# Sandy Locke

She is truly grateful to have some good friends living in Winchelsea and they are excited for her to be here as they can just come into the shop to see her for a cuppa now and not go into Geelong!

If she gets spare time, Sandy loves to row and she is a member of the Corio Bay Rowing Club. She also loves to garden, travel, sketch, eat out - and generally enjoy life.

Sandy Locke has been a trade qualified Chef for approx 40yrs. She always knew that eventually she would open a shop - she just never thought it would be a pizza shop in Winchelsea!

But, after her friends telling her in conversation that Winch needed a good takeaway with more options besides just having a fabulous pizza shop, she thought she would ask Joe if he wanted to sell his business - and when he said yes, she couldn't believe it (She doesn't think that he could either, judging by the look on his face!)

She thought she would make it her own by adding in things that she knows people will like such as different pastas, souvlakis in homemade wraps, really good burgers, a weekly specials board and some different cakes and desserts which are extremely popular with her customers. They are what she is known for. All will be made on the premises - and of course Joe's Coffee (Kazbah) as it is the best on our region. It is a best seller in Sandy's coffee van Sweet Sandy's Cafe de Wheel's.

The business has continued operating as usual with no hiccups, it just had a transfer of ownership. Sandy has kept the staff on, as good experienced staff are one of the best assets you can have. Her team are fabulous, as they are excellent workers as well as being really good people. She says she is truly blessed.

She will also be changing the operating hours to include Sundays, so Thursday-Sunday 12.00pm until 8.00pm, with a 9.00pm closing time in summer depending how busy they are and of course, staffing.

Sandy is excited for the future and is looking forward to building strong business relationships, as well as friendships, along with successfully growing her business in Winchelsea. She looks forward to meeting all the Winch locals.

Sandy has travelled to many countries, Peru and Jordan (the Dead Sea is an interesting experience!) being two of her favourite countries.

She has also been to the Falkland Islands, a wildly rugged spectacular place full of wildlife, including King, Rockhopper and Magellanic penguins. She went to visit the Falklands on her way back from Antartica in 2018.

The Falklands are still under British rule and even to this day they refuse to have anything to do with Argentina. They have all their food flown in from the UK. If they need specialist medical treatment, they are flown back to the UK in an Airforce jet as there is a base on the Islands. Their food is sold frozen in the supermarkets and they grow their fresh vegetables in hot houses attached to their homes.

In 1992, Sandy was living and working in England when she met the then Prince Charles. Having shaken his hand and made a bit of chit chat, she believes he is a lovely man and is going to make a great compassionate King.

Sandy has also worked in Corrections at HM Prison Barwon, as Victoria's first female Industry Supervisor. She managed the kitchen with a crew of 22 prisoners and 4 staff, as well as a swag of casual staff members. The prisoners were trained in Cert 1, 2 & 3 in Hospitality, so they could get a job when they were released. She says she trained them well and they were really good cooks.

## Mick O'Mara

Mick's early childhood was spent to the south-west of Melbourne. Back then the Highett-Cheltenham area was a market garden and dairy farming area. The land on which they used to graze their horses and cows ran down to a Catholic boys' home that is now Southland. The house that they lived in no longer exists.

The best story he can remember from that era was a horse called Jenny that his sister had. Jenny was an ex-steeple-chaser who could jump almost any thing. One day he was going to jump a blackberry bush. When Jenny was a few millimetres away from the blackberries she decided she wasn't going to jump it after all! However he was committed. It was quite a disaster!

Mick's ancestors were the first non-indigenous people to live in that area. When they were teenagers my many greats grand father and his brother sailed their five metre fishing boat from Hobart to Port Phillip in the 1830s. They settled on the cliff top above the beach at what has become Sandringham. The chimney of their house is still there. The nearest non-indigenous neighbour was at what is now St Kilda. Unfortunately for the present day O'Maras, they didn't do a Winchelsea's Thomas Austin and select from Sandringham to Dandenong to run their farm. They were fishermen and made their living from Port Phillip.

Mick's early dream was to be a dairy farmer. His father decided he was to be a "scientific" farmer and sent me to Dookie Agricultural College. At Dookie he discovered their dairying techniques were very old. They didn't even have "walk-through" bails. With all the arrogance of a 16 year older, he decided that Dookie had nothing to teach him and he simply enjoyed life without putting any effort into his studies. At the end of the year the Dookie Principal decided he wasn't good farming material - and booted me out.

Mick says the exit from Dookie was the best thing that could have happened to him. He found work as a builder's labourer working with jack hammers on the high rise buildings in Melbourne Central. Pay was very good but, when he looked around, there are no old builders' labourers. In those days he was too old for an apprenticeship so he had to do night-school to get academic qualifications.

That meant new jobs. First was clerking at the Agriculture Dept. and then Lab Technician at Melbourne Uni. The Uni job was wonderful. It exposed him to the academic world that he had never experienced before, and he decided to become a teacher.

By pure luck Mick's partner Prue found a beautiful house at Winchelsea. When they looked at Winchelsea they found everything they wanted. A great school, beautiful pool, close to a big town and a stone house on the Barwon for \$14000. How could they not buy it? Winchelsea had everything they wanted.

As a teenager I played with Moorabbin Reserves. When St Kilda took over the Moorabbin ground and Moorabbin Football Club disbanded, I was too busy with night school and didn't ever play football seriously again. Football was great when you moved from one small country town to another - you instantly knew a whole lot of that town's people

### What is your favourite sport?

My favourite sport was athletics. I ran A Grade at Olympic Park. I was a 400 metre person. One of my great memories is when our manager said, "We haven't got any one for the Three Miler. Can you do it?" I turned up at the start line and found I was running against Ron Clarke, the World Record holder. Sure, Ron lapped me, but I had run against Ron Clarke! When I went up the bush, my running career finished.

What is a trip that has changed you?

When I had to finish up teaching because of industrial deafness, (probably from my builders' labouring days), I took up delivering boats. I decided to do the Sydney to Noumea yacht race. I was navigator. For ten days all I saw was 1 ship and 2 flying fish. I need more to occupy my time more than that, so my dream of sailing around the world went out the window, (or porthole).

### Do you have a pet?

Since Prue first got a Labrador as a present from her parents, we have had Labradors. At first we bred our own, but now we have other peoples' "Needs a good home" dogs. Our current one Peppa, (who is reminding me it is past tea time) came from Korumburra. She is simply a beautiful dog!



### Veterans Card offers discounts for Australian Defence Force members

The State Government is supporting veterans now and into the future with the launch of the Veterans Card - an Australian-first initiative.

The state Government will invest more than \$36 million over four years in the digital card, which has already been taken up by more than 6,000 veterans.

The Veterans Card provides eligible veterans with discounted registration for one light vehicle, free trailer and caravan registration, a marine (boating) licence, free public transport on Anzac Day and Remembrance Day, a fishing licence exemption, and access to the Victorian Government veteranspecific employment programs.

Anyone living in Victoria who has served or is currently serving in the Australian Defence Force is eligible for the Veterans Card – Victoria.

All eligible members of the veteran community can apply through either the Service Victoria website or the Service Victoria app on their smartphone.

### Saving ambulances for those most in need

Ambulance Victoria's massively expanded Secondary Triage service is now supporting more than 500 people every day get the appropriate care they need — freeing up hundreds of paramedics to care for the Victorians who need them the most.

Established 20 years ago, the State Government has massively expanded the service, which since 2021 has tripled in size to more than 270 highly skilled nurse practitioners and paramedics.

Since 2016, the service has connected more than one million Victorians that did not need an emergency response, with alternative care freeing up paramedics to respond to urgent patients, reducing demand on emergency departments and saving hospital resources for the sickest Victorians.

It's estimated that about one in five calls to 000 don't need a lights and sirens response, with 37,825 callers being diverted to the Secondary Triage team in the first three months of 2023.

This has seen patients connected to non-emergency patient transport providers, telehealth services, their GP or an after hours doctor, and the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department.

With an additional \$13.1 million invested in the Victorian Budget 2023/24, Victoria is now home to the largest ambulance led triage in the world.

To keep the pressure off paramedics and other first responders, for non-emergencies, Victorians are urged to visit their GP, local pharmacist, or GP Respiratory Clinic.

If in need of urgent care, Victorians can access the VVED from the comfort of their own home, attend one of the 27 Priority Primary Care Centres across the state, visit one of Victoria's 24/7 Supercare Pharmacies, or call NURSE-ON-CALL 1300 60 60 24 for immediate, expert advice.

More than 2,200 new paramedics have been recruited, with \$277 million invested in this year's Budget to recruit more paramedics, deliver better training and support innovative models of care.

### Digital games market comes to Melbourne

The State Government is backing the state's growing digital games industry to take locally made games to the world, through a major new marketplace event – Play Now Melbourne.

Play Now Melbourne is set to connect local developers and studios with international games heavy weights.

Australian game developers are invited to apply to be part of the event where they can pitch their games to international publishers, platform holders and decision makers with the aim of securing career-changing deals and selling their games on the global market.

Play Now Melbourne is being delivered by VicScreen and will be part of an action-packed Melbourne International Games Week (MIGW) this October, with games industry leaders from around the world converging in Melbourne.

Leading global publishers and platform holders such as Kepler Interactive and Meta are already confirmed to attend the market with more announcements to come.

In recent years, Victorian made games such as Cult of the Lamb and Kinder World have taken the global games industry by storm, and Play Melbourne will help our next slate of games level up.

Play Now Melbourne adds a local post to the calendar of international games industry trade events, including GamesCom in Cologne, Germany and the Game Developers Conference in San Francisco, USA, and will support Australian developers to build international relationships without leaving home.

Created by the State Government and curated by Creative Victoria, Melbourne International Games Week 2023 runs from 30 September – 8 October. Play Now Melbourne, taking place on 5 October, adds to the range of industry conferences, awards, showcases, and public events.





# Real Estate agents who underquote get caught

Real estate agents who tried to dupe Victorians by underquoting on properties have been found out by a taskforce established by the State Government to protect buyers.

The Consumer Affairs Victoria underquoting taskforce tracked hundreds of sales campaigns in 2022-23, attending auctions and inspecting agents' premises, often after receiving tip-offs from members of the public.

Minister for Consumer Affairs Danny Pearson said unscrupulous agents were on notice and the results produced by the taskforce showed businesses looking to take advantage of homebuyers were playing a high-risk game.

In the 12 months to June 30, Consumer Affairs Victoria inspectors issued 48 underquoting infringement notices totalling more than \$520,000 and issued 37 official warnings to 29 estate agencies.

Underquoting distorts the property market and can waste time and money for people looking to buy a home.

It is illegal to advertise or advise a price that is less than the seller's asking price,

the agent's current estimated selling price, or price in a written offer already rejected by the seller. Agents must update the price information they provide to buyers if any of these things change during the sales campaign.

Agencies that do the wrong thing face penalties of more than \$36,000 and the loss of sales commissions.

Underquoting can also result in penalties under the Australian Consumer Law of up to \$10 million for corporations and \$500,000 for individuals.

Data collected from complaints submitted to the Consumer Affairs Victoria website enables the taskforce to identify the locations and agents with the highest amount of suspected underquoting, with inspectors increasing their compliance activities in those areas by attending auctions and inspecting agent sales files.

### Petition to halt Transmission projects

The Victorian Farmers Federation has launched a petition to the Victorian Parliament calling for VNI West and Western Renewables Link transmission projects to be stopped.

VFF President Emma Germano said "We're hoping to deliver a message to government from hundreds of people that these projects must be stopped and reassessed, before it's too late."

"It's clear the Victorian Government has failed to adequately plan for the transition to renewable energy and this will have big impacts on food and fibre production and regional communities."

"What's worse is the appalling treatment of farmers and regional communities and the failed consultative approach undertaken by energy authorities and the government."

"We want to see the planning powers of the Australian Energy Market Operator rescinded and for the government take full responsibility for planning of transmission infrastructure."

Ms Germano said government must look at all alternatives to the current projects, including the plan set out by the Victorian Energy Policy Centre.

## Aged Care Taskforce principles welcomed by National Seniors

National Seniors Australia welcomes the announcement of the Aged Care Taskforce draft aged care principles.

Chief Advocate Ian Henschke said these guiding principles will help drive the much-needed reforms and reflect what our members and the wider community have been telling us for years.

"Older people tell us they want to stay in their own home and not go into an aged care home, so we're pleased this is one of the key priorities," Mr Henschke said.

"We also have long called for a simpler, fairer, more transparent system. This is now listed as a key part of the way forward. Most importantly, accountability for all funding received is now enshrined, so taxpayers and recipients of care can have confidence in the system they pay for.

"These principles are a good way to start the funding reform process, along with the commitment to community consultation. Older people, their families and the community should have their faith restored in aged care, which is a fundamental part of Australia's health care system."

- 1 The aged care system should enable and encourage participants to remain in their home for as long as they wish and can do so.
- 2 Aged care funding arrangements and their outcomes should be fair, simple, transparent and sustainable.
- 3 Government is and will continue to be the major funder of aged care. Government funding should be focused on care costs. Personal contributions should be focused on

- accommodation and everyday living costs with a sufficient safety net.
- Government and participant contributions should be sufficient to provide quality and appropriate care delivered by a skilled workforce, allowing and encouraging innovation by the health, hospital and aged care systems.
- 5 There should be accountability for funding received from government and participants, how it is spent, and the quality of the services provided.
- The residential sector should have access to sufficient, and new, capital to encourage the development of new accommodation and upgrades to existing accommodation.

## Could virtual fencing be an option in Victoria?'



Momentum is growing for a national animal welfare code that could pave the way for virtual fencing across Australian farming businesses.

Each state has its own animal welfare code and while virtual fencing is allowed in other states, it is outlawed in Victoria and South Australia.

With support from the DemoDAIRY Foundation, several South-west Victorian dairy farmers recently learnt about the potential benefits of virtual fencing to manage herd grazing and movement during a New Zealand study tour.

One of the farm consultants leading the SW Farm Business Discussion Group, Angus Drummond, said there was a lot of interest in a farm using a Halter collar app for virtual fencing, prompting a suggestion to lobby the State Government to allow their use in Victoria.

Virtual fencing was also highlighted during a recent dairy innovation day at Mount Gambier. Dairy Australia Principal Scientist, John Penry, said a study completed in 2021 into virtual fencing was positive about the technology. "Dairy Australia's role is to point to the evidence base and that four-year study is still relevant. Whilst today's technology might be a slightly differently designed collar, the premise for

Since completing the study, the commercial company involved has focused on applications in the northern beef industry. "Unfortunately, animal welfare codes differ between states," Dr Penry said. "Presently any virtual herding technology relies on an electrical pulse and audible warning. This technology can be used in other states but not Victoria and South Australia because it doesn't fit within their animal welfare codes," Dr Penry said.

Halter representatives and a farmer in their testing program attended the South Australian dairy innovation day, creating strong interest. "There is definitely interest around how farmers could use that sort of technology to make grazing management simpler and less time consuming, particularly during the calving period," Dr Penry said. "The technology by and large seems to work and there are relatively few animals that can't be trained on it. A next step for Australia would be to get a more homogenised between-states animal welfare code".

Dr Penry said Dairy Australia believed it would be in the country's best interests to have uniform animal welfare codes between the states. "That's not specifically about virtual fencing but as a general principle," he said.


