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Dear Church Family,

On May 5, 2019, God blended River City Church and New Bridges Community Church into one family. We knew this was God's idea and that He would make us BETTER TOGETHER. Here is a snapshot of highlights from the past few years:

- Each semester, 600-700 people grow spiritually and build friendships in small groups
- 175 salvations & 80 baptisms took place across the LC-Valley
- 3 Churches were planted – The Bridge in Clarkston, Neuma in Spokane, and Dinner Church in Lapwai
- Over 200 people are fed every month through Dinner Churches and Adopt a Block
- River City Worship recorded a LIVE music project in February of 2020
- We launched ONLINE church in 2020
- River City Dance Academy develops 80-100 kingdom dancers every semester
- Fingerprints Children's Center influences the lives of 150 families annually
- Our Prophetic Team was trained and released in 2021
- GLOBAL Ministries – River City has given over \$350,000 in the last four years. Through our Global partners we've seen 135 Churches planted, 346 Babies rescued, 8,031 people provided with food, shelter, or 2,939 people baptized.

We celebrate what God has done and look forward with great anticipation to what lies ahead. This booklet contains our new Mission Statement, our values and strategy, and a future vision we want you to prayerfully invest in.

You will also find our BIG VISION GOAL – the "30/300." We believe we will plant 30 churches and develop 300 kingdom leaders in the next seven years. This God-birthered dream is only possible as we partner together with Jesus and other churches, being Spirit-led each day to spread the gospel and make disciples that multiply.

Imagine with me if every believer at River City became equipped and "compelled to go," reaching those in their spheres of influence, making disciples of Jesus in their families, neighborhoods, workplaces and beyond.

THE PROBLEM

The LC Valley metro area is home for more than 62,000 people, 40,000 of whom claim no religion or faith connection at all.

LC VALLEY - 40,000 (no religion)

In the Northwest USA and Canada, a region known for its proud waving of the "NO RELIGION" banner, people need Jesus! We live in a fractured and hurting world where SO MANY people live in spiritual poverty and broken-heartedness. Too many people live without the love and power of God, the only place we discover true freedom, genuine hope, and purpose.

In Washington and Oregon, the proportion of adults who say they have no religion ("Nones") has risen from just above 20% to 32%, while in B.C. Canada it has gone from 35% to 44%.

People across the Northwest were asked.... "What's your religion?" and 25 percent say, "I don't have one." Almost 63 percent don't belong to a religious community. Nationally, only 14 percent claim no religion and 41 percent join no church.

Abandoned by the emptiness of the world, over 9 million of the Northwest's population teeters hopelessly on the edge of destruction, desperately in need of our Savior Jesus. Individually and together, we recognize it's our privilege to carry the good news of Jesus to the neighborhoods, cities, and rural areas of our region.

DNA GROUPS

GROW CLOSE

Intentionally small (3-4 people), designed to disciple and multiply.

What is a DNA Group?

A “DNA group” is a small group that ideally consists of 3-4 people - men with men, women with women - who meet together 2-4 times a month. The “small” is by intention so that relationships can grow close. DNA Groups provide a structure for us to care deeply for one another and foster growth as disciples of Jesus.

The goal of a DNA group.

NURTURE the truths of the gospel in our hearts, and faithfully **ACT** on what the Spirit calls us to do. This will spring up from those you lead to JESUS for the first time, or those in your relational sphere who have never been discipled.

Why DNA?

At the most basic level, following Jesus requires a few other followers who know you, love you, and grow with you. Jesus did not intend for us

to follow him alone; we need each another. We need others around us who commit to learn the gospel, encourage each other in faith, and pursue fruitfulness and faithfulness in following Jesus. We need to motivate one another toward going and making disciples every day.

Designed to Multiply.

As you prayerfully listen to the Spirit’s direction each week and respond in active obedience to His leading, you will act on what you learn. Sharing the gospel and taking steps toward loving and serving your neighbors will result in people becoming followers of Jesus (and needing to be discipled).

Each person in a DNA group will be activated to make other disciples who then make other disciples who make other disciples, resulting in kingdom multiplication. We acknowledge this isn’t a disciple making formula, but rather a Spirit-led and intentional relationship.



COMPELLED BY THE LOVE OF JESUS WE ...

DEVELOP LEADERS

Proverbs 11:14 (NLT) "Without wise leadership, a nation falls;
there is safety in having many advisers."

Participating in Leadership track is one of the best choices I have made. Being new to River City, but not new to faith, LeaderTrack stretched me in ways I could not even anticipate. One of the most interesting things about this opportunity is that it challenges both the deepest and those newer in faith exactly where they are, and that is not something easy to do. If you are wanting to go deeper in your relationship with God, understand the principles that River City holds dear, as well as develop friendships on a deeper, more peer-mentoring level, this is an excellent place to begin. One of the challenges I personally struggled with was developing a "plan" to make a God-sized dream a reality. After wrapping up the course, God brought something to me beyond what I could have ever dreamed! But, because of LeaderTrack, I was able to see God's hand in my life leading up to this opportunity, as well as be willing to accept this new challenge as the next step in my faith journey. Through it, I have seen things that could only be from God. And it has changed me forever.

DEVELOP LEADERS

We will intentionally develop 300 leaders by 2030

**"Discipleship is not just helping someone live like Jesus.

Imagine a leadership development HUB at River City that trains, equips, and launches healthy leaders throughout the LC Valley, the Northwest, and beyond. Life-Giving Churches, your places of work, communities and healthy families need leaders. River City will intentionally develop 300 of these leaders by 2030.

Why DEVELOP LEADERS?

Throughout Scripture we see evidence that God chooses to accomplish His mission through humans. One key component of missional serving is Leadership.

God has been working through human leaders from the beginning of time. The heroes of faith in the Bible demonstrate the importance and need for leaders in all spheres of Influence. In the New Testament, we see that Jesus, after His finished work on the cross, empowers the Body of Christ to follow the Spirit-led Leadership of the apostles. The apostles regularly appointed leadership in every local church context by drawing from the ordinary people in their midst (Acts 6). Jesus called regular fishermen as the first disciples, investing in them, developing them, and releasing them to do the same, creating a movement of disciple-making leaders that changed the world. Jesus' mission is still ours today. We must develop leaders and send them out to permeate every sphere of society.

Everyone is CALLED TO LEAD.

Jesus told every Christian to GO and MAKE DISCIPLES. No person who is a Christ-follower is exempt from making disciples. We all directly impact and influence other people. This means YOU are a LEADER.

Indeed, God gifts people differently, and there are varying capacities and degrees of impact. In (Ex. 18:1-24) Jethro unpacks his solution to a leadership issue when he gives wise instruction to Moses, who was on the edge of burnout. He tells him to set up leadership divisions into groups of 10, 50, 100, and 1000, find faithful and capable people, and put them in charge of one of those groups. This implies that people have different capacities, experiences, and gifting.



MULTIPLICATION is better!

"You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others."
2 Timothy 2:1-2 (NIV)

Before Jesus died, some of his last words were the command to GO reach the whole world, **MAKING DISCIPLES** everywhere. The Apostle Paul demonstrated the passing on of this mandate to his spiritual son Timothy. He tells him to be strong in the grace God has given and multiply disciple-making leaders. This will have generational impact.

We see four generations of reproducing and multiplying disciples: Paul (1st Generation), Paul to Timothy (2nd Generation), Timothy to Faithful People (3rd Generation), Faithful people to others (4th Generation). Paul is clearly telling Timothy he can't just be a doer of the mission and he can't personally disciple each new believer. He must develop other faithful MULTIPLIERS of the mission.

"It's easy to pour into a few, and they grow and flourish in so many ways, but if they are not challenged to find a few that they can pour into and disciple, then it stops with them. At best, I may continue to regularly disciple a few, which is addition, but if I can help catalyze a few others to intentionally repeat the process (2 Tim 2:1-2) and they in turn do the same, multiplication begins to happen and we will begin to see generations of multiplying disciple-making leaders." - Kevin Beeson

Who is **LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT** for?

Leadership development is for all believers from all walks of life (our content targets people ages 16 and up). Healthy leaders impact their families, neighborhoods, workplaces, and social spheres. By God's grace they will live out their full God potential, fully on-mission and fully present with others in those spheres. Their faithfulness, united with a servant's heart, will allow Jesus to shine through them as they live their God Story out loud for every person they encounter.

LeaderTrack opened the door for me to begin a ministry by reigniting the purpose God has for me. I gained confidence as we unpacked our gifting, strengths, and encouragement to lead others. My LeaderTrack mentors showed me how to be more effective and efficient. God has blessed the work of our hands through this program and we are reaching more people in the community to show the love of Christ.

HOW WE DEVELOP

Below are the current vehicles we use to develop and equip leaders.

Our conviction is that all the environments offered would be
relational, informational and transformational.

EQUIP

LeaderTrack 1 (Lead Self) - offered Fall semester

This track gives you the tools to grow as a disciple-making leader, learning rhythms to stay healthy. The track will be three months in length, consisting of three intensive weekends, a mentor and mentoring group, three books to read, and homework. You will also develop a personal growth plan that sets a trajectory for ongoing growth. Our desire is that you are catalyzed to be an apprentice or begin actively leading others in a group or team setting.

LeaderTrack 2 (Lead Others) - offered Spring semester

This track gives tools and character deposits to set you on a course to be a servant-leader in a variety of settings. The track is three months in length, consisting of three intensive weekends, a mentor and mentoring group, books to read, and homework. You will be stretched and coached to lead your group/team more effectively. You will be built up and encouraged as you grow in being a servant leader who advances the kingdom.

GROUP Coaching (Lead Leaders) - offered as needed

This group is set up to provide ongoing coaching for those actively engaged in leading leaders.

Other Development Offerings

- Apprenticing with a group/team leader
- DNA group participation and activation
- Leadership Intensives (1-2 day seminars)
- Leadership book clubs



LeaderTrack was an amazing opportunity to learn about how to lead in all aspects of my life, and each person involved was so supportive in wanting to help me grow. The class taught me that we should always be honest with the people we are leading, and that you don't always have to know the answer. I also learned that everyone can continue growing, no matter how old you are. I was in a group of women who were all at least 30 years older than me who were honest about where they needed to grow, and shared wisdom from their own leadership experiences. They made it easy to want to learn more and grow in my leadership skills as well as my faith in Jesus.

COST TO DEVELOP LEADERS?

We want to keep costs affordable for developing each leader. To fund the coordination of our development hub, along with administration and operations, startup costs can be primarily covered through our current budget. However, as the number of participants grows, we know that costs will also increase. Below is a cost estimate to begin growing a leadership development hub.

2023 - 2025 = \$46,000 - \$54,000 annually

Most of the training and administration can be absorbed by current staff and budgets, but we desire to broaden our training team to connections we have within the LifeLinks network and beyond. Added events and supplies incur more costs, especially with the need of a Development Coordinator position as this vision continues to roll out.

- 8k** Outside trainers, equipping
- 24k** Part time leadership development coordinator
- 10k** Admin, operations, graphics, curriculum
- 3k** Food and supplies

2026 - 2030 = \$60,000 - \$85,000 annually

Anticipation of greater impact will incur increased cost, based on a growing number of participants.

- 12k** Outside trainers, equipping
- 35k** Leadership development coordinator
- 15k** Admin, operations, graphics, curriculum
- 6k** Food and supplies

LeaderTrack is an education. Worthwhile education is always expensive, and the price of LeaderTrack is hard work, focus, and self-reflection.

By 2030, River City will creatively partner to plant 30 life-giving churches and develop 300 leaders in the Northwest USA & Canada, a region known for its proud waving of the "NO RELIGION" banner.

These 30 church plants are part of a greater God Dream, to plant 100 churches across the Northwest who love the hurting, broken and far from God. As the gospel is declared and demonstrated, we know that the Good News will capture hearts and rescue those who are spiritually blind. We are compelled to GO!

Why CHURCH plants?

"Jesus' essential call was to Plant Churches. Virtually all of the great evangelistic challenges of the New Testament are basically calls to plant churches, not simply to share your faith. The Great Commission (Matt. 28:18-20) is a call not just to "make disciples" but to baptize. In Acts and elsewhere, it is clear that baptism means incorporation into a worshipping community with accountability and boundaries (cf. Acts 2:41-47). The only way to be truly sure you are increasing the number of Christians in a town is to increase the number of churches."

"96% of church growth is due to transfer growth and not churches striking into the heart of our enemy's territory."

One church-planting challenge is that much of current church growth is transfer growth. We believe God puts people in families and transfer and re-location are part of life. Much of that is positive, yet the need remains for us to catalyze believers to be stirred by Jesus to GO. Church planting is one of the primary ways to expand the Kingdom of Jesus. We want to establish Holy Spirit empowered hubs, multiplying disciples and churches in the cities and rural communities of the Northwest.

Church plants are most effective!

New churches are the most effective means to reach spiritually disconnected people. Church plants are significantly more likely to draw non-Christians than established churches. A 2015 Lifeway Research study found that 42 percent of church plant attendees were not previously part of a church.⁶

More recent studies in the USA show that the types of churches which are thriving are Dinner Churches and Micro-Churches. It's also interesting to note that Charismatic and Pentecostal Churches are among the top growing churches in the world.

Carey Nieuwhof gives his definition of a charismatic church.

"If you looked at almost any growing church led by younger leaders, it definitely trended toward the charismatic. And what is a charismatic church? By 'charismatic churches,' I mean churches defined by expressive worship, more emotional delivery in preaching, an openness to the work of the Holy Spirit, and a warmer, more enthusiastic, and emotionally expressive gathering."⁸

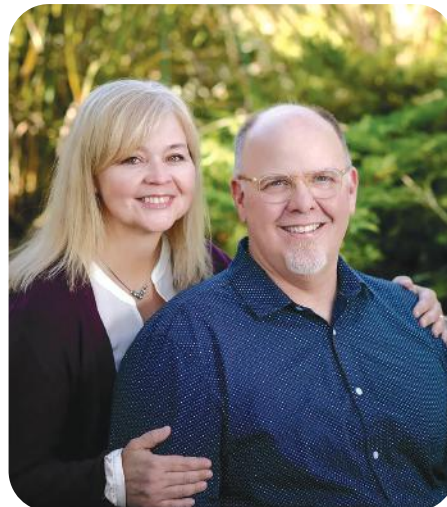


OTHER

NEUMA

Spokane (Missional Community/Micro-Church+)

One young girl poured out her struggles and insecurities to a friend on their way to a Neuma missional community gathering. During group ministry, we take time to speak life to one person in the group. This girl wept as one person after another spoke to the very heart of what she shared on the way to the missional community. She felt known by God and loved by her church family. Receiving the exact encouragement she needed was transformative to her faith journey.



THE BRIDGE

Clarkston (Dinner Church)

Mel came for a free dinner and Jesus touched her. She enjoyed a meal, made some friends and eventually was captured by the love of Jesus. Abiding daily in the scriptures, she is loved by a great community of friends. Mel is growing daily and shines with the love of Christ.

Jenn, who is disabled and in a wheelchair, was battling lack of blood flow and on the verge of having her legs amputated. The team gathered and prayed for her. The very next day her doctor said, "It's unexplainable, but the circulation is back in your lower body and there is no need to amputate."



THE REFUGE

Walla Walla (Attractional)

We work hard to foster a culture of transparency. During one of our small groups we asked the question, "What is a source of shame that you need Jesus to heal?" A member of the group shared about an abortion. She said she was raised in a religious home and had been pregnant as a teenager. Fear and shame motivated her decision to take the life of her child. In that moment she made a vow to never be in that situation again.

A couple of years later she was pregnant again. She just couldn't go through another abortion, so she courageously decided to give birth to her son. However, the shame of what she had done to her first child had affected her ability to love her son. Through tears, she expressed a lack of connection and distance between her and her son. In that moment, we prayed with her and Jesus healed her and lifted her shame.

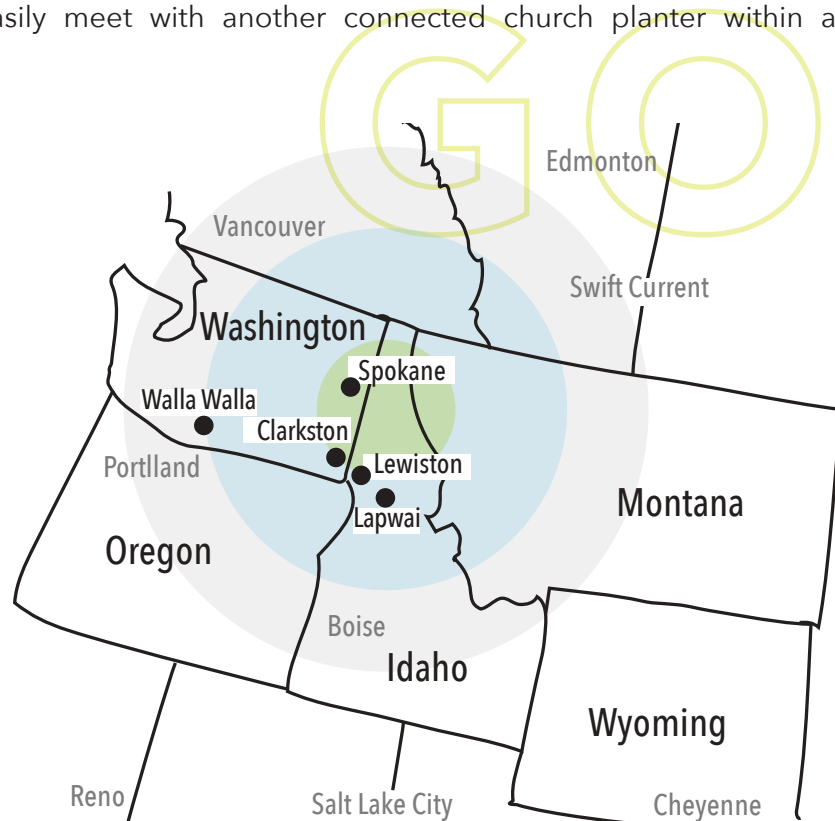

A TWO-HOUR WINDOW

Relationship and community are essential ingredients for a disciple-maker for Jesus, and we believe these same elements are vital for future church plants. Proximity and accessibility will also be factors when determining the location of a new church plant. Drive time and the Northwest go hand in hand, and we want to be sure every church planter can easily meet with another connected church planter within a two-hour drive.



COST TO PLANT A CHURCH?



Dinner Church = \$54,000 annually

Reaching many of those who have limited resources, funding comes from those who choose to serve and invest and from other outside donations.

- 24K - Meals and Space Rent
- 15K - Part-time Pastor 12-15 hrs per week
- 5K - Marketing, Admin, supplies, misc

Micro-Churches = \$5,000 annually

Minimal funding is needed to Kick Start this organic planting process, but the ongoing costs of food, supplies, leader training, and outreach is primarily covered by the tithes and offerings of the micro-church gathering.

- 2K - Rent for quarterly gathering of micro-churches.
- 1.5K - Training, curriculum and equipment
- 1.5K - Food and misc.

Other = \$70,000 - \$100,000 annually

(Revitalizations, Fresh Expression, Campuses, and more)

This category has a wide variety of costs based on the specific model, but is a more traditional plant with facilities and part-time pastoral staff. A church plant that is more than two years old with less than 100 in attendance averaged \$10,000 in startup costs and \$60,000 in first-year costs. For churches more than two years old with between 100 and 200 in attendance, average startup costs were \$84,500.

INVEST FINANCIALLY

Our goal is to plant **30** life-giving churches that have the ability to impact thousands of people.
