibrant career fields- Dorjee, a journalist at Indian Express; Lhadon, a researcher at Tibet Policy Institute; Ngoshi, a freelance illustrator; Thinlay, a recruiter at Uber; and Dhodhen, an architect at Chromed Design, played an essential role in catalyzing the students to spark passions on various professions aligned with their passions.

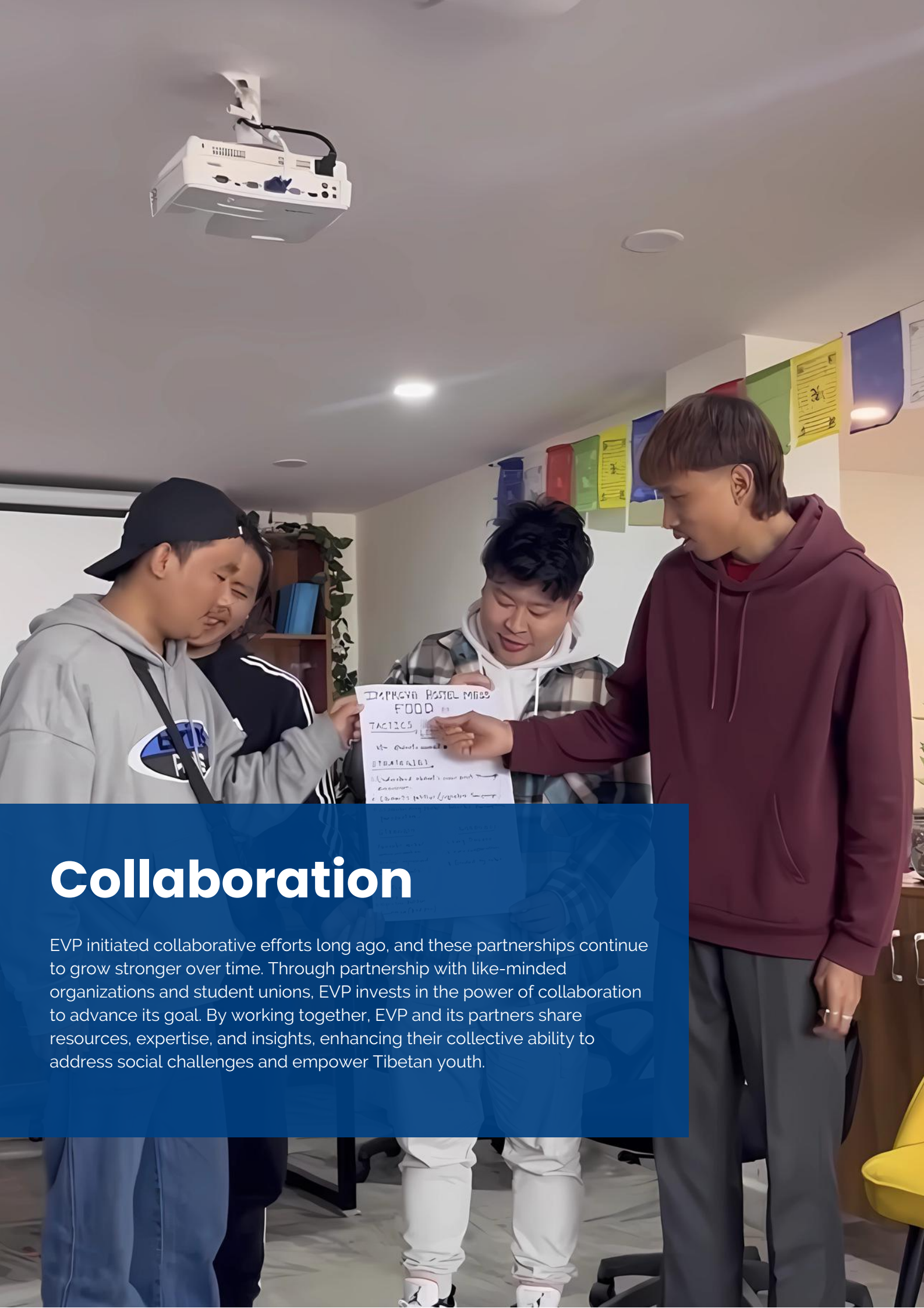

Collaboration

EVP initiated collaborative efforts long ago, and these partnerships continue to grow stronger over time. Through partnership with like-minded organizations and student unions, EVP invests in the power of collaboration to advance its goal. By working together, EVP and its partners share resources, expertise, and insights, enhancing their collective ability to address social challenges and empower Tibetan youth.

HIGHLIGHTS 2022-23

RITINJALI SECOND CHANCE SCHOOL

The Second Chance School by Ritinjali in Mahipalpur, New Delhi, is a residential program that provides a secure, loving, and stimulating environment to the boys through a wide range of learning experiences designed and implemented in collaboration with Pallavanjali.

The 2-year program helps students attend various vocational training courses and internships while encouraging them to appear for the Class X and XII examinations, which the National Institute of Open Schooling conducts.

With this collaboration, Karma, who had dropped out of school successfully passed his class X examination with a certification in graphic design.

EVP Counsellor Monlham led a session on "Importance of Positive Parenting in Child's Mental Health."

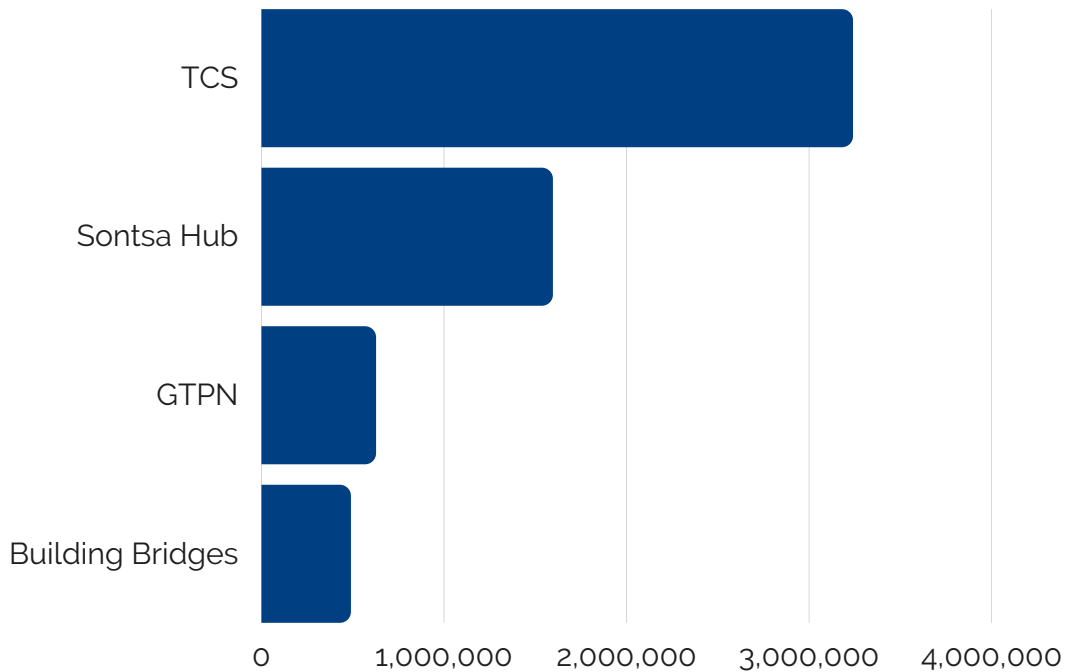
