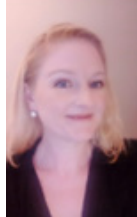

STRUCTURE & MANAGEMENT

Charcot-Marie-Tooth Association Australia Inc. (CMT Australia) is led by a National Committee of 7, comprised of 4 Office Bearers (President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary) and 3 General Committee Members. The National Committee are all Volunteers. The Constitution allows for a 4th General committee member, if an Office Bearer holds more than 1 position.

To assist the committee, CMT Australia have employed a part-time National Administration Assistant, who manages incoming calls to the National number, processing of payments and receipts, mailing out to our postal members, and general assistance to the National Committee in their tasks.

To gain a National Support presence, there is 7 State Support Coordinators, 8 Regional Support Contacts around the Nation. We also have a Support Contact in New Zealand. These roles are all Volunteer.

All who Volunteer in the above roles either have CMT or are Supporting Family with CMT.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT - ROBERT TWIN



I took over as your President at the 2021 AGM having served as Treasurer for a number of years. In doing so I retained the Treasurer position to maintain continuity in this important component of our Association. I was fortunate that at the same AGM we attracted a pro-active group as my fellow committee members. My report today is a reflection of the efforts of the whole committee including Helen Burnie (VP), Janelle Ward (Sec), and committee members Lisa Moore, Shaana Dekker, Darryl Beitsch and Jillian Critchley. It is also testament to the support we have had from our State and support group coordinators and Sustaining Partners.

It's my belief that any association established to serve the needs of its community, should be guided by its goals, as these form the basis for its existence. In 2017 we published our first strategic plan with our goals as the foundation. 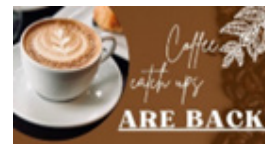

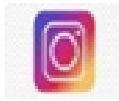

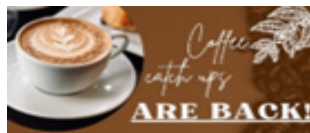

TREASURER'S REPORT - ROBERT TWIN



I believe that this is my 12th Treasurer's report for CMT Australia, and I'm pleased to report that we continue to be in a sound financial position. Whilst the profit and loss for 2021/22 shows a net profit of \$49,868, this includes a carryover of donations for Youth and Research from the previous year of \$32,484. If this is adjusted out, then the net profit reduces to \$17,384, a reduction of \$30 on the 2020/21 result. This demonstrates that our non-donation financial management is steady, indicating a good balance between our revenue and expenditure outside of donations.

Our biggest incomes and expenses relate to donations, and it is difficult to track progress here on an annual basis due to the fact that donations are not matched by expenditure in the same financial year. A good measure of our financial position is reflected in the total equity as at 30th June 2022 which is reported in the balance sheet at \$104,296.

CMT Australia is now exempt from the requirement to have a formal audit due to the scale of our turnover. Your committee agreed that this year we will not seek a formal audit, and instead find a suitably qualified financial expert to review the accounts and pass judgment on their veracity. We were fortunate to have TaxBiz as one of our sustaining partners, and Max Newham has completed such a review at no charge to our association. This is a saving of over \$1,000 and I thank Max for his support in this regard.

We have placed on our website the 'profit and loss' and 'balance sheet' figures assessed by TaxBiz, along with Max's report to our membership.

We have retained our membership fees at their very modest rate of \$40.00 per household per year to ensure support for CMT Australia is affordable. This brings us around \$11,000 in revenue. To enable us to apply for government grants we have retained our GST reporting status. Whilst this depreciates our membership income, it does enable us to claim back GST on items of expenditure. We currently hold a credit of \$2,170 in this regard.

Our current research donation account sits at around \$5,000 after having provided seed funding of \$10,000 to each of the 3 research projects we are currently supporting. Along with our researchers, we have established GiveNow CrowdRaisers to enable the balance funding of these projects with a total requested of around \$25,000. See our website for details as to how you can help us achieve the full funding of these grants.

I would like to express our appreciation to our four sustaining partners, Concord Hospital (in kind support), TaxBiz, Brazier Mobility, and Footpower. If you know of a company who would be interested in supporting CMT Australia through this program, please contact me so we can discuss options with them.

I would like to make a special thank you to Lisa Moore, who in addition to managing our website, has made my life a lot easier through her management of the membership receipts. We understand that some members have had issues in dealing with our payment options and ask for your patience while we finetune these.

That review covered verifying large payments made on behalf of the Association, reconciling and verifying material items on the balance sheet.

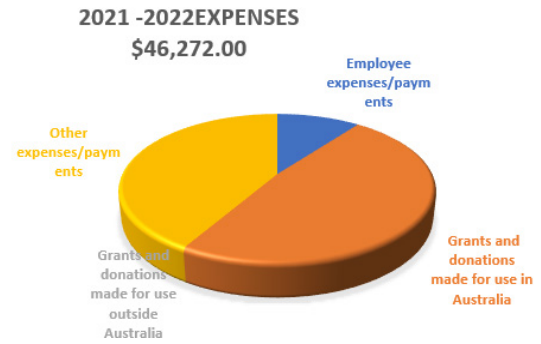
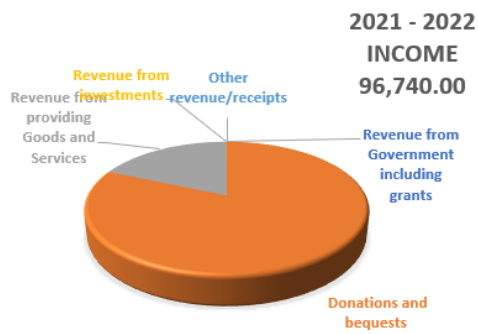
