History of The Game

In 1889, students from two Baltimore City public high schools, Baltimore City College and Baltimore Polytechnic Institute, met at Clifton Park to challenge one another in a game of football. Thus began one of the oldest football rivalries in existence at any level. This rivalry precedes the Army-Navy series begun in 1890. As a matter of fact, the length of the City-Poly football rivalry is greater than all the collegiate rivalries except Harvard-Yale (begun in 1856) and Yale-Princeton (begun in 1863).

In the early years, City College counted Polytechnic as only a scrub opponent, and The Game (as it has come to be known) was of little consequence. City was fifty years old and had been fielding a football team for some time. City's heavy collegiate schedule overshadowed the playing of Poly, a fledgling school at the time.

The 1907 game produced the first of the ties (2-2) and Poly's first victory in 1908, witnessed by 2,000 spectators at Oriole Park, sparked widespread interest in the series. Since then, City, Poly and local newspapers have been keeping records of the annual contest.

School spirit on both sides grew with the rivalry, resulting in the 1923 game being played in the Baltimore Municipal Stadium. In this era, crowds of 20,000 were common at The Game. Crowds of twenty to thirty thousand were standard at The Game up to the 1970's. The Maryland Scholastic Association championship, the last seasonal contest for any school in the league, was decided many times by The Game.

In 1944, the scheduled City-Poly Game clashed with the Naval Academy's schedule to play the same day in Municipal Stadium. To resolve the conflict, The Game was moved to Thanksgiving Day that year, a tradition which lasted 48 years.

In 1993, The Game was moved to a Saturday in early November to allow the possibility of City and Poly to compete for the State Public High School Championship. Both schools made the playoffs that year.

School spirit is at its peak during the City-Poly Game, the highlight of the athletic year. Each school continues to view a victory over its rival opponent as the completion of a winning season, notwithstanding its win-loss record on game day.

WHEREAS, we recognized that The Game, half-time show, after game dances, and all the other associated activities are designed to build school and community spirit and to bring out the best among the competitors;

WHEREAS, both Baltimore City College and the Baltimore Polytechnic Institute are Community of Caring schools;

WHEREAS, as Community of Caring schools, each of us shares a commitment to the Community of Caring values of caring, respect, responsibility, trust and family;

WHEREAS, we agree the best way to demonstrate our commitment to the Community of Caring values and add a new, positive dimension to this historic rivalry is to demonstrate the highest level of Sportsmanship before, during, and after this great game;

On behalf of the constituencies we represent, we commit ourselves and them to the following:

- We will cheer FOR our Team, our Cheerleaders, our Band, our Mascot, our School, and Ourselves;
- We will NOT jeer, taunt, or disrespect the Team, Cheerleaders, Band, Mascot, Students, Alumni, or Representatives of our Opponents;
- We will demonstrate the best in leadership, sportsmanship, and behavior
- We will demonstrate the values of caring, respect, and responsibility at all times before, during, and after The Game.
- We will neither threaten, condone, nor engage in any form of violence at any time in connection with any aspect of this great and historic rivalry.

Approximately one week prior to The Game, representatives of both schools met at Baltimore City College to sign this Commitment to Sportsmanship. Representatives included the Student Government Associations presidents, the football captains, the drum majors, and the cheerleader captains.

We expect all fans at The Game today to abide by the terms of this agreement.
