This takes a lot of time, thought and consideration in planning and being flexible on the night.

In March this year, I wrote to parents and advised that we will need to increase the cost of subscriptions from September 2026. This decision taken by the Trustees, was not made lightly. Subscriptions have remained the same for the last two years, however, to avoid a significant increase in future years, we have made the decision to increase the termly subscriptions by £5. This will help us manage the increase in cost of resources and activities.

We will of course continue to support costs through fundraising. Last year we held a successful range of fundraising activities. The Summer Fair was a great fundraising event for us. It was well attending by the community, and supported by our local

Police, Councillors and the Mayor of Brent – who is an ex-pupil of Preston Park Primary School. It was wonderful to see his excitement visiting his old school and be reunited with his teachers. The games and food stalls were a big hit also.

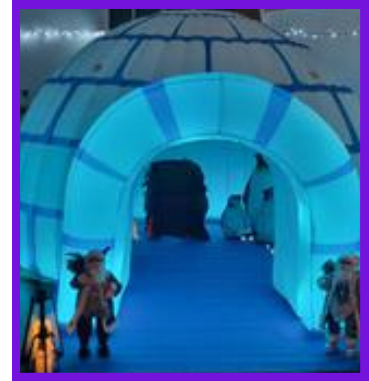
Even I couldn't help but enjoy the session when this beautiful Gecko came to visit us.

Autumn Term 2025

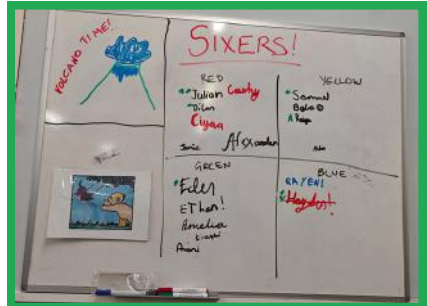

We wrapped up the year with their very first Christmas Camp, which Cubs contributed the stockings for, using their acquired sewing and ironing skills.

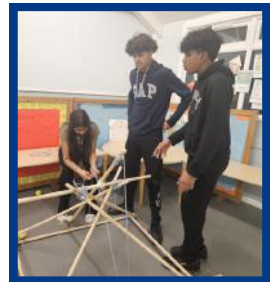

EXPLORERS

Riddhi and I took over explorers at the start of the year. Personally, I have been in scouting throughout scouts and explorers going on multiple camps both locally and internationally. 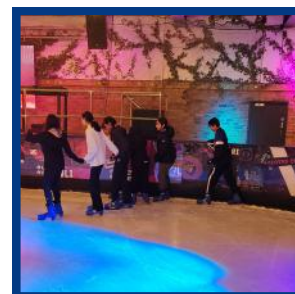
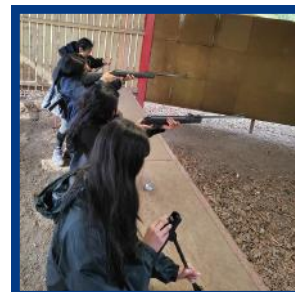
Fundraising event

Adult Volunteers

- Ensure you arrive to the venue, either on-site or off-site, before our young people to welcome them
- Please share with other leaders any relevant information discussed with parents during drop off and pick up
- Ensure Risk Assessments are read and familiarise yourself with session activity before arriving at the session
- Always be in your uniform or agreed uniform along with group necker
- If you are unable to attend your regular session, inform your colleagues with at least twenty-four hours' notice so that appropriate cover can be organised
- Try to prioritise your availability for scout events and activities. Without sufficient leaders YP won't be able to take part in activities/events
- Treat everyone with respect, you are a role model for the YP
- Stay updated on the latest Scouting policies and safety protocols

Parents/Carers

- Inform the relevant Section Leader of any changes to their child's health and allergy information
- Ensure the OSM profile details are always UpToDate
- Respond within reasonable time to messages/emails for events/activities for your YP
- Inform the Section leader if the YP will not be attending sessions or if running late
- Badges provided to YP at the end of term to be sewed on the uniform ahead of the next session
- Replacement scarves, woggles and badges will be purchased at your cost

Young People

- Try and attend all sessions to achieve the most out of scouting
- Take part in at least 2 outdoor activities a year out of which 1 would be an overnight camp
- Be in full uniform with the group necker and woggle for all sessions
- Follow code of conduct for each session

7th Wembley Scout Group Annual General Meeting July 2025

Date: Friday 18th July 2025

In Attendance: Trustees, District Commissioner, David Kitchen, 7th Wembley Leaders and Parents.

Minutes

1. Welcome, Introductions to Trustees and Leaders

The Chair of Trustees opened the meeting, welcomed parents, and invited the panel of Trustees and Leaders to introduce themselves.

2. Chair's Report

The Chair delivered her report. This was the third Annual General Meeting of the 7th Wembley Scout Group. The Group is one of the biggest and fastest growing group in Brent. The Chair stated that the Annual General Meeting plays an important role in the Scout Group calendar and thanked the parents for attending. It is an opportunity for the Trustees, Leaders and Parents to come together as a Group to celebrate the achievements of all the sections, and encouraged parents to read the AGM report. The Chair explained that the Trustee Board is a team of volunteers who work together, as charity Trustees, to make sure the Scouts Group is run safely and legally. At the heart of the role is a focus on strategy, performance, and assurance. The Board ensures that the Scout Group is well managed, complies with the charity's governing document and the law, manages the charity's resources responsibly and carries out its purposes for the public benefit. The Board also oversee the accounts and set the subscription fees. The Chair acknowledged the departure of the District Commissioner, and thanked David for his support. Thanks was also given to Jay for the venue space, Sapna for designing the AGM report and to the APS Group for donating the printing costs.

3. District Commissioner – David Kitchen

David explained that Brent was the second largest and most diverse Scout district in London. He thanked the group for their hard work in increasing the number of young people joining Scouts. He has managed to introduce 12 new groups during his term as a commissioner, and he will be stepping down from September. David advised of the district's upcoming events. These include a summer expedition to Switzerland, swimming Gala and World Scout Jamboree in 2027 to Poland. He encouraged members to get involved in organising events and supporting leadership roles in the group. Lastly, he shared the completion of training undertaken by volunteers and Young Leaders.

4. Treasurer's Report

The Group's Treasurer presented the accounts for the period April 2024 to March 2025. A copy of the accounts is also available in the AGM report. The Chair explained the governance process for agreeing the subscription fees and confirmed that notice of any changes would be given at least one term in advance. Subscription fees would be remaining the same for the year 2025/26. Fees will be reviewed in March 2026.

5. Group Lead Volunteers Report

The GLV thanked everyone for attending the AGM. He recapped on the group events that the group have been involved in the past year. He announced that the Sponsored group hike raised £1337 in total and awarded certificate to the top 3 members that raised the most funds. He mentioned the Jambowlree was a very successful family event, and we will look at doing more of them. Introduced new members that have recently joined our adult group: Reshma, Mohini & Kiran. He urged all parents to support the group by responding to OSM and WhatsApp invites as quickly as they can, so it helps in making necessary arrangements. He informed members that 7th Wembley have now joined the Jack Petchey Foundation and Nehal will be coordinating the nominations.
