Serving God's own country

A week-long trip in the remotest areas of Kerala provided the opportunity to engage with the most deprived sections of the community, and concerned stakeholders and understand the existing best models of women empowerment. Starting with attending the SHG meeting of Kudumbashree in Athirappilly which was formed 25 years ago, the team overviewed the working of the special care centre for orphans and destitute in Mayannur to interact with the tribals of Palakad and Wayanad districts. The key observations were the alarming mental health issues, consistent rise in sickle cell disease and hygiene concerns among the tribal population.
