Gordon College commends Dr. Asio for this well-deserved achievement and reaffirms its support for advancing high-impact, globally competitive research.



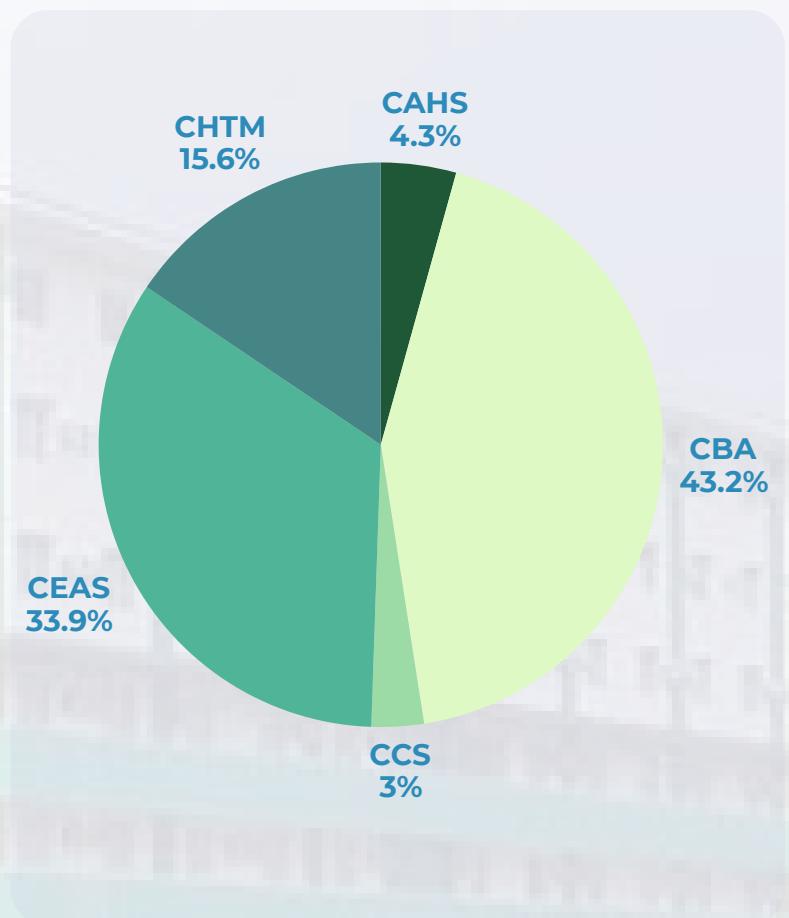

## Student Engagement Across Colleges

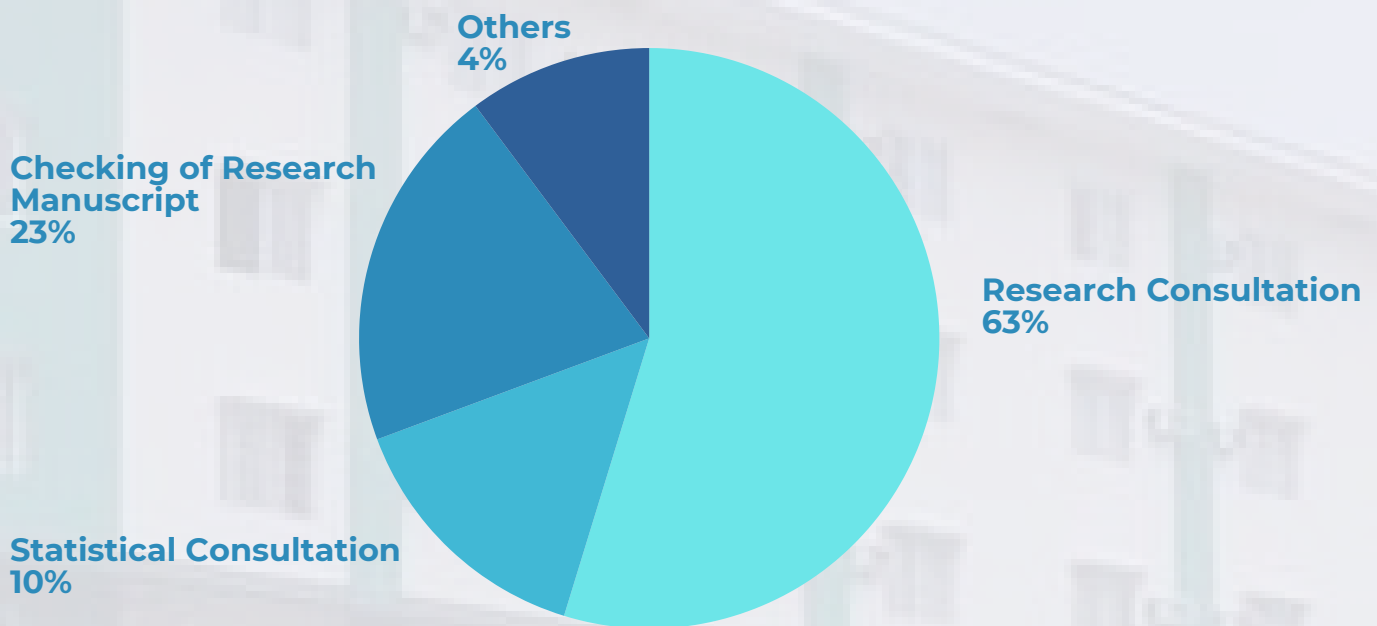
Among the colleges with the highest number of visits were the College of Business and Accountancy (CBA), College of Education, Arts, and Sciences (CEAS), College of Hospitality and Tourism Management (CHTM), College of Allied Health Studies (CAHS), and the College of Computer Studies (CCS). These units consistently sought assistance in different phases of the research process, reflecting their active participation in scholarly work.

## Top Reasons for Student Visits

The most common purposes for visiting included research consultations, checking of research manuscripts, and statistical consultations. Other frequently availed services involved instrument validation, submission of hardbound copies, signing of research-related forms and letters, and CESU-related concerns, highlighting the office's integrated approach to both research and community extension.

# GORDON COLLEGE – CCS SHINES AT SIKAPTALA 2025: NATIONAL CS AND IT COMPETITION

Gordon College – College of Computer Studies (CCS) proudly showcased its research excellence at the SIKAPTALA 2025: National Computer Science and Information Technology Competition – Research Presentation, held virtually on March 24, 2025, via MS Teams.
