Alex Newson, MS '17 Special Education Doctoral Candidate, Class of 2024

Alex Newson is a Special Education doctoral candidate, expected to graduate this June. Alex left her career as a special education teacher to join the doctoral program at the College of Education. She was drawn to aiding and advancing the lives of autistic individuals after her brother was diagnosed with autism and she began advocating for his education accommodations. Alex is the 2023-24 recipient of the Helena Degnath Wessela Memorial Scholarship, established by Conrad Wessela in 1990 in memory of his wife, Helena Degnath Wessela. The scholarship provides financial assistance to students who are preparing to work with those who are mentally or physically disabled.
