LIGHTHOUSE COMMUNITY CENTER

"One-Stop Center" with access to food, clothing, bicycles, homeless backpacks, hygiene kits, reentry supportive housing services, restoration of rights, and voter registration.



LIGHTHOUSE BELOVED COMMUNITY

Affordable ownership of sustainable, attainable, and generational housing. 90 acres of land established in 2020 as a Community Land Trust (CLT). Homeownership classes and down payment assistance available for first time home buyers!



LIGHTHOUSE COMMUNITY HEALTH

The Jesse Kay Clinic at Lighthouse is a nurse practitioner-led community-based clinic offering primary care, preventive services like diabetes screenings, diagnosis, and treatment. Transportation assistance available!



LIGHTHOUSE PHARMACY CENTER

Discounted Medication Therapy Management, free door-to-door prescription delivery, and a refill program.











The year in review

Your noble stewardship strengthened the Lighthouse throughout 2022, and we would like to express our deepest gratitude for your support. It helps the continuity of our commitment to serving community.

As we close our 18th year providing wraparound services to our neighbors, the Lighthouse Community has grown into a family of services acting as a beacon to nearly 20,000 people in 2022.

Our increase in numbers is credited to the opening of Lighthouse Community Health Services, a nurse practitioner-led primary healthcare practice, in honor of Jesse Kay. This year we will be expanding services and opening an in-house pharmacy.





The power of a collaborative community is how the Lighthouse sets its course. None of this would be possible without the generous efforts of Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, TANF, Mental Health America, Grounded Solutions, FocusPoint Mental Health, Promise Ranch, MoveUP, and Center for Common Ground. They are collaborative partners delivering dignified and meaningful programs that align with us and support life changing interventions.

Owning a home remains the primary way most people build wealth and create a legacy for their families. We made some exciting advancements with Lighthouse Beloved Community CLT thanks to your support. With 90 acres of land, we are the largest landowner in Lynchburg dedicated to 100% affordable housing. No other program exists in the City of Lynchburg that preserves the affordability of homeownership.

Summer Highlight

Community Land Trust home ownership classes were taught to nearly 100 individuals. Home Buyer Education Classes were added in the Fall.

Winter Highlight

We were awarded a three-year research grant from MHA and Elevance to address Youth Mental Health and Substance Abuse Disorders using a digital support platform covering the State of Virginia.

Equine Therapy services with Promise Ranch for at-risk youth was recognized through a grant from MHA and LL Bean.

Autumn Highlight

New construction of our first CLT home started in September and was sponsored by Divine Fog Serves. We partnered with ROK-ON, a building materials science company, as our supplier for net-zero construction.



The Jessie Kay Clinic opened offering primary healthcare to patients.

Focuspoint Mental Health opened offering on-site behavioral healthcare, and a 23-hour crisis stabilization service.
