ICCR 2025 LEGACY AWARDEES



The winners of ICCR's 2025 Legacy Award are Amy Domini, founder and Chair of Domini Impact Investments and Trustee Emerita at the Sustainability Group at Loring, Wolcott and Coolidge; and Reverend Séamus Finn, Chief of Faith Consistent Investment, OIP Trust for the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate.

The ICCR Legacy Award was created to honor those whose work has provided a strong moral foundation and an enduring record of demonstrated influence on corporate policies. For decades, both Amy and Séamus have worked

introduce its precepts to new audiences and communities across the globe.



Amy Domini
Recipient of ICCR's 2025 Legacy Award

It's difficult to isolate only one or two examples from **Amy Domini's** 40+ years in socially responsible investing. A true pioneer, Amy paved the way for values-aligned investing long before it became popular, and her 1984 book on the topic,

co-authored with Peter Kinder, Ethical Investing, was the first comprehensive discussion on the subject. One of her most significant contributions was the creation of a mass-market option for ethical investing: the Domini 400 Social Index (now the MSCI KLD 400 Social Index), a benchmark for responsible portfolios that she developed with Peter Kinder and Steve Lydenberg in 1990. Amy's work fundamentally changed the conversation from simply excluding poorly performing companies from portfolios to actively and thoughtfully evaluating companies based on a wide array of environmental and social metrics, all while keeping pace with the S&P 500.



Rev. Séamus Finn Recipient of ICCR's 2025 Legacy Award

Rev. Séamus Finn has been a steadfast evangelist for faith-consistent and socially responsible investing both domestically and on the global stage, contributing to evolving Catholic Social Teaching on shareholder engagement, creating bridges between faith

investors and the larger investment ecosphere, and exploring ways to bring international perspectives and to apply the principles of multiparty dialogue to shareholder advocacy. Séamus's truly global perspective of investing as a trustee of the OIP Investment Trust established by the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate has focused on "who's not at the table" and brings those communities' concerns to bear when trying to make change, with companies, lawmakers, and global financial institutions. Along with his colleagues at ICCR, Séamus led seminal engagements with the nation's leading banks, calling out the risks of uncollateralized mortgages years before the 2008 financial crisis, and he was a leading voice on human rights and worker rights challenges in both the global mining and apparel sectors. Séamus also served multiple terms as ICCR board chair, helping to steward the governance of our coalition and ensure its financial sustainability.

Leslie P. Norton is an Editorial Director; Sustainability, at Morningstar, the financial research and ratings firm. There, she helps make sustainable investing comprehensible for retail investors and their advisors, and conducts Q&As with well-known investors and market observers. Previously, she was a writer at Barron's and Barrons.com. She won a SABEW "Best in Business" award for a series of stories investigating fraudulent Chinese equities, which protected the savings of investors and pensioners by warning about deceptive stocks before they crashed. She has received fellowships from the East-West Center and the National Press Foundation.

Prior to Barron's, Leslie worked as a researcher for an investment manager, and helped start the London bureau of Bloomberg News. She attended Yale College and Columbia University.

Born in Manila but raised in New Hampshire and Pennsylvania, her interest in words began early. She was a contestant in the National Spelling Bee, where she misspelled the word "cucaracha," placing fifth out of 79 contestants and receiving a prize of \$100. She lives in Portland, Oregon with her son.

Lydia Kuykendal has spent the last 18 years in health advocacy leading issue campaigns, managing coalitions, acting as a media spokesperson, cultivating strategic partnerships and lobbying elected officials. Her current position as Director of Shareholder Advocacy at Mercy Investment Services allows her to engage directly with publicly held companies on issues such as access to health care, human rights, gun safety, transparency in artificial intelligence, and anti-racism.

In the past she has worked for Louisiana State University and The American Cancer Society's Cancer Action Network. Before coming to Mercy Investments, she served as Engagement Director at Giffords, a national gun violence prevention organization. There she worked to develop and implement engagement strategies and campaigns to reduce gun violence at the national, state, and local levels. A native of North Carolina, she is a 2004 graduate of North Carolina State University with a B.S. in Biomedical Engineering and earned her Masters of Public Health from Tulane University in 2006.

She is deeply committed to social and environmental justice, both on the streets of her Brooklyn neighborhood and in her corporate advocacy work serving clients at Zevin Asset Management. Marcela earned an MS in International Health Policy & Management and an MBA with a focus on Sustainable Development, both from Brandeis University. Marcela serves on the Stewardship Committee for Massachusetts Pension Reserves Investment Management (Mass PRIM), advising the board. She also serves on the advisory board of The Migration and Climate Adaptation & Finance Working Group, committed to enabling a future in which human mobility helps to deliver a just climate adaptation process. Marcela is a board member of the New York Foundation, a philanthropic and non-profit leader in grassroots organizing, advocacy, and grantmaking in service of social justice issues and movements that confront systemic barriers toward a more just and inclusive New York City.

Dr. Jonathan Lee Walton

Jonathan Lee Walton, Ph.D., is a social ethicist and religious educator known for engaging American evangelical traditions. On January 1, 2023, he became the 8th president of Princeton Theological Seminary.

He is the author of two books: Watch This! The Ethics and Aesthetics of Black Televangelism (NYU Press) and A Lens of Love: Reading the Bible in Its World for Our World (Westminster John Knox Press). Walton has also published dozens of works in various academic journals, books, magazines, and newspapers. His work and insights have been featured in national and international outlets, including the New York Times, CNN, Time Magazine, and the BBC.

Prior to becoming the president of Princeton Seminary, he served as the Plummer Professor of Christian Morals and Pusey Minister in the Memorial Church of Harvard University and dean of the School of Divinity and Wait Chapel at Wake Forest University. He earned his Ph.D. and Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary and his BA from Morehouse College in Atlanta.

Dr. Walton is married to Cecily Cline Walton, a children's book author. They are the parents of three children and reside in Princeton, NJ.






