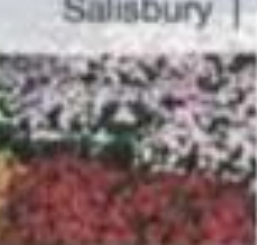

Hope you enjoy the game

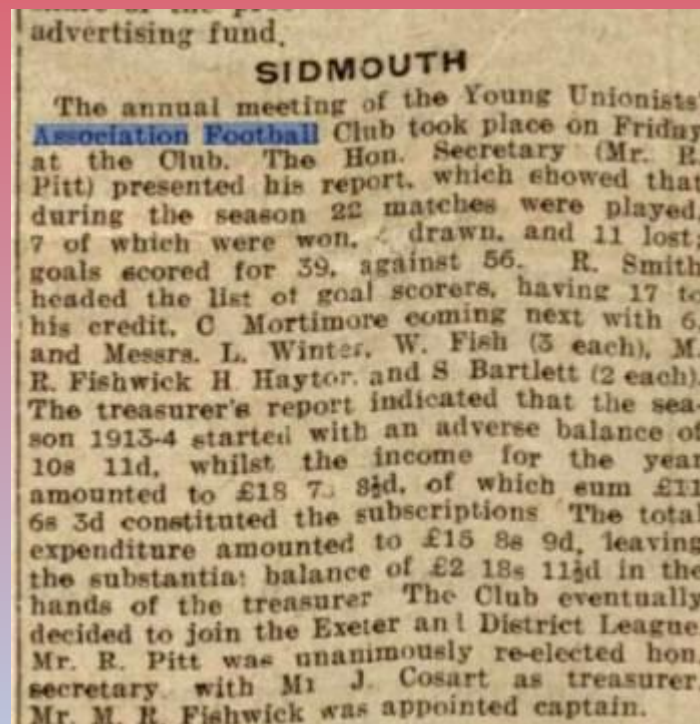

# Meet the Opposition



The history of Sidmouth Football Club since its inception has been one of continuous development through to the present day. As you will see the Club is now a far cry from its humble beginnings in the century before last, and a credit to the fathers of Sidmouth football that the 'Vikings' continue to thrive to this day.

Although Sidmouth FC was founded in 1895 and football was regularly played in the town, the first evidence of a fully constituted league-based football club in Sidmouth was in 1912 when a team known as the Sidmouth 'Young Unionists Association Football Club' played in the East Devon League. However, after just two seasons the First World War disrupted their progress. The newspaper clipping below records the Club AGM of the time and mentions one C. Mortimore as a frequent goal-scorer. He is an ancestor of Ken Mortimore who has been involved with the Club over many years and remains so to this day, as club groundsman.



## Local newspaper report of Sidmouth (Young Unionists) Football Club AGM

In 1919 the team seems to have been reformed and played until 1922 possibly as the Sidmouth 'Imps' when they joined the Ottery & District League for just one season. They won that at the first time of asking so re-joined the East Devon League until 1928 when they switched across to the Victory League for one season before a return to the East Devon League where, in 1931, they became Junior Division 1 East champions.

In 1937 Sidmouth became champions again so re-tried their hand back in the Victory League until progress was again hampered by the intervention of World War 2.

After the war Sidmouth moved back to the East Devon League which was now known as the Exeter & District League, and in 1957 were promoted to the Premier division for the first time.

In 1968 Sidmouth won the Premier title for the first time but in the 1980s they found themselves back in Senior division football on three occasions although they did win the Senior Division 1 'A' title in 1987.

In the 1990/1991 season, when three points were first awarded for a win, the Vikings were relegated, but returned to the Premier division a year later despite only finishing eighth. This was because the Devon & Exeter League, as it had now become, saw a number of its Premier teams transfer to the newly formed Devon League, and had to change its constitution so clubs with better facilities such as Sidmouth were favoured.

Sidmouth were then in the Premier Division where they won the championship for the second time in 2011. They then decided to step up to the South-West Peninsular League (East Division) where they played their football until 2025.

#### The Ground

Over the years matches were played variously on a field between Lawn Vista and the river Sid – now allotments, Vicarage Field – where Glebelands now is, occasionally on the hockey field at Manor Road, Blackmore Field – the current rugby pitch, a field in Sid Road -where Redwood Road now is (with players changing at the Anchor Inn) and finally at the Recreation Ground, Manstone.

The original changing accommodation at the “Rec” was sited at the top end of where the skate park now is. It was, to say the least, very small, comprising a wooden hut (through which the wind whistled) with two tin baths (filled by a gas copper) which, after use, were emptied into the stream behind.

The current Clubhouse, laid down in 1974 has developed over several phases, the apex roofed area being the original and financed by a reasonable bank balance, supplemented by grants from the Devon Playing Fields Association and Devon County Council. A subsequent phase, completed in 2010, saw the addition of modern changing facilities for players and officials and included an accessible toilet and laundry room. In 2013 the club bar and lounge areas were modernised and refurbished.

In 2017, with the help of the Keith Owen Fund (KOF), the Club completed the construction of a Gym and Workshop (The Ken Mortimore Building) as part of a rear extension to the existing Clubhouse. Recent additions have included solar panels, a re-configured office and a fully equipped kitchen and servery. Elsewhere, further KOF assistance in 2021 saw the installation of a pitch-end ball-stop and together with Football Association and Devon County Council funding the Club completed a major upgrade to the ground with the installation of floodlights, covered seating, perimeter railings and additional spectator standing. Recent pitch extensions and fencing ensure compliance with the Step 5. FA requirements to compete in the Western League.

The Club has a large and loyal following in the town and many of Sidmouth’s leading businesses are involved in sponsorship and support. Since promotion in 2025 to the Western League teams travel the length and breadth of the West of England and in league and cup-ties play as far afield as Bristol, south Gloucestershire, north Somerset and into Dorset, Wiltshire and Cornwall.

#### Nickname

The origin of the team-name ‘Vikings’ is explained in the following post on the Club website some years ago from Andy Harris.

Andy Harris on [October 25, 2013 at 8:28 pm](#) said:

*“The nickname “The Vikings” was the result of a competition held by the Sidmouth Herald in about 1975. A prize of £10 was on offer for the winner of the competition, to give Sidmouth Town a nickname. I entered the competition myself as a then 15-year-old boy..... and WON !!!!  
Among the reasons I gave for choosing this name was that the Sidmouth crest/coat of arms had a Viking ship on it and it also described their attacking play. I was duly invited to the club house and then presented with my cash prize of ten crisp one pound notes, which were arranged in a large fan shape and subsequently my picture appeared in the following weeks Herald with a rather large grin on my face. Ten pounds was a good sum of money back then, as when I began work the following year I was only earning £25 pounds a week and a pint of Trophy bitter was only 29 pence a pint in a pub.  
Just thought I might add a little to the club history as I stumbled across this page today “*

# ONLY THE CAPTAIN

As part of the recent changes to the Laws of the Game (2025/26) approved by IFAB in March, the “*Only the Captain*” protocol will be applied across all competitions in England starting from the new season.

## Purpose and Rationale

The protocol is designed to strengthen respect between players and referees by formalising that only the team captain may approach the referee to discuss key decisions. The aim is to reduce incidents of mobbing, dissent, and intimidation of match officials- improving the environment for everyone involved in the game.

## Key Points

- Normal, respectful interactions with referees are still permitted; however, dissent (by word or action) remains a yellow card offence- even for captains.
- Only the captain from each team is allowed to approach the referee on major decisions.
- Captains are responsible for ensuring teammates stay away from the referee during these moments.
- Referees may delay the restart to allow captains to communicate messages back to their teams if necessary.

## Additional Details

- If the goalkeeper is the team captain, an outfield player must be nominated to fulfil this role for referee interactions.
- A “captain-only zone” of 4 metres will be established around the referee; no other players are permitted within this area.
- Any non-captain entering this zone should be cautioned for dissent by action. If multiple players enter, at least one must be cautioned, and the incident will be reported to the relevant authorities.
- Competition organisers are encouraged to introduce sanctions for repeated breaches across the season.

## National Implementation

This protocol will be implemented consistently across:

- All professional competitions
- The National League Pyramids
- County FA-administered football

The approach is to create alignment and consistency from the top tiers to grassroots, improving behaviour towards match officials at every level.

## Education and Communication

The new initiative is currently being rolled out to referees, County FAs, Referee Development Officers, and other stakeholders to ensure clear understanding and consistent application.

All leagues have been instructed to send communication to clubs to ensure teams are fully aware of the expectations and can prepare accordingly.

Although IFAB have included an arm signal to initiate the protocol at these levels, in England we will not adopt this. Referees will manage the protocol themselves, using their existing match management skills.



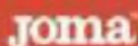
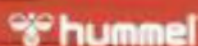

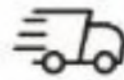

I CAN'T have been the only one to notice a distinct change in the temperature over the last few weeks as the summer months passed and autumn set in.

With t-shirts and shorts now long packed away in the bottom of the wardrobe, woolly jumpers and thick coats are now the order of the day for bracing a cold afternoon or evening on the terraces.

The autumn and winter months can be difficult periods for Non-League clubs up and down the country. Storm Amy battered our shores and played havoc with the fixture scheduled a fortnight ago, while the likes of Bram, Chandra, Dave and Eddie brewing for the next instalment.

Indeed, echoes of past storms and multiple postponements that wiped out week-after-week of fixtures sprung to mind as I ventured to a Friday night fixture between Northern League Division One rivals Newcastle Blue Star and Horden Community Welfare a couple of weeks back.

Now, I can't have been the only one expected to arrive at Blue Star's KD Stadium to be told the fixture had fallen foul of the strong winds and heavy rainfall that had battered the north-east and beyond for large parts of the previous 24 hours.

Yet, to my surprise, it was very much business as usual as the two sides made their way out onto a playing surface which looked in pristine condition despite being battered in the hours leading up to the game.

Somehow, amidst howling wind and driving rain, an intriguing contest ensued with the points shared in a 1-1 draw.

Indeed, on reflection, a share of the spoils was quite fitting on a day where the real winners were the team of Blue Star volunteers who worked tirelessly, without any individual reward, to get the game on in testing conditions.

But it wasn't just the ground staff at Scotswood who deserve credit.

Off the pitch, turnstiles were in use, pints were being pulled in the clubhouse, bins were being emptied, half-time draw tickets sold and the club shop manned.

Then, once the full-time whistle had been blown, the clean-up operation began, both in and outside of the stadium – tasks that the 243 in attendance wouldn't have given a second thought to.

This, of course, is indicative of everyday life at a Non-League club, whatever the level, and got me thinking just how invaluable volunteers are to the day-to-day running of our clubs and how they provide the foundations of their very existence.

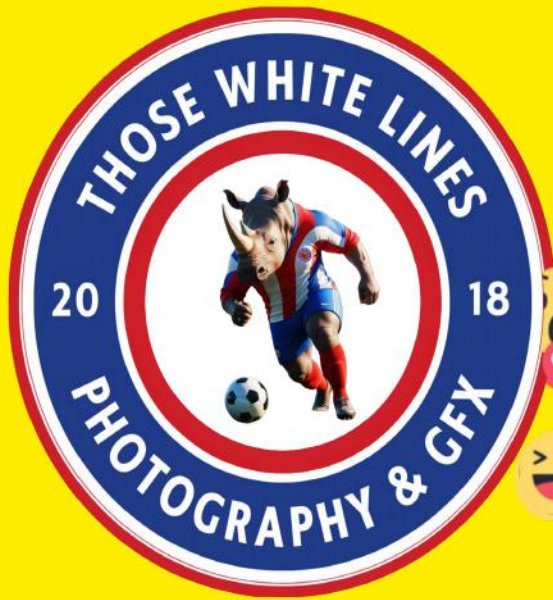
Without them, there would be no football clubs, or if we did, they would be unrecognisable from what we can consider ourselves fortunate to have.

From the tea lady to the kitman, the bar staff, to those manning the turnstiles and sweeping up post-match - all are as essential as each other and deserve our utmost respect and appreciation.

The winter months, as always, will be significant challenges as the bad weather descends - and that is when our volunteers come to the fore and go beyond the call of duty. Their work is invaluable, whatever the weather.

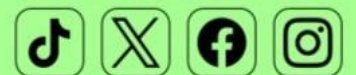
