32 Years Celebration our Children and Youth

Inspired by our community leaders and families, the Hawai'i State Legislature and Governor established the first Sunday in October beginning in 1993, as a day to honor and celebrate Hawaii's precious children and youth. A few years later, a day turned into a month-long celebration!

Mahalo to Hawai'i's families, teachers, mentors, volunteers, and leaders who have contributed to our young people's growth and set a strong foundation upon which our young people are in the fabric of what makes us truly Hawai'i.

In 2011, the Children and Youth Day organizers asked PAF to take on the role as fiscal sponsor to help oversee the financial management of Hawai'i's largest Children & Youth event in Hawai'i.

Pacific American Foundation (PAF), established in 1993 has had the honor of helping to improve the lives of Pacific Americans in Hawaii with a specific emphasis on children and youth. Their educational initiatives including career planning and stewardship practices have centered on the cultural and natural resources of our communities as "re-discovered assets" for learning outside the traditional school environment. The restoration of Waikalua Loko I'a has become the "piko" of their community programs that exemplifies the Aloha in all of us.

Since 1993, Hawai'i CYD has been largely a volunteer effort that has grown every year. Kama'aina Kids, a long-time participant and very successful statewide youth serving organization, was asked to also lend their management expertise. They currently are one of the largest private childcare provider serving keiki ages 6 weeks to 11 years old. In 2014, Kama'aina Kids assumed a more active and critical role in organizing and sustaining the growth and popularity of honoring Hawai'i's children and youth by becoming our event administrator.

PAF and Kama'aina Kids are very proud to be a part of this great community event celebrating 32 years! Ho'omau!

On behalf of all that continue to serve, we thank all of the Hawai'i CYD Ohana for the opportunity to participate and share our aloha with the many thousands of volunteers that give of their time and resources to make this one of the largest and most successful events focused on children and youth in the country!

1. FRIDAY CYD TENT SET-UP

Chair: Jeff Subee

CYD tent vendor, XME Party Rentals LLC, is scheduled to set up CYD-use tents, tables and chairs:

Aloha and Stage Hype stages (20x20 per) and side tents (10x10 per)
Stage Hype and Punchbowl Street Jam side tents (10x10 per)
Shade Area, Aloha Stage (30x60)
First Aid Station tent (10x20)
Sponsored 40x120, 30x60 and 20x40 participant tents
56 x 6' tables and 5 x 60" round tables

By setting up on the weekday, this helps increase visibility and awareness that an event will soon be taking place on the grounds.

The event grounds span 2,580 in perimeter, or .01 square miles.

2. SATURDAY SET-UP, 8am to 12pm

Chair: Jeff Subee

Parking: will be available at Kalanimoku Garage from 8am to 12pm. Mahalo to Richard Hung from DAGs for helping make this possible.

Punchbowl Street: There is no set-up allowed for this day on Punchbowl Street.

State Capitol Grounds: For those who need to drive on the limited grounds pathway ("pathway"), you are only allowed to drive on the paved pathway, entering from Punchbowl at the crosswalk then exiting on S. King Street using Likelike Street. From 8am to 12pm, vehicles will be allowed to drive along the pathway to their designated location. See **Image 1**.

Kalanimoku Grounds: For those who need to drive on the limited grounds pathway ("pathway"), you are only allowed to drive on the paved pathway, entering from Punchbowl at the crosswalk then exiting by making a U-turn at the red circled area in **Image 1** to exit back on Punchbowl Street. From



8am to 12pm, vehicles will be allowed to drive along the pathway to their designated location. See [Image 1](#).

Rules when entering pathway from Punchbowl Street for both State Capitol and Kalanimoku:

- Vehicles should not be parked along the pathway more than necessary to unload their tent and/or supplies (tables, chairs, etc.)
- If you are in the middle of setting up your tent and another vehicle comes along behind you, you must move your vehicle. **DO NOT drive or park on the grass**
- If you are driving along the pathway and a vehicle is blocking your way, DO NOT drive around. You must wait for them to leave before continuing the path
- For those setting up your own tent, absolutely no stakes are permitted. Water barrels, concrete slabs, sand bags are all acceptable weights
- When exiting on to Punchbowl and King Street, please be careful of traffic

For organizations that are dropping off booth supplies along S. King Street, please be mindful of traffic.
No Parking signs will be deployed on the innermost lane by 8am however you are able to park and unload.

Porta Potties: Island Porta Potties deliver 8 flushable toilets, 1 ADA flushable toilet and 2 hand washing stations in the AM. Portables will be located on Likelike Street and along walkway by Kalanimoku Building. Please see Event Map for restroom icons. Please note these are the only restrooms available for the event.

3. OVERNIGHT SECURITY

Chair: Jeff Subee

Surfing The Nations will be providing 9 volunteers to watch over the Frank F. Fasi Civic Center and Kalanimoku grounds starting from Saturday October 4 at 5pm to Sunday October 5, 2025 6am. This is to deter any theft or damage to any tents and equipment left on the grounds for CYD purposes.

WARNING: Please note that CYD is not responsible for any equipment or supplies left overnight. We highly recommend not leaving anything of value that can be easily carried away from your area overnight.




Image 1 Driving Pathways



4. SUNDAY SET-UP & CLOSING LOADING SCHEDULE

Chair: Jeff Subee

Non-Punchbowl Street Residents Set-Up. For those who wish to drive along the pathway (**Image 1**) to drop off supplies, access from Punchbowl St. will be available prior to 7am. Starting 7am, Police will be closing Punchbowl Street and only vehicles with a **Punchbowl Street Pass** will be allowed entry **ONLY** from Beretania Street. If you are not assigned to Punchbowl Street, and need access after 7am, you can use the **Punchbowl Street Pass** to gain entry to Punchbowl Street up until 8:30am to drop off supplies **ONLY**. However, you will **NOT** be allowed to drive along the pathway.

YOU WILL NEED A PASS to gain entry onto Punchbowl St. once it closes at 7am.

Closing. After the event finishes at 3pm, those wish to drive along the pathway on the grounds will have to wait until 3:30pm when Punchbowl Street reopens for you. You have until 4pm before XME Party Rentals LLC, our tent vendor, arrives to start breaking down the various large tents. **YOU WILL NEED A PASS** (enclosed) to gain entry onto Punchbowl St. once it reopens at 3:30pm.

Rules when entering the pathway from Punchbowl Street:

- Vehicles should not be parked along the pathway more than necessary to unload/load their tent and/or supplies (tables, chairs, etc.)
- If you are in the middle of setting up your tent and another vehicle comes along behind you, you must move your vehicle. **DO NOT drive or park on the grass**
- If you are driving along the pathway and a vehicle is blocking your way, DO NOT drive around. You must wait for them to leave before continuing along the path
- For those setting up your own tent, absolutely no stakes are permitted. Water barrels, concrete slabs, sand bags are all acceptable
- When exiting on to Punchbowl or King Street, please be careful of traffic

5. EVENT DAY PARKING

Chair: Jeff Subee

Kalanimoku Lot: ~240 stalls. **DO NOT PARK** in restricted parking stalls marked in red. **Parking is reserved for CYD Participants, Volunteers and Entertainers only.** No public parking. Opens 5am and closes 5pm.

Frank F. Fasi Civic Center Municipal Lot: ~950 stalls. For Sunday 10/5/25, parking entrance and exit on Beretania Street side only. Open to everyone on first come, first served basis. This is also considered the CYD overflow parking in the event Kalanimoku lot is full. We were informed that the pathway that



leads from the lot to the Frank F. Fasi Civic Center grounds may be fenced off, in which case exiting to the event will be from the Beretania Street side.

S. King Street: Inner lane blocked and reserved for pre-identified vehicles and load/off load only. This is mostly for Stage Hype performers and CYD personnel.

Central Pacific Bank: ~200 stalls. Open to everyone from 9am to 4pm. Security may also be around to assist people get to their vehicles.

Department of Health Front: ~20 stalls. Open to everyone from 7am to 4pm.

6. TENT AREAS COORDINATION

Tent Areas C3, C4 and C5 will have a volunteer assigned to facilitate the spacing of each organization booth space(s) as these are open areas. If you have any questions, feel free to call Jeff Subee at 808-291-8753.

7. AUTHORIZED DEPARTURES

Please note there are no early departures unless of an emergency or pre-arranged with Event Administrator, Jeff Subee info@hawaiicyd.org. This is to ensure the integrity of the event and the expectations of those attending. In certain circumstances, such as Punchbowl Street Participant's, there are no early departures allowed due to crowd control and safety.



Please assist in spreading the word by sending flyers electronically to your networks, putting information in your newsletters and other publications, announcing the event at public meetings, and inviting your employees, members, friends and family to come and enjoy the day and month's activities.
