From Father Will:

Every year, millions of people across the country start off the New Year by embracing some sort of change. One of the more popular resolutions is to lose weight, or live a more active life. Gyms often offer membership deals around the first of the year in an effort to entice those swayed by the idea of living a healthier lifestyle. Often times, those memberships are underutilized. In fact, it's not uncommon for month to month gyms to lose a huge percentage of their membership at the end of the first quarter each year. In the meantime, those members often revert back to their old ways of living, causing their health to suffer.

In much the same way, often times we begin the year with great enthusiasm for rejuvenating our spiritual lives. We commit to reading the Bible more often. We may even pick out a daily scripture reading plan, and download the Bible in a Year app on our phone. Often times, when we rely on our own will power and self-motivation to see these new disciplines through, we wind up falling off the wagon and giving up by the time Lent rolls around. We may try to use Lent to jump start those ambitions again, but after Easter our attentions shift and those disciplines are gone until Advent or the next iteration of our New Year's resolutions rolls around.

Recently, Archbishop Steve Wood addressed this common conundrum and offered up a few different scripture reading plans to help us in this arena, but he also identified the root cause of our failures in this area, a lack of spiritual maturity. While there is a desire in our hearts and minds, we often lack the fortitude to persevere in these disciplines if we are not mature in our faith. We can't just desire to read the scriptures to be a better person. Instead, we must grow in our spiritual maturity. As we do so, our hearts will be changed by the Lord. As our hearts are changed by him, they will desire him more. As we desire him more, we will find that the only way we

can truly live is to be deeply rooted in faith, hope, and love through our spiritual life.

During the upcoming season of Epiphany we will be looking at the ways in which we might grow in spiritual maturity. While there are many facets to our faith, there are five key areas of commitment that we will be focusing on: Bible reading, the community of faith, regular worship, prayer, and sacrificial giving. As we grow in these areas, our desire to draw closer to God will also deepen. It is, after all, in all five of these areas that we grow in spiritual maturity. Reading our Bibles alone won't fix the problem. We are, instead, to find our whole identity in our Lord and savior.

The way we do so is through growth in spiritual maturity. Join us the last Sunday in January, and through February, as we dig into this necessary element of our faith and address the areas of need for spiritual growth in our lives. Then, on the heels of that, join us for our Tuesday Lenten suppers as we dig into the ways in which our liturgical forms of worship and prayer contribute to our spiritual growth as well. In the same way that you're more likely to stick with a workout regimen if you have accountability, the likelihood that you stick with your resolutions to grow in the faith will only increase if you remain in communion with the body of believers. I look forward to seeing each and every one of you Sundays, and Tuesday evenings in Lent.
