We want to thank Roger and Christina Fallek for coordinating and hosting this event, and a special thank you to Christina's mother who made some unbelievably good cookies.







very New Year, thousands of people around the world celebrate by making a resolution or a wish. From eating grapes to jumping waves and burning wish papers, there are lots of different ways to do it. So how did it all begin?

The very first New Year's resolutions dates happened over 4,000 years ago. The first recorded people to celebrate a new year were the ancient Babylonians. Their new year celebration was a 12-day festival called Akitu, which began at the start of the spring planting season in March. During the celebrations, Babylonians would make resolutions to their gods, but they probably didn't make any promises to exercise more, save more money, or start a new hobby. The Babylonians usually pledged their loyalty to the king and made promises to pay their debts and returned borrowed items to their rightful owners. They believed that if they kept their resolutions, the gods would treat them favorably that year. But, if they broke their promises, they would get on the bad side of the gods. The modern day Gregorian New Year began in ancient Rome in 46 B.C., when Emperor Julius Caesar introduced a new calendar and declared January 1 as the start of the new year. The Romans originally began the new year starting in March (like the Babylonians), but moved it to January to honor the Roman god Janus. He was a two-faced god who could look back to the past year and forward to the new year. At the new year, the Romans would offer sacrifices to January and make resolutions for good behavior.

New Year's resolutions continued into the Middle Ages. Knights would make an annual "Peacock Vow" at the end of the year. They would renew their resolution to maintain the values of knighthood by putting their hands on a live or roasted peacock.

In the 18th century, Christians would hold mass on New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. Worshippers could reflect on the past year and make resolutions to do better in the year ahead. In 1813, a Boston newspaper published the first recorded use of the phrase "New Year Resolution."

Over two centuries later, New Year's resolutions are a common practice around the world from North America to Asia. Whether they're rooted in religion, culture, or an entirely individual practice, these resolutions take different shapes in many different countries. Here is a look at how different countries make New Year's resolutions each year.

United States: Resolutions are a big part of New Year celebrations in the US. At the start of 2022, 23% of people resolved to live healthier, while 21% were focused on personal improvement and happiness and 20% resolved to lose weight. However, of the 41% of Americans who make New Year's resolutions, only 9% followed through on them.

Brazil: On New Year's Eve in Brazil, it's tradition to go to the beach to make your resolutions. After midnight, you should go in the ocean and jump seven waves while making seven wishes. You should

wear all white clothing in the water, as it represents purity. The tradition pays tribute to Yemanja, the goddess of water.

Italy: In Italy, New Year's resolutions are called buoni propositi, or "good intentions." These resolutions are often similar to those made in the US, such as exercising more or quitting smoking. Some Italians also have luck-bringing traditions. You can eat fatty pork to fatten wallets, or eat blackeyed peas for good fortune. It's said that some Italians also wear red underwear at New Year to bring good luck in the year ahead.

China: The Chinese New Year is a massive two-week festival starting on the first full moon of the lunar calendar. It usually kicks off between January 21 and February 20. The celebrations lead to the Lantern Festival, with millions of people traveling to their families during this time. Chinese people make resolutions by practicing rituals and traditions to ensure good luck in the New Year. They can give red envelopes with money and hold reunion dinners with family. They also offer sacrifices to ancestors and do a thorough house cleaning, to usher in a prosperous New Year.

Columbia: In Colombia, people don't make resolutions (resoluciones) but wishes (deseos). As the clock strikes midnight on January 1, it's tradition to eat one grape for each chime of the bell starting at 12 am. For each grape, you make a wish – so 12 grapes and 12 wishes in total. These wishes aren't like resolutions in the US. Instead of resolving to eat healthier, you would wish for good health. Some people write down their wishes on a piece of paper at New Year's and carry it with them throughout the year. On December 31 they burn their wish paper and make a new one. If you have a specific resolution or wish in Colombia, there are other traditions you can follow too. Those who wish for a bountiful year can fill their pockets with lentils. If you wish to travel, you carry your suitcase around the block at midnight.

Spain: The Spanish also kick start their new year by eating 12 grapes exactly at the stroke of midnight. If you can eat all 12 grapes before the bell finishes chiming 12 times (so one grape every two seconds), you'll have a very luck and prosperous new year. The catch? You have to finish all the grapes by the time the clock finishes striking midnight, or you'll have bad luck!

Maybe we should call our New Year's Resolutions "good intentions" like the Italians. Less pressure!

subjects are cars and motorcycles. Art will be juxtaposed against Corvettes, motorcycles and other automotive icons that served as the inspiration for the work, including a 1937 Cord 812 on loan from the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Automobile Museum in Auburn,

Beginning in April, the Vintage Shop will make limited "product drops" of vintage apparel for sale on the recently renovated CorvetteStore. com. In fact, the store is seeking donations of all types of Corvette merchandise, including T-shirts, totes, lapel pins, and more, that is clean, odorless, and in good condition. sessions by GM certified Corvette technician Paul Koerner, along with lots of other fun activities, with guided road tours, a Museum's Choice car show, and a live auction with exclusive Corvette memorabilia on tap.

Veterans will again be celebrated during Military Appre-

ciation Month May 1-31, with all active and retired duty military admitted free to the NCM with military ID. Vets "n Vettes will also offer veterans a comfortable place to meet and share stories and experiences while enjoying road tours and other Corvette-related activities. Believe it or not, February 2024 will mark the 10th anniversary of the sinkhole that swallowed several key Corvettes that were on display in the Skydome. To mark the occasion, in June, "Ground to Sky: The Sinkhole Reimagined" opens as a limited engagement exhibit that



includes select cars recovered from the sinkhole and more about the past, present, and future of the NCM.

The 2024 National Corvette Caravan, held every five years with regional caravans forming across the United States to meet in Bowling Green, arrives August 29-31, 2024, with four days of festivities planned, including the 26th Annual Corvette Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony on August 31.The year will close out in October with a refreshing of the popular "An American Love Affair: Pop Culture and the Corvette" exhibit that will include a new multimedia performance in the Skydome.

## Total = 53,493 Units (for 2023)

The reason we possibly do not have the exact numbers is that some units, while almost fully completed, are not all 100% built yet. Nor do we know how many CTF (Captured Test Fleet) vehicles were made for each of the four versions. The 53,493 annual production amount is the 2nd highest production year in Corvette history. 1979 was the highest with 53,807 Corvettes. While the 2023 model year production was extended by several months, this is not the first vear that production exceeded a traditional 12-month period. But when the final tally is shared by GM, 2023 might just squeak by as the # 1 Corvette production year of all time with 53,808+ total units!

## 2023 C8 Production Numbers bers.

While we still await the official GM press release of 2023 production totals, thanks to a precision Corvette researcher with great connections, we have these unofficial num-

## 1st Customer E-Rays Produced

We learned that during the week of December 11th, that E-Ray VINs 001, 002, an 003 were produced. When more will be built is not yet

known. Some customer E-Rays are next scheduled to be built with a TPW (Target Production Week) of 1/8/24. We still do not know what GM's plans are for the percentage of total E-Ray made during the 2024 model year. Will it be 15%, 20% of total production? Since BGA (Bowling Green Assembly) is maxed out in daily output of units, where would those E-Rays come from? My belief is that they would be reducing the number of Stingrays to make the E-Rays

#### Record Daily C8 Production Achieved

We had a wonderful surprise in the fact that a new record of 214 C8's were produced in one day in early December. The previous record was 208 in one day. To accomplish these totals, BGA is now working 10-hour double shifts almost every production day. The repair line and other selected work units within the plant are working six-day weeks. Lastly, a new maximum record of 74 Z06s



— but that is my guestimation. To learn this, we might have to wait three months or so until the E-Ray's slow, progressive roll out is completed. The reason I am thinking three months is because it took three months to ramp up production of the C8 Z06.

were made in a single day during December.

#### Really Good Z07 Availability News

Ever since the first Z06 allocations were granted on August 18, 2022, the number of complete aero packages were extremely diminished for almost every allocation cycle. For some allocation cycles, not a single Z07 package was available nationwide. Without the full aero, which includes the Z06's high wing and the dive planes, one could not order a Z07. Hence, for some who were near the very top of dealer Z06 lists for many years (even before the Z06 was officially revealed), quite a number of the Z06's customers who wanted Z07 aero were offered a Z06 without aero turned it down. This has gone on for close to 16 months. I know of one customer who was offered a Z06 without Z07 eight different times-he turned it down every single allocation. But, great news happened during the allocation cycle of December 14th when GM allowed EVERY single Z06 allocation to have the complete visible carbon fiber option ("T0G"). Merry Christmas from GM to those who have been waiting for up to twelve total allocation cycles to get their Z06 with Z07 aero. But this begs the question... how come not one painted carbon flash aero package ("T0F") was available when the identical aero components in visible carbon fiber

were? The cost to get the "T0G" is several thousands of dollars more than "T0F". But as one friend stated... "even though I had not budgeted to get visible carbon fiber aero, you can bet I will find that extra money needed". She is now grinning broadly that her Z06, which is expected to be built in February or March, is going to be, as she put it, "a Z07 beyond my original wishes."

## Why Is Bowling Green Assembly Plant Closing To All Outsiders On February 5th?

When we first heard this, our first fear was that production was stopping for some unknown amount of time. However, C8 production is continuing unabated February 5th forward! So why will us outsiders be shut out? Of course, the answer is

that there are some changes taking place for the C8 that GM does not want those taking public tours of the plant seeing and sharing with the rest of us. When will Corvette plant tours resume? No answer has yet been given. Although, most feel that BGA will re-open just as the April 25th NCM Michelin Bash begins. The major C8 model year changes will possibly be revealed at that event.

Reason for the February 5th closure is one of the following:

- A) A big surprise maybe a C8 Grand Sport is coming for 2025?
- B) The C8 ZR1 is a 2025 model and will be revealed at the Bash
- C) The long-rumored interi-

or elimination of the "Great Wall of Buttons" to the C8 interior.

## Still Two Major C8 Production Issues

There are still some serious long-term production issues that need final resolution. One is that some of the first completed C8 Stingrays for 2024 were transported to Michigan on October 5<sup>th.</sup> Mid-Engine Corvette Forum that the cause was a replacement of the dual clutch



transmission. However, it was recently confirmed that the 110+ C8's that were shipped to Michigan are <u>not</u> getting brand new DCT's but their transmissions are being rebuilt. Finally, as of late December, the problem has not vet been found and fully rectified. How do we know this? In the past two weeks, two more completed C8's were trucked to Michigan for repairs. Was it defective parts, incorrect assembly process, or both? As a result, we are still seeing more completed C8 Stingrays being shipped to Michigan for a complete DCT rebuild.

The second issue was Corvettes going down the line with missing parts. These are called "Build Shy" units. This issue has unfortunately been going on since August. We know of some documented cases where vehicles being completed without those last few parts (sometimes wheels or fenders or regular badges, etc.), and were put in a back lot at the plant for over 2-1/2 months. Regrettably, we also learned of two specific October 16th vehicles which did not get to their correct dealerships for over 8 weeks. Will the "Build Shy" process ever stop?
