Tytherington Rocks FC

A Proud History



Tytherington Football Club was formed in 1896 by local Headmaster, Mr Emanuel, and others including the Rev John Bingley. Rev. Bingley stipulated that, to gain his support, the club should play in amber and black, his old college colours at Brasenose, in Oxford.

The club played in the Wotton-Under-Edge League and travelled to away matches by waggonette, a four-wheeled horse drawn cart, with seats along both sides. The club played at many different grounds in the early days, including Mill-Leaze Fields behind the village shop. They eventually found a permanent home at the Hardwicke Playing Fields. The club used the Swan Inn as their changing rooms until a new pavilion was erected by the Parish Council, on the playing fields in 1938.

In the 1920s the club was suspended by the Gloucestershire Football Association for non-payment of a fine. The fine followed a referee being jostled into an adjoining brook after what the home side felt were some dubious decisions! No pay - no play, so Tytherington disbanded until 1932 when Tytherington Rocks FC was formed, joining the Bristol & Suburban League. War disrupted the local leagues and Rocks re-joined Division 1 in 1947. The same year a youth team called the Pebbles was formed and played in the Gloucestershire Junior Boys' League.

The 1960s were spent between Division 3 and Division 5. Facilities were upgraded in 1979-80, with new showers and toilet block together with electricity! The Reserves reformed in Division 7 and the first team reached Division 1 for the 1987-88 season. 1987-88 saw the formation of the third team joining Division 7 and at the same time Streamside Juniors were adopted as Tytherington Rocks Juniors. A floodlit training pitch was opened in 1988. Rocks entered Premier Division 2 and by 1993 arrived in Premier Division 1. Ground improvements continued with dugouts and perimeter fencing. As Champions of the Bristol & Suburban Premier League in 1997, it was shock and disappointment when an application to the Gloucestershire County League was rejected. Following rejection, a new bar, separate changing facilities, referees room and a spectator stand raised the profile of the club and, in 1998, the County League application was successful.

The team survived a difficult first season but, during the next four years, enjoyed top half finishes and were GFA Challenge Trophy Finalists, League Cup Finalists and, in 2004, were County League Runners-up. Hellenic League football and Hellenic League status Division 1 [West] arrived in 2004-05. Season 2011-12 was to prove to be the first of three outstanding years for Tytherington Rocks. The 1st team finished 18 points clear to win the UHlsport Hellenic League Division 1 [West] title, followed by a 3rd place and then champions again in 2014, this time by 5 points. Following this success, a transfer request to move to the Toolstation Western Premier League was rejected by the FA. This refusal had a devastating effect on the club with players and team management of both 1st team and Reserve teams leaving in their numbers.

History will record that several managers and committee members worked tirelessly to ensure the survival of the club during the following four seasons.

The 2018/2019 season ended with all three teams (U18, Reserves and 1st team) all completing their programmes, although they all finished in the penultimate positions in their respective League divisions. Between August 2019 and now, Rocks have experienced major changes both on and off the field including the seasons destroyed by Covid-19.

Reserve sides have folded mid-season, an U18 team had run its course and a Ladies team arrived and left. Numerous committee, management, and playing staff departures and arrivals took place during the two seasons destroyed by the Coronavirus.

One welcome achievement did however materialise. Rocks won the Beaufort Cup, an end of season competition run by the Bristol Premier Sunday League.

In recent years, the club joined the Toolstation Western League, achieving respectable finishes, including 13th place in the 2021/22 season. After an unconsulted transfer to the Hellenic League, the Rocks spent several seasons in mid-table, regularly traveling for away fixtures across Worcestershire, Warwickshire, Shropshire, and Oxfordshire. However, due to restrictions imposed by the landlords, the club was unable to carry out necessary stadium improvements. As a result, the Rocks have chosen to compete in the Gloucestershire County League for the 2025/26 season – a league fondly remembered for its local derbies during the 2000s.

League Season So Far

Tytherington Rocks 0 - 0 Hanham Athletic

At Hardwicke Playing Fields Tytherington Rocks played their first game back in the County League against Hanham Athletic. Both teams started slowly looking not to concede early on. Hanham created the first chance but were denied by a good save by the home keeper Billy Pullin. Tytherington made chances but strong Hanham defending kept chances to a minimum. Rocks were denied two goals from Toby Waterman firstly for a foul on the keeper and the second for offside. Hanham thought they had scored but were denied by a Jack Pullin goal-line clearance, but overall neither side did enough to win the game and a 0-0 draw was a fair result.

Cribbs Reserves 0 - 2 Tytherington Rocks

Cribbs Reserves welcomed Tytherington Rocks to the Lawns for their first home game of the season and after an even first twenty minutes Rocks had the ball in the net only for it to be ruled out for a foul. In response Cribbs' James Carolan tried his luck from 45 yards lobbing the keeper, but saw the ball bounce just wide. On 35 minutes Alex Craig's through ball set up Bryson Ladip but he was denied by Billy Pullin's good save, and another half chance for Cribbs with Andy Capon volleying just wide. Just before the break, Rocks had two great chances to score, Toby Waterman missed from close range and another shot just wide. Into the second half and a goal eventually came on 75 minutes when Ollie Briggs latched onto a through ball, composed himself, and slotted past Corey Weir to give Rocks the lead. A few minutes later Weir kept Cribbs in the game, tipping over an excellent shot by Stu Nelson. On 80 minutes, Cribbs substitutes combined, Jake Harris crossing for Toby Pocock, whose volley was saved, then Pocock again, from outside the box, firing just over. With Cribbs pushing for an equaliser Rocks broke away and a cool finish from sub Tom Bidder made the final score 2-0 to Rocks.

Tytherington Rocks 1 - 2 Bishop Cleeve Development

The Rocks returned home following last weeks convincing win against Cribbs. In front of 37 fans the home team started slow and it took 12 minutes into the game when Callum Debonis finished off a well worked team goal with a volley to beat the keeper. Tytherington started to put passes together and levelled the score when Ollie Briggs shot went through the hand & legs of the keeper. The game was level throughout the first half with both teams trying to take the lead. Tytherington had the 1st of 4 penalty claims turned down during the last few minutes of the half. 2nd half started with Tytherington putting pressure on the away side and creating a few chances from corners but still couldn't find the net. 3 more penalty claims came in quick succession but all turned away by the ref. The away side thought they were going to take the lead when the player rounded the goalkeeper only for Connor Davey to make a last ditch goal line tackle to keep the score at 1-1. The game looked to be heading for a deserved draw for both teams when a clearance from a long throw landed at the feet of Jamie Lock who smashed the ball into the top corner to take the 3 points back to Bishop Cleeve. Overall a good midweek game of football from 2 teams looking to play football

Filton Athletic A - A Tytherington Rocks Filton Leading 1-0 at abandonment (73rd Min)

At Elm Park Filton Athletic took on Tytherington Rocks for a match that unfortunately never went the distance. The game started in heavy rain and the first chance fell to the visitors when a shot from Toby Waterman was well saved by Tom Bradley, with Chris Hillyer blocking Ollie Briggs back up. Rocks had another chance when Waterman's shot was blocked by Jack Willmore and the resulting corner bounced around the Filton box before the incoming shot brought a great save from Tom Bradley. Filton started to eek out some chances, Venables from distance wide and Abdulrahman also from distance. Rocks then drew a good save from Bradley from Briggs' effort. Filton then struck the bar, Venables deep cross headed goalwards by Cooper. Both teams started the second half creating half chances and Cooper had a big chance on the hour when good wing play by Merrett who put in a low cross towards Cooper, but the ball went under his foot! He didn't dwell on that because moments later a Dan Payne shot was blocked and Cooper slid the ball home for 1-0. On 75 minutes Rocks Ben Cook went into a strong challenge with Liam Dorman in which Cook got a shoulder injury and couldn't continue or move so the game was abandoned.

Tytherington Rocks 3- 1 Cribbs Reserves

League Cup action at Hardwicke where Tytherington Rocks took on Cribbs Reserves. The game started strongly for the Rocks and on eight minutes Ollie Briggs chased down a loose ball, with keeper Jude Brown trying to shield the ball out Briggs knocked it round and squared to Ali Al Fadhli to score. Rocks had a few chances to double their lead but almost conceded in the last few moments of the half with Jack Pullin clearing off the line. It took only four minutes of the second half for Rocks to double their lead, Briggs heading home from a corner. Briggs doubled his tally on the hour for 3-0. Cribbs eventually got on the score sheet five minutes from time Alex Craig scoring. Rocks progress 3-1.

Tytherington Rocks 3 - 0 Bromley Heath United

At Hardwicke, Tytherington Rocks dominated Bromley Heath United in a return to League action. Rocks took the leads on the half hour when a ball down the line by Jon Morgan found Ali Al Fadhli who squared for in form striker Ollie Briggs to make it 5 from 5. Rocks had a few chances to double their lead and took just two minutes into the second half to take their chance, Blaine Skuse volleyed in from a miss-kick by Sam Sackett-Springer. It wasn't to be the keeper's afternoon, judged to have handled outside the box he received a red card. From the resultant free-kick Tytherington gained a corner from which the substitute keeper punched the ball straight onto Stuart Nelson's head for 3-0 for a deserved Rocks win.

Frampton United 0 - 0 Tytherington Rocks

At the Bellfield Frampton United and Tytherington Rocks contrived a pretty uneventful afternoon with few chances created by either team, although a looping header in the 16th minute from Frampton's Theo Browne landed on top of the crossbar. Rocks Toby Waterman forced Tom Kaye into a good save on 35 minutes and five minutes later they had a great chance to open the scoring from the penalty spot but Kaye saved Waterman's effort. Frampton's best opportunity fell to Browne but Nelson in the Rocks goal bundled his shot away. In the closing minutes Rocks Jake Hynes had the final chance of the game but Kaye saved with his feet and 0-0 it ended.

Tytherington Rocks 1 - 3 Sharpness

Top of the table Sharpness made the trip to Hardwicke Playing fields to take on Tytherington Rocks who were undefeated in their last 4 games. An even start with both teams working each other out. Sharpness started to show their form with a few half chances but both teams went in at half time level at 0-0. Second half carried on from first with Sharpness taking control and it took 4 minutes for the deadlock to be broken when a ball through fell to Kier Bennett who slotted home. The lead was doubled 8 minutes later when Tytherington keeper Billy Pullin tripped a Sharpness attacker in the box. James Tainton stepped up to slot the penalty home. Tytherington started to press forward but couldn't get through the Sharpness back line. Sharpness scored a third through Marley Thomas, although Tytherington felt their defender was impeded by the official. In the final few minutes Tytherington scored a consolation goal with a quality lob over Sharpness goalkeeper Peter Dykes by Ollie Briggs.

Tewkesbury Town 4 - 0 Tytherington Rocks

In the league, Tytherington Rocks went to Tewkesbury Town's Northway ground with both teams looking to continue their impressive League form. It was a cold and windy afternoon and after a quiet start to the game first strike was to the hosts midway through the half after some good work out wide by Jamie Goodwin his cross found Shea Danter to bravely dived in to put them one up. Shortly after Goodwin was again the provider winning an aerial battle in midfield to put Scott Jordan through to score with a delightful lob. Tytherington started the second half looking to gain some sort of a foothold on the game but Town stood firm and got a third when Goodwin capitalised on a short back pass to rob keeper Billy Pullin and slot into an empty net. The fourth Town goal followed shortly after with Goodwin, continuing to cause havoc, forcing an own-goal and an impressive 4-0 scoreline for a fifth consecutive League win.

Tytherington Rocks 0 - 1 Henbury & Rockleaze

At Hardwicke Tytherington Rocks with a much-changed squad welcomed Henbury & Rockleaze for the Remembrance weekend fixture. It was a game of little action in front of goal but H&R started quicker although they never tested Stuart Naylor in the Rocks goal. Tytherington started the second period the quicker of the two sides but, again, without creating anything. Both sides appeared to be happy with appoint apiece until the ball landed at Harvey Moran's feet in time added, leaving him to tap in from 8 yards to give H&R three points.

Chalford 4 - 3 Tytherington Rocks

In perfect conditions at Highfield Way Chalford and Tytherington Rocks served up a seven-goal thriller marked by high quality finishing, momentum swings and moments of individual brilliance. Chalford started brightly with Dzeko threading an excellent early pass to Ryan Harry on only eight minutes, but his effort drifted narrowly wide. Chalford continued to press and Lewis Newell saw his deflected strike trouble the Rocks defence. Tytherington's attempted response didn't really trouble Chalford, who went close again on 27 minutes when Dan Carter's powerful effort was well saved by the Tytherington keeper and moments later a promising Rocks counter was halted by superb covering work by Miller. Chalford regained momentum and on 38 minutes Danny Harris delivered a superb ball to find Harry who delivered a pin-point cross in for Andy Maryon to head home from close range. However, Rocks found an equaliser just before the break with their No.3 firing in off the post. Chalford started the second half with urgency and another good save was followed up by Maryon who perhaps should have done better. Five minutes in Sam Hart produced an outstanding save to keep things level but in the 53rd minute Rocks took the lead when their No.10 guided a deft header into the corner. Chalford responded superbly when a delightful free kick from Newell picked out Maryon who finished emphatically to restore parity. The reprieve was short-lived when Rocks No.2 powerfully headed home from a corner. Chalford had one disallowed on 67 minutes but three minutes later their perseverance paid off when Newell unleashed a stunning strike to level things up, and he repeated the feat on 78 minutes with another magnificent effort. A minute later he almost made it a remarkable hat-trick of long-range goals, but, a superb save was made tipping the ball onto the crossbar. Chalford held firm to secure a fine 4-3 victory. Just a final note that just before kick-off Tytherington showed exemplary respect in observing a minute silence, greatly appreciated by all at Chalford.

Opposition

Ruardean Hill Rangers play their football on the highest point in the Forest of Dean, 920 feet above sea level.

Formed in 1919, Ruardean Hill played in the old Forest of Dean league until its termination in the late 1950's where they moved into the North Gloucestershire League and have remained there in some capacity ever since.

Ruardean Hill gained their first promotion to the Northern Senior League in 1994/95 and competed here for several seasons before being relegated in 2001. Immediately gaining promotion the following year only to be relegated again in 2004. In the 2011/12 season they gained a last day promotion back to the senior league and also reached the final of the 'Amateur Cup'. The 2012/13 season brought the club its first promotion to the Northern Senior League Division 1 for back to back titles. The 'Hill' finished in the top eight for each of the next three seasons before finally winning the Division 1 title last season scoring an incredible 125 goals and conceding just 34 in 35 games. Ruardean Hill's current first team has a good mixture of youth and experience

The club's promotions owe a lot to the depth of its other senior teams and the junior ranks. Ruardean Hill now field 3 senior teams and a Under 14's team who became Champions of their league and gained promotion to Division 1 of the Cheltenham Youth League last season with a un defeated season.

The club are this season competing in their 9th season in the Marcliff County League and are hoping for a strong showing again this year having established themselves.

Dan Bowles (Defender) – 1st full season with the club who also plays for Cinderford Town U18's. Dan is a proper defender who likes to battle with the opposing strikers. Doesn't lose much in the air. Great Drummer.

Isaac Hatcher (Midfielder) – Another young player who is in his 1st full season with the club. Played the second half of last season with 2nd team winning Players Player of the Year. Great energy and pace to burn. Can play anywhere in midfield and up front.

Dan Matthews (Midfielder) – Dan is a player again with great energy and never stops running. Can play anywhere along the midfield and like to get a good tackle in. Reliable !!

Ryan Smith (Midfielder) – New signing for the Club. Going to be a great addition with the ability to play on numerous positions. Will hopefully add good competition to the squad this season.

Mitch Griffin (Midfielder) – Mitch likes to get the ball down and take people on. Can play on either wing. Great work rate and always puts a shift in for the team.
