## RAFA AT THE ROYAL ACADEMY OF DANCE, LONDON



Rafa in Y5 was dancing before he could walk. When he was only 3, he saw a small section of Matthew Bourne's Swan Lake on TV and he wanted to be just like the male dancers that he saw on the screen. Rafa started ballet lessons at Clare Novaes Balet School in Moira when he was in P1 and he initially felt nervous that there were no other boys doing ballet. He was really fortunate to be able to have 1 to 1 sessions with his teacher for a year to help him develop his technique without worrying about being the only boy.

Over the last 5 years Rafa has been exploring lots of different styles of dance and learning to navigate the dance world as a little boy in a sea of little girls! While he continues in his ballet work with Clare Novaes, he has hugely benefited from having the opportunity to work with male dance teachers who have inspired and motivated him along the way.



Rafa is part of 'Belfast Boys', Contemporary boys Dance Troupe, as part of DU Dance NI, which is led by a male dance teacher, Sean O'Neill. Rafa enjoys hip hop & street dance at PCSP in Portadown where he also has the benefit of having a male teacher as another role model.

In October 2022 Rafa was part of the Royal Academy of Dance 'Boys Only' weekend where he had the amazing opportunity to work with world-class male dance teachers, the trip culminated in an outstanding boys-only group dance performance at Trinity Laban in London.



Rafa has always been encouraged in his dancing by his peers and his teachers at Rowandale, and he is so lucky that he is surrounded by friends who are proud of him and all his talents. So now whenever anyone tries to tell Rafa that 'Boys Don't Dance'... he just laughs!

My family and I visited Canada a few years ago and I would love to go back and explore more of the area around Lake Louise and the Rocky Mountains.




