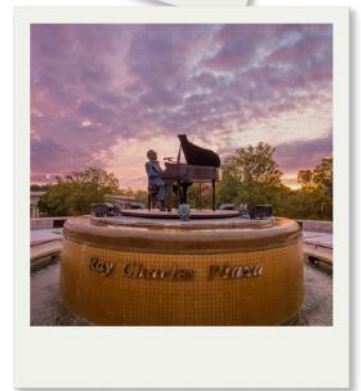
In addition to academic enhancements, ASU is focused on increasing student engagement and campus life. THE CITY OF ALBANY

Located in the heart of Southwest Georgia, Albany is a city rich in history, culture, and southern charm. Known for its warm hospitality and strong sense of community, Albany offers a blend of small-town feel with growing city opportunities. It serves as a regional hub for healthcare, education, and commerce, making it an ideal place for both residents and students to live, learn, and thrive.

Albany holds a significant place in the history of the Civil Rights Movement. In the early 1960s, the city was the center of the Albany Movement—one of the first mass efforts to desegregate an entire community. Led by local activists alongside Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), the movement laid critical groundwork for future civil rights campaigns across the South. Today, the city honors that legacy through memorials, museums, and educational programs that highlight the resilience and courage of those who fought for justice.

Beyond its historical significance, Albany is home to scenic parks, the Flint River, family-friendly attractions, and a vibrant arts scene. Whether exploring the Albany Civil Rights Institute, attending community events, or enjoying local cuisine, visitors and residents alike find Albany to be a welcoming city with a proud past and a promising future.



Albany State University President



Dr. Robert Scott

Born in New Jersey and raised in Suffolk, Virginia, Dr. Scott was the first in his family to attend college. He attended Norfolk State University, a historically Black university in Norfolk, Virginia, as a DNIMAS Scholar. The DNIMAS Scholar program, created through a generous gift to the university, addresses the severe shortage of minority scientists in the workforce by attracting and producing undergraduates who can complete graduate degrees in STEM. After earning a biology degree from Norfolk State, he then entered the graduate program at Georgia Tech, with a research focus in cell and molecular biology, and became the first DNIMAS Scholar to receive a Ph.D.

After receiving his Ph.D., Dr. Scott became a biology professor at Norfolk State. He later served as an associate dean at both Boston College and Spelman College. In these roles, he gained leadership experience, oversaw curriculum development, secured research funding, and mentored future leaders, all while prioritizing student success.

In his most recent role at The Kraft Heinz Co., Dr. Scott worked to transform the company's R&D organisational model, departmental strategy, and culture in order to drive business transformation. Among his responsibilities, he worked to foster partnerships between corporations and universities.

In his time at Kraft Heinz, he led a R&D transformation that has helped the company track toward delivering an innovation growth goal of \$2 billion in incremental sales, increased revenue attributed to innovation by double digits and created a culture of engagement which led to a reduction in voluntary turnover in his organization by more than 50%.

At Abbott Nutrition, Dr. Scott led a global team to deliver science and technology-based nutritional products to consumers and healthcare providers. During his tenure at The Coca-Cola Co., he led corporate teams in the United States, Europe, and Asia from Atlanta and then lived abroad in Mexico to lead Coca-Cola's Latin America R&D organization, helping to commercialize consumer-centric product innovations and packaging solutions that supported company environmental and sustainability goals. Dr. Scott also worked for Procter & Gamble as a senior scientist. In each corporate role, academic partnerships were a key enabler of his success.

Albany State University Director of Athletics

Director of Athletics

Dr. Kristene Kelly enters her third year as the Director of Athletics at Albany State University, a role she began in July 2023. Originally from St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands, Dr. Kelly brings over 20 years of progressive experience in collegiate athletics across all three NCAA divisions.

Before joining Albany State, she served as the Deputy Athletic Director for Internal Affairs/Senior Woman Administrator at Vanderbilt University, a Power 4 institution in the Southeastern Conference (SEC). In that role, she led various internal areas, including sports performance (applied sports science, strength & conditioning, sports medicine, nutrition, and mental health), academics, compliance, human resources, and campus recreation.

Her prior leadership roles include:

- Dartmouth College – Executive Associate AD/SWA
- Keene State College – Director of Athletics and Recreation
- Saint Augustine’s University – Associate AD/SWA, Department Chair, and Assistant Professor
- Johnson C. Smith University – Sports Information Director

Throughout her career, she has been recognized for excellence, including:

- CIAA Senior Woman Administrator of the Year (2011, 2013)
- CIAA John Holley Sports Information Director of the Year (2005)

She also led Keene State to six NCAA postseason appearances and oversaw more than 200 Little East Conference All-Academic honorees. He also led Keene State to six NCAA postseason appearances and oversaw more than 200 Little East Conference All-Academic honorees.

At Albany State, Dr. Kelly has made a transformative impact in a short time. In her first two years, the Golden Rams have:

- Captured three SIAC Championships (Women’s Track & Field and Cross Country (2024) and Baseball (2025))
- Achieved a department-wide GPA of 3.12, one of the highest in recent history
- Graduated 130+ student-athletes, including several who earned master’s degrees
- Improved 65 spots in the Learfield Directors’ Cup standings
- Secured over \$2 million in external funding, resulting in major facility upgrades across multiple sports
- Increased social media engagement and digital storytelling
- Launched three fueling stations to support student-athlete wellness
- Supported two teams traveling via airline, including one international trip
- Prioritized staff development, investing in the professional growth of coaches and administrators
- Maintained a top-three SIAC finish in the majority of varsity programs

In September 2024, Dr. Kelly was inducted into the Johnson C. Smith University Athletics Hall of Fame, honoring her enduring contributions to the profession.

Dr. Kelly holds two bachelor’s degrees from Johnson C. Smith University (Physical Education and Communication Arts), a master’s degree from the University of Tennessee, and a doctorate in Sport Management from the United States Sports Academy.

She is a proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. Dr. Kelly and her husband, Jonathan Kelly Sr., are the proud parents of Jonathan Jr., who recently graduated from Albany State University. With expertise in NCAA compliance, Title IX, budgeting, athletic fundraising, and student-athlete success, Dr. Kelly continues to lead Albany State with a student-centered approach and a bold vision for creating legacies.

HEAD COACH

Quinn Fordham Gray Sr. | 3rd Season



Quinn Fordham Gray Sr. was named Head Coach of the Albany State University Golden Rams football program on December 19, 2022, bringing with him a wealth of experience as a former NFL quarterback and collegiate coach. In just two seasons, Gray has made an immediate impact, guiding Albany State to competitive success in the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC).

In his first season (2023) at the helm, Gray led the Golden Rams to a 6-5 overall record and an appearance in the SIAC Championship Game, showcasing his ability to instill discipline, structure, and a winning mentality. In his second season (2024), the program continued to build under his leadership, finishing 6-4 overall with a 6-2 conference record, tying for second in the SIAC standings. Under his leadership, Albany State has captured back-to-back HBCU Classic sweeps, including multiple wins in the NYC HBCU Classic, Coastal City Classic, and the Fountain City Classic. The Golden Rams offense ranked No. 1 in the SIAC in scoring during the 2024 regular season, averaging 34.5 points per game.

Coach Gray has coached 12 SIAC All-Conference players in two years, including:

- Back-to-back SIAC Freshmen of the Year: Frederick Gaines (2023) and Tiant Wyche (2024)
- 2024 SIAC Offensive Player of the Year: Quarterback Isaiah Knowles

He has also raised the team GPA to 2.82 and graduated 23 football student-athletes, including four who earned their master's degrees.

His impact goes beyond the field. Gray mentored student-athlete Jack Pierrot, who was selected as an NFL Foundation Fellow, and guided student intern Ashanti Hart, who now serves as a graduate intern at the FBS level with Kennesaw State University.

Gray began his coaching career in 2017 as the head football coach at Lincoln High School in Tallahassee, Florida, where he rebuilt the program and cultivated a culture of growth and accountability. In 2020, he transitioned to the collegiate level as the quarterbacks coach at Alcorn State University, further sharpening his offensive acumen and developing talent at the NCAA Division I level. Gray also served as a senior offensive analyst at the University of Memphis.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Gray enjoyed a distinguished professional playing career as a quarterback, spanning the National Football League (NFL), NFL Europe, and the United Football League (UFL). Gray was signed by the Jacksonville Jaguars as an undrafted free agent in 2002. After a successful stint with the Frankfurt Galaxy of NFL Europe in 2003, he returned to the Jaguars, where he played from 2005 to 2007. In 2008, he had brief off-season stints with both the Houston Texans and Indianapolis Colts before joining the Kansas City Chiefs for the regular season. Gray concluded his professional career in 2009 with the New York Sentinels of the UFL.

A standout athlete from an early age, Gray grew up in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, and attended Dillard High School, where he was a multi-sport star, excelling as a quarterback in football, a pitcher in baseball, and a standout in basketball. He earned All-Region and All-District honors in football and carried that competitive edge to the next level.

Gray played college football at Florida A&M University (FAMU), where he left an indelible mark on the program. He set multiple all-time records, including:

- Career Passing Yards – 7,378
- Pass Attempts – 1,113
- Pass Completions – 562
- Touchdown Passes – 57
- Single-Game Pass Attempts – 65 vs. North Carolina A&T (2001)

In recognition of his record-setting collegiate career, Gray was inducted into both the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Hall of Fame and the FAMU Sports Hall of Fame in 2020.

Gray holds a Bachelor of Science in Health and Physical Education from Florida A&M University (2006) and earned his Master of Science in Sports Commerce from the University of Memphis in 2023, underscoring his commitment to lifelong learning and professional development.

A devoted husband and father, Gray is married to Shemeka Gray, and together they have six children: Quine, Destiny, David, Quinn Jr., Ashton, and Londyn.

ABOUT THE MATCHUP



GAME PREVIEW

Albany State enters the contest holding a 43-7 all-time series lead over Clark Atlanta. In the modern era of the rivalry, dating back to October 2011, the Golden Rams have won 10 of the last 11 matchups, including a four-game win streak since their 36-3 victory on October 20, 2018. The Panthers' last win over ASU came in 2017, a 44-36 thriller. In their most recent meeting on September 24, 2022, Albany State blanked the Panthers in a 35-0 shutout.

Inside the Golden Rams

Under the leadership of Head Coach Quinn Fordham Gray Sr., now in his third season, Albany State has continued its rise as a powerhouse in the SIAC. The Golden Rams sit at 4-1 overall and 3-0 in conference play, riding the momentum of a commanding 47-6 victory over Lane College last weekend.

Statistically, Albany State leads the SIAC in scoring offense, total offense, rushing offense, punt returns, first downs, third-down conversions, and red zone offense.

The Golden Rams also rank second in scoring defense, rushing defense, kickoff yardage, and sacks, while holding the third spot in interceptions—a testament to their balanced, disciplined play on both sides of the ball.

Offensively, quarterback Isaiah Knowles has been the steady hand guiding the Golden Rams, ranking among the top passers in the league. Running backs Tiant Wyche and Aljhanod Thomas have provided explosive playmaking in the ground game, while receivers Jamill Williams and Omari Stewart have emerged as key targets in the passing attack. Up front, senior offensive lineman Noah Stovall anchors one of the most physical units in the conference.

On defense, linebacker Derrick Drayton continues to shine as one of the SIAC's top tacklers and leaders, while Andrew Ruffin has consistently disrupted opposing backfields. In special teams, Kyle Wright provides stability with his strong leg and precise placement, complementing Cam Watts, who remains a threat in the return game.

ABOUT THE MATCHUP

Inside the Panthers

The Clark Atlanta Panthers (2-3, 1-2 SIAC) enter Saturday's game looking to bounce back after consecutive conference losses to Allen and Benedict. Under Head Coach Teddy Kealton (2nd season), the Panthers have shown flashes of offensive promise, ranking second in the SIAC in passing offense and offensive efficiency, and third in third-down conversions.

Leading the charge for Clark Atlanta is quarterback Charles Williams, who has displayed impressive arm strength and poise under pressure. His connection with wide receiver Malik Harris, one of the league's top deep threats, has been a key component of the Panthers' aerial attack. Defensively, linebacker Jordan Davis and defensive back Xavier Green headline a group that prides itself on speed and physicality, looking to slow down the Golden Rams' balanced offensive assault.

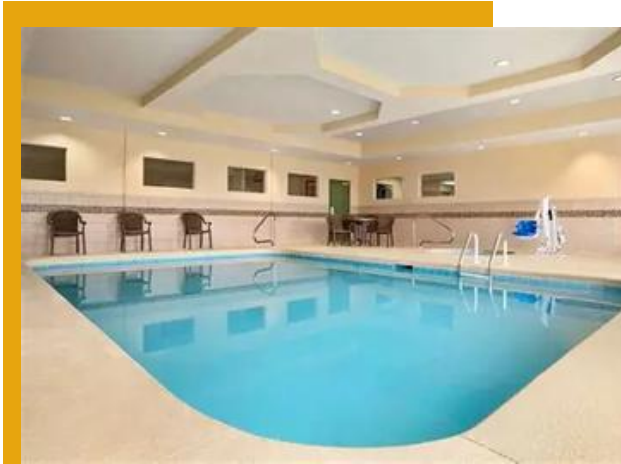
