ABOUT ZOOM

ZOOM was founded in 2011 on a simple premise: that fans of a sport would prefer to see behind-the-scenes photos taken by its stars rather than photographers.

It was the brainchild of Caroline Reid and Christian Sylt and was first launched in Formula 1. ZOOM's founders had spent a decade working in the sport and became tired of seeing drivers doing hundreds of studio shoots standing in front of the same plain backgrounds so that countless photos of them could be printed, signed and given to fans and VIPs. Reid and Sylt realised that fans would be far more interested to see photos that the drivers had taken so they arranged it.

For the majority of the past decade all of F1's drivers and team bosses have each taken a photo every year of whatever they wanted and sent them to ZOOM so that they could be printed, signed, framed and sold at a charity auction. There were no restrictions on what the photos could show and the only caveat was that they had to be taken by the stars themselves.

The photos showcase everything from the drivers' pets, holidays and the views from their bedroom windows to shots inside their locker rooms at the races. The images give a glimpse inside one of the world's most secretive sports and don't just offer deeply personal insights into the drivers but also show how they have progressed over time.

One of Lewis Hamilton's earliest photos was of his beloved bulldog Roscoe but one of his most recent shots was his stunning trophy cabinet which was far from fully stocked when he began taking photos for ZOOM. Similarly, the photos taken by reigning champion Max Verstappen moved from hiking in the hills to trips on vintage planes as his celebrity status accelerated.

All of the photos were taken exclusively for ZOOM and they are also included in an annual book which has sold nearly 80,000 copies internationally raising more than £150,000 for charity.

ZOOM is one of very few independent initiatives in F1 which all of the drivers, teams and team bosses have been involved with. F1 itself has extensively promoted ZOOM on its website, Facebook, Instagram and Twitter pages and it has been showcased on the BBC, CNN, ESPN, ITV, Sky Sports and NBC. This coverage and far more can be found on zoom-auction.com/media.html

For a decade it was the only collection of photos taken by the stars of any sport. Until now.

During the pandemic ZOOM's founders decided to expand the format outside motorsport for the first time and selected the Aramco Team Series (ATS) for this prestigious position. It is a natural fit as it is a team sport like F1. The world's best players team up with amateur golfers in ATS events making it the first team event series of its kind on any professional tour.

The photos that the ATS players took for ZOOM cover everything from the excitement and drama on the courses to the entertainment in the evenings. They showcase the splendour of the event locations and the camaraderie created by the competition. It gives a glimpse through the eyes of golfers for the first time and creates one of the most personal collections of photos ever produced in the game.

She turned professional in July 2015 and won three times on the Ladies European Tour Access Series that year. Her first win on the Tour came in July 2021 at the Aramco Team Series – London with Sarina Schmidt, Diksha Dagar and amateur Andrew Kelsey.

She then turned her passion into her profession by successfully joining the professional ranks on the Ladies European Tour in 2007. Her first LET win came in 2012 at the ISPS Handa Ladies British Masters. Four years later she became the first woman to win a PGA national tournament when she was crowned PGA Wales National Champion and the following year she notched up her third title with a victory at the WPGA International Challenge.

By 2014 she won the title of English Women's Amateur and turned professional two years later. She competed in the LPGA Final Qualifying Tournament, earning full status on the Symetra Tour and partial status on the LPGA Tour for 2017. Her maiden win as a professional came in May 2019 with a two-shot victory at the Pure Silk Championship in Virginia. She followed this up with a win in Dubai in October 2021 which was also her first victory on the Ladies European Tour.

The following year she turned professional after winning the final stage of the LPGA Qualifying Tournament. Her first professional victory came in 2021 when she won the Aramco Team Series Sotogrande event.

Her father taught her the rules of the game and she earned LET membership for 2014 after finishing tied for 34th at the Lalla Aicha Tour School Final Qualifying. Her best result came last year when she closed with a two-under 70 in the Trust Golf Women's Scottish Open at Dumbarnie Links to finish with a seven-under 281 total.

Born in Eskilstuna, Sweden, Anna Nordqvist's first significant golfing accolade came when she was crowned Swedish Junior Player of the Year in 2004. Four years later she was part of the winning Swedish team at the European Ladies' Team Championship. She turned professional immediately after the final round and followed this up by winning the Ladies European Tour Final Qualifying School in January 2009. In only her fifth start on the LPGA Tour, Anna won her first professional tournament and major, the LPGA Championship in Maryland in June 2009. Since then she has won three majors, the latest coming in August 2021 at the Women's British Open in Carnoustie.
