

TAHITI CULTURE


Strength, power, influence, supremacy, greatness, sovereignty, omnipotence, prestige, control, genius, authority, superiority, nobility, stature, presence, elegance, beauty ... the list goes on and on. These words define the Mana in a precise situation, a particular context, from a specific point of view. Mana is a mythical and essential concept in Tahiti culture, a fundamental truth. It's both tangible and intangible, expressive yet imperceptible, revealing but enigmatic, so natural but also mysterious and esoteric.



The word tatau originated in The Islands of Tahiti, and the symbols have meaning and the meaning tells the story of each Tahitian's personal history. In each line drawn on the body, the ma'ohi of the past is connected to the Mana of the present and future. Tahitian people believe in the presence of Tohu, the god of tatau, who painted all the oceans' fish in their colors and patterns, gives each tatau an essence of meaning and life. A link between heaven and earth. Polynesian tattoos are also signs of beauty, and in earlier times were an important part of life as they signaled the end of adolescence.

TAHITIAN MUSIC & SONG

When the missionaries came to Tahiti, they tried to suppress the powerful, life-affirming and sensual sounds and movements that embody Polynesian music and Tahitian dance. In the dance and rhythms, Tahitians give voice to their Mana, allowing it to rise from the sea, descend from the hills, and emanate from the soul of every Polynesian man and woman who falls under its mesmerizing spell

Tetiaroa will always have a special place in the heart of anyone who visits. This coral island in the heart of the Society Islands is a veritable haven of peace for birdlife, sea turtles, and all sorts of marine life. An island paradise for lovers of nature in a stunningly beautiful setting. Just a few minutes from Papeete by plane, Tetiaroa is one of the jewels of French Polynesia. The atoll is just over three square miles and is composed of 13 motu. It is an important bird

sanctuary where several species come to lay their eggs and nurture their young. The soft white sandy beaches and crystal clear water in the lagoon rival even the most splendid atolls in the Tuamotu Islands. Soft white sandy beaches, crystal clear water and breathtakingly beautiful natural surroundings make Tetiaroa the perfect place to unwind. The island is also an important reproduction site for birds and sea turtles.

takeoff to PAPETE



Situated in the heart of the Society Islands of French Polynesia, Tahiti is a name that makes the whole world dream. From the hectic city center of Papeete to the peaceful drive through the peninsula, the island of Tahiti offers a great variety of scenery and an equally large choice of activities. Lofty mountains for hiking, the sea and the lagoon for swimming, museums to visit, international and local cuisine, and festivities throughout the year.

Most of the island's inhabitants live on the coast, leaving the interior almost intact and authentic, despite the busy capital never being very far away. Papeete, which means 'water basket' in Tahitian, is the cornerstone of this island nation.

It is a modern city with world-class hotels, gastronomic restaurants, nightclubs, a lively, colorful market, museums, and shops, including pearl boutiques, of course.

takeoff to MOOREA



Discover the natural beauty of Moorea: a tropical paradise not to be missed. The distinguishing feature of the destination is its two large bays, Cook and Opunohu, which are separated by Mount Rotui and give the island its trident form. Formerly called "Aimeho" or "Eimeo", Moorea, with its luxuriant vegetation and exceptional lagoon, is an ideal place to wind down and recharge your batteries. Whether in a couple, with family and friends, or on your own,

you'll enjoy your stay on the sister island. Encircled by a magnificent coral reef which has 12 passes, Moorea is the perfect destination if you like watersports or if you're looking for somewhere peaceful to unwind. The two bays are areas of multiple sporting actvities. Divers will enjoy discovering the diversity of marine life in the lagoon, You can also explore the bays and the superb scenery around them by kayak or paddleboard.

takeoff to TAHA'A



The island of Taha'a is to the north of her big sister, Raiatea, in the same lagoon. It is a unique destination in French Polynesia where life goes by at a very Tahitian rhythm. This flower-shaped island is surrounded by a string of small motu, each with pristine white sandy beaches. The air is filled with the scent of vanilla from the many plantations, which are pleased to welcome visitors. There are many activities to try, such as snorkeling, diving, hiking, and more.

The crystal clear turquoise lagoon is perfect for diving enthusiasts, with magnificent coral and a multitude of marine life to discover. Fishing trips and motu excursions which include a picnic on the beach, are also very popular. And there are several pearl farms you can visit to learn about the creation of these magnificent jewels. Life goes by at a gentle pace in Taha'a. It is a tranquil island with luxuriant and preserved vegetation, which can be explored on hikes.

takeoff to BORA BORA

ITI ITI HUAHINE CRUISE - MAHE 36

With its 11 meters in length, the Mahe 36 from the French shipyard Fountaine-Pajot has all the qualities of a large catamaran. Inside, the saloon offers very large spaces for a boat of this size, and ingenious accessibility on the port side to the chart table and the navigation functions. The cabins are designed with very large beds. The large portholes which give a view of the sea bring a lot of light. The bathroom, in the forepeak, is particularly spacious with its 2 meters long, and its modern decoration.

INCLUSIONS

Meals included, with the exception of lunch on the first and last days of the cruise. The breakfast is continental. All drinks are optional (supermarket price + 15%). Leisure equipment available on board: 2 sea kayaks or 1 sea kayak/1 stand up paddle board depending on availability, 2 floating hammocks, snorkeling equipment (fins, mask, snorkel), fishing line.

DAY ONE - HUAHINE

Boarding will take place at the Fare dock around noon after lunch. Once on board, guests will meet the crew and review the itinerary and safety instructions. Sailing to Hana Iti begins. Navigate to Avea Bay, a beautiful white-sand beach south of Huahine—dinghy exploration with the skipper with swimming, snorkeling, and kayaking as your activities. Dinner will be on board.

DAY TWO - TAHA'A (3 TO 4 HOURS OF SAILING)

Day two starts with three to four hours of sailing during the crossing from Huahine to Taha'a. Guests will enjoy continental breakfast onboard. Upon arrival at Taha'a Faaha Bay, guests will visit the vanilla plantation, followed by lunch on board. After lunch, guests will depart to motu Tautau. The day ends with a superb sunset over Bora Bora (weather dependent)—dinner on board.

DAY THREE - TAHA'A LAGOON

Walk and swim while exploring the coral garden at Motu TauTau with the skipper. Enjoy lunch onboard. After lunch, sail to Apu Bay with a visit to a pearl farm. The day ends with a relaxing dinner on board.

DAY FOUR - TAHA'A & RAIATEA

Guests' last day begins with continental breakfast on board. After breakfast, set sail to the town of Uturoa, where guests will visit local shops, such as banks and internet cafes. Lunch will be served on board, and sailing will begin at the Apooiti marina. Guests will depart the vessel at 1 pm local time at the Tahiti Yacht Charter base.
