As the term continues, we look forward to more successes and celebrations. It has been a fantastic start to the academic year, and we are proud of how our students are approaching their studies and embodying our key values. ●

Rites of Passage



I have written before about some of the rhythms to life at primary school and the various points in the year when key things happen.

There are regular activities too. I like to think that we are always showing our commitment to providing the most broad and balanced definition of education that we can. This means staff and parents (plus the children) putting themselves out to enhance this wider provision.

Some of these become rites of passage, defined by the Oxford English Dictionary as a 'ceremony or event marking an important stage in someone's life'. Most schools offer activities that fall into this category – events, visitors and trips that

(especially in young minds) leave a lasting, and sometimes lifelong, impression.

One category we remain very committed is residential trips.

Our Year Four children usually spend two nights at Ufton Court, which offers a history-themed experience, and in their final year with us Year Six spend a week at Woodlands in South Wales.

They left bright and early on a morning in October – a military-style operation involving a vast coach, sixty bags and suitcases, medication, picnics, card games for the journey, an array of cuddly toys and five members of staff. Plenty of waterproof gear too, given the forecast. Very few tears. Perhaps one or two from the parents – many of the children will not have been away from home for a week before.

Woodlands offers our children a unique experience and we know the lasting impact the trip can have on them, from multiple reports by our former students. Yes, they challenge themselves during the week with full days spent hill walking, climbing, canoeing and caving, but they also need to organise themselves, familiarise themselves with complex new equipment and live communally in a large Victorian house. Those challenges can be daunting for

some, and equally beneficial once conquered.

Given our long history with Woodlands, the collaboration between our staff and theirs is usually seamless, and the team manages to allow the children just the right balance of freedom and supervision. Very often, children develop their sense of self and a sense of responsibility whilst they are away. They quite often have lots of questions. Quite often the answer is, 'See if you can work that out for yourself.'

And usually they do.

We enjoy hearing from them when they return at the end of the week. Normally they return a more bonded and cohesive group. The adventures they have had and the stories they have to tell will stay with them. They then had half-term to wind down from the trip before focusing back on their Year Six studies.

And now we are on the run-up to Christmas once again! It is always a special time, and it is a real privilege to help children celebrate a wide variety of different festivals through the year.

A just giving page is now set up in and shared to the community through our facebook page and in the library. You can also donate cash if preferred by leaving your donation in an envelope with the Pearmans at 50 Kennylands Road, or through their letterbox.

Many thanks for the two received already for £50 and the other £30.

A POTENTIAL OLYMPIC CHAMPION IN OUR MIDST

Underwater Hockey - what's that I hear you say?



I have always been a water baby, starting at my first swimming club at just 3 years old and joining a Synchronised Swimming Club at six and a half, where I spent the next 16 years competing at a high level with my club. I moved through Junior GB and into the senior GB Team in 2018 where I took part in the European and World Championships, and at the London 2012 Olympic Games.

After retiring from synchro in 2013, I understandably felt a bit lost and unsure where to go next. Being a highly competitive individual sport and competition are very important to me, and for a few years I competed in kayaking and swimming, until I found underwater hockey!

I started playing underwater hockey in February 2020, unfortunately just before the lockdown started. After a couple of years of playing on and off, I joined a club based in Egham and progressed surrounded by some incredible and experienced players. This year in particular has been a very successful year with my team, London Ladies, where we have defended 2 titles, European Club Champions and National Champions.

Not only this but I was also selected

to compete for Team GB this August in the Netherlands with the Masters ladies, where we became Intercontinental Champions (Europe/Africa including USA). We beat the current World Champions, France, in a very tense final that

ended up going to extra time after a 2-2 draw. We rose to the occasion, scoring three times to seal the gold medal in style! The team was mostly made up of players who had been playing for most of their lives, and I felt incredibly lucky to be able to play alongside and win with these amazing athletes.

All of the GB teams have qualified for the World Championships showing the strength, depth and spirit that Team GB underwater hockey currently have. This is a result of a lot of hard work in and out of the pool and we have all been following a tough training programme as we head towards the World Championships in 2 years' time.

The squads have much to do to make sure we continue this success and come out on top. It is an exciting time for the sport, and I am looking forward to seeing how my hockey skills can be further improved!

Underwater hockey, also known as Octopush, isn't a particularly well known sport however the game originated in Portsmouth in 1954 when an open water diving club needed an alternative during the cold winter months. The game consists of wearing a snorkel,

mask, waterpolo hat, fins, a tough glove on the playing hand and a short stick. There are 10 players on each team in the pool, 6 playing and 4 players as substitutes. The aim of the game is to get the heavy puck along the bottom of the pool and into the opponent's goal! I had a lot of transferrable skills from synchronised swimming but if you have a love for water (especially being under it!) and sport then please come and give it a try. It is a bit different, but it is also a lot of fun and so many great people are involved with the sport.

Local residents of Sonning Common can give it a go with Caversham Underwater Hockey club. They meet every Tuesday and Thursday 9pm-10pm at Queen Anne's School Caversham. You can find them on Facebook or contact Roy on 07884257247. ●

Each evening, on my walk home from the office, I often see a man with his dog, a bag in one hand and a litter picker in the other. He stops for every scrap of rubbish – bottles, crisp packets, even the tiniest bits of paper. One day, he told me he'd made a New Year's resolution to pick up five pieces of litter every day. Sadly, he said, it's never hard to find them – he often returns home with a full bag. That small daily habit has removed around 4,000 pieces of litter from our streets.

His story is a reminder that the best way to make a difference is through

small, consistent actions. Imagine if we all picked up just one piece of litter when we saw it – what a change we'd see.

The Village Volunteer Army

This litter-picking hero is just one of many volunteers who make our village such a wonderful place to live. Our Village Gardeners tend to public spaces with care. EcoSoCo and the SoCo Spring Clean teams protect our environment and keep the village beautiful.

The PTAs at both our schools, led by parents like Cate Sturgess, enhance our children's education through countless fundraising efforts. Shedquarters, run by Sheila – recently and deservedly recognised as a Henley Hero – provides a vital community space for creativity and connection.

FISH volunteers offer transport and companionship to those who need it most. The Friends of SC Library keep our library thriving. The Lunch Club brings people together, while the WI continues its long tradition of community connection. Age UK's Coffee Mornings and Film Club

provide warmth and friendship for older residents, and our Scouts and Guides leaders nurture the next generation.

And, of course, a special thank you to the dedicated team of Youth Club volunteers, who give their time every week to create a safe, fun space for young people to socialise, learn, and grow. Their energy and commitment make a real difference to the lives of our village's younger residents.

I must also mention the volunteers who helped the council pump 500,000 litres of water into our pond during the hot, dry months – a huge effort that saved a much-loved village feature.

This list is far from complete, and I apologise if I've missed anyone – every act of volunteering, large or small, matters deeply.

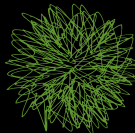

Record Turnout and a Course PB for the 3rd Sonning Common 10k



Sunday 5th October was the third edition of the Sonning Common 10k, with 302 runners taking on the scenic route - our biggest field yet! Near-perfect running conditions helped many achieve fantastic personal bests. Runners included 89-year-old Tom Harrison of Reading Roadrunners, who inspired us all with his effort. We are already looking forward to seeing even more runners on the start line next year.

Returning champion, Rob Corney, defended his title and in the process, shaved off an impressive two minutes off last year's time to win in 31 minutes and 10 seconds. The female title, also went to a familiar face- Nicola Lee, last year's winner, who once again took first place in a brilliant 38 minutes and 10 seconds.

The event, which raises vital funds for the Sonning Common Primary School, managed to raise over £8,000 this year – an amazing achievement for our school. A special thanks go to our generous sponsors: Shiplake College, Focus at Badgemore Park and Beville Estate Agency whose continued support make this event possible.

Before the race, runners enjoyed an energetic warm-up led by Jacqueline from Focus gym on the school playground. The chip-timed route took runners from Grove Road towards Memorial Park before heading out onto the peaceful country roads around Wyfold before heading home through the village of Kidmore End and then entering the finish line sprint on the school playground. Whilst the route is fairly undulating, we were delighted to

see so many runners achieve lifetime personal bests.

A huge thank you goes to everyone who makes this event possible- our fantastic marshals, whose encouragement keeps spirits high throughout the course; the staff from the primary school who marshal and run the BBQ and cake stall; photographers Kathryn Fell and Simon Booker for capturing the action; Kate and Becky from Raise the Bar Bootcamps for staffing the ever-popular halfway water station; PSCO Graham Davey for his ongoing presence and support; and the Sonning Common First Responders for keeping everyone safe.

Powering Sonning Common: Rooftop Renewables for a Greener Future



CPRE (The Countryside Charity) Oxfordshire Launches Community Rooftop Renewables Project with Special Film Screening

Residents of Sonning Common and surrounding villages are being invited to an inspiring evening on Tuesday 21 January, as CPRE Oxfordshire and partners launch a new community initiative, Rooftop Renewables: Powering Sonning Common, with a special screening of the acclaimed documentary Power Station.

Power Station tells the uplifting story of a community that came together to take charge of its energy future, following the journey of artist-activists Hilary Powell and Dan Edelstyn on their mission to turn their street into an energy-generating powerhouse.

After the screening, local residents can find out how to get involved in the new project which kickstarts in February with a series of workshops. Designed to support the village to explore the potential of rooftop solar energy as a practical, community-led step toward

net zero, the project aims to help to reduce emissions and energy bills while protecting Oxfordshire's countryside from unnecessary large-scale solar developments.

Lisa Warne, Director of CPRE Oxfordshire, said:

"We're excited to be working with Sonning Common to show that renewable energy

doesn't have to mean losing our countryside. By focusing on rooftops first, we can power our homes, protect our landscapes, and strengthen our communities."

The project is a partnership between CPRE Oxfordshire, Sonning Common Parish Council, EcoSoco, Oxfordshire County Council, Cosy Homes Oxfordshire, and the Renewable Energy Co-operative Ltd.

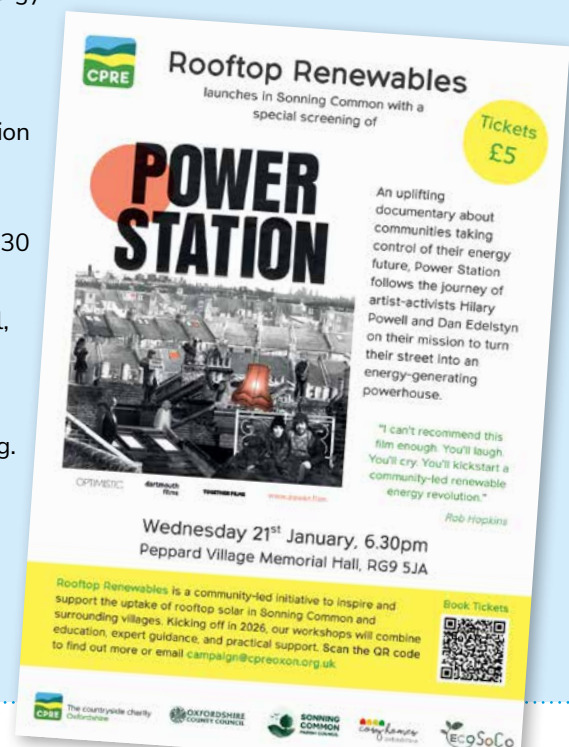

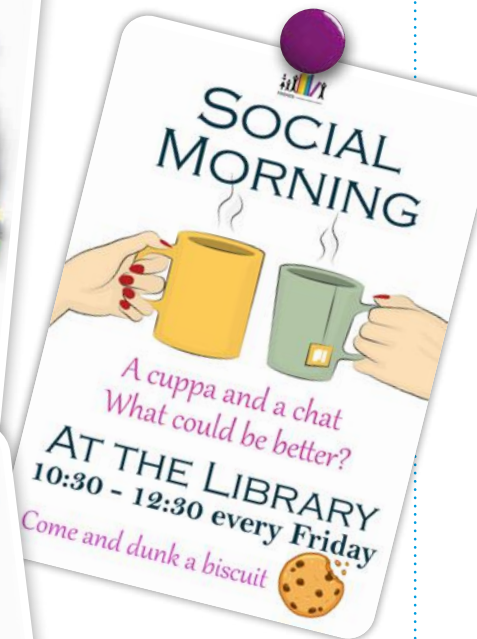

I pointed out that the problem was that her white SUV was too wide – I couldn't get out of my car without my door coming into faint contact with her bodywork.

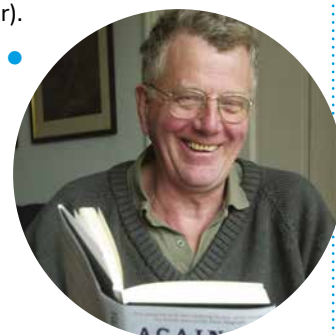

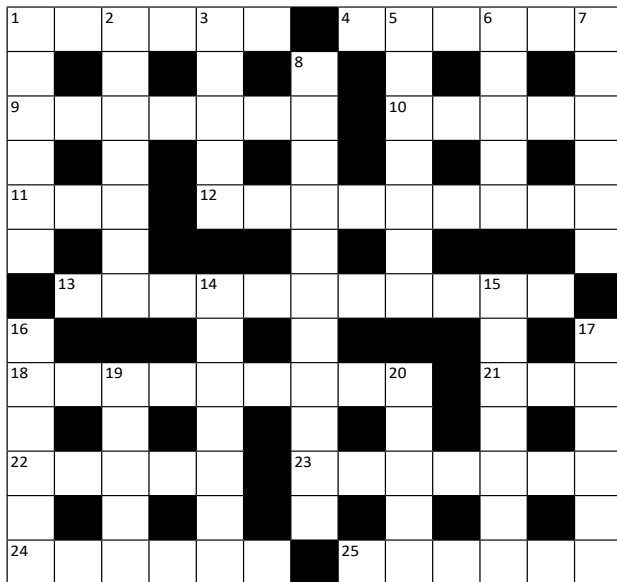

WINTER WELLNESS

Why the darker months affect your mood

As the days get shorter, the evenings colder and the mornings frostier, many of us look forward to cosy nights in, warm fires and Christmas festivities.

For others the idea of darker days, cold weather and less time outside can be a daunting prospect. In fact, as winter creeps in, google searches for 'seasonal affective disorder' rise by approximately 500%, with many finding that the colder months negatively influence their motivation, mood and productivity, and many people find that the colder months leave them feeling sluggish, tired and struggling to keep on top of mental wellness habits.

One of the best ways to counteract this and help ourselves is to 'Find the Light'.

Try to make opportunities for brightness throughout your day. This might include getting outside in natural sunlight where possible (even if just for 5-10 minutes at a time), opening blinds and curtains in your home, situating your desk close to a window and using lamps and mirrors to increase brightness indoors. Whilst natural light is ideal for boosting mood, studies have found that exposure to bright indoor lights during the day help our bodies to regulate the sleep cycle and stimulate the brain to feel alert and revitalized.

And if you can get outside into nature that will help your mood too. We are very lucky to live in a beautiful area with opportunities for walking using the many public footpaths through woods and

fields or just get down to the Millennium or Memorial fields for a stroll. Take a waterproof or umbrella just in case!
