Sports Talks

The former National Champion and now Trainee Sports Psychologist explored the key concepts and strategies used at the elite level, bridging the gap between his work with top senior athletes and young minds he mentors at the Boys' Prep.

The talks were:

- 1. Goal Setting for Young Athletes
- 2. Challenge & Threat States
- 3. The Importance of Autonomy in Sports for your Child
- 4. How Elite Athletes Optimise Self Talk & Visualisation

This fascinating set of talks saw Mr Trigwell sharing with our parent community the powerful tools that can enhance athletic performance and equally benefit young athletes by boosting motivation, focus and mental resilience. Furthermore, he provided practical advice on integrating these techniques into sport, academics and everyday life to strengthen their mental game.

Mr Trigwell also leads our Primary Sports Scholarship Programme which aims to build the aerobic and anaerobic fitness of our Year 5 boys and set them off into Year 6 with a strong set of skills and resilience for their senior school journey.
