Manager's Corner

Springettsbury Township treasures its parks, taking great pride in their appearance and continually exploring opportunities for improvement. The playground equipment at Penn Oaks Park was outdated and in need of replacement due to safety concerns. We are excited to share that the Township has received a statewide funding program grant awarded through Gametime PA/Pennsylvania Recreation & Park Society (PRPS), which has been applied to the cost of purchasing new playground equipment. The total approximate cost of this project was \$225,000, with the Township responsible for \$114,643. We hope this park improvement will enhance your experience while visiting Penn Oaks Park.

The Township has also recognized that improvements are necessary at Rockburn Park. A grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development in the amount of \$229,544 has been secured to renovate Rockburn Park. This project involves creating a new playground, walking trail and site amenities at Rockburn Park. The Township is presently in the design phase, with the construction phase to commence shortly. Sewer Payment Options

Springettsbury Township provides multiple options for residents and property owners to make sewer bill payments, including by mail, in person, over the phone, ACH direct withdraw or online credit card/ electronic check payment. The Township encourages all residents to make payment early to ensure it is received by the due date. Payments are posted on the date payment is received, not by the postmark date. Failure to receive sewer bills is not considered a reason for non-payment and does not extend the due date.

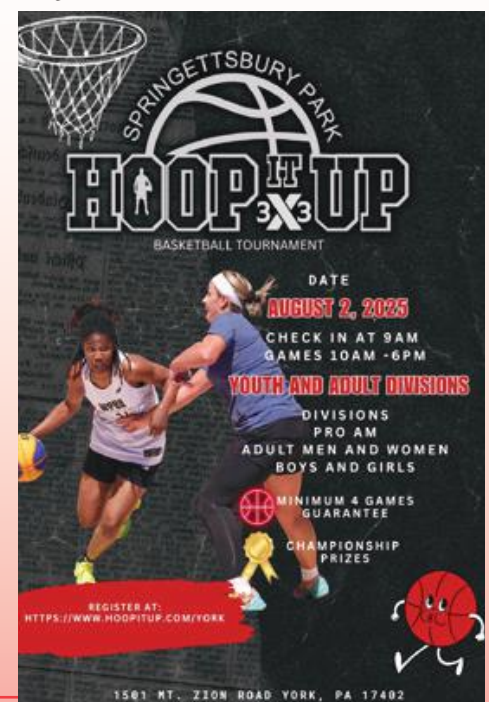

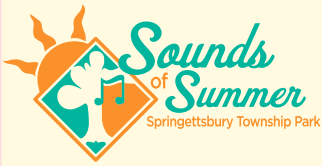

PARKS RULES

It is expected that all users of Township facilities will conduct themselves and their activities in such a way as will not obstruct or interfere with the use and enjoyment of the facilities by others. Respect for, courtesy to, and cooperation with other users will be the norm, and any failure to demonstrate these qualities may result in denial of use of the facilities.

Springettsbury Township Parks will be subject to the following rules and regulations:

- Springettsbury Township Park will open at 7 a.m. and close at 11 p.m. All other parks will operate from dawn to dusk. There shall be no trespassing on park property during closed hours.
- Smoking shall be prohibited at all times on any park property.
- The Township Manager, the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, the Chief of Police or the Director of Parks and Recreation may close the park(s) if hazardous conditions exist that endanger life or property. There shall be no trespassing on park property during such times.
- There shall be no littering.
- Vandalism and negligent or deliberate destruction or removal of natural or physical property is prohibited. Possession or use of a mineral or metal detector, magnetometer, side scan sonar, other metal detecting device or sub-bottom profiler is prohibited. All natural, cultural, and archaeological resources are protected and may not be removed or disturbed.
- Open fires or hot charcoals shall only be permitted in Township park grills. Grills are not to be left unattended and shall be thoroughly extinguished upon departure.
- Picnic tables are not to be removed from the picnic shelters.
- The solicitation, selling, or the distribution of any items or services unrelated to Township sponsored activities is prohibited.
- Posting of signs of any kind is prohibited.
- Alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are strictly prohibited.
- Use of explosives or explosive devices, fireworks, sparklers, hot air-balloons, rockets, remote control air planes or vehicles, air guns, bows, slingshots or any similar items for non-Park and Recreation sponsored events is prohibited. It shall be lawful for any person to discharge a firearm within the Township, except if discharged in violation of all local, state and federal laws, rules and regulations, including but not limited to the Air Rifles Law, Game Commission Rules and Regulations and the Game Law.
- Injury or killing of wild or domestic animals is prohibited.
- All dogs must be currently licensed and vaccinated. Dogs shall not be permitted on any playground, sports fields or in the amphitheater area. Dogs must be leashed at all times and the leash must not be longer than six feet (6'). Limit two (2) dogs per adult. Waste must be collected immediately. Dog owners are responsible for injuries inflicted by their dog to others. Aggressive dogs are not permitted.
- No hitting of golf balls.
- Use of any amplification devices and microphones is prohibited unless activity is sponsored by the Township.
- Motorized vehicles except those expressly authorized are prohibited except in designated parking areas.
- Facilities and equipment can only be used for the purpose intended.
- Use of electrical outlets is restricted to Township only equipment or Township-sponsored events.
- Skateboarding, In-line skating and bicycling are prohibited in all picnic shelters, on the tennis courts and Amphitheater area including the stage, terrace seating area and designated access points.
- It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in any abusive, loud, vulgar or otherwise disorderly conduct.
- Parking areas are for park users only. All vehicles shall be parked within the designated spaces provided.
- Tents, canopies or any other like structure are prohibited unless used for a Township sponsored event.
- Smoking shall be prohibited at all times on any park property.

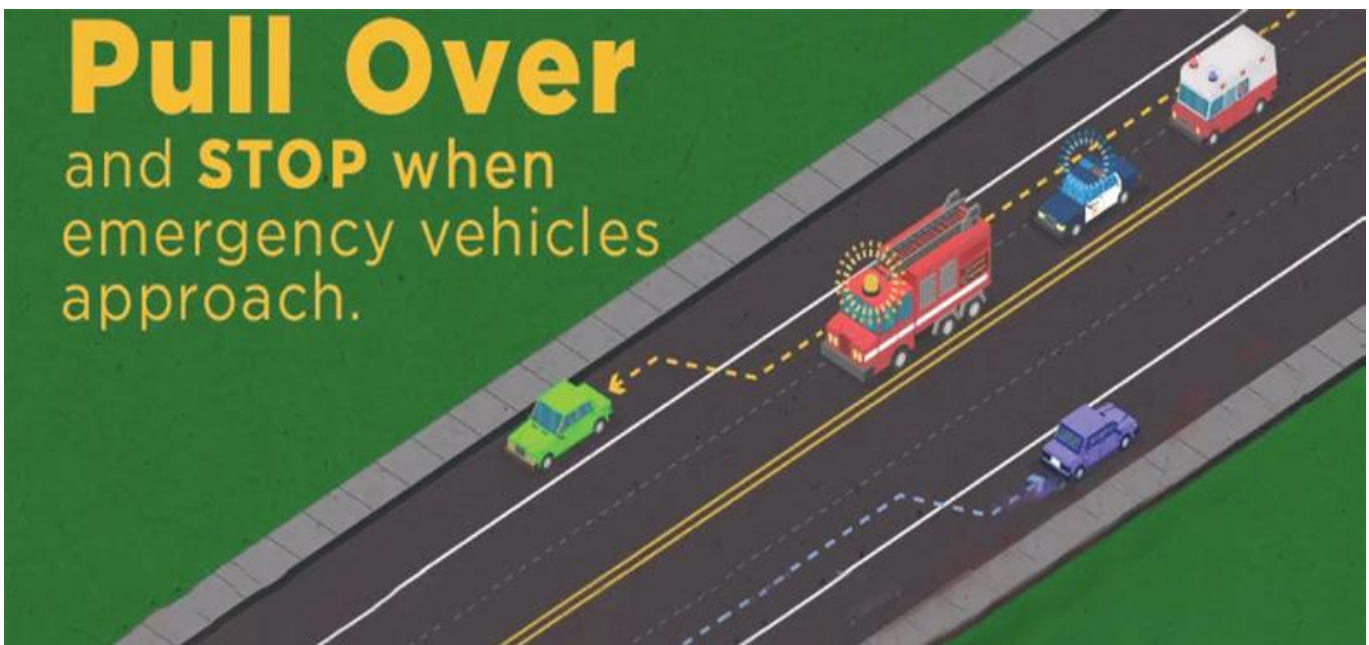
What is the right of way rule for emergency vehicles in Pennsylvania?

York Area United Fire & Rescue emergency vehicle drivers have reported that when responding to emergencies with our lights and sirens on many drivers don't know what to do when the emergency vehicle is approaching. For many this is just a misunderstanding of what to do. Pennsylvania law states that when approached by an emergency vehicle with their emergency lights and sirens activated you **MUST** pull over to the right as far as possible and you **MUST STOP** until the emergency vehicle is past you. This is for your safety and the safety of the crew on the apparatus.

In Pennsylvania, the right of way rule for emergency vehicles is clearly defined to ensure the safety and efficiency of emergency responses. When you hear or see an emergency vehicle approaching with its lights flashing and sirens sounding, you are required by law to yield the right of way and move to the right side of the road. This allows the emergency vehicle to pass safely and quickly. In Pennsylvania, failing to yield the right of way to an emergency vehicle can result in fines and penalties. It is crucial to be aware of your surroundings while driving and to promptly and safely respond to emergency vehicles to help prioritize the safety of those in need.

PA Consolidated Statutes §3325. Duty of driver on approach of emergency vehicle.

- (a) **General rule.**--Upon the immediate approach of an emergency vehicle making use of an audible signal and visual signals meeting the requirements and standards set forth in regulations adopted by the department, the driver of every other vehicle shall yield the right-of-way and shall immediately drive to a position parallel to, and as close as possible to, the right-hand edge or curb of the roadway clear of any intersection and shall stop and remain in that position until the emergency vehicle has passed, except when otherwise directed by a police officer or an appropriately attired person authorized to direct, control or regulate traffic. On one-way roadways a driver may comply by driving to the edge or curb which is nearest to the lane in which he is traveling.





Fireworks Law



Summer is here and with it comes fun summertime celebrations, many of which include fireworks. To help everyone understand how to safely and legally enjoy fireworks, here are the laws in Pennsylvania for possessing and using consumer fireworks.

- Only people 18 years of age and older may purchase, possess and use consumer fireworks.
- No one may intentionally use consumer fireworks
 - On private property or on public property, including, but not limited to, streets, parking lots, sidewalks and parks, without the express permission of the owner or entity that controls the property.
 - Within, directed at or directed from a vehicle or building.
 - Directed at another person.
 - While the person is under the influence of alcohol, a controlled substance or another drug.
 - Within 150 feet of a building or vehicle, whether or not the building or vehicle is owned by the user of the fireworks.

There is also a law regarding consumer fireworks around livestock.

- No person may use consumer fireworks within 150 feet of an animal housing facility, or a fenced area designed to confine livestock owned or managed by another person.
 - If a person uses consumer fireworks at a distance of 150 to 300 feet from an animal housing facility or fenced area designed to confine livestock owned or managed by another person, the user of the fireworks must notify the owner or manager of the livestock in writing at least 72 hours in advance of the use of fireworks in the area.

For additional information on the use of consumer fireworks in Pennsylvania, please refer to the Pennsylvania Agriculture Code (3 PA.C.S.) Chapter 11 FIREWORKS.

Remember that Springettsbury Township also prohibits the use of any type of fireworks or sparklers in all Springettsbury Township parks.

Township residents and the local community are invited to join Stephen Smith of the Historic Preservation Committee at the Springettsbury History Night event on Tuesday July 8, 2025. "Barns of Springettsbury" will explore the history, variation and interesting stories of township barns. The event will take place in the Community Room within the Springettsbury Township Administrative Complex at 1501 Mount Zion Road, York, PA 17402, at 7:00 P.M., with doors opening at 6:30 P.M.

Learn the story of the pictured township brick-end barn. The openings are not just decorative they also provide the barn interior with ventilation and some natural light. The creation of these designs was generally left to the skilled bricklayers of the day. Each barn seemed to provide new inspiration in varying arrangements, and as a result, nearly every brick-end barn had its own character.

The Recycling Page

2025 Springettsbury Residential Trash & Recycling Collection Program

Services Offered

- 1-3 ea. 32-gallon trash bag or trash can per week plus recycling pick-up. **Cost per quarter = \$98.40.**
- 1-96 gallon tote equal to 3-32-gallon trash bags or trash cans per week plus recycling pick-up. **Cost per quarter = \$98.40.**
- Extra waste bags may be purchased at the Township Municipal Building or by calling Penn Waste at 717-767-4456. **The fee per bag is \$5.00.**

Yard waste will be collected in four (4) foot lengths once per week (**beginning the first week of March and concluding the first week of December**): bundled; placed in a biodegradable Kraft or other paper bag; placed in maximum 32-gallon container with a Township approved brush identification sticker. Brush stickers can be obtained at the Township Municipal Building for \$.50 each.

REMINDERS: Please do not combine yard waste and recycling materials. Do not use the 96-gallon totes provided by Penn Waste for yard waste. Yard Waste containers should be no larger than a 32-gallon container.

Acceptable Large Items

Residents should contact Penn Waste, 717-767-4456 to schedule the large item collection at least one day prior to the normal collection day.

- Appliances
- Carpet 48" maximum length rolled and tied
- Furniture
- Mattresses and box springs
- Car tires only (*must be off rims*)
- Discarded lawnmowers must have gasoline and motor oil removed
- Plumbing fixtures - toilets, sinks, bathtubs, etc.
- Washer and Dryer units

Unacceptable Large Items

- Rechargeable Batteries
 - Television sets and electronic devices
 - Stains, Chemicals and Liquids
 - Scrap Metal
 - Automobile Parts
 - Household Hazardous Waste
 - Tires on Rims
 - Commercial/Industrial Waste
 - Construction Material or Debris
- To include: Drywall; Brick; Block; Treated Lumber; Roofing Shingles; Ceiling Tiles; Concrete; Doors; Windows. Small quantities of select materials may be accepted at the Resource Recovery Center. Fees may be applied. Call before visiting – 717-845-1066.

What to do with Unacceptable Items?

- Used Oil from vehicles can often be disposed of at auto shops or agencies selling auto supplies.
- Unacceptable metal items can often be disposed of through various Metal Recyclers or Scrap Metal facilities in the area.
- Plastic Bags – from all stores - can be recycled at many local grocery stores.
- Truck and tractor tires can be taken to a tire distributor to be disposed of or recycled. Contact business in advance, a fee may be required.

- It is always recommended to call a facility first to see what their policies are regarding accepting materials

Recycling Acceptable Items

Place ONLY these items in your Recycling Bin

Metal: Aluminum and steel food & beverage cans

Glass: Clear, brown, blue and green glass food & beverage containers

Plastic: #1, #2, and #5 ONLY

Paper & Cardboard:

- Corrugated cardboard boxes
- Newspapers
- Cartons for Juice, Milk, Soy Milk, Soup / Broth, Wine, Egg Substitutes and Cream

Remember:

- Remove all packaging materials (Styrofoam, peanuts, bubble wrap, plastic liners)
- Flatten ALL boxes, and
- Bundle all cardboard that does not fit into the recycling bin
- Cover loose paper with heavier items to prevent it from blowing away. If the weather forecast calls for high winds or wet weather, keep your paper recyclables until the next week. Wet paper products are difficult to process.
- Rinse thoroughly to remove all contaminants.
- Please dispose of any liquids in items before placing in recycling bins

Please have your waste, recycling and large item available for collection at curbside by 6:00 a.m. on your collection day, but no earlier than 4:00 p.m. the day prior to pick up. Empty containers must be removed within 24 hours after collection. No items may be placed at curbsides that are too heavy to be lifted into a truck by two people. Additional trash bags are NOT considered a bulk item.

DID YOU KNOW?

Continental Paper Grading (CPG) accepts magazines, junk mail, catalogs, cereal boxes, and books for paper recycling. Drop off these materials at CPG 3350 Concord Road, York
 Monday – Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Remember: The Covered Devices Recycling Act (Act 108) prohibits residents and businesses from placing electronics waste at the curb or in their trash. Covered devices include: desktop computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals (keyboard, mouse, printer and speakers), televisions and e-readers that browse the internet.

ELECTRONICS COLLECTION TIMES AND LOCATION

The York County Solid Waste Authority (YCSWA) has a FREE Residential Electronics Recycling Program open to York County residents. Collection of electronics is conducted Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to noon at the Small Load Drop-off Facility at the York County Resource Recover Center, 2651 Blackbridge Road. For the most up-to-date information please contact YCSWA, 717-845-1066 www.ycswa.com.

Recycling Unacceptable Items

- Needles & Medical Waste – DO NOT place used needles or any other medical waste with recycling! This is a serious health hazard to everyone.
- Diapers (acceptable as trash)
- Aerosol cans (acceptable as trash)
- Windows, mirrors, ceramics, drinking glasses, light bulbs or broken glass (acceptable as trash)
- Shredded paper (acceptable as trash)
- Aluminum foil (acceptable as trash)
- Food soiled or wet materials including paper, cardboard (acceptable as trash)
- Styrofoam, packing peanuts, bubble wrap (acceptable as trash)
- Plastic bags (acceptable as trash)
- Tissues and other paper products (acceptable as trash)
- Paperboard products such as toilet paper / paper towel rolls, cereal boxes, tissue boxes (acceptable as trash)
- Pool chemicals (Hazardous Waste)
- Hose (acceptable as trash)
- Rechargeable Batteries (For disposal options visit: Call2Recycle.org)

Holiday Collection Schedule

Penn Waste observes New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. When your collection day is on or after a holiday, collections will be delayed by one day. Example: Memorial Day falls on a Monday. Collection schedule this week is Tuesday through Saturday. Thanksgiving falls on a Thursday. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday collections will not change. Thursday and Friday collections will move to Friday and Saturday. **EXCEPTION:** If holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, there is **no change** in service prior to or after the holiday.
