DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

**Built to stand the
test of time.**



At Woodlands International College, we strive to turn out students who are future ready. To support this, we work diligently to create a built environment conducive to embracing that future, aware that superlative facilities are key to delivering a superlative education. With almost 24 years of exceptional service under its belt, Woodlands is built with multi-generational education in mind. It's not just about educating our own children; it's about educating their children, and their children's children too.

At the forefront of this approach is a philosophy and firm commitment from the Directors to continually reinvest in capital expenditure projects including physical expansion, the extending and upgrading of existing infrastructure, augmenting technology, and enhancing security. In the competitive landscape of modern education, a school operating as a business faces a critical choice regarding its financial contributions: to extract profits for stakeholder gain or to strategically return them to the institution. While profitability is essential for sustainability, the long-term health and excellence of a school are inextricably linked to the deliberate and forward-thinking reinvestment of its earnings. Directing earnings back into the school is not merely a day to day tactical exercise; it is a long-range strategic initiative that fuels academic excellence, enhances competitive advantage, and ensures enduring success.

The most immediate and profound impact of reinvesting reserves is the direct enhancement of the student learning experience. Financial resources can be channelled into updating and expanding curricular offerings, from robust STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics) labs to vibrant arts programmes and well endowed sporting facilities. Outdated textbooks can be replaced with dynamic digital resources and online learning platforms. And the highest calibre teaching resources can be sought out, secured, and retained.

Beyond the classroom, reinvestment is crucial for maintaining and modernising the physical and technological infrastructure on Campus. A safe, inspiring, and well-equipped environment is a powerful stimulus and prerequisite for effective learning. Over the past decade, the Board has allocated some R65 million to major bricks-and-mortar capex projects which include:

- **Upgrade of Information Technology laboratories at Senior College (2025)**
A comprehensive upgrade of the Senior College Information Technology laboratories was undertaken, replacing all existing devices with 50 state-of-the-art ASUS All-in-One (AIO) computers. These advanced units feature touch-screen functionality and come standard with wireless keyboards and mice, ensuring a modern, efficient, and user-friendly learning environment. This investment significantly enhances the technological capabilities available to our students and educators, supporting dynamic teaching methods and future-ready digital skills
- **Wall around the Junior and Senior College (Main) Campus (2025 and also in 2019)**
Previously partially walled, the remaining two sides of the property bordering Trichardt Street and Leith Road were completed, enhancing access control and security
- **Leith Road pavement upgrade (2025)**
Working in consultation with the local Council, the Leith Road pavement was repurposed to provide a slip road with traffic lights, and more user-friendly access points, enhancing safety, visibility, and convenience for motorists and pedestrians alike
- **Upgraded playground for toddlers (2025)**
A carefully thought out and designed new playground was built, catering to the specific needs of toddlers, and facilitating under cover play with a wide array of equipment such as slides and climbing apparatus
- **New security guard rooms at Matthews Hall (2025)**
To augment our existing robust security measures on Campus, and enhance working conditions for our valued staff, two new security guard rooms were added to Matthews Hall
- **CCTV security installations (2025 and also in 2024)**
Additional cameras were installed to increase surveillance coverage across key areas on Campus, reinforcing overall safety and improving monitoring capability
- **World-class sound upgrades to Matthews Hall (2025)**
The installation includes powerful FBT Muse 210 line-array clusters paired with Muse 218 subwoofers for exceptional clarity and low-end depth. To ensure that performers and presenters are heard effortlessly throughout the expansive Hall, eight high-quality wireless headset microphones were added, supported by diversity antenna fins and a JTS antenna combiner for flawless coverage. The entire system is managed through an FBT control processor and operated via an Allen & Heath SQ-series digital console with an AR stagebox, delivering seamless, professional-grade sound for all events

- **Addition of Volleyball Court (2025)**
In response to the popularity of this sport among our students, a purpose-built sand Volleyball court was added on the Senior College Campus
- **Addition of Slam Dunk Basketball nets (2025)**
To cater to the enormous popularity of this dynamic sport among our student body, official-standard portable slam dunk basketball nets were installed at Matthews Hall
- **Establishment of the Woodlands Bonsai Garden (2025)**
To celebrate and complement our beautiful wooded natural surroundings, a Bonsai Garden was created and is now home to over 20 wonderful miniature trees, both indigenous and exotic
- **Acquisition of additional land (2024)**
A purchase was concluded for a five acre parcel of land designated for use as additional sporting facilities and convenient parking for sporting and other events
- **New classrooms at Pre-Primary College (2024)**
The construction of three large new classrooms with bathrooms and storerooms was undertaken to serve all Grades, improving comfort and affording ample space for indoor play and activities
- **Woodlands Sports Arena (2023)**
The development of a 40 500m² (ten acre) Astro-Turf multipurpose outdoor facility affording competition standard training and events was completed. Home to Woodlands Sport, this world-class sporting facility catapults our exceptional young sportsmen and women to new heights, comprising a full-size Cricket oval featuring a permanent pitch, two senior-size Hockey and Soccer fields, four junior-size counterparts, three permanent Netball courts (with scope to add a further eleven such courts during peak season), and a 400m Athletics track with standalone 100m sprint track. The complex also boasts a 2km Technical Mountain Bike Track with night lighting, outdoor audio system and a dedicated technical area
- **The Jenny Copeling Hall at Pre-Primary College (2023)**
Construction of this essential multipurpose facility affords whole-school congregations, irrespective of the weather, providing an outstanding venue for meetings, concerts, plays, and other gatherings
- **Redevelopment of 'The Willows' land (2023)**
An existing section of Campus was reimaged to make way for Cricket nets, a Javelin run, Long-Jump pit, Discus, and Shot Put, affording a wealth of practice and competition-worthy opportunities for our students
- **Wall on Dr Vosloo Road property (2023)**
A wall was erected to regulate access to this area, and to ensure the security and safety of our students
- **Addition of Table Tennis area (2023)**
In response to growing interest in this fast-paced sport, an all-weather Table Tennis area was added at the Senior College, both for competition and leisure purposes
- **New special-purpose classrooms at Junior College (2022)**
The construction of two large new classrooms, with bathrooms, was undertaken to house specialty Natural Sciences and Art laboratories to support our leading edge curricula in these fields

- **New general-purpose classrooms at Junior College (2022)**

The construction of three large new general use classrooms, together with a new bathroom, was undertaken

- **New security guard room at Pre-Primary College (2022)**

To augment our existing robust security measures on Campus, and enhance working conditions for our valued staff, a new security guard room was constructed

- **Augmentation of College landscaping (2022)**

To further beautify our Campus grounds for the enjoyment of all, and future generations, the gift of a wide variety of mature trees was made by Co-Founding Directors Ronnie and Janet Matthews

- **Matthews Hall (2019)**

Construction was completed on a 2 500m² multipurpose indoor facility capable of hosting gatherings of up to 1 000 people, and supporting a wide range of cultural pursuits with a top-flight stage, sound, and lighting. A high-performance engineered floor improves results in sporting disciplines such as Indoor Hockey, Soccer, and Netball – irrespective of the weather or time of day

This dedication to reinvesting is a clear indicator of the Board's core values and long-term vision. In doing so, Woodlands continues to benefit from faculty development, cutting-edge resources, and innovative programmes, building a school that is not only financially sound but also academically distinguished, resilient, and perpetually committed to providing an exceptional and transformative education for every student it serves.

The Directors wish to express their genuine appreciation and gratitude to the College's community of deeply engaged parents and its dedicated members of staff for their extraordinary support of, and commitment to, Woodlands.

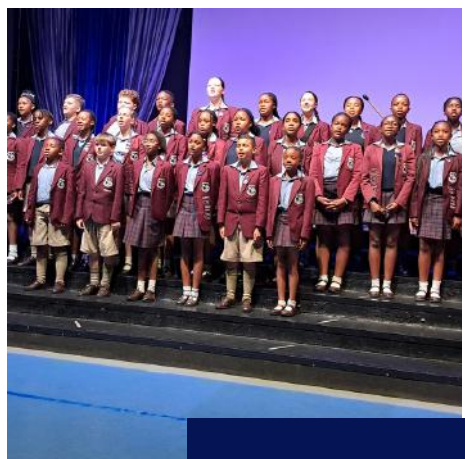

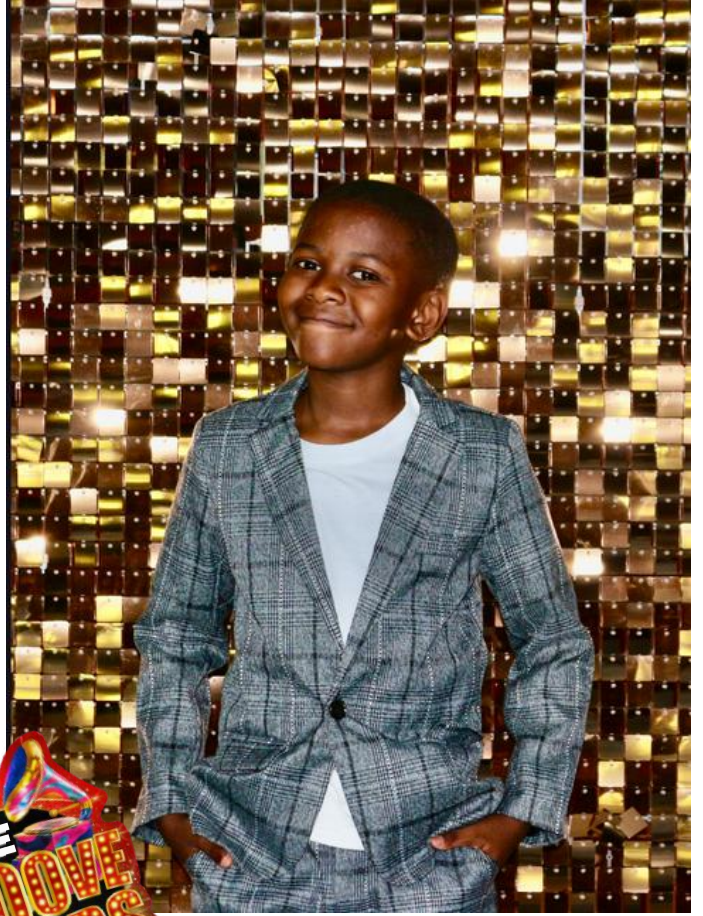

A MESSAGE FROM OUR HEAD OF SPORT

The year 2025 can best be captured in three words – raising the bar. Our athletes and coaches have elevated the standard from participation to true competition, and I am incredibly proud of the dedication and determination shown across all sporting codes.



Athletics

Our season began with a friendly meet to shake off the holiday rust, followed by Woodlands' first-ever Night Track Event, where our athletes were crowned inaugural champions. At Inter-Primary, seven athletes qualified for BLAV and three for the D6 team. A historic moment came when Minathi Mthetwa qualified for the 4x100m relay at Provincials – a first for our school.

Swimming

After moving from the C to the B League in 2024, our swimming numbers grew so much that we introduced a new B Team this year. Both teams competed in weekly galas, with the B Team performing admirably against mostly A Teams and finishing fifth overall. Strong individual and team performances highlight a promising future.

Netball

In our final year in the D13 League, our netball teams delivered spirited and competitive performances. The U10s were a standout group, and special congratulations go to Holly Sanderson for her selection to the District Team.

Hockey

Interest in hockey continues to rise. For the first time, we fielded U10 teams in the Easterns League. Our boys reached the quarterfinals in both U11 and U13 divisions, while the U13 girls finished second in the Willow Cup and celebrated Phadimo as Player of the Tournament. Their tour to the Midlands for the St Anne's Festival was a great success. Eight players earned provincial selection, and we hosted our first indoor festival.

Football

Our teams enjoyed a busy and rewarding season. Highlights included a third-place finish at our U11 tournament and a record eight players selected for the Benoni Team, with Khulubuse Dladla making the Easterns Gauteng squad. Three girls – Lexi Paizes, Lihle Cetyiwe, and Minathi Mthetwa – also earned provincial selection. The U12 and U13 boys gained valuable experience at St Andrew's in Bloemfontein.



Cricket

Cricket participation continues to grow, with mixed-gender teams competing in the Easterns Private School League. We remain committed to building a full girls' team by 2027

Tennis

Now in our second full year in the Gauteng East Tennis Association League, we field both boys' and girls' senior teams. Our Junior Programme continues to develop future talent.

Cross Country

With around 90 runners, Cross Country enjoyed another strong season. Twenty athletes qualified for the Boksburg Championships and District Trials, reflecting exceptional endurance and commitment.

Golf

Golf remains small but dedicated. Competing in the Boksburg Golf League, our players train year-round. Congratulations to Reuben Jordaan on his selection for the 2026 Provincial Squad.

Mini Sports (Grades 1-3)

Our youngest athletes eagerly participated in mini football, netball, and hockey, building foundational skills and confidence.

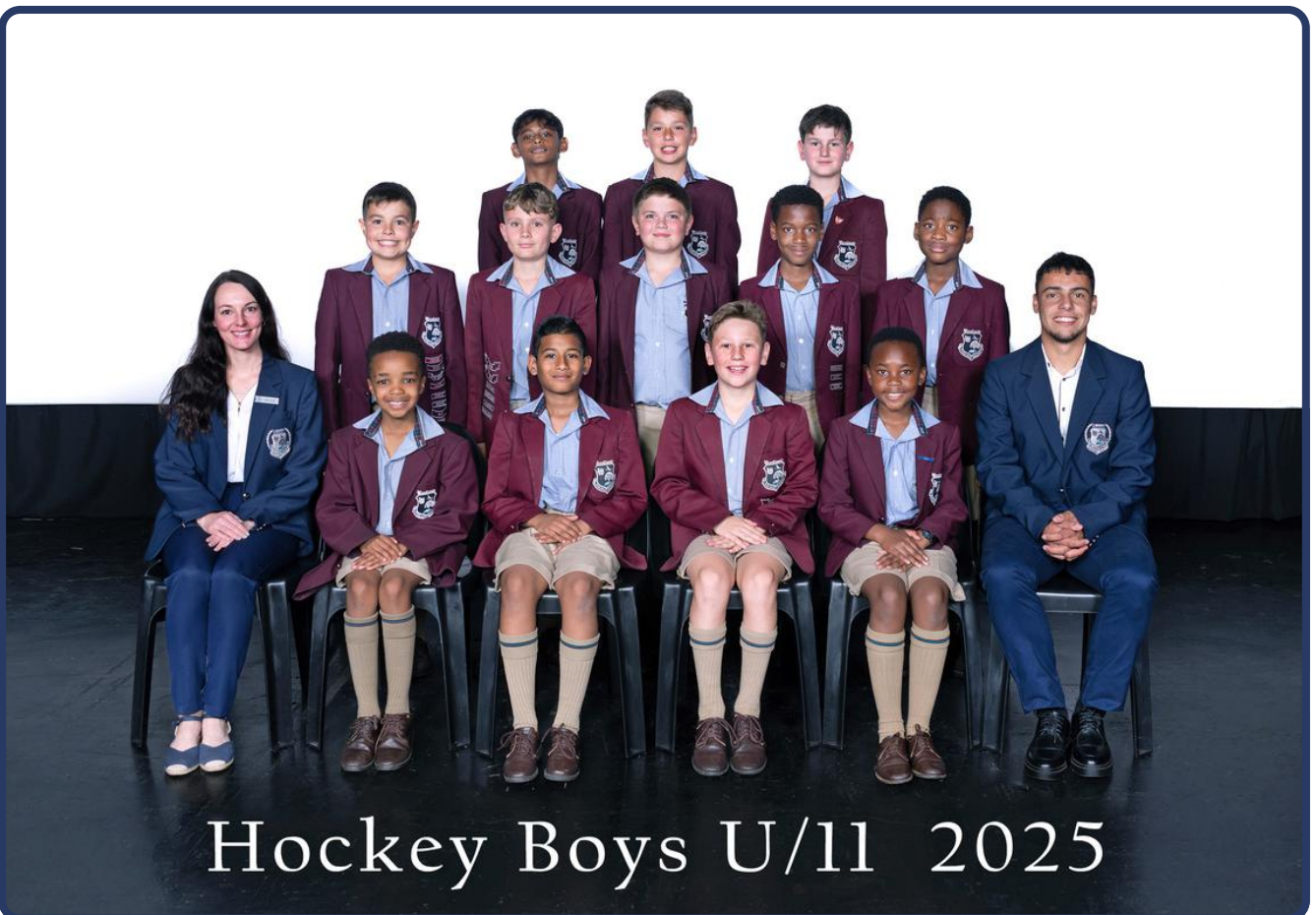

ACADEMICS

At Woodlands International College, the 2025 academic year has been a celebration of learning, perseverance and excellence. Guided by our motto, “Rise Above Mediocrity,” both children and teachers have demonstrated a shared commitment to achieving their highest potential in every learning area.



Across all grades, our children have embraced academic challenges with enthusiasm and determination. In Mathematics, our children have developed critical thinking and problem-solving skills from the very start of their educational journey. In the Foundation Phase, much fun was had while learning to tell the time and working confidently with basic operations and problem-solving tasks. Through our focus on NumberSense, creative teamwork and the use of mathematical apparatus further strengthened skills, building confidence and preparing the children for the challenges of the Mindbourne programme, where they continue to extend their mathematical skills and knowledge. Academic competitions, such as Maths 24 and The Wits Maths Competition, have further inspired mastery and a love of numbers.

In Science, our budding scientists have explored models, conducted experiments, watched informative videos and engaged with a range of texts to uncover the wonders of energy, the animal kingdom, the water cycle, space and the physical world. A visit to Maropeng and the Planetarium brought classroom learning vividly to life, enriching the understanding developed through practical investigations and classroom activities. Our annual Science Expo was bigger and better than ever, as children presented hypotheses, tested their ideas and impressed a panel of judges with their curiosity and creativity.

In Social Sciences and Life Skills, children deepened their understanding of the world, its people and its history. Whether learning practically about our incredible wetlands or engaging in classroom discussions, lessons have been enriched through the use of Kagan Structures, which ensured every child was actively involved and enjoying the process. The use of Thinking Maps brought another dimension to classrooms, helping children to organise, summarise and manipulate information in ways that strengthened their metacognition, comprehension and retention of knowledge.

A particular highlight of the year was Entrepreneurs' Day for our Grade 7s. They scripted adverts, designed posters, conducted market research, created web pages, managed budgets and developed innovative ideas to run their own businesses – showcasing creativity, teamwork and business acumen. In addition, our Grade Six children took their study of democracy to a new level – forming political parties, campaigning, voting and even electing a class president. This authentic experience flowed naturally into the prefect selection process for 2026.



In English and First Additional Language, our children have refined their creativity, communication skills and appreciation for expression – both written and oral. Our Grade 1s, who began the year just learning to write their names, are now proudly composing full paragraphs that delight their teachers. In the Foundation Phase, the Time2Read programme has helped our youngest children become confident, fluent readers who are developing strong comprehension skills. Older children have explored the world of written expression through novels that came alive in the classroom, deepening their understanding of literary conventions and language. Our much-anticipated Literacy Week was once again a highlight of the year, with children dressing as their favourite book characters, sharing poetry and showcasing creativity by dressing to represent idioms. This year also marked a special celebration of Afrikaans is 100 Jaar, which brought a wonderful dimension of cultural and linguistic appreciation to our campus. Through the use of role-play, song, games and creativity, IsiZulu and Afrikaans lessons are thoroughly enjoyed.

Technology and innovation have continued to play a vital role at Woodlands, equipping children with the tools and skills needed to succeed in an ever-evolving world. In partnership with ScopeIT, we have continued to enhance computer literacy and proficiency across all grades. Children have not only designed and 3D-printed their own objects, but have also learnt the basics of coding – creating avatars, designing games and even developing simple apps after studying the structure of web pages.

This year, the academic spirit of Woodlands International College has shone brightly. Through dedication, integrity and a passion for knowledge, our children have truly embodied what it means to rise above mediocrity.
