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
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WELCOME

Thank you to all who made the camps work of 2015 so successful and I pray that God's hand of blessing is on 2016.



GREYSTONES CSSM

One of our larger missions is Greystones CSSM which has been running for 119 years and is wonderfully led by Alison Gill. For two weeks a team of 50 volunteers run a daily service on the beach and age specific activities for those aged 4-18 years old. This year we were blessed to see 719 children and teens register with us during the two weeks. The theme this year was 'Guess Who' and during the mission we heard stories of Jesus and how those stories can still impact us today. Through talks, stories, games, crafts, walks, chats, prayers and studying the Bible we saw children and adults grasp a new sense of who God is and His love, mercy and grace. One of our leaders upon reflection on the fortnight shared with us "I remember a really touching moment on the last day when several kids in my group asked God to be their friend". Our prayer for these children is that their relationship with God keeps growing throughout the year and the decision they made to be friends with God has a

2015 has been a year of change, arrivals and departures and continued opportunities.

The year started with 'Nua' a fantastic SU camp quickly followed by a large gathering of American missionaries who had travelled from all over the world to meet for refreshment and encouragement. As we approach the end of the year we are in the midst of getting ready to run the Follow the Star programme, an interactive retelling of the Christmas message for junior and senior infants. Our work spans such a diverse group of people but with one aim of providing a safe, fun and relevant programme for exploring the Christian faith.

We have had close to 5000 people stay with us during the year from schools, parishes, youth groups and SU camps and a further 1200 for day events. There are many highlights throughout the year from conversations had with individual young people to watching groups tackle our new raft building activity or the new orienteering course. One event that often remains imprinted in our memories is the commissioning service for Ember leaders. This event run in partnership with the Dublin Archdiocese aims to train groups of senior school students to be leaders within schools where they will be an example of faith in action. Being part of a service where young people commit to support, serve and be faith ambassadors within their school is exciting and transforming to all.

There have been a number of changes within the staff team during the year and we want to thank all for their commitment, dedication





and desire for sharing God's love during their time. Early on in the year Ger and Deirdre Carolan moved to Canada and we welcomed Christophe Borel to the team to fill this vacancy. In November we waved goodbye to Steve and Lucy who moved to Dartmoor in England to work at Heatree Activity Centre and we were delighted that Jasper Chisnall was able to fill this vacancy. We also celebrated the graduation of our 4 interns in June and welcomed another 3 in September. You can read more about Christophe, Jasper and our interns on the following pages.

We head into 2016 with much optimism and expectation. In particular we are praying for direction and wisdom on how to further improve our programmes, helping young people explore aspects of the Christian message through our schools retreats in a relevant and natural way.

AUTHENTIC YOUTH

Yet again, Authentic Youth retreat team has been blessed with a great year of in-school retreats around Ireland as well as an increased number of activity retreats at Ovoca Manor.

Thank you for your continued prayer and financial support. We cannot do this work without your help and assistance and it is a real encouragement to us knowing we are covered in prayer.



We have been in approximately 20 secondary schools around the country and spoken to just over 2,000 students since January 2015. Our group sizes can vary anywhere from

13–120 and both ends of the scale bring so much fun and laughter in our retreats. The bigger numbers bring instant atmosphere and the smaller ones are better to get to know the students more personally. Our days are received





very positively and we get called back to the same schools each year, which encourages us that we must be doing something constructive and helpful for that teacher, chaplain and school.

We finished our gap year last year in June with Elodie, Zola, Owen and Sazi. It finished strong and they were encouraged by their year with us. They have since moved on to their 'normal' lives. Sazi and Zola went back to South Africa and have gone to college. Sazi deciding last minute to join seminary! Owen moved to Spain and Elodie went back to Switzerland. Please do keep them in your prayers that God will continue to help them grow deeper in relationship with Him.



This academic year we have Anna, James and Josh who have jumped into the year enthusiastically. They are all 19 years old and are all from the island of Ireland. James is from Belfast while Anna and Josh are both from Dublin. They, like last year, are living down at the Manor and do all retreats both at the Manor as well as in school. The interns do invaluable work and these three have gotten stuck into all aspects of SU life.

Please pray that they embrace this year and listen to God's voice and His guidance for their lives.

ALPHA YOUTH MIDLANDS

This term has been very busy with Alpha – Youth in the Midlands. Alpha has run in six schools, Sacred Heart School, Tullamore College, Colaiste Choilm and Killina who are all in the Tullamore area.

Combined we had approximately 140 students experiencing Alpha this term in Tullamore. This left us with a great opportunity to join all schools together for their Holy Spirit Day!! This was to date the largest Holy Spirit Day for the midlands. Due to a mix up with one school sending us all their TY's we had 150 students. This was a very busy but exciting day with a mix of fifth year and transition year students. Our second largest Holy Spirit Day took place in Athboy, Co. Meath. We had another great day with over 120 fifth year students attending. I have to mention our final Holy Spirit Day, which was the smallest so far with 18 transition year students from Gallen Community School, Ferbane attending their Holy Spirit Day. It might have been small but still well worth it. It is great to see a total of nearly 300 students experience Alpha - Youth this autumn!!

Working with the students can be at times challenging but as the weeks go by you find more and more students enjoying the whole experience. At the end of Alpha in Athboy one student said 'Before Alpha I really thought God could never forgive me for the things I have done wrong. Alpha has really opened my eyes and now I know God can forgive me!'

Another student wrote the following after completing Alpha this autumn.

'I did the Alpha programme as part of my Transition Year curriculum. I found it extremely interesting; I also found that it related very well to young people. It didn't force Christian beliefs on to us; rather it explained how God

works and how great He is! I learnt so many new things that I never knew about God. After watching each video clip we would answer the question asked in our small groups.



This was a great opportunity to talk about our belief in God and how we felt about everything. There was nobody forcing us to take part in these discussions. There was a very open and calm air in all the groups, which left me feeling very comfortable and relaxed. This opportunity helped me get closer to God and also my peers.'

Prayer Spaces as always has been a very big part of my Holy Spirit Days, but this autumn I was asked to set up Prayer Spaces in Tullamore's Church of Ireland and Presbyterian churches. St. Catherine's Church held a 200 Years of Worship Flower Festival, which was covered by RTE. It was so exciting for me to be given the chance to incorporate prayer spaces with breath taking flower arrangements. Seeing how well these prayer spaces worked, Rev William Hayes from the Presbyterian Church really wanted to incorporate prayer spaces in an event his church was running. This was a day of prayer and information for the refugee crisis. I was asked to speak again this year at the Chaplains Association of Ireland in Killkenny. As a result of this I was asked by two chaplains to come to their school next term to set up Prayer Spaces for a week so that the whole school can experience these prayer activities.

ALPHA YOUTH IN SCHOOLS & PARISHES

It's been five years now since we started using Alpha – Youth in schools and parishes across the country. It has been a joy to see Alpha - Youth grow. You'll find Alpha running in over 15 counties. More than 40 schools have used Alpha - Youth. Up to 60 different youth and parish groups have benefitted from it and one of the things I love about Alpha in general are the volunteers that it mobilises. There have been hundreds of volunteers since 2011 giving of their time and sharing their faith Journeys. In addition to this we have added more to the Alpha team. Annette Evans, for the last two years, has been developing Alpha - Youth and prayer spaces within the midlands and we are now turning our attention towards Cork with the hope of employing someone there in 2016. The harvest is plentiful...

In recent years there has been significant growth in the amount of overnight Alpha retreats down in Ovoca Manor. Alpha has always prioritised the retreat element to the programme and the benefits of taking students away from normal life are fruitful. Schools like Gonzaga, Belvedere, St Marys, Colaiste De Hide, St Brendans and more have really invested in what Alpha can bring to the faith development of their students. In some cases these school are not only running multiple Alpha – Youths but also having multiple overnight retreats every year. It's a good time to do outreach in Ireland.

TO HEAR FROM THE STUDENT'S PERSPECTIVE...

I had the complete wrong idea about Alpha - Youth before I left the school to go to the parish centre, on the first day of the programme.

I wouldn't consider myself very religious or to have a strong faith, so to be completely honest, I wasn't really looking forward to it. I shouldn't have thought that way though because I was so wrong.

Every session on a Thursday afternoon started with tea and biscuits, which was really nice and made it less formal, along with a team game. These were really fun and made our little group bond more and get to know our leader, who volunteered to come every week, and for whom we are extremely thankful for.

The Alpha - Youth course is centred on short clips of footage usually containing four questions per clip with two young men featuring in the clips. They were modern stories, which made it easy to relate to. The questions asked us all about what we believe or what we have learned from bible stories. No answer was ever "wrong" or "right" and everyone in the group listens to each other and respects your opinion. Some questions required more deep thought but others were just casual questions about our life experiences. Listening to other people's answers created conversations between the whole group about whatever topic was being discussed for the week. Our leaders often told stories about their lives as they are more mature than us and have been through so much.

I think Alpha - Youth has helped me scratch beneath the surface about God and not to be so closed minded. For many years Scripture Union have been bringing speakers into Ireland facilitating full weeks of school tours reaching thousands of students with inspiring testimonies and words of hope. Inspire School Events is an initiative which is being organised through the strong partnership of Scripture Union and Alpha Ireland. This year we had our first school tour on the theme of Easter. Scott Evans was the guest speaker communicating on the topic 'Captivated by the story of God on a cross and a grave that couldn't hold Him'. It was a powerful 5 days in 11 schools engaging with some 1500 students. Treise Lenihan from Cork said 'Scott has the likeability factor and has a great gift for speaking to students on their level. He breathed life into the Easter story for the students by presenting it in a refreshing and thought provoking way'.

In November we welcomed back Jason Maupin from the USA. Jason has spoken in Ireland for many years sharing his story with over 10,000 Irish students. He has a remarkable story to share. Raised in a home where his father was abusive, by the age of nine, Jason had become suicidal. With his

mother diagnosed with Lupus and his brother on a downward spiral of drug and alcohol abuse, Jason bought into the lie that his own life was worth nothing. Out of desperation, he took his mother's handgun to try and kill himself. With the choice of life and death in his hands, Jason realised he had to look beyond his circumstances and realise his life was for a purpose greater than he would ever know. Anne Loughman from St Colmcilles said 'that his vulnerability with the students is breath-taking. The students were completely fixed on his every word as he spoke about overcoming adversity. His wife Jessica was the perfect addition with her powerfully performed songs. I'd have them back in a heartbeat'. This November he spoke to 19 schools, over 2000 students in 9 counties an even had the wonderful opportunity to speak to prisoners in Mountjoy.

FAITHFEST



IT'S YOUR MOVE

It's Your Move and primary school retreats are one of the main focus areas of our work with primary school aged children. Its Your Move is a four week faith based transition resource run in school or after-school through churches or parishes. Since its pilot in 2011 over 400 students have gone through the IYM programme. Our retreat package encourages groups to come away for a day in 5th class, followed by 'Its Your Move' in 6th class and an overnight residential experience. This night away provides opportunity for the students to have a shared experience before moving to secondary school and to focus on important topics like friendship, peer pressure and change, all underpinned with Scripture and the assurance that God is with us wherever we go and whatever changes we may face.



"Experiential workshops for children taking them on the journey of Pentecost"

The Pentecost Project has run for the last two years as the children's part of 'Ecumenical Bible Week'. The Pentecost Schools experience has been a series of experiential workshops for children taking them on the iourney of Pentecost and allowing them to creatively express their understanding and own ideas around what happened during this time. Its first year saw 257 children participate and learn about Pentecost and produce incredible class comic books. Last year the Pentecost Schools Experience took place in the inner city in Dublin with 137 children from 4th class participating. In addition to this we added an online project for schools. 'The Pentecost Project Competition', this allowed schools to be part of this event and design individual comic books about Pentecost. Schools could follow four workshops online with everything they needed on the website ready to be downloaded. Parishes held an exhibition and prize giving for their local participating schools.

NEW & EXCITING SCRIPTURE UNION FILM SERIES

TO REACH THOUSANDS OF YOUNG PEOPLE

There are some very exciting developments within SU. We are embarking on a very exciting journey of creating an 8 part film series.

The Scripture Union film Series is designed to create a cost effective, scripturally faithful, interdenominationally sensitive, high quality, creative and engaging video resource that removes obstacles to faith development, identified by Irish teenagers. Over the past 5 years our research spells out a lack of understanding of the unique claims of Christianity and an unfamiliarity and difficulty in understanding the meaning and relevance of the biblical stories. Young people today are asking the big questions of faith and without any credible engagement or defence of Christianity they are quick to walk away.

So we are currently in the process of scripting 8 episodes. Each episode will be 15mins in duration split into three parts.

The following episodes, with draft titles, are based on research from Irish young people and the questions they ask; each specifically targeted at equipping young people with answers and empowering them to hold the faith with confidence and dignity.

- 1. How did we Get Here?
 Reasoning for a supreme being
- 2. Are the Gospels for Real? Are the gospels reliable?
- 3. Did Jesus actually rise again? Was it an historical event?
- 4. What was Jesus like? Encounters with Jesus







- 5. What's Jesus got to do with me? Understanding the big picture
- 6. What's the deal with Suffering? Where is God when it hurts?
- 7. Why do Christians have no fun? Tackling Christian Stereotypes
- 8. Aren't Christians to blame?
 What should mission look like?

We're delighted to have the production company 'Tiny Ark' to produce and film this Film Series with Greg Fromholz as Director. Jonny Somerville will be the host of the series along with guests and a host of volunteers. Filming will be done in studios, on location around Ireland with some specific international filming trips. All is being done to ensure that this resource is of high quality, relevant and faithful to God.
