ELEVATING ACADEMIC FXCFILENCE

Under the new strategic plan, "Oregon Rising," the University of Oregon is dedicated to fostering academic excellence and student success. This plan focuses on four key goals:

- 1. enhancing pathways to timely graduation,
- leading career preparation efforts,
- cultivating a thriving campus community, and
- accelerating **societal impact** through innovation.

The College of Education is at the forefront of these initiatives, particularly in youth behavioral and mental health.

Through partnerships with the Ballmer Institute and the Prevention Science Institute, the college is pioneering research and training programs that address critical issues in school mental health and prevention. These efforts not only align with the university's strategic goals but also position the College of Education as a leader in addressing the mental health crisis among youth.

SUPPORTING STUDENT SUCCESS

The University of Oregon's commitment to student success is exemplified by initiatives like Oregon150 aimed at fundraising to directly support students throughout their academic journey. In the College of Education, this translates to recruiting and retaining students, providing financial support, and assisting graduates with professional licensure costs.

The college's partnership with the Coalition of Oregon School Administrators (COSA) further enhances its impact, particularly in preparing K-12 education leaders. The newly designed education leadership licensure programs and graduate degree programs are enrolling students in record numbers. These programs are crucial in addressing the shortage of education leaders and ensuring that future leaders are equipped to promote equity and justice in K-12 education.

We are the highest-ranked academic unit at the University of Oregon, due largely to a decades-long record of national and international research and development in special education, counseling psychology, educational leadership, and school psychology. Our research culture is unique and highly influential because our faculty have a long tradition of translating research into effective models, methods, and measures that improve lives.

PHILANTHROPY FUNDING RESEARCH

Supported by the Norma Kruger Outreach Fund, Stephanie De Anda piloted the linguistic diversity protocol to tackle linguistic bias in special education assessments. Her research shows Spanish-speaking children under three are 20 percent more likely to be misdiagnosed with communication disorders. This funding has now provided crucial pilot data for future studies and grants.
