

Supporting Our Students With Four-Legged Friends

There's about to be more four-legged friends at schools across Victoria as part of a State Government program to give students the wellbeing and mental health support they need.

101 schools across Victoria will receive a grant as part of the Animal-assisted Wellbeing and Engagement Program.

The schools will each share more than \$1.7 million to implement new or expand existing animal-assisted wellbeing and engagement programs.

The initiative aims to help students build confidence and social connections, enhance empathy and strengthen emotional regulation.

Existing animal-assisted wellbeing and engagement programs in schools are already delivering these benefits and helping students to engage in learning more effectively, leading to improved attendance.

Most of the programs support students through activities involving dogs and horses which are trained to work alongside their handlers.


At some schools, students are improving literacy skills by reading books to dogs, others are building confidence and trust by working with horses.

Some schools have a support animal trained to work at their school under the care of a certified handler, while other schools work with certified external providers to tailor weekly wellbeing and engagement activities for students.

The State Government is investing \$4.8 million over three years to ensure more students can benefit from animal-assisted wellbeing and engagement programs at their school and prioritising services for students with disability and additional needs.

Round two grant applications will open to schools in Term 2.

Plans For Winchelsea Community House To Continue Managing Shire Hall

Surf Coast Shire Council will seek to enter into an agreement with the Winchelsea Community House to continue managing the Winchelsea Shire Hall for the next two years.

Council officers will also commence negotiations to continue delivering its Child and Family Health Services, from the hall and community house.

The proposed plan is an evolution of the current arrangement which has been in place following a Council resolution in 2021.

Under the proposed agreement, Council would pay the Winchelsea Community House an annual management fee, which reduces over the two years recognising that room hire income is increasing.

The Council decision considered the importance of this building to the Winchelsea community whilst balancing that this management model is quite unique for Council owned buildings.

In 2027 Council will transition to a model where the Winchelsea Community House has the option to manage the Winchelsea Shire Hall without Council paying a management fee. If this is not suitable, Council would manage and book the hall to user groups.

This model reduces and concludes Council's contribution

which is a more consistent approach to managing community facilities across the shire.

Cr Adrian Schonfelder said the Winchelsea Shire Hall held great significance for many locals, who were keen for it to be the heart of the town.

"It's been wonderful to see lots of people regularly popping in and out of the hall. There's a wide range of activities on offer and it's great to see the community embracing it with hire rates steadily increasing over the past two years," he said.

"So we're pleased to enter into further negotiations with Winchelsea Community House to continue their role managing the hall over the next two years."

"We look forward to working together to support the transition of the hall into the community house service offerings in the longer term, which is more in line with the way many other Council owned facilities are managed," Cr Schonfelder said.

"There are many benefits of co-locating Council's Child and Family Health Services within the Winchelsea Community House alongside other key community services for families so we absolutely want to see these benefits continue."





Council To Gift Land In Winchelsea To **Local Vicses Unit**

Surf Coast Shire Council will gift excess vacant land in Winchelsea to the Victoria State Emergency Service (VICSES), to continue to support the volunteer-based organisation.

Council approved the transfer of 2504m2 of land at 325 Mouslev Drive. Winchelsea to the local VICSES Winchelsea Unit at the July 2024 Council meeting.

Fronting the Princes Highway, the VICSES Winchelsea Unit has been based at their current site - now gifted to them by Council - for the past decade.

Councillor Tony Phelps was pleased that VICSES had recently signed an agreement with Council, marking a key milestone in the process.

"It will help the VICSES Winchelsea Unit and the invaluable emergency response work volunteers carry out in the community to help keep people safe."

VICSES Winchelsea Unit Controller, Kris Jeffery said: "Our VICSES volunteers play an important role in keeping our local Winchelsea community safe, and it's critical we have the right infrastructure to better serve this community."

"Our volunteers are pleased with this result, and we thank Council for their generosity."

Council also approved to sell a separate portion of excess land adjoining the site through a public process. It is expected to be placed on the market in the coming months, following improvements including grass cutting and removing soil mounds.

"It's 1.47 hectares of land. Given Council doesn't need it, it makes sense to move it on," Cr Phelps said.

"The sale of the excess land will result in additional income for Council and create the potential for better use of the land."

Council invited submissions on the gifting and the sale of land over a four-week period in mid-2024. No submissions were received.

What's Afoot at Council

It has been, apparently as usual for a new Council term, a very busy couple of months. The draft budget. The new 4-year plan. Presentations on diverse shire services, responsibilities and activities. Council meetings & events. Emails (always), talking to & meeting with people. I thought I'd pass on a few significant items.

Last Tuesday saw the March Council Meeting held over in Lorne, with half an hour beforehand to mingle and chat. (By the way, the next 'away' Council meeting will be in Winchelsea in August, so if you want to join us in person please come

One important decision was about the Winchelsea Shire Hall, with the existing 3-year activation agreement coming to and end in June and what happens next. Having been Chair of the Winch House Committee up until the end of last year, I was advised that due to potential conflict of interest it would best if I stepped out while this item was discussed and voted on – which is what I did. reluctantly but with acknowledgement that Councillor integrity is important to public perception. My thanks to Cr Schonfelder

to taking up the item and speaking so well about the need to continue for another 2 years with a revised agreement (given the Covid hangover and issues with heating that interfered with the first 2 years). It is extremely important for the Winchelsea community to realise that this gives just 2 years to formulate and activate a model that will keep the Shire Hall open to the public after Shire funding stops. It really is over to you.

Another item was a decision to phase out the fleet of small community buses. They are ageing and generally a decade old or more, and due for replacement. In addition, new regulations and driver requirements arising from the Hunter Valley bus tragedy a few years ago are going to make it all a bit harder. So not only over \$400,000 for new buses but also more difficulty in finding drivers. With declining use of these buses, Council has decided to sell them off and use some of the proceeds to subsidise the use of commercial buses for the next 2 years instead. I would like to think there may be some alternative and/or innovative way of helping those in the community who find transport difficult let's face it, public transport isn't great in our region. Your ideas are very welcome.

For Shire non-profit organisations, it was pleasing to see the return of the Surf

Coast Grant Finder. It offers a free subscription to the Grant Guru email notification tool which is designed to streamline the grant finding process for community groups. Select the types of grants to hear about and an email advises of new matches. It's a great tool for finding funding. Find out more at grantguru.com/au/surfcoast - there are ALL sorts of grants available.

Did you know it is Shire policy that a plaque or memorial for a deceased person will not be considered for 3 years following the passing of that person, to allow for a historical perspective to be developed? Cr Grist followed up on a knockback to a plaque being arranged for a Winchelsea community stalwart, and it transpired that the State has defined principles around this – although the Shire's own policy exceeds the State's 2-year delay. We look forward to this policy coming up for review in due course.

There's a lot more on the boil. Don't forget, if there's an issue you want the Shire to fix, report it via the website ("Lodge a request" on

Winter Uniforms Next On School **Saving Bonus Shopping List**

The State Government's School Saving Bonus is providing cost of living relief to hundreds of thousands of families, who have so far saved more than \$150 million on the costs of school essentials.

But for families who haven't had a chance to use their bonus, time is running out to buy uniforms or textbooks.

Families are encouraged to use their \$400 School Saving Bonus to purchase winter school uniforms before the cold weather sets in.

More than 700,000 transactions have been processed since the Bonus was launched in November, with families saving more than \$60 million on uniforms. \$58 million on camps and excursions, and \$31.8 million on textbooks.

While most families have drawn on their School Saving Bonus in part or in full, around 30 per cent of bonuses remain untouched - ready to be used by families ahead of winter.

The next few months are the last chance to use the \$400 School Saving Bonus to purchase uniforms or textbooks, either through approved suppliers or at secondhand uniform and textbook shops run by schools.

Any money unspent by 30 June will automatically transfer to a family's school account, with parents able to use these remaining funds on school activities like camps, sports or excursions.

Non-government school families who have a healthcare or concession card are



also eligible to receive the bonus. These schools decide how to allocate the bonus to best accommodate their families and students.

The School Saving Bonus builds on many State Government programs easing the cost-of-living, including free school dental checkups, the Glasses for Kids program, and Breakfast Clubs dishing up more than 53 million meals since 2016.

Apollo Bay Area To Enter Stage 2 Water Restrictions On Monday 7 April

Apollo Bay, Marengo and Skenes Creek will enter stage 2 water restrictions on Monday 7 April. This is in response to dry conditions, with the area experiencing its third driest October-to-January period in the past 50 years.

Water storages are sitting at their lowest level since 2016, below 40% compared to 99% at the same time last year.

Barwon Water will support the Apollo Bay community to understand the changes over the coming weeks by:

- Holding a series of community pop-ups to answer questions
- Distributing posters, fact-sheets and information in the
- Providing detailed information on the Barwon Water website about what you can and can't do in stage 2 water restrictions
- Messaging customers in the Apollo Bay region
- Ensuring their customer centre has extra information for people who call with questions

Stage 2 restrictions are aimed at best managing storage levels and ensuring the wider community is using water efficiently and wisely.

Barwon Water will continue to closely monitor storages, usage trends and rainfall forecasts, with an eye to lifting restrictions as soon as possible.



WINCHELSEA BOWLS CLUB



On 26/2/1962 a public meeting was held in the Shire Hall with many interested people deciding to form the Winchelsea Bowls Club.

On 18/1/1965 a list of names was compiled, and the secretary was instructed to print and post an invitation to all local people who had helped construct the green.

It was moved at the next meeting that three rooms from behind the doctor's residence be moved to the bowling club site. This building was then moved to the Netball Club.

The present building was moved 1970-1971 from camp at Gerange-Anglesea Power Station.

To start the club financially they took out debentures amongst the members.


They paid for lights the first year to play Pennant at night and recently put in new overhead lights for future use.

In 2008 the club installed a synthetic green due to continued water restrictions.

The initial uniform was an approved R.V.B.A tie, white or tan rubber soled and heel-less shoe and the approved Association blazer - navy blue with club colours on top of pocket and navy blue hat band with the club name in white letters was used. Ladies wore a white dress 15" from the ground with white or flesh stockings, white cardigan and shoes, a white hat, navy hat band with a white or navy handbag.

Winchelsea was very well represented at league level and still is. There are many life members and many premierships have been won.

Climate emergency: 2025 declared international year of glaciers

I would recommend a forum being organised by the Colac Climate Action Team on Wednesday, 16th April @ 6pm in the Colac Otway Performing Arts & Cultural Centre, 95 - 97 Gellibrand Street.

Greg Mullins AO AFSM is an Australian firefighter. He is a former Commissioner of Fire and Rescue New South Wales, a Climate Councillor with the Climate Council and a founding member of Emergency Leaders for Climate Action.

Over five decades he watched as weather patterns and natural disaster risks changed, seeing bushfires becoming bigger, hotter and more destructive. He talked to scientists and weighed their evidence with his experience, coming to the realisation that man-made global warming was setting the stage for a deadly firestorm. In early 2019 he tried to warn the government that a Black Summer was imminent so that adequate preparations could be made. . .

But when he and former fire chiefs from across the country tried to meet with politicians to sound an urgent warning, they were ignored.

"As each of the states and territories in Australia, their fire seasons heat up and start early, they won't be able to share trucks, people, incident-management personnel, so it's going to be harder and harder to fight these fires and we need a national response to this. It's up to the retired fire chiefs who are unconstrained to tell it like it is and say this is really dangerous," he said.

"People are at risk, we need a game changer in how we deal with these catastrophes because they're going to get worse and worse."

Other speakers are;

Jo Dodds, Bushfire Survivors for Climate Action. "I have seen for myself that climate change is not a future threat, or something happening only in

Antarctica or Kiribati. It is happening NOW, to my communities and others who face similar threats now, not just in the traditional fire seasons, but all year round."

Any government that knows what we have been through and continues to suggest that there's no need for urgent action should be held directly responsible for the next fire. It is their job to ensure the safety of our communities, their job to represent OUR interests against those of the fossil fuel industries that are driving the majority of the climate destruction. Any government which does not prioritise the people, our homes and livelihoods. our food production and livestock, any government that ignores our security

from the biggest threat our communities will ever face, should be held accountable."

Cam Walker, Australian Firefights for Climate Action. "Firefighters are on the frontline of climate change. We see the impacts of fire seasons that are longer and more intense. Fire behaviour is changing, and changing for the worse. This is our workplace, and it is becoming more and more unsafe"

Kirsten Diprose, Storyteller|Board Director|Podcaster| Farmer. "My passion is telling the stories of rural people. This has led me to create the Rural Podcasting Co, a service to help rural people tell their own story."



Council To Offer Bus Hire Subsidy For Eligible Groups

Surf Coast Shire Council will offer bus hire subsidies to eligible community groups and organisations from September 2025 until June 2027.

The subsidy will be introduced as part of Council's decision to transition from its current bus hire model, which is declining in use, carries substantial risk, and is not cost effective.

The new subsidy model will provide community groups with a safer, more accessible and more efficient way to hire a bus. It will also enable access to a wider variety of vehicles to meet community need.

A community bus trial found bookings for the buses continue to decline despite a wide-reaching promotional campaign last year. Bus trips decreased by 18.5% from 151 trips in 2022, to 123 trips in 2024. This is on the back of community groups accessing other vehicles, including some groups purchasing their own.

In making the decision, Council considered the significant increased cost to ratepayers to operate the community buses. It's estimated the new model will save more than \$1.4m in renewal and operating costs in Council's long-term projections.

The fleet is made up of four 12-seaters (in Anglesea, Lorne, Torquay and Winchelsea). The Winchelsea Bendigo Community Bank owns a 28-seater bus that Council books to the community.

Council's four 12-seater buses are due for replacement, and do not meet accessibility requirements. They carry significant risk, safety, financial, and insurance requirements, which are difficult for both Council and community users to meet.



"The fleet of four buses will be sold to help fund the new subsidy model, and fleet management costs will be reallocated to support community groups hire other buses," Council's General Manager Community Life Damian Waight said.

"We acknowledge the decision to discontinue the fleet might be an adjustment for some groups, so we're committed to helping them transition smoothly over the next two years.

"This will include eligible groups and organisations being able to apply for a subsidy for commercial bus hire fees."

The subsidy will be available from September 2025 and will end on 30 June 2027.

Eligible priority groups – such as older people and people with a disability – will receive a 100% subsidy for each booking, totalling a maximum \$1,500 each financial year.

All other community groups – including community groups, sports clubs and schools – are eligible for a subsidy of 50% towards the value of each booking, with a maximum \$250 per claim and totalling a maximum \$750 each financial year.

A booking form will open on Council's website from August 2025. Community groups will also be able to check their eligibility on the website, or by calling Council on 5261 0600.

The booking webpage will be promoted to the community before it goes live.

Council also decided at its March Council meeting to transition the Winchelsea 28-seater back to Bendigo Community Bank.

Don't Cross The Line - Treat Workers With Respect

The State Government is putting work-related aggression and violence in the spotlight with a new campaign asking the community to not cross the line, and to stop and reflect before tempers rise.

'Don't cross the line' – a fresh campaign from WorkSafe Victoria – calls on everyday Victorians to consider the toll on workers who may experience yelling, swearing and hostility as part of their day to day work.

The campaign will run on TV, radio, social media, print and feature in workplaces – focusing on the cumulative

impact of these forms of aggression.

The campaign comes as WorkSafe data reveals almost 1,000 workers were seriously injured – including 316 workers who suffered mental injuries – because of suspected work-related aggression or violence incidents last year

Alarmingly, 100 of the victims were young workers aged under 25, including several teenagers. Claims were made from workers across a range of industries including retail, transport, health care and social assistance, education and training and emergency services.

The campaign portrays situations where community members may feel frustrated and tempers boil over – such as when transport is delayed, there's a mix-up

with an order, or a long queue.

Each scenario highlights the fact that workers in public-facing roles may face multiple acts of aggression in a single day – and encourages members of the community to stop, think and act better in the moment.

Employers have a responsibility to protect workers from hazards, including having systems in place to prevent aggression and violence in the workplace as well as for reporting and responding to incidents that do happen.
