Registration will open **March 1** at 8 a.m. for **WAUKEE RESIDENTS** for all activities unless otherwise noted. **NON-RESIDENT** registration will open **March 4** at 12 p.m.

What is your cancelation policy?

Programs, activities, special events and festivals which are canceled, postponed or changed in location will be announced as soon as possible. Please check Facebook or Waukee.org for updates. Waukee Parks & Recreation reserves the right to cancel a program or an activity that does not meet the minimum number of participants necessary to offer the program.

What is your program refund policy?

Programs/Classes/Camps: A \$5 non-refundable processing fee will be deducted from the refund when an enrollee withdraws from a program at least one week prior to the first day of the program. Within one week of the program start date, a refund will not be issued.

Leagues: A \$5 non-refundable processing fee will be deducted from the refund when an enrollee withdraws prior to rosters being made. After rosters are formed, no refund will be issued.

Trips: Cancelations for trips must be made at least three weeks prior to the trip date to receive a full refund less a \$5 non-refundable processing fee. No refund will be issued for cancellations within three weeks of the trip.

What is your facility rental refund policy?

To receive a refund, reservations must be cancelled at least 10 business days prior to the date of reservation. A \$10 non-refundable processing fee will be deducted from the refund. No refund will be issued for cancelations made within 10 business days of the start of the reservation.

What is your photo/video policy?





• Tallgrass Pond is located west of Grand Prairie Parkway and south of Tallgrass Lane.

 Kettlestone Village Pond is located north of Westown Parkway and east of SE Parkview Crossing Drive.




