From the Rabbi



With the approach of summer since childhood, I have made summer reading lists. Whether it was at the beach growing up, poolside, on vacation or at home, this is always sacred time and with our Jewish holidays "late" this year, the beginning of summer coincides with Shavuot, our holiday dedicated to learning. We read the Biblical book of Ruth which highlights the redemptive qualities of love and kindness and that even in the midst of crisis and loss, we each have the potential for transformation and growth to elevate not only ourselves but our people.

On my "summer reading list" is Rabbi Shai Held's new book, *Judaism is about Love: Recovering the Heart of Jewish Life* which is available in our synagogue library. I cannot recommend it enough. Rabbi Held opens his new book: "Judaism is not what you think it is. Judaism is about love. The Jewish tradition tells the story of a G-d of love who creates us in love and enjoins us, in turn, to live lives of love. We are commanded to love G-d, the neighbor, the stranger, and all of humanity - and we are told the highest achievement of which we are capable is to live with compassion. This is considered nothing less than walking in G-d's own ways."

This has been an incredibly difficult year for Israel and the Jewish people across the globe since October 7th, Hamas' brutal attack, the ensuing war with Hamas and rising antisemitism on campus and in America. We must remain vigilant against this rise in hate, stand with Israel and raise our voices to bring the hostages home. In meeting here in Cleveland with an Israeli mother of a Nova Music Festival victim, Natalya told me that she wants to honor her son's memory by focusing on the love in her life, the love that he stood for and to share more love into the world. I gave her a copy of Rabbi Held's book.

Rabbi Held writes: "The world is a complicated place, suffused with both beauty and barbarism. Any given day can make us dance with joy and recoil in horror...In the face of all this, Jewish tradition makes a simple but audacious claim: we remain capable of choosing the good...not that we **will** choose the good but that we **can** do so. Although we so often fail, it teaches, we are capable of succeeding. We can choose love."

President's Message



The day after Passover ended, I was involved in an anti-Semitic incident, my first since high school. I was sitting in my local Panera in Chagrin Falls getting work done, while these two men sitting right in the middle of the restaurant went on and on for more than five minutes about

how some Jewish contractor they knew had supposedly purposely used substandard materials on a construction project, leading to some sort of serious problem on the job site. The clear subtext—and it wasn't even a subtext, really—was that the contractor had been too cheap and dishonest to buy the right grade of materials.

It just so happens that particular day I was wearing a t-shirt in Hebrew. After hoping for a couple of minutes these guys would shut up, I finally stood up and stared at them. When the one facing me saw me staring him down and saw my shirt, he froze in mid-sentence and offered the lame excuse that, hey, "we're equal opportunity offenders, man." I replied, "no, you're equal opportunity racists and I'm sick of listening to you," and moved to another part of the restaurant.

I am not ashamed to admit this incident shook me for a few days afterwards. It's one thing to see all the statistics about the dramatic rise in antisemitism in America over the last several years, and quite another to experience it personally. After reflecting on what happened, two things really troubled me. First, the fact that these two men felt completely at ease spewing antisemitic tropes in the middle of a full restaurant speaks volumes about how normalized such conduct is becoming; can you imagine this happening in our area just 10 years ago? But what bothered me even more was how none of the other people having lunch and listening to this garbage spoke up about it—either to the perpetrators, or to even come over to me afterwards and express their support.

I'm not really sure what lessons to take away from this. All I know is that when I witness hatred, bigotry or racism—whether against Jews or any other minority group—I am going to continue to speak up. Silence equals consent, and closet racists need to be told to get back in the closet,

From the Rabbi



Shavuot recalls the receiving of Torah from Sinai. The human role in revelation seems passive. But what if it's not? Two stories:

A king - *why's it always a king* - gives two servants each a measure of wheat and a bundle of flax. The first dutifully guards it, holding onto it for safekeeping. The second weaves the flax into a beautiful tablecloth and grinds the wheat into fine flour, kneads it, and bakes it into bread. When the king returns and asks what they've done with his gift, he's disappointed to find the first servant's flax and wheat untouched, but comforted to see the nice warm challah resting on a magnificent tablecloth.

Story two: The daughter of a Roman emperor - *an emperor, this time!* - meets Rabbi Yehoshua. She says to him, "Woe that such wisdom is contained in such an ugly vessel!" Ancient trash talk. Rabbi Yehoshua responds: "Does your father keep his wine in clay vessels? Surely that's unbecoming of an emperor. Rather, he should store them in gold and silver vessels." The emperor's daughter relays the message, and her father transfers all his wine into gold and silver vessels. The wine spoils.

These stories have something in common, other than ingredients for Shabbat (challah, a table cloth, and wine). They speak to the impact we, as receivers of Torah, have on the actual content of Torah. From the original sacred source material of Torah - flax and wheat - Judaism lovingly derives an oral tradition (Mishnah and Talmud, from which the above stories are found). And as author Ilana Kurshan teaches, we, as vessels, impart our own unique flavor onto the Torah - the wine - we learn. Our lived experience enters into a chemical reaction with the text, producing Torah unique to each and every one of us.

Shavuot isn't just about passively receiving Torah. It's about actively sharing our own. Just like Shabbat seems like a passive day of rest, but is actually sacred time we actively work to create by setting a beautiful table. Where we welcome angels and the Presence of God, Who welcomes us into sacred partnership.

State of our Youth & Learning Center

As we conclude each school year, it has become my tradition to reflect on our Youth & Learning Center here at B'nai Jeshurun, and this year has no doubt been filled with many superlatives! With record numbers of families and children participating in our annual Purim carnival, a record 22 high school students participating in our Hineni Teen Fellowship, this year was highlighted by a trip to New York City to explore immigration and the American Jewish experience, and a record 83 3rd-7th grade students participating in our annual Youth Shabbaton, held each spring at Camp Wise, we have much to be proud of. On Shabbat mornings, our young family Shabbat B'Yachad programs drew more families than we have seen in many years, and this year also marked the return of a stand-alone Pre-Kindergarten class on Shabbat mornings for the first time in 10 years, demonstrating that our future is indeed strong.

I want to take a moment to recognize the hard work and dedication of our two long-time assistants, **Wendy Altmire** and **Shirley Haas**, who are both retiring at the end of this school year following a combined 46 years helping build and sustain everything we do. The strength of our Youth & Learning Center is due in no small part to their efforts.

Despite our successes, this has also been a very trying year as we have struggled following the horrific terrorist attack perpetrated by Hamas. We continue to pray for the release of all hostages, to combat the Antisemitism that has reared its ugly head far too often in the months since, and hope for peace to be restored as soon as possible. In the face of all of these challenges, however, our students and families are committed to connecting even more closely to our tradition – we saw it in the pride of our 1st grade students at their Consecration ceremony, our 3rd grade students upon receiving their own Siddur and leading our Shabbat morning youth service, our 4th grade students upon chanting from the Torah for the first time, our 5th & 6th grade students as they led our Friday evening Shabbat services, our 7th grade students at their B'nai Mitzvah, our teens every Monday night at Makom, our weekly teen evening, and on and on.
